

### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This last year has been a productive one and, at least in many respects, a successful one for Table Tennis Australia.

We have improved our financial position to the extent that at 31 December 2003, we had an accumulative surplus of \$194,795. This cash reserve will enable us to plan for the future without the uncertainty as to whether we have the financial resources to implement those plans.

We have established committees in the areas of Athletes With Disabilities, Development, and Marketing and Sponsorship. Our Veterans' Committee and our Officiating Committee have continued to operate, as has our High Performance Committee (albeit with a different composition). In addition, our Coaching Committee has been re-constituted. Some of these committees have begun, or continued (in the case of existing committees), to work efficiently. In the case of some of the more newly constituted committees, the challenge to make a valuable contribution to table tennis lies in front of them. We have established an administrative infrastructure but, ultimately, committees are only as good as the people who comprise them. It is now up to all committee members to function effectively. I thank all committee members for their contributions to date and I hope that there will be further and, at least in some cases, greater contributions from them in the future.

As mentioned above, one newly established committee is that of Athletes With Disabilities. The prime mover behind the establishment of this committee was Arthur Wilks. In August 2003, TTA, through Arthur's committee, conducted its first Australian Athletes With Disabilities Championships, which were held in Sydney and proved to be a great success. In the light of that success, I am confident that there will be further growth in this area. I applaud Arthur and his fellow committee members for their invaluable work to date.

Our National Junior Selectors and our National Senior Selectors comprise two further committees, each chaired by Mary LeGassick. Being a National Selector is a thankless task. When National Selectors' decisions, whether they be seedings, rankings or national team selections, are perceived to be correct, the Selectors' work often passes unnoticed ("the team picked itself" is a frequent comment). Generally, it is only when the Selectors' decisions are perceived to be incorrect that there is any focus on them. With the proliferation of international events at junior and senior level, the work of our National Junior and Senior Selectors has increased very substantially. I thank Mary and her fellow selectors for their extensive efforts.

Mary has also chaired our High Performance Committee. By far the largest portion of TTA's income consists of grants and most of the grant monies are solely for high performance purposes. One of the functions of the High Performance Committee is to determine how the high performance grants should be spent. This is a heavy responsibility and it involves a significant amount of work, particularly given the extensive international programs now undertaken by some of our our elite players. I thank Mary and her fellow committee members for their work.

Following last year's Annual General Meeting, Graeme Ireland took over the chairing of the Officiating Committee from Arthur Wilks. However, Arthur remained on the committee, as Table Tennis Australia Annual Report 2004

did all of the other existing committee members. The respective portfolios of the committee members remained unchanged and the committee continued to function efficiently. I thank Graeme and his fellow committee members for their efforts.

As mentioned above, the Coaching Committee was re-constituted with Karen Pon as chairperson. The committee has been quite active and those activities are discussed in some detail in Karen's report. I thank Karen and her fellow committee members for their work.

The Veterans' Committee has continued to be chaired by Ken Cole. Ken's committee operates with a fair degree of autonomy and the Board of Management is happy for this to occur. Veterans' table tennis has been one of the success stories of Australian table tennis over the last decade or so. If the other age divisions had as many enthusiastic participants, table tennis would be much healthier in Australia. I commend Ken and his fellow committee members for their continued contributions.

In addition to the Australian Athletes With Disabilities Championships, the following national championships were held in 2003:

- in April, the Australian Youth Championships were conducted once again by Table Tennis Victoria in Melbourne;
- (b) in July, the Australian Schools' Championships were conducted by Table Tennis New South Wales in Sydney;
- (c) also in July, the Australian Senior Championships were conducted by Table Tennis Queensland (in collaboration with Wynnum Table Tennis Association) in Brisbane;
- (d) in September-October, the Australian Junior Championships were conducted by Table Tennis New South Wales in Sydney; and
- (e) in October, the Australian Veterans' Championships were conducted by Table Tennis South Australia.

All of the abovementioned Championships were successfully conducted by the respective Associations and I thank those Associations for their efforts.

We have now established an order of rotation of the Australian Junior, Senior and Veterans' Championships around the States and Territories. This rotation should have several advantages. First, the States and Territories now know in which years they are entitled and, more importantly, expected to conduct each of the abovementioned championships and this knowledge enables the States and Territories to begin planning for those championships well in advance. Secondly, the rotation will give each State and Territory an equal chance to promote table tennis in that State or Territory by conducting national championships. Thirdly, the rotation will distribute more evenly, although still not equally, the travel and accommodation costs incurred by States and Territories in participating in national championships. Consideration should now be given to the establishment of a travel cost equalisation scheme. The issues of if and when the Australian Youth Championships should begin being rotated also need to be determined.

The separation of the Australian Schools' Championships from the Australian Junior Championships does not appear to have been successful from the perspective of participation in the former championships and consideration should now be given to linking these two championships again.

In my report to the 2002 Annual General Meeting, I stated inter alia that the regulations pertaining to national championships were among those sets of regulations needing an overhaul. Revising regulations is a time-consuming task and it requires at least a modicum of drafting skills. Time has not permitted a revision of the entirety of our national championship regulations, but various happenings in the lead-up to the 2003 Australian Senior Championships made it imperative that we at least amend those regulations dealing with the requirements to be eligible to participate in individual events and in teams events at the various national championships. It appears that in the past, these regulations have been overlooked, ignored or misconstrued by some players and officials. We have now amended these regulations and the onus will now be on the players and their respective States and Territories, in whose teams the players are being entered, to ensure that the eligibility requirements are satisfied. Of course, the ultimate responsibility of ensuring that the players have satisfied the eligibility requirements rests with the referee of each of the national championships.

Allan Clarke has held the Board portfolio of National Events for the last couple of years. Further aspects of our national championships are discussed in his report. I thank Allan for his work in this area.

On the international front, our national teams participated in various events in 2003, as follows:

- Men's and Women's Teams in the World Individual Championships held in Paris, France, in May 2003;
- (b) Junior Boys' and Junior Girls' Teams in the World Junior Circuit Events held in Wellington, New Zealand, in September 2003; and
- (c) a Junior Girls' Team (our Junior Boys' Team having failed to qualify) in the World Junior Championships in Santiago, Chile, in December 2003.

In addition, half of the members of the Oceania Cadet (under 15) Girls' and Boys' Teams which competed in the World Cadet Challenge in Genting, Malaysia, in October-November 2003, were Australian players and the coaches of those teams were Australians (one of whom was also the manager of the teams).

In December 2003, Jian Fang Lay participated in the Women's World Cup in Hong Kong by virtue of having won the Women's Singles Event at the 2002 Oceania Championships.

More recently, Australian Men's and Women's Teams competed in the World Teams Championships in Doha, Qatar, in March 2004.

The next five months will be a very busy one for our national players, with the Australian and Oceania Olympic Qualifying Tournaments being held in Melbourne in April, the Table Tennis Australia Annual Report 2004

Oceania Championships being held in Whangarei, New Zealand, also in April, World Junior Circuit Events being held in Noumea, New Caledonia, in May, the Commonwealth Championships being held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, in June, and the Olympic Games being held in Athens, Greece, in August.

Whilst on the subject of national representation, we have revised our selection criteria for national representation and our eligibility requirements for national selection. These two concepts are often confused (and some people also confuse eligibility requirements for national selection with eligibility requirements for participation in national championships). The purpose of eligibility requirements for national selection is not to assist our players in formulating their competition schedules for the year, nor is it to assist the National Selectors in selecting national teams or in compiling national rankings or seedings, although those eligibility requirements may in fact provide some assistance with each of those tasks. Eligibility requirements for national selection (at least those portions of the eligibility requirements which relate to participation in competitions) set out those competitions in which a player must participate in order to come within the pool of players from which the national teams will be selected. The purpose or function of eligibility requirements for national selection is to ensure, as far as possible, that the players who are considered for selection in our national teams provide a reasonable degree of support for the game. Selection criteria for national representation set out those factors which the selectors are permitted and required to take into account in selecting players for national representation. The purpose or function of eligibility requirements for any national championship is to define the field from which the champion player or team (and other placegetters) will be determined.

On the day before last year's Annual General Meeting, our then Chief Executive Officer Matty Padley sought a release from her contract, which was due to expire in July 2003, from 4 April 2003. This was a matter which was appropriate to be considered by the newly constituted Board of Management (i.e, the Board as constituted after the 2003 AGM). When that Board subsequently met, it agreed to release Matty from her contract from the requested date. This inevitably meant that the position of Chief Executive Officer would be vacant for a few months while we went through the process of selecting a successor to Matty. During that period, and also for a period after her successor began work, Matty provided valuable administrative assistance. I thank her for that assistance and also for the substantial amount of work which she did prior to her departure.

The field from which we had to choose Matty's successor proved to be a large and surprisingly well qualified one (both in terms of work experience and academic qualifications). After a fairly exhaustive (and exhausting) process of perusing numerous resumes and interviewing some excellent candidates, we chose Martin Shaw who, appropriately, had degrees in law, finance and sports administration, together with an impressive background in sports administration work (as verified by Martin's referees). Given that our Director Finance (whoever he or she might be at any particular time) might reside in another State or Territory from that of our office, the Board regarded it as essential that our new Chief Executive Officer have some financial expertise.

Martin has reached all of our high expectations, perhaps even exceeding some of them, and has proved to be an outstanding success. I congratulate him on the quality and quantity of his work to date.

Finally, I would like to thank the current Board Members for their respective contributions over the last twelve months. This Board has undoubtedly been the best Board with which I have been involved during the period of my presidency. There is a good combination of youth and experience (I know that it is a cliché, but it is an appropriate one in this case) and also a good combination of table tennis knowledge and commercial qualifications and experience. Most importantly, all of the current Board members have the national interest at heart and, perhaps remarkably (at the risk of appearing cynical), there is a complete absence of personal agenda. I have dealt with some of the contributions of Allan Clarke. Mary LeGassick and Karen Pon elsewhere in this report and I need not dwell on them. Allan has been a Board member since the Interim Board assumed the management of Table Tennis Australia in May 2000 and he has been Vice-President for the last 12 months. His contribution has been an extensive and important one and he has provided me with wise counsel when I have needed it (which was more often than I would care to admit). In September 2003, Stella Zhou and Ralph Kober joined the Board, respectively as Director Finance and an appointed Board member. They have both made valuable contributions and, given their relative youth, I hope that they will continue to do so for many years to come.

This is the end of my last term as President. I have mixed feelings of relief and disappointment. I am relieved that no real catastrophes have befallen TTA and that it has not been wound up, as appeared a distinct possibility when I first assumed the presidency in May 2000, but I am disappointed that there is still much to be done. We have repealed many outdated regulations, but there are several more which are in need of revision. I consider that we should have an athletes' commission. However, this will require significant amendments to our constitution and I have not yet had time to draft them. Perhaps in my "retirement", I may have time to draft some suggested amendments to our constitution and some suggested revisions of our regulations.

It was only by accident that I became a member of the Interim Board and then, in the space of about a minute, Chairman of it. Certainly at the time, I was not the best equipped person to be President because I knew very little about table tennis administration at the national level. It is slightly ironic that now, on the point of my departure, I can say (at the risk of immodesty) that I know quite a lot about table tennis administration, and table tennis administrators, at the national level.

A few months ago, a potential presidential candidate asked me what particular joys the presidency had brought me. My mind was racing. I did not know where to start. Should I tell him about the power, the money, the glamour, the women? In the end, I decided to tell him the truth. Needless to say, he did not nominate for President.

I am very conscious that it is an honour and a privilege to be President of TTA, but that does not necessarily mean that it is enjoyable. If you pursue policies and make decisions which you believe to be correct, you will inevitably step on some people's toes and there are so many people with their own agenda. Still, I am neither embittered nor burnt out. I am looking forward to pursuing my legal career and a more regular social life and I hope that I may be able to make some contribution to Australian table tennis in the future.

## CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

2003 has seen a continuation of the recovery of the sport from its perilous state in 2000, and while it is clear that there are still improvements to be made in many areas of the sport, we are now in a position to move forward.

Having come into the position mid year I should record my thanks to Matty Padley for her work as CEO. Matty was a great source of information in my early days, and she had clearly done a mountain of work during her time at TTA. Matty left the Association in a much better state than she found it due mainly to her hard work.

Much of the focus since my arrival has been on providing a stable infrastructure for the sport to develop in the future. A sport such as table tennis, which has few paid staff at either state or national level, must rely on volunteers to help drive the sport. It is a big commitment to make, as all volunteers have their own work, family, and social commitments outside of table tennis, and yet there are many around the country who have put their hand up for the tasks required. We are lucky to now have active committees in coaching, officiating, athletes with disabilities, high performance and, most recently, development, as well as national selection panels that have the unenviable task of selecting teams to represent our country. To all who have agreed to give their time to benefit the sport I thank you.

We are continuing to look for ways that we can provide service to our state associations and clubs. A national insurance scheme is one such area that has been looked into this year and I am pleased to see that it is on the agenda for discussion at today's meeting. I am confident that we can get this up and running in the near future. A national database and the possibility of integrated websites for TTA, and, should they wish to be involved, state associations, and local clubs is another area where we can provide a service to our members.

With the recent establishment of the Development Committee we hope to be able to form better communication with the states to see how we can best help in attracting new members. I don't think there are any easy answers, but I look forward to the input of the state representatives as we tackle the most pressing issue our sport faces.

One of the areas where we can attract new members is in the area of athletes with disabilities. Fortunately we have had Arthur Wilks to drive our AWD program from its inception, with ever increasing results. We have been accepted as members of the Australian Paralympic Committee, and this year held our first Australian AWD Championships, attracting 37 competitors. This is a number that we hope to improve upon for our 2004 AWD Championships, and already indications are that we will do so. We have also spent a great deal of 2003 doing the preparatory work for our Project CONNECT application which, if successful, will open up may doors in this growth area for the future.

Financially the Association is in a strong position. There may be calls from the members to reduce levies due to our current bank balances, but it should be remembered that there are restrictions on some of the funds that we currently have acquired through grants from

the Australian Sports Commission, the Australian Olympic Committee and the Australian Commonwealth Games Association. Our general account, which is used to cover our administration costs, is now at a level that will provide us with the ability to meet unexpected cost rises. While there have been some surpluses generated in recent years in this account, I don't see that continuing in a major way in the future, as administration costs are rising faster that state levies.

2003 was a relatively quiet year for our high performance program, though this could safely be described as the calm before the storm of 2004. The World Championships in Paris saw modest results for the Australian team, but it was a positive experience for many of the members of a young team. There are increasing opportunities for our junior players to gain experience at an international level with the introduction of the World Junior Circuit and the World Junior Championships. Our Junior Girls team qualified for the latter, held in Santiago, Chile, by way of their victory at the 2002 Oceania Championships. With an increasingly crowded calendar of senior and junior international events we will be increasingly faced with difficult questions of which events to support on our limited funds. The addition of M2006 funding in the lead up to the Melbourne Commonwealth Games will help in the short term, but the longer term remains unclear at the moment.

I should record my thanks for the work done by Brian Lauri and the Board members. Brian took on the unenviable task of President at a time when no one else wanted the job and has given much of his time and effort to the job of keeping TTA afloat in what were initially difficult times. All the Board deserve our thanks for their commitment to table tennis.

### TTA OFFICIATING COMMITTEE

The TTAOC met last year in Canberra from  $21^{st}$   $-23^{rd}$  Feb, under the chairmanship of Arthur Wilks. The members were joined by Maureen Sherman (Tas) and invited officials from Australian Sports Commission. At that meeting the Level 3 (National Umpire) course was finalised. This was subsequently submitted to ASC for approval and approved in June. We now have 3 approved umpire courses ranging from Entry level, through State, to National level.

A number of umpires have now undertaken the Level 2 course and are on their way to becoming qualified. Emphasis will be placed on giving Level 3 courses this year.

Generic role descriptions were also completed covering the different functions to be undertaken by committee members. These included awards, selection, technical, umpires and referees, liaison with ASC, and liaison with State representatives. These may be varied from time to time to take into account members' differing interests, skills and preferences.

Due to a variety of circumstances the committee was not as active in the latter part of the year, although we have still done umpire selections for Olympic Games, World Championships, and various other events to which Australia has been invited to send officials. These included Neil Montfort (Vic) and Dave Delpratt (Qld) for the Olympic Games, Mick McShane (Qld) for the China Open (Pro Tour) and World Teams Championships. Maurie Poole (NSW) and Nimo Ramchand (Vic) also attended these Championships. The committee has also been responsible for the selection of the Official of the Year Award, which for 2003 went to Angelo Tabone (Vic).

Australia has 3 approved ITTF Advanced Umpire trainers - Lindsay Drummond (Vic), Phil Males (NSW) and Graeme Ireland (Vic) who were active during 2003 assisting with courses in China (2), Malaysia and Hong Kong. They are also scheduled to do courses in Asia this year. Officials active within the ITTF include Phil Males on the Rules Committee, Ron Keyhoe on the Equipment Committee, and Graeme Ireland on the Technical Committee and special advisor to the Umpires and Referees Committee.

Our first meeting this year will take place on  $4^{th} - 5^{th}$  April at Kilsyth, during the rest day at the Australian Olympic Qualifying Tournament. At this meeting, along with a number of other items, we intend to develop the Level 3 (National Referee) course, which will be the final course to be covered under ASC/NOAS guidelines. Following completion of the course material, budget permitting, it is intended to hold a 2-day training seminar, during a weekend, in Melbourne. National and International Umpires who are interested in becoming National Referees will be invited to attend. We have also received a request to send someone to Darwin to assist with umpire and referee training, and running tournaments and local pennants. This should occur before  $30^{th}$  June.

### NATIONAL COACHING COMMITTEE REPORT

The TTA National Coaching Committee (NCC) was convened in September 2003, with the first meeting on October 21. Sue Stevenson, Mark Smythe and Karen Pon (Chair) were at this meeting, which served as an introduction to the roles and responsibilities of the NCC. Alois Rosario joined the NCC in December.

One of the earliest actions of the NCC was the preparation of a strategic plan outlining the goals and objectives of the NCC, forwarded to all Member Associations. This document provides a direction and framework for the NCC to work within, and outlines the main goals and objectives of the NCC. The three broad areas of priority are: improving club coaching structure, increasing numbers and standard of all levels of coaches, and improving the standards of play in Australia, as measured by the success of our elite players.

The second of these has dominated proceedings over the past six months. Thus far, a list of approved Level One Course Presenters has been prepared, subject to coach availability, and financial assistance has been granted to Member Associations for the purposes of conducting a Level One Sports Specific Course. That most Member Associations are availing themselves of this opportunity is an encouraging sign.

In the planning stages is a Level 2/3 Sports Specific Course to be held this year. Currently we are awaiting the results of grant applications that would assist us to run this course at minimal cost to participants.

The Level One course is currently being reassessed, with the two major factors being the need to incorporate Athletes With Disabilities (AWD) components into the course, and consideration of the recently released ITTF Level One Course. The AWD components will be added with the assistance of Arthur Wilks, chair of the TTA AWD Committee. At this stage the NCC has decided to retain the current TTA Level One Course rather than change to the ITTF model.

Also under review is the traditional coaching accreditation structure of Levels One, Two and Three, although this is still in the early stages.

A Coaching Newsletter is being prepared, and is expected to become a regular feature from the NCC.

The High Performance Committee, which consists of Mary Le Gassick as Chairperson, Alois Rosario and Stella Zhou recommends to the Board the allocations of the funding received from Government bodies, international tournaments that players could benefit from entering, training camps that are required and any player assistance distribution.

### NATIONAL COACH

We were fortunate to obtain the services of Jan Berner from Norway who has been contracted to be the coach at major championships until the Athens Olympic Games.

### AIS CAMP

A successful High Performance Camp with 15 players under the control of Jan Berner was held in June 2003 at the AIS in Canberra. Accommodation and meals were also at the AIS. All players had fitness tests, nutritional and psychology lectures and it is planned to use the AIS again for future camps.

### COMPETITIONS

Australian athletes competed at the World Individual Championships in Paris, the Womens World Cup (where we were represented by Jian Fang Lay) and the Danish, Swedish and Finnish Opens by William Henzell and David Zalcberg.

### JUNIORS

2003 saw the introduction of a World Junior Circuit, with an event being held in Wellington, New Zealand, at which Australia was represented by a girls and boys team. Australia was represented by a Junior Girls team (Claire Campbell-Innes, Mimi Lee, Michelle Hodgson and Michelle Beaumont and coach Pam Clarke) at the World Junior Championships in Chile.

Claire Campbell-Innes and Kyle Davis were selected in the Ocenia Junior talent Squad and attended a training camp in Sweden.

Australia was represented by 2 junior girls and 2 junior boys as part of the Oceania team at the World Cadet Challenge in Malaysia. Karen Pon was chosen as Coach/Manager, while Mark Smythe was appointed as Coach.

### ATHLETES BASED OVERSEAS

An increasing number of athletes are being based overseas, either permanently or for moths at a time. During 2003 this included William Henzell, Trevor Brown, David Zalcberg (all playing in professional leagues) and Kyle Davis, Kamalesh Tharmasuthan, Tammy Gough, Peri and Claire Campbell-Innes (for competition and training).

The challenge we face is how long to bring our overseas athletes back to Australia each year for the main domestic season, without either unfairly prejudicing our domestic based players, or by not allowing the overseas players time enough to take a break between the European season and the time they are required to be back in Australia.

## NATIONAL EVENTS REPORT

The national and international calendars of events for 2003 were quite compact and due to the Olympic Games and Oceania Championships 2004 will be an even busier year.

As Australian players increase participation on the international circuit it is hoped that the experience gained will result in a higher standard being reached and more depth achieved.

With the addition of the world junior circuit as a prelude to the World Junior Championships our younger players are being exposed to an incredibly high standard of play, particularly by countries that have virtually been the benchmark for the sport for decades.

In line with TTA's policies, overseas based Australian players returned home to participate in national championships.

During the year the Regulations for National Championships, which were badly in need of an overhaul, were given some attention by the Board. In particular, the eligibility requirements for national championships in relation to individual and team events were updated.

The Board has published a national championship rotation covering up to and including 2012 in the veteran, senior and junior divisions and it is envisaged that this will assist with the planning of such important events.

This initiative also improves the chances of these tournaments being rotated around the nation, which is both an original and contemporary intention in relation to the conduct of national championships – for many excellent reasons.

During 2003 all Australian Championships appeared to be quite successful. Once again, the Youth Championships were hosted by TTV in conjunction with the annual Easter Classics.

TTNSW had the task of conducting both the Australian Schools and Australian Junior (including Under-18) Championships while the Australian Seniors headed north to Queensland for the first time in a while. The Australian Veterans Championships were played in South Australia.

The Board of TTA hopes that players will continue to support the various national events as they are rotated around the nation as it is considered important for overall development to show case the sport across the country.

## ATHLETES WITH DISABILITIES PROGRAM

- The advantages and benefits of a successful Athletes with Disabilities program donot need enumeration.
- The Board of TTA has acknowledged these advantages with philosophical and financial support over the last two years. We thank the Board for its support and commend its foresight.
- It would be interesting to ponder on why we haven't become involved before!
- In 2002 and early 2003 the then Vice President of TTA included this program in his portfolio. Following his resignation from the Board in March 2003 Arthur Wilks offered to continue with this program as Manager. The Board accepted this offer.
- A governance committee was established with the following as members: Arthur Wilks, manager, Martin Shaw CEO TTA, Stephen Lee IU/IR/IPTTC delegate, Jason Hellwig, Sports Manager APC, Jane Hall EO Australian Athletes with Disabilities, Robyn Smith NED AUSRAPID, Dr Jacinta Baldwin CEO Deaf Sports Australia, Neil Harwood Chair ITTF committee charged with establishing close ITTF/IPTTC relationships, Joy Boyd Wheelchair athlete.
- We have conducted the first TTA AWD championships. It was an outstanding success with 37 athletes competing from 6 of the 8 VMs. Competitors were from all classes 1 -11 plus an event was added for non AUSRAPID intellectually disabled athletes.
- We have published our first AWD Newsletter and arranged for its placement on our website.
- We applied for and have been accepted as a full member of the Australian Paralympic Committee.
- We have trained 6 classifiers to various international levels, two at the highest noninvitational level, and one a wheelchair former athlete.
- We have established 8 regions of players/coach/manager as the basis of our future development (and plan others – many others hopefully).
- Planning is well advanced for the 2004 championships to be held at Homebush on 21/23 May. The "grape vine " suggests that there will be significantly more entries this year- already there are nine..
- We have been joined this year by Deaf Sports Australia and it is expected that up to a dozen or so of their athletes will compete.
- Both AUSRAPID and Deaf Sports Australia use our tournament as their sole selection vehicle for Australian teams.

- All competitors must be members of TTA.
- A level 1 coaching course for 3 deaf athletes is to be run in 3 weeks time.
- In addition to the TTA developments outlined above 4 of the VMs are already well advanced with planning and significant events. The major aim of project CONNECT is to assist all VMs with their planning and events.
- Project CONNECT
- This is a joint Australian Sport Commission/Australian Paralympic Committee initiative. "CONNECT" is certainly easier to get one's mouth around than Creating Opportunities Nationally through Networks in Education, Classification and Training
- In 2003 the project funded 6 sports (large, or high status) and we finished 7<sup>th</sup>. As a
  result we were deemed to be a *Preparatory Sport* with some expectation, but no
  certainty, of success in 2004.
- There is considerable funding for selected sports over a 2 year period in addition to assistance/advice etc.
- Probably the most important concept in CONNECT is "inclusiveness". To date we
  have moved along this path by including all classes of AWDs in the competition, by
  requiring membership of TTA, by revising the philosophy of the new Level 1
  coaching course, by including wheelchair rules in the revised level 2 umpire course.
  Much remains to be done.
- Applications close 16 April with results to be announced on 28 May. I have almost completed our application and believe it to be quite formidable, but the competition is fierce.
- Each VM was asked to provide a short letter of support, and collaboration, to assist the national application. Thank you all for your support.
- If our application is successful I will contact all Presidents seeking their nominations for an implementation committee – the coal face committee. (contact will be after 11 July however when I return from holidays)
- I look forward to a nation wide commitment, collaboration and great success. It's
  pretty exciting isn't it ! We can make this project an exemplar for every sport in
  Australia with everyone behind it, CONNECT or no CONNECT. Are you convinced
  and committed?! Now we wait for 28 May.
- I would be happy to answer any queries, or to elaborate on any of the above if requested.

Also, another thank you to the Bureau for their continued support with out Triennial Grant Program – our Association has been guaranteed further funding for another two years. This is essential for our growth as a "small" sport in the ACT.

### Coaching/Promotion

### Development Officer/Coaching Co-ordinator - Zak Kozakiewicz

A very successful schools program (starting with Canberra Grammar Boys School) was organised and run by our Development Officer/Centre Manager, Zak, with assistance from Glenys Joliffe, Arthur Wilks and Wendy Olsen. Zak has also assisted Arthur Wilks with coaching for disabled students and provided coaching for our association members on request.

### **Diasbled Program Schools**

Arthur (assisted by Zak and Glenys) ran a program for disabled students from Lyneham High School, culminating in a team of students representing their school and the ACT at the first ever Australian Schools Disabled Championships, and also the first ever Australian Disabled Table Tennis Championships.

Congratulations to Arthur on great organising and running of the Australian Championships, which turned out to be a great success. Congratulations to Patrick Horn (from C Grade) who won a silver medal in the Mens Open Standing Singles and a gold medal in Doubles in the Mens open Standing Group. Also, congratulations to Jamie Lee Kelly and Kate Wade from Lyneham High School who won a silver medal in the Womens Class 11 Doubles.

This program will be continued in 2004.

### Other

Mohammed Al Hassan was justifiably very proud of his Under 16 Boys Team, which won a silver medal at the Australian Junior Table Tennis Championships. Thank you to Mohammed for coaching the team in the lead-up to the Championships and for the Teams event. Thank you also to Zak who took over from Mohammed when he had top return to Canberra for family reasons on the last day of the Teams matches.

Dong Dong Zhang and Mohammed Al Hassan have also been involved in general coaching throughout the year and we thank them for their time and commitment.

## TABLE TENNIS SOUTH AUSTRALIA PRESIDENTS REPORT

The Annual General Meeting of 2002 saw a bare minimum of only four directors to conduct the business of Table Tennis in South Australian. This unfortunately highlights the shortage of administrators not only in our sport but in all amateur sports and required an immediate search for personnel to fill some of the vacant Directorships

After the sudden passing of Molly Gleeson in January this year several nominations for Board positions were received and the Board was quickly able to accept the nominations of Maurice Quinn as Finance Director, Sally Potter as Tournament Director, John Potter as Match Director and Geoff Goss as Coaching Director. With these nominations the Board became significantly more able to administer the needs of Table Tennis at State level.

The problems filling the positions on the Board are also being felt at Affiliate level with many Affiliates having difficulty-finding volunteers to assist them in their work. This lack of volunteers has been recognized as a problem for all "minor" sports across Australia and shows the need for participants in any sport to be prepared to help in some way. Without that assistance then the long-term viability of Sporting Associations is severely impacted.

At the completion of my first term as President I look back and see that really not much has changed in Table Tennis in the past 30 years - the problems of yesterday are still there today and still need to be resolved. Finance is still a major problem with the State Association still having to fight for every penny (cent) it needs to provide a minimum service. Our only secure source of income is the player registration and affiliation fees we collect from our Affiliates. Unfortunately it is still a struggle for us to collect these fees due to a reluctance in some areas to contribute to the cost of administering Table Tennis in our State. A finance report is provided at the AGM for your perusal, which shows the income and expenditure of the Association, and any criticisms are invited.

Looking at the many problems facing Table Tennis I felt it was necessary to start with the basics. I cannot see that TTSA can solve the problems of Table Tennis without help from its Affiliates. Advertising, promotion, coaching and development of the sport needs to be done in concert with each of our Affiliates. TTSA does not have the personnel money or, in some cases, the skills that are needed to resolve the problems we all face. There needs to be a consultation process between TTSA and it's members. Special Meetings and workshops that have been held in the past are not well attended by a majority of Affiliates so it is my intention to try to arrange visits to each Affiliate as time permits. Whether that involves one on one meetings with individuals, attendance at committee meetings or an invite to attend AGM'S I intend to visit as many Affiliates as possible next year. These meetings will primarily address the problems facing our sport and seek to gain input and opinions from each Affiliate on the direction and possible courses of action that need to be taken.

This year has been spent reviewing and updating the various policies and regulations of TTSA. These include the Tournament Regulations, State Team Managers, Coaches and Players Guidelines, Match Play Regulations and various Policies that impact on the conduct of Table Tennis at State level. This was necessary to get our house in order to

ensure that in all circumstances TTSA events are conducted with best practice in mind. State Teams for instance should never be allowed to travel away without adequate supervision from a team manager, especially where juniors are involved and our "duty of care" responsibilities must be enforced.

Responsibility for the welfare of players and officials at all events conducted by and on behalf of TTSA has meant that Risk Management has also become a concern. This means that Risk Assessments of all facilities used by TTSA for Tournaments and Match Play will be necessary and hire contracts for the use of facilities will be initiated to acknowledge the rights and responsibilities of each party. It is intended to visit all facilities used by TTSA with a view to assess the suitability of each facility for TTSA use. This is not meant to be a "Big Brother" approach but merely a checking process, which may turn out to be of benefit to those facilities involved. It is important in these days of litigation that TTSA and its Affiliates be aware of their obligations to their players. We all need to be aware that near enough is not good enough and the welfare of our players and officials is of prime concern.

At this point I would to thank the members of the Board for their hard work during the year in their various portfolios – so much is achieved by a small group of volunteers who give of their time in a sometimes thankless task.

I would also like to thank Bev and Brian James and members of the organizing committee for the Australian Veterans Championships held in Adelaide in October for their efforts in conducting a very successful Championship. A special thanks also for all those who assisted with setting up, taking down, umpiring, refereeing and all the other things that need to be down in order for this event to be a success. It turned out to be a job very well done indeed.

I wish you all the very best for the Christmas season and hope you have a wonderful time and return in the new year refreshed and keen to begin a new Table Tennis season and I hope to meet with you all at some time during the new year.

### TASMANIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION INC.

Once again in 2003 our player numbers remained relatively static. Entry levels overall in the open tournaments were maintained at the levels experienced in 2002. It was pleasing to note that the Men's Singles event attracted 24 entries for the Tasmanian Open and 27 for the Tasmanian Closed. I believe that these are the largest fields for some time.

Devonport Table Tennis League and Southern Tasmanian Table Tennis Association both continued their junior coaching programmes this year utilising grant funds from Sport & Recreation Tasmania. These were, as usual, very successful undertakings and these branches are to be congratulated for their initiative.

Tasmania currently has few junior players and none of those who we do have are female. Branches continue to struggle to find people willing to volunteer to be Committee members. The flow on from this is the difficulty in finding people to assist us in recruiting and coaching junior players in numbers that would enable us rebuild our player base and ensure our financial viability in the coming years.

Some of TTTA's branches are currently dissatisfied with the lack of visible benefits of being affiliated with TTA. It is currently difficult for TTTA to mount a case for the continued affiliation with TTA when the TTA/ITTF connection is less relevant to our aging player base. The cost to Tasmania of being affiliated is high in terms of our total revenue base (including that of our branches). The levy system of TTA urgently needs reform. TTA should consider the ramifications on its own finances if the smaller Voting Members withdraw. For example, a National Sporting Organisation which does not have national coverage will find itself disadvantaged when seeking to access Federal Government funding. TTA therefore needs to find a way to raise a reasonable amount of money to fund its operations while keeping affiliation affordable for the smaller Voting Members.

I wish to record my thanks and appreciation to the TTTA Board members for their contributions during 2003. As Chairman I count myself fortunate to have Directors who are highly capable in carrying out the duties under their portfolios. Thank you to Bill Atkinson for his attention to National Affairs, Maureen Sherman for continuing to keep us all up to scratch on technical matters, Doug McLean for his excellent work in keeping our website up to date and getting us media coverage wherever possible, Elaine Wright for attending to the administration portfolio, and finally, Margaret Turner for succeeding in keeping us on the straight and narrow financially.

It is with personal sadness that I record the deaths of Laurie Wharmby and Tas Jones, both Life Members of the TTTA and David Forster former STTTA Committeeman and father of Chris Forster a former Tasmanian champion player. Laurie was also a Life Member of TTA and one of its greatest leaders.

In 2003 Bundaberg held the State Juniors and Townsville held the Seniors and Veterans. Thanks go to these clubs for conducting these championships. It is a commitment all of us appreciate and applaud. I am of the opinion a Statewide roster system should be introduced so all affiliated clubs can participate in the conducting of these events. A way of making this a success would be to have a team of volunteers available to help those inexperienced at conducting State Championships. My aim has always been to unite the clubs by a sharing of resources thus, improving the ability of the smaller clubs to participate.

Wynnum held the National Senior Championships, by all reports it was a success for Queensland. Thanks to all who helped. Without the support of all Queenslanders these events would not be as good. Brisbane Table Tennis Association is conducting the event this year and by all reports will be bigger and better than ever. Queensland is privileged to be holding the event two years in a row. This came about because a roster system of the States commences in 2005 and Queensland were last to receive the event, so TTA decided to ask us if we were interested in conducting it again, we accepted as it brings the best players in Australia into our backyard.

Improving the number of players playing our game at club level is a priority for the board and should be for each and every club. Increasing our membership in each club will bring a more varied local competition, hopefully more volunteers and also more revenue to improve our sport. It is a requirement of the State government that we encourage more participation and lift the standard of play in the State. Our funding relies on meeting these and many more requirements.

Thanks to all the volunteers who give their time freely to Table Tennis in Queensland. As a volunteer myself I understand the sacrifices necessary to run a club, and at times it can be very taxing. But the rewards are always there and can often be seen in some small way by the appreciation of a parent or club member. Keep up the good work; Table Tennis needs each and every one of you.

We conducted training camps for Elite players in Mackay and Wynnum. These were successful and we hope to conduct more this year. Coaching is very important to the development of our juniors and a Statewide strategy should be implemented so as to gain the best results possible,

I have visited clubs in 2003 and have been able to work with many talented volunteers. I will be visiting more clubs this year and hope to meet with and discuss topics of interest relevant to each club's circumstance. My hope is to see the talents of each of us harnessed together so we can see the best results for our efforts.

## WESTERN AUSTRALIA - REPORT ON ACTIVITIES

For the first time for quite a few years all Board of Management positions were filled. The position of Executive Director was left vacant and in it's place an Administratition Manager (Bob Lake) and a Development Officer (Frank Kenny) were appointed. Those who continued in their 2002 positions were Brian Lauri (President), Dave Cooper (Match Director & Tournament Director), Irwin Parker (Finance Director), Charles Crock (Coaching Director) and Tasman Gilbert (Publicity & Promotions Director). Penelope Whitby took on Social & Fund Raising portfolio and embarked upon a number of very successful activities. In recognition of his efforts over 40 years Dave Cooper was awarded Life Membership of the Association.

Overall membership remained stagnant, a slight decrease in Perth membership being offset by an increase in country membership. A result of this was a record entry in the State Championships, which includes country teams and individual events. Albany hosted a very successful country tournament and hopefully, this year, Esperance will build on this when it hosts this year's country event.

The upgrade of the Association centre continued this year with the revamp of the foyer by Frank Kenny and the work in the garden, including the installation of reticulation. Coupled with the redevelopment of the property next door and the installation of underground power the centre is externally now aesthetically more appealing. Another pleasing development was the rebirth of the Association newsletter "11 UP" under the editorship of John Mathewson. The newsletter was issued regularly and was of excellent quality.

As usual the Association offered pennant competitions for Summer, Winter, Spring and Veterans. Teams numbers remained fairly stagnant. It seems that the desire to compete in these competitions is declining over the years possibly due to the aging of the player population. All competitions ran smoothly in part due the introduction of a duty referee system.

The Association Junior Development program, sponsored by Healthway with assistance from the Department of Sport & Recreation, continued on from previous years. Frank Kenny undertook the administration of this and all activities were completed successfully. In addition he organised a community TV segment and a two-week shopping centre expo, which included exhibitions, coaching, and competitions.

As usual Western Australia was well represented at National Junior and Veteran Championships. However we only fielded a women's team at the senior championship. After their success in 2002 it was disappointing that the leading male players were unavailable to form a team in 2003.

The Association incurred a \$1353 loss mainly the result of additional expenditure incurred on insurance and on Healthway sponsored projects. Increased centre profit helped contain the loss, as did financial support received from Table Tennis Australia. Increased expenditure on pennants, being payments to umpires and referees, was offset by an officiating grant received from the Department of Sport and Recreation. Overall the Association's financial situation is healthy but a continual monitoring of the situation is necessary. It is important that expenditure is kept to budget and income at least maintained. Financial resources will need to be applied toward the staging of the 2004 National Junior Championships in Perth, as overall expenditure is expected to exceed income.
