REPORTS

PRESIDENT

In 1998 I believe we have taken a major step forward for table tennis in Australia. This is the result of the review of our governance and structure and is the beginning of the changes necessary to ensure that our sport survives and thrives post the Sydney Olympic Games and into the 21st century.

I applaud the way the States entered into the process with an open mind and can well understand the reservations that were experienced during the review. We have achieved a very good result but it is my belief that we must continue to search for better ways of performing our roles. I urge everyone to continue the positive effort to make sure that we have the best possible structure and processes in place, avoiding looking at the personalities involved but to getting these aspects right. We must ensure we are all held accountable for our various roles and actions. We will not succeed without trust at all levels and a constant striving to meet agreed goals. If the system is operating correctly and the necessary routines are handled with the minimum of effort we can then focus on the vital tasks of creating an energetic culture, raising the image of the sport, attracting players, providing attractive competition and other such activities. We will then be in a position to compete with other sports rather than wasting our time competing amongst ourselves. By working together and making sure that the best people are deciding policies, we will succeed.

I think that our national championships were conducted in an improved manner this year and I thank all those associations who were involved. The quantity of competitors reflected an increased interest. This championship, combined with local associations and regional events are vital ingredients in the necessary cultural change that will occur.

Undoubtedly the major success for the year was the Sportscover Australian Open which attracted some 100 overseas competitors, most of which were highly world ranked players. In a highly competitive financial climate the event returned a small surplus and was well attended. I wish to record my thanks to our sponsors. In addition to Sportscover, our naming rights sponsor, we were assisted by the Australian Sports Commission, Yasaka, AIA Insurance and many others. Without the strong support of our sponsors this event would not occur.

Once again we have been largely dependant on the Australian Sports Commission for our funding and we are grateful for this. It is vital that we work very hard and consistently to gain financial independence particularly whilst the Sports Commission is coming to terms with their future role. I know that we will continue to receive support from them but it is looking more likely that this will be at a diminished level. We need more money, not less to develop table tennis and this is the concern of all of us. We are responsible for our future.

Again, I thank the Board, States and staff for their efforts in 1998. I place on record my particular thanks to the members of the Task Force that worked on the structure, including Julie Sarll of Strategic Sports and Recreation for their work. The staff have been placed under pressure as a result of concerns from our members regarding the future and I am proud of the way they have coped and have got on with doing the job.

NATIONAL EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

1998 has been a momentous year for Table Tennis in Australia. It has been a very challenging one with three major initiatives occupying the major part of the year.

The Australian Open Table Tennis Championships truly came of age as an international event. With an entry that exceeded one hundred and forty players (one hundred from overseas), a reigning world champion and five former world champions, prize money in excess of 80,000 Australian dollars and a stadium near to capacity each day it was just reward for the many people who worked to make it a success. Television coverage was world wide with a minimum 250 million viewers. SBS covered the event nationally. Sponsorship was up considerably on 1997 and although not to the level desired has laid a very good base for 1999.

As the flagship of Table Tennis Australia, the Australian Open is now developing as a key world Table Tennis event.

Negotiations with the venue for 1999 are complete and the event will once again be held in Melbourne during August. In addition the 1999 ITTF Pro Tour Finals will be conducted as a test event in January 2000 in the Olympic Venue at Homebush in Sydney. With US\$230,000 in prize money and sixteen of the best men and sixteen of the best women players in the world in attendance this will be an exciting prelude to the Olympic Games. The ITTF Pro Tour Finals will be a test event for the Olympics and will be conducted with considerable help from SOCOG.

Registration numbers have remained relatively stable again this year. However a table produced at the end of this report shows an alarming trend in people not reregistering. Does this mean that as fast as we entice people to the sport they are just as quickly leaving it? In the three years the ACoRD system has been in operation we have accumulated 18,000 + people on the data base of registered members but approximately 11,000 have not reregistered in that time leaving a net 7,000+. Is this because the names are not being passed on to TTA or is it that people are being turned off the sport because of unattractive programs? Further research of the database will hopefully come up with the answer.

A major initiative created in 1998 was the Smash Hit Program. Piloted in Newcastle with the help of TTNSW it is to be hoped that this will be the program to encourage primary school age children to play the sport and fill a large gap in the Table Tennis program.

The pilot program has been a successful one and the need is now there to translate this to the rest of Australia.

Clubs and Associations are invited to be part of this exciting initiative which has membership and financial benefits for all Table Tennis. Table Tennis is now placed to take on the many other sports who have modified junior programs running.

As the Australian Sports Commission funding is reduced the Smash Hit Program is one that can fill the gap financially.

One of the larger initiatives undertaken for the year came to fruition in November with the Strategic Task Force tabling its Report and recommendations at a Special General Meeting. After eighteen months hard work the Report was accepted and following amendments the recommendations were passed to be incorporated into a new Constitution for presentation at a Special General Meeting scheduled for February 1999. If the new constitution is accepted then it will come into force at the 1999 Annual General Meeting scheduled the following day. It would be fair to say that the process was a difficult one but at the end of the day a worthwhile exercise which should allow the sport to appoint a Board which can make decisions to take the sport forward, comfortable in the knowledge they now have the power constitutionally to do so.

The Australian Sports Commission supported the process both morally and financially and this support was very much appreciated.

One of the challenges that faces Table Tennis Australia in 1999 and beyond is to raise the profile of the sport. In all efforts to raise sponsorship, even for a major event such as the Australian Open the message has been clear. "We would like to help you but the profile of your sport is too low." Table Tennis needs a group of players who are competitive with the world's best. The Board in conjunction with the Australian Sports Commission have undertaken a review of the Elite Program. This review will be complete by the AGM and will be reported on in a seminar then.

As funding has been cut on a regular basis over the past three years the Elite Program has been curtailed in its efforts to raise the standard of Australia's elite players. It is an issue that is now urgent.

The changes in technology in today's world have been dramatic. Table Tennis Australia now has a Home Page that in 1999 will become of vital importance as a communication tool. The publication of the magazine will occur on the Internet along with other vital information. The Board is addressing the Internet as a vital issue

TTA must communicate this way. Ideally each State should have an email facility for the distribution of printed material. Along with the major Championships, technology and its development are one of the major challenges for Table Tennis in 1999.

Significant challenges lie ahead for Table Tennis in this country. It will only be a coordinated effort on the part of everyone involved in the sport which will make it prosper. The challenges that face all sport in the present are very different to the ones that sport faced ten years ago. We cannot look back and say it was better then because our society has changed and we cannot revisit those times. If Table Tennis is positive to change and uses it for the good of the sport then it will prosper.

In conclusion I would like to record my personal thanks to the Board of Management and Staff of Table Tennis Australia for their support of myself in what has been a difficult but gratifying year. There were times when that support was very much appreciated.

NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

1. NATIONAL COACHING ACCREDITATION SCHEME (NCAS)

During 1997/98 all sports were required to re-submit Coaching Courses for approval to the Australian Coaching Council (ACC). An extensive evaluation is then conducted to ensure the Courses meet the educational standards set by the ACC.

In the case of table tennis, Courses were last written in 1982, thus requiring total re-writing. New resources were also produced for the courses including:

- TOPS Table Tennis in Schools Program Manual
- Table Tennis Australia NCAS Level 1 Manual

A massive inservicing of State Coaching Directors and Level 2 and 3 Coaches across all states was then required to ensure uniformity of course presentation, as the old courses could no longer be taught.

Twenty Coaches across Australia are now eligible to present the new Level 0 and 1 Courses. Level 2 and 3 will be presented by a combination of National Coach, National Coaching Director and other Sports Science Specialists.

2. STATE VISITS – NATIONAL COACH/NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

As in previous years, Table Tennis Australia has State visits by the National Coach/National Coaching Director, with all states receiving at least one visit.

The aims of the visits are to provide Coaching Courses/Seminars/Education as well as State based Junior Camps. During 1998, a larger number of visits took place, due to the need to inservice coaches in the presentation of the new NCAS Courses.

Visits included:

 - New South Wales – July
- National Coaching Director
 - South Australia – January
 - Western Australia – January
 - Queensland – March
 - Australian Capital Territory – May
 - Northern Territory – July

3. TOPS – TABLE TENNIS IN SCHOOLS PROGRAM

A total package for Coaches and School Teachers which includes a modified table tennis program using smaller tables and bigger balls was completed in 1998.

The Manual includes:

- Lesson Plans for 5-8 year olds
- Lesson Plans for 9-16 year olds
- Basic Stroke Cards
- Activity Cards
- Skills Circuits
- Competition Formats
- Skills Awards Scheme

- Rules

The initial printing and formatting costs of \$8,000 was budgeted to be returned in the first two years. With the great success of the program, and sales of over 200 copies, together with other new Coaching Resources, the \$8,000 mark was passed in September of the first year.

Table Tennis Australia is also negotiating with the International Table Tennis Federation for the distribution of TOPS worldwide.

4. NATIONAL JUNIOR CAMPS

Two National Junior Camps were held in 1998 as follows:

Camps are aimed at linking in with existing tournaments to both boost the standard of the tournament and provide competition for the juniors with minimal additional financial outlay.

5. SCHOLARSHIP COACH

Table Tennis Australia appointed Stephen Dainton of Albury as the 1998 Scholarship Coach. The Scholarship Coach position is provided by the Australian Coaching Council for a young coach to serve an apprenticeship under the National Coach. Coaches must also complete the Graduate Diploma of Sports Coaching.

Stephen has proven to be young man with a passion for table tennis, and has made excellent progress under the tutelage of Jerzy Grycan.

Stephen has been re-appointed for 1999.

Table Tennis Australia has been extremely fortunate in having a Scholarship Coach for the last five years, as many sports apply for limited positions.

6. NORTH EAST VICTORIA JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT SQUAD

A model for a self funding regional training squad was trialled in Albury/Yarrawonga.

The basis of the program was that a Level 3 Coach, would hold five weekend training camps over a five month period, with a Level 1 Coaching Course held early in the program. This would enable local coaches to work with the Level 3 Coach and develop the skills to continue the training between visits and take over at the completion of the five months.

The cost of the Level 3 Coach was shared across the 20 participants, and training diaries were supplied to all participants.

Stephen Dainton provided the majority of the coaching and organisational aspects of the squad.

7. COACHING NEWSLETTER

The Coaching Newsletter together with the NCAS Accredited Coach list continues to be produced quarterly and sent to all accredited coaches, states, clubs and associations.

NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR

1998 Australian Schools Championship & Challenge Cup

The 1998 Australia Schools Table Tennis Championship and Challenge Cup was held at the Geelong West Table Tennis Stadium. The support we received from the Geelong Association was great. A special thanks to Lindsay Drummond (Referee), Mervyn Crowley, Sharyn Doolan, Mandy Parkinson and Jim Montgomery.

As a summary, this year we had a record number of entries, 143 compared to an estimated 120 last year. This year we saw an improvement in the representation from Victoria. There were 79 participants from Victoria compared to last years 21.

Packages were established for competitors. This included accommodation, meals and transport. All competitors received a competition bag that included participation certificates, ordered shirts, chocolate bar and competition program. There was an opening ceremony and special function after the tournament. This function was at Splash Down (Indoor pool, waterslide and BBQ).

This year we introduced 2 person teams to make it easier for schools to get teams together. We also introduced a TOP'S Table Tennis category. TOP'S is Table Tennis using the smaller table and larger ball.

General comments after the tournament were that everyone had a great time and are looking forward to next year's Championships. Overall a successful tournament.

Smash Hit

Smash Hit Table Tennis is a new program developed by Table Tennis Australia. The program is targeted at children aged 8-12 years old. The aim of the program is to have children having so much FUN they do not realise that they are developing their skills. Smash Hit looks at the child's personal achievement rather than winning or losing. This is established through their Personal Achievement Book.

Newcastle has seen the very first Smash Hit program. This was the pilot scheme starting 21st October and finished on the 23rd December. In total there were 35 children participating and all feedback has been positive. The aim is to have these children learning the rules and skills of Table Tennis. Once they show a desire to progress further they are linked into their local Table Tennis Club.

At the start of the program the children paid a \$25 registration fee. For this they received a racket, achievement book, ball and badge. Overall the children have enjoyed themselves and express a keen interest in returning for future Smash Hit programs.

Active Australia

Active Australia is about making Australians as active in sport and recreation as possible. There are 2 main focus areas – encouraging people to be more physically active and working to improve the places where people can be active.

To achieve Active Australia status organisations have to report and plan on their organisation. TTA has completed a required checklist and is waiting on approval. Once approval is given TTA will be focusing on Associations and then Clubs to undergo the same process. TTACT has already started this process.

An extra option that will be offered to Clubs and Associations is the "Dual Logo" status. This means that TTA can change the Active Australia criteria to suit Table Tennis. Once the Club or Association completes these criteria satisfactorily then they have permission to use the Active Australia Logo and the Table Tennis Australia Logo (achieving dual logo status).

Official of the Year

Graeme Ireland has been named the "1998 Table Tennis Official of the Year". This award is chosen via the Table Tennis selection committee for the National Officiating Program (NOP).

Graeme's achievements include: Referee at the Asian Veterans Championships, Deputy Referee for the World Veterans Championships, China Open Championships and Australian Open Championships. Graeme also officiates at National and State Championships as well as being Vice President of the Victorian Umpires League. Congratulations to Graeme.

Volunteer of the Year

The winner of the 1998 Volunteer of the Year is David Beaumont from Gulgong in NSW. David is a valuable and successful volunteer in coaching, administration and development of Table Tennis in NSW. A number of David's achievements include running and coaching the local Gulgong Table Tennis Club of 40 junior players, running of the NSW Country Championships, has stepped in as acting president of NSW, is a member of the National Development Committee, is a member of the NSW Development Committee, is a State selector of NSW Veterans Table Tennis and is involved in the sub committee for securing a home for Table Tennis in NSW (Homebush).

Other commitments include David's own personal training and playing at tournaments such as the Australian Veterans where he won Gold. All of these commitments involve a great deal of time and travel (Gulgong is 4-5 hours from Sydney). There is no doubt that David Beaumont is a worthy recipient of this award.

Intellectually Disabled Australian Championships

1998 has been the first year in which we have had an Australian Table Tennis Championship for people who are intellectually disabled. This tournament was held in conjunction with the Victorian Closed Championships at the Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre.

The Championships were successful so we have taken a big step towards Table Tennis for people who are disabled. All the competitors enjoyed their experience and are coming back for next year's Championship.

State Umpires Course

With the Paralympics being held in Sydney 2000 there is a need to further develop our umpire's skills. Therefore the State Umpires Course has been re-written for accreditation into the National Officiating Program (NOP). TTA are waiting on approval of the course and then it will be taken to all States to run courses for umpires. Once this structure is completed and working successfully the National Umpires Course will be re-written for accreditation into the NOP.

National Development Committee

The National Development Committee consists of representatives from all States and the ACT. This group has regular tele-conferences (approximately 1 every 3 months). At each of these tele-conferences various development issues are raised and discussed. There has been much development come out of this group, for example, the development video, Table Tennis poster and Active Australia Wide Day of Table Tennis (March 1999).

We look forward to this group working together for the development of Table Tennis in Australia. For this to occur it will be next year's task to make this a working group rather than an advisory group.

National Development Directors Conference

This conference was held in Canberra on the 26th – 28th October. All Development Directors from National Sporting Organisations were invited along with other personnel interested in the Development of Sport.

This conference consisted of seminars, workshops and guest speakers. Topics discussed were development for people who are disabled, marketing, promotion, information technology, indigenous sport and others.

One of the most valuable aspects of this conference was meeting other Development Directors and discussing development in their sport and exchanging of ideas.

Other Conferences

Other conferences that I attended through-out the year were Harassment-Free Sport, Sports Net and Active Australia organised by the Australian Sports Commission, Risk Management organised by the ASSA, The Volunteer Involvement Program Presenters Course and Strategic Planning organised by Sport and Recreation Victoria. All courses have been valuable in providing myself with new ideas and training.

Director of Membership/Development

Arthur Wilks, Director of Membership/Development has been a valuable asset to Table Tennis Australia. His support to my role and responsibilities has been fantastic. With constant communication via phone and faxes we have developed many new ideas and programs, for example, the Active Australia Day of Table Tennis, Development Committee and the Development Plan.

I thank Arthur for his valuable support; ideas, achievements and I look forward to working with him next year.

Other Developments

There are many other developments that are still in the planning stages but are yet to come in 1999. These are: Table Tennis Commercial and Development Video, Table Tennis merchandise, Active Australia Day of Table Tennis, Table Tennis Poster and International Table Tennis Championships for people who are disabled.

ACoRD Registration System

Up to the time of writing this report, following is a breakup of the numbers for 1998. As the final update is now due there still may be a few outstanding and these will be advised to the board early next year.

It is a pleasure to advise that all states are now operating the ACoRD system and we finally have some reasonable figures to work with. A couple of states still have some fine tuning to do so that in 1999 we should have a fully uniform system with all states inputting information into the same areas where it is required. The NED will advise those states who need to amend their systems and the only difference should then be registration types which states have autonomy over themselves.

OFFICIATING COMMITTEE

The Officiating Committee was active during the year and organised the selection of Referees for all major TTA events including the Australian Open/Pro Tour. Also we received invitations from many overseas countries for Deputy Referees and Umpires which we were able to fill each time.

My thanks to Secretary Fran Keyhoe for all her work associated with the committee especially in co-ordinating the selection process for Referees and Umpires.

The Committee will be undergoing a review in the new year with the view to expanding its powers and duties. Over the last few years the Committee has been hampered by the restrictive regulations that governed its operations. Current and previous members of the Executive and also other members of the committee have over the years gone outside the system to assist the Board with the officiating process. This has been appreciated by the Board, and in the majority of cases approved all appointments that the committee put up. Under the new constitution, that we hope will be approved next year, and following the review, the Officiating Committee should have a greater role in the co-ordination and control of Referees and Umpires.

OFFICIAL OF THE YEAR

This is a new award set up under the National Officiating Program for all sports. Fran Keyhoe received the award in 1997 and Graeme Ireland was the recipient this year.

AUSTRALIAN OPEN/ITTF PRO TOUR

This event was held in August 1998 and will be covered no doubt in other reports.

Due to circumstances beyond our control we were unable to invite and assist umpires from overseas which is a requirement for ITTF events. We were lucky however that two overseas umpires made the trip at their own expense to officiate at this event. Terry Canup from the USA and Michael McAvinue from New Zealand made the effort and we appreciate their commitment.

Many Australian International and National Umpires also supported the event and it was gratifying to note that all went smoothly with no major problems on the officiating side.

As the Rules Officer I was able during the year to update all TTA Championship Regulations. This had not been done since 1995 and championships were being conducted under outdated regulations. A copy of all the Championship Regulations was sent to states for their records. Also I am in the process of reviewing the Sundry Regulations for Committees and the General Regulations. When completed these will be issued to all states to complete the set.

ITTF REGULATIONS

Some changes were made to ITTF Regulations at the Council Meeting in Durban South Africa earlier this year. The changes were not significant but are available if you would like to see them. Please note that they are not Rule changes as this cannot be done until the ITTF BGM next year.

International Competition

Australian athletes have participated in the Italian Open, Swedish Open and Finnish Open. The most significant result has been achieved by Russell Lavale who defeated:

2. P. Atikovic (CRO) World Ranking 177
3. Junior Champion of Japan

Shirley Zhou during the Finnish Open managed to get into the semi final of the tournament defeating Melnik from Russia, world ranking 57.

Miao Miao has won two national Polish tournaments defeating a number of players from the world ranking list and Chinese players playing in the Polish National League.

Simon Gerada has been performing very well in Sweden defeating a number of players with much higher World Rankings than Simon.

However Simon and Miao's results do not score them points towards the World Ranking because they are domestic competitions not sanctioned by the ITTF.

Australian Olympic Program athletes have also the privilege to train at Insept with the men's and women's French National Team. We have spent twenty days training with players of the calibre of Jean Paul Gatién, Kim Taek Soo, Christopher Legout, Paul Chila and top French Juniors. Insept is one of the best centralised Olympic preparation facilities in the world.

Olympic Qualifying for Sydney 2000

Automatic Nomination for Sydney 2000 Olympics

The highest ranked male and female players on the World Ranking list published after the 1999 World Championships will be nominated to represent Australia in the Sydney 2000 Olympics by Table Tennis Australia.

SPECIAL EVENTS & MARKETING

Having only been in the position of Marketing Director for a very short period it is somewhat difficult to assess all the needs of this area at once. However I have been able to establish certain preliminary objectives which were put to the delegates meeting in October and which are as follows :-

OBJECTIVES

1. to increase the current membership of TTA by one third (33%) in the year 1999 and to be able to continue on at this rate in the subsequent two years;
2. to secure financial stability for TTA through sponsorship and participation;
3. To raise the profile of table tennis as a sport within the Australian community and to change the public perception of the sport.

Whilst these preliminary objectives give us a good basis to move on into 1999 I feel that this report would be incomplete without reflecting on some of the issues that have come to my attention over the last few months. In my capacity as a member of the Australian Open Organising Committee I have been charged with the responsibility to raise sponsorship for the event. This has meant that I have been involved in raising sponsorship and I have been involved in numerous discussions with potential sponsors. All of this has provided an interesting insight into how the greater Australian public views table tennis both as a sport and as an organisation. These views are variously both positive and negative but from a marketing standpoint it is the negative ones that are most concerning. Foremost amongst these is the lack of membership in many states. On a proportional basis to available population there are wide discrepancies between states i.e. Victoria has approximately 1000 members per million of available population whereas Western Australia has approximately 100 members per million of available population. What is it that Victoria is doing right that Western Australia is doing wrong? Is it the administration, the resources or the personnel. All of these questions and many more have to be answered and resolved if we wish to attract meaningful sponsors for the future of the sport.

The difficulties experienced at present in attracting both participants and sponsorship to the sport will only be overcome if we can go forward together with a single focus whilst avoiding the minor sport pitfalls of politics, kingdom building, and introspection.

I look forward with some excitement to the changes and challenges ahead in the coming year.

DIRECTOR MEMBERSHIP/ DEVELOPMENT

I was selected for the above position early in 1998 on a casual vacancy basis. Soon after, Sallee Caldwell was appointed to the National Development Director's (NDD) position.

These positions are very closely connected. The two reports should therefore be read in conjunction. Also relevant is the short occupancy period for both incumbents.

The Australian Sports Commission, for accountability and funding purposes, requires an annual report from the NDD and a development plan for the next three years. These reports refer also to elements from the coaching portfolio in addition to developments in officiating. The area therefore is quite broad.

Highlights from 1998 include developments in Table Tennis for athletes with disabilities, the work of the Development Advisory Committee now the Development Committee, completion of TTA's application for Active Australia Provider status, completion of the new State Umpire's Course, the success of the Australian Schools Tournament and the successful launching of Smash Hit in Newcastle. I will comment further on two of these developments.

Active Australia Provider status is essentially a check list on the Health of an organisation. Working through the list allows a club/association to assess its current situation and therefore to highlight areas for attention in the future. (if any)

Increasingly, funding bodies are looking more favourably on organisations that are improving their efficiency using this simple approach. There is no better method of preparing your club/association for the future.

The Development Advisory Committee was established for two main reasons:

- (a) to provide a forum where representatives from affiliates could converse on table tennis matters in a cooperative and frictionless manner.
- (b) To provide a forum where ideas could be swapped and developed in the interests of Table Tennis in Australia.

The Development Committee which has replaced the above, has an additional aim of implementation. Members will, I am sure, extract relevant ideas from the list generated by the committee and implement them in their areas.

Perhaps (a) is the most important of the three. Clearly there is a need for more cooperation, less friction, and a genuine desire by everyone to work towards our shared goals without rancour. I remain confident.

The committee has planned an Active Australia Wide Day of Table Tennis to be held in March. The goal is for every facility in Australia to run an Open Day together in a show of solidarity and faith in our future. This event will certainly be a litmus test of the effectiveness of the committee, and other aspects as well of course.

Thank you to all those who have extended courtesies, support and assistance to Sallee and Arthur in 1998, and very best wishes for 1999.

DIRECTOR COMMUNICATION & STRATEGIC PLANNING

INTRODUCTION

The strategic planning process of Table Tennis Australia during the past 18 months has focussed on making recommendations that concern:

- The structure and governance of T.T.A.
- The development and implementation of national plans and policies; and
- Membership categories

This plan will be on the agenda of the Special General Meeting for its adoption on 27 February 1999. A summary of progress and the issues to be developed follow.

STRUCTURE AND GOVERNANCE

This special and general meeting will also be provided with the adoption of constitutional amendments that will provide the structure and empower the organisation to implement the plan.

PLANS AND POLICIES

The incoming board will further develop National Policies through workshops and develop a management plan to co-ordinate and implement them.

A brief workshop conducted in December provided the most recent opportunity for the Board to focus on the development of a Management Plan for T.T.A. and this will need to be finalised before mid 1999.

A Membership Development sub-committee has been formed and this has already recommended membership categories that will be included in the amended constitution.

A Marketing Development sub-committee has been initiated and the Marketing Director at last report was seeking further representation.

POLICY IMPLEMENTATION

Policies in areas of development and finance are proposed as high priorities for the incoming Board to address. Recommendations on program development, sponsorship and user pays have been reported to T.T.A.

T.T.A. will need to negotiate contracts with states and territories regarding the implementation of its Policies.

TABLE TENNIS PROFILE

A document titled "Table Tennis Profile" is required to be developed. This will list current policies and describe the position of Table Tennis in its market place.

Each item in the profile will be examined to determine whether a service, activity or program requires attention either within the short or long term.

The profile needs to be appraised annually to determine whether the issues documented are accurate or current.

The finalised profile will form part of T.T.A.'s Management Manual together with the Management Plan.

MANAGEMENT PLAN

A Management Plan will be introduced after it has been accepted by the Board and circulated to the States for comment.

The plan will analyse T.T.A.'s objectives, co-ordinate implementation and prioritisation and report on achievements.

A document which is a collection of all policy decisions and procedures resolved by T.T.A. is to be developed and kept current by the National Executive. This document shall be able to trace the meeting agenda and decision references. This document will be reviewed annually to enable the Board to keep policy current to objectives.

DECISIONS DOCUMENT

A further document in which all the decisions of the Board are provided in categories is also required. This document will provide evidence of all decisions made by the Board and be indexed for ease of research.

TRAINING PLAN

A Training Plan for both staff and Board members is required, reviewable annually. This should cover the induction of staff and new Board members and assist in the development of necessary skills.

PERFORMANCE REVIEWS

The Management Plan implementation will be the major tool for assessment of the performance of Board members and the National Executive Director (NED).

A performance review document will be drafted by the NED for all staff employed under contract conditions by the Board and this document will be signed by all parties. This document will include Management Plan items and any other measurable performance index that is mutually acceptable as indicated in the appendix to the Strategic Plan.

STAFF ASSESSMENT

The current annual staff assessment process should continue and position descriptions should continue to be updated annually.

DELEGATIONS OF AUTHORITY

The NED shall have full delegation in accordance with the Limitations Policy adopted as part of the Strategic Plan.

The NED shall have all delegations to other staff approved by the Board.

CONCLUSION

The Strategic Plan proposed for Table Tennis Australia's adoption is a credit to all who have participated in its development. The co-members of the task force facilitated by Julie Sarll for Strategic Sports and Recreation Pty Limited are all congratulated for their professional and well informed inputs. Member States and Territories have embraced the proposals and been vigorous in debate and discussion on important issues.

All members of Table Tennis Australia should now feel complete like ownership of the plan and be committed to its implementation.

QUEENSLAND

Queensland experienced a busy and successful year on the tournament scene in 1998 and is looking towards an extremely busy 1999. Membership continued to fluctuate slightly, but maintained a similar level to that of recent years. Table Tennis Queensland also managed to entice a couple of clubs to affiliate as part of the club expansion program. Some strong work in this area is continuing in discussions with a number of new contacts. The test will be in our ability to maintain their affiliation over the coming years.

During late May, Table Tennis Queensland conducted its inaugural Top Ten Tournament and All-Star Weekend. Much thanks must go to Martin Rogers for his efforts in organising an event which was described as "the best event in 25 years". The round-robin format matched Queensland's top ten male and female players in an exhausting weekend of top grade table tennis.

Table Tennis Queensland also organised the Queensland Open and Closed Senior Championships in 1998 for the first time in many years. Numbers for the Queensland Open Championships were helped by the fact that a National Junior Camp was conducted during the week leading up to the event and its inclusion as part of the TTA Grand Prix. National Coach, Jerzy Grycan, described the event as the best State Open of the year in his presentation speech.

The tournament season made a very busy year for most players. Also some associations found it difficult to organise their championship and consequently cancelled their events. 1999 will see a lengthening of the tournament calendar which will hopefully result in greater player patronage.

The March AGM saw a number of new faces joining the Board of Management of TTQ. Many thanks for the contributions of the previous Board of Management which included Dennis Fox, Wayne Reid, Gordon Zahn, Gerard Watts and Roger Hopper. Dennis Fox was also elected as a life member of TTQ at the AGM.

The employment of Mr Engelbert Hugging continued during this year. He worked tirelessly in a difficult position given the distances we experience in Queensland. It is enormously difficult for him to have a substantial impact on players in north Queensland, some of which he would need to drive for 20 hours to reach. However, improved communication networks and trips to regional Queensland are proving of benefit to those areas.

The Queensland Government through the Department of Tourism, Sport and Racing continue to be big supporters of Table Tennis. Their support, both administrative and financial, continue to help TTQ to develop the sport in Queensland. The Queensland Government has granted a minor increase for 1999, and we are already working hard to reap the rewards of that extra contribution.

Queensland representatives continue to perform particularly well. Every Queensland player at the Australian Junior Championships returned home with a medal. It is not often that 17 players go away and all return successful. Both Under 14 teams managed to win Australian Championships. All other teams performed well at the Australian Junior, Australian Youth, Australian Senior and Under 18 and Australian Veteran Championships.

Finally, I would like to thank all the players, Associations, Board of Management and Executive members which continue to support Table Tennis Queensland in many ways.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA

After the Annual General Meeting in November, there were still some vacancies on the Board of Management but the President was confident that these positions would be filled as some people had shown an interest.

I believe that South Australia has been the leading State this year with many appointments and great performances from players.

1. In December Table Tennis Australia advised us that Li Wang Li was appointed as Coach of the Year.
2. Some of the National Youth Camps have been held at the Fort Largs Police Academy and the Southern Association was invited to be host for the Australian Closed Championships.
3. TTA has agreed that South Australia can host the Australian Junior Championships in 1999 and we were negotiating the change of date from September to July school holidays.
We were hoping that TTA would welcome our suggestion of the July date that would take the pressure off the players, by spreading out the season and the tournaments. It is a lot to expect our top juniors to have weeks off at a time for Championships within a month, while trying to study for exams.
4. Adelaide has been chosen to host the Australian Masters Games, with the date 25/9 to 3/10/99. A date selected with our sporting body having no control over. This date is the week chosen by TTA for the Aust. Junior Championships and another reason for the request for the date change.
5. In the year 2005, the World Police Games will be held in Adelaide with table tennis included.
6. Our State Teams played well producing a gold medal in the U/16 girls' team and silver and bronze in several of the other team events.
Alex Swanson won a gold medal in the U/16 boy's singles.
However our most success came from our veterans with gold in the women's O/40, O/50 & O/60 teams and individual gold for Kay Crowell in the O/40 singles, and Betty Bird in both the O/50 and O/60 singles. A host of medals were also brought home in other events as well.
Congratulations to all.

Our SA players are still leading the way for our state, with Tammy Gough and Paul Langley representing Australia overseas. Steven Walker is training in Poland and William Henzel is training in Sweden.

One disappointing factor that emerged this year was the cancellation of the National League competition, after being advised of three changes of date during the early season. Hopefully this competition will be re-introduced in 1999.

A Computer ranking system is being prepared by Brian James from Southern and will assist the State Selectors with their method of selection. Many thanks to Brian for offering to assist with this program.

SA received a grant of \$4,000 in 1998, to buy and upgrade our computer system. A vote of thanks to the Office of Recreation & Sport "Active Club" for this grant which is derived from funds from poker machines.

Year 7 Camp - We were advised that our Association could not run the Year 7 Camp in 1998, as the required information had not been received. This information was held up in the hope that we could obtain extra numbers of participants. Very disappointing but we hope the Association and the Coaches can get together and plan a similar venture in 1999.

Numerous notices were sent to schools, contact made with our affiliated associations and notices given out at competitions, but this still did not generate enough interest for the children to apply for the camp. We had a parent volunteer to act as the Camp Co-ordinator, Mrs. Lorraine Longbottom, and we thank her for her interest.

Promotion - I wish to thank Maurice Quinn for working with me in arranging for some juniors to attend a Come & Try Arlex exhibition at the Wayville showgrounds in May. We had the robot machine in action and the public was invited to participate. Many thanks to Maurice and his young players for assisting in this area.

State Trials - There seems to be a difference of opinion on the importance of conducting State junior trials. Originally they were conducted with the idea of inviting all affiliates to nominate their top juniors to "try out". From these results, squads would be selected and squad practices held regularly, thus giving players, from all affiliates, the opportunity to obtain further training while mixing with players of their own age. Those players that did compete in two organised sessions this year did enjoy the chance to compete against the top players that were in attendance. Some Coaches do not believe they are necessary, but I feel that we do need to encourage the youngsters, as they are the future of our sport.

I believe the result of a lack of this type of training showed up in the Under 14 girls age group this year, when South Australia had only two young girls for the State U/14 team.

With grant allocations from Living Health over the last few years, the Association expects to see an increase in the numbers of juniors coming through the system.

Test Match - It was with great excitement that we saw some top world class players competing in South Australia. The French team was willing to come to Adelaide for this match and although their standard was a lot higher than our own Australian players it was a thrill to see them in action.
The venue at ETSA Park was ideal and approx. 700 people were in attendance.

A list of improvements was noted and will be considered for any future events.

The Association must thank our Patron, Mayor John Dyer, from the City of Charles Sturt, for arranging a civic reception for the players, before the commencement of the evening's matches.

We appreciate the interest and support given by Mayor Dyer and his Council Members who attended the reception. The players were presented with a pin and flag, depicting the City of Charles Sturt.

Centenary of Table Tennis - This Test Match served as a celebration for the Centenary of Table Tennis in Australia and invited guests included the Minister of Recreation & Sport, Hon Iain Evans MP, Mr. & Mrs. Barry Stanton from Sport SA and Mr. Barrie Robran, from Living Health.

In the preparation of the Australian Closed at the Southern Centre, the Organising Committee arranged for T-shirts, advertising the Centenary year, to be sold.

State Track Suits - A sub-committee, including representatives from all age groups, planned and agreed upon a new design for a State tracksuit for the senior and junior players, as well as a players' shirt for all age groups. These new designs have proved very acceptable by the majority, together with favourable comments from our interstate opponents.

The Association is currently considering a new state logo that has not yet been finalised.

Some disappointments during the year included the cancellation of various tournaments, Port Pirie, Women's Invitational and the Woodville Open and Junior tournaments. The calendar had too many tournaments programmed with not too many 'free' weekends. The Tournament Director, Mrs. Barbara Tickner intends to convene a meeting of interested people, and discuss the forth coming season.

Living Health - It was with great concern that we saw the disbandment of Living Health and the health messages disappear. The Government has re-allocated the funds to a Department and from there the allocation of grants will be distributed.

I thank all the affiliates that made the effort in circulating the survey forms and obtaining signatures for the support of Living Health.

Funding has been granted from the Office of Recreation & Sport and will continue until June 1999.

After that time it will be interesting to see what eventuates.

As the season has finished and the new year upon us, we wish to thank everyone for their support and cooperation throughout the year.

I thank the Board of Management Members for their assistance throughout the year.

commercial sponsorship. A grant of \$20,000 from the Department of Sports and Recreation to enable TTV to promote table tennis amongst groups totalling more than 1300 people of Non English speaking background, Koori's and women. These factors contributed to an increase to registration numbers by 113.

An extremely successful Gala Auction fundraising dinner was held. This event was well supported by the table tennis fraternity and an amount of \$4800 was raised by TTV which was used exclusively for the development of table tennis in Victoria.

At the Affiliates Meeting in November a one tier registration system was endorsed by affiliates for implementation in 1999. A bi-monthly newsletter named "Short Serve" was initiated to keep affiliates more quickly informed of issues and Board decisions. TTV's magazine Nets N Edges is still published three times a year.

On a sad note Table Tennis Victoria lost two stalwarts in the passing of Karol Javor and Alan Cleaves. Both made a monumental contribution to Victorian and Australian table tennis.

Table Tennis Victoria looks confidently to the future working together with TTA within an improved structure for the development and progress of table tennis in Australia.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA

Although all Board of Management positions were filled in 1998, not all portfolio holders were able to devote the necessary time to their jobs, thus putting an unnecessary burden on the Executive Director Bob Lake, time which would be better spent on development activities. Nevertheless all programmed activities for the year were satisfactorily completed.

The Association passed another milestone in 1998, with the celebration of its 60th anniversary with a dinner at the Burswood Casino. This was a well attended event, with many past players and state champions making an appearance. Special congratulations go to Brian Lauri (Social and Fundraising Director) and his committee. Brian has recently taken over from Russell Lamborn as President for 1999 so I hope this event is a good omen for future Association activities. Russell made a solid contribution to Association activities during his four years at the helm, and has indicated his willingness to continue to assist in a lesser capacity.

In his first year as coaching director, David Brown oversaw a visit by Glenn Tepper as well as continuing with his own coaching work with the able assistance of Karen Pon. Phil Ranger continued to be the mainstay with the schools coaching programs. Some of the fruits of their endeavours can be seen in the improved performance of our juniors at the National Schools Championships and National Junior Championships.

Although it is disappointing that two of our country associations did not re affiliate, it is pleasing to see that Albany, under the guidance of Peter Muller, continues to involve themselves in the promotion of events and produce quality junior players. This year they conducted an Open Championship, the State Masters games and made the trip to Perth to participate in the State Country Championships.

Due to a number of factors, including reduced fees, increased administrative expenses and an increase in the TTA levy, the Association recorded its first loss. Accordingly decisions have now been taken to increase fees. Regrettably the Centre fund only grew to slightly over \$12,000. The Associations quest for a new centre has somewhat been complicated by numerous other venue issues which hopefully will be sorted out in the near future.

It is pleasing to see that most people eventually used their better judgement in relation to the "Strategic Action Plan for Table Tennis in Australia" and agreed to something that is realistic and workable.

However I am very concerned with the standard of administration of Table Tennis Australia. Western Australian criticism of the way the administration handled the question of the 1999 National Championship dates and bidding process has been recently documented, so I will not repeat the details in this report. However there are too many other examples that I can draw upon to support this assertion. From first hand experience, I know that administration at TTA was better in the past, and Western Australia received more support and assistance in an era when TTA had a lot less staff and Government financial assistance.


