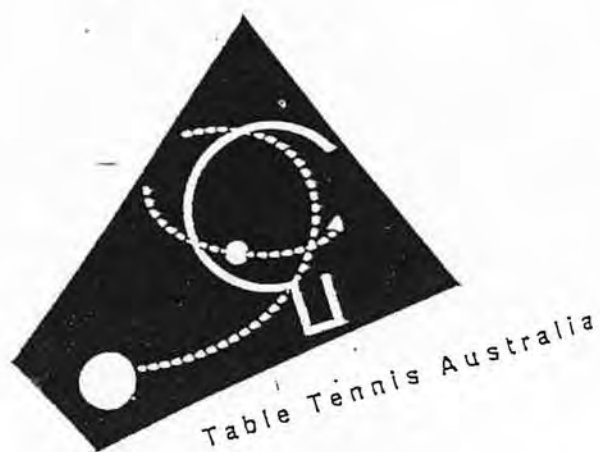

REPORTS

PRESIDENT

After my first year in office I would like to be able to report that major steps have been made in the development of our sport, with our aims of financial independence and a significant increase in registration numbers achieved, but it has turned out to be more a year of consolidation. Whilst moderate progress has been made the time line for achieving our goals is getting shorter and I believe that we must be in a sound position by the year 2000. I am of the opinion that the structure of the sport will change after the Olympic Games, with Government funding decreasing significantly, particularly for those sports who are operating without sound planning and practices. To this end a forum will be held immediately prior to the 1997 Annual General Meeting to formulate an action plan to set in place necessary changes to our sport.

There was a change in coach in late 1996 with Jerzy Grycan replacing Zhou Lan Sun. Mr. Zhou worked very hard for us and the VIS for almost ten years, in a very trying period, and during this time he was responsible for the significant development of many of our players. I wish to record publicly my appreciation of his efforts. Jerzy has brought a new direction to the program which will add to its effectiveness and I am sure that continued improvement in rankings will be the result.

1997 has been a very busy year for us internationally, with the World Championships a highlight. We were represented by quite young teams and it is pleasing to report that the Women maintained their placing, whilst the Men improved some ten positions to finish 39th. It would appear that the effort put into elite development is now having a very positive effect.

The highlight of the events conducted in Australia was the Australian Open held in Melbourne in August. The event attracted many of the world's top players including the legendary Deng Yaping, Olympic and World Champion. The performance of these players was superb and some of the play was the best ever seen in this country. The 1998 Australian Open promises to be even better as the International Table Tennis Federation recently awarded it Major Pro Tour status - one of eight to be held around the world. As well as this the finals of the 1999 Pro Tour series have been allocated to Sydney.

When one remembers that the Asian Veterans Championships will be held in Melbourne in November/ December this year, combined with the major events above, exposure and publicity will be guaranteed, which will assist in our long term development. We must grasp these opportunities and make sure they are very successful.

National League is continuing to expand with Tasmania having a team this year. This competition is vital in today's sporting environment and I ask all Table Tennis people to get behind this competition and make it grow.

The Olympic Athlete Program has provided many opportunities for our players but has also caused some concerns as the Program becomes more focused. These concerns are being addressed to ensure that the Program is better understood and that a system is in place to satisfy all levels of development.

In the past couple of months the Board has been looking very closely at the roles and responsibilities of each of the Directors, with a view to having a clear and accountable area of operation. We must direct our energies in a constructive and professional manner and be prepared to be measured by the Council.

There is much work to be done and to meet the demand it is vital that we recruit and develop a larger pool of volunteers as well as ensuring that our professional resources are well directed. We all have a role to play in this regard.

Finally I wish to express my thanks to all those volunteers who have helped during 1997, and also my fellow Board members and staff for their contribution. We are fortunate to have staff who believe in the sport and are prepared to work long hours.

NATIONAL EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

This report is written in the knowledge that the 1998 Australian Open Championships will be one of the eight most important Table Tennis events in the world. News has just been received that the ITTF have awarded Australia, along with China, Japan, Korea, Brazil and Sweden the first six events. Two more remain to be awarded. TTA has slowly over a period of four years been building the Australian Open into a major tournament which culminated in the 1997 Australian Open breaking new ground in standard of players, presentation, conduct and organisation. For this we must thank the considerable support of Tourism Victoria, the Australian Sports Commission and the International Table Tennis Federation who have provided significant funds to establish the event. With television coverage to 64 countries covering at a conservative estimate 360 million households the event had huge international exposure. The ITTF have very stringent conditions in place that must be observed. In 1995 four teams visited Australia to compete. This increased last year when China and Austria in particular sent delegations. TTA are indebted to Table Tennis Queensland and Jean Dorries for taking on board the ITTF Pro Tour after tendering for the 1996 Australian Open as a domestic event. It allowed us to take the next step up.

This year players from eighteen countries competed including eight of the world's top twenty-one female players. The highlight was the Men's final between Ding Song, world number six and Johnny Huang world number thirteen. It was a sensational match that kept the crowd enthralled.

Not only have TTA been awarded a major event in 1998 but also the ITTF Pro Tour finals in 1999. The event is a testament to the great strides that TTA has made in the last four years and indicates the potential the game has in Australia.

Registrations have remained relatively stable this year. As the year 2000 approaches the Board of TTA have addressed the future of the sport, in particular the years post 2000. I believe it is fair to say that the population of the Table Tennis community has remained relatively stable but unfortunately the population of Australia has steadily increased. Table Tennis in Australia must address with urgency its lack of a national junior program such as other sports have. Little athletics or junior football, hockey's equivalent called Minkey and many others have cornered shares of this huge market. We must have two things going for us to do this:

- (i) a program
- (ii) the support of everyone in the game for the program

The National Development Director and the National Coaching Director along with Victoria's Development Officer have addressed the issue of a modified program for schools. The program they are proposing is an exciting one. We, as a National body, must provide the outlets and programs for the many children who will be enticed to the sport. Clubs and Associations will need to have programs that are exciting, as well as organised if they are to retain the new members. At this point in time there is a comfort level in the sport. Why expand, why do things differently, why change? Whether we like it or not other sports have done it and are rapidly expanding in a very competitive atmosphere. Table Tennis runs the risk of losing the youth market and therefore its future. If Australian Sports Commission funding disappears or is significantly cut following the Olympics then its resources disappear also and the task of developing the sport becomes almost impossible.

The National Table Tennis League saw seven teams battle out the competition with Melbourne Conquerors defeating a gallant Adelaide Castalloy in Sydney for the title. The League expanded to include the Tassie Tridents when two submissions from Tasmania were considered. A David Wilson led club was granted the right to operate out of the Apple Isle.

This year has been a hard one financially with TTA attempting to honour its promises and fulfil its obligations. The financial position was made more difficult due to the cut of approximately \$64,000 in December. This occurred in a year when we had every major international competition including the Olympic Games, Oceania Championships, Asian Championships, Global Youth Championships followed by the Commonwealth and World Championships. Table Tennis Australia now has to work very hard to make up lost ground to cover this shortfall. It was the one major disappointment in a year of significant change.

National Coach Zhou Lan Sun indicated to the Board that he would not be seeking reappointment. Following an exhaustive interview process of some of the world's leading coaches Jerzy Grycan, a leading Polish coach was appointed in his place. Grycan is considered to be one of the top six coaches in the world and his contact is written with a view to him leading Australia's push to a medal in 2000.

We were fortunate to have one of the world's leading juniors relocate to Australia. Miao Miao has emigrated with her parents from Poland and settled in Australia where she keeps her connection with Jerzy Grycan intact. TTA are indebted to the Australian Olympic Committee for their support in her relocation. Leading players Kerri Tepper and Ying Kwok retired leaving a hole at the top level, which will be filled, we hope, by the likes of Shirley Zhou, Tammy Gough, Yvonne Li, Miao Miao and others.

The Schools Championships continue to expand with fifty teams taking part. In 1997 the Championships will be expanded to regional level to bring schools closer to clubs and associations and therefore provide a link to facilitate recruitment of children into the sport.

Table Tennis Australia moved to its new offices in St. Kilda Road in September which created a working atmosphere much more conducive to work. With that move came technological changes as the Australian Sports Commission hooked TTA up to its home page and provided us with access to the Internet and Email facilities. Investigation is now being undertaken to allow TTA to update its own home page through the Commission and use this facility as its most important communication outlet. The brave new world beckons.

In conclusion I write with the Planning Seminar to be held in conjunction with the Annual General Meeting in mind. This, in my mind, will be the most important meeting TTA has ever held. With the Olympic Athlete Program money TTA has been able to fund a fully professional staff to develop the sport. That staff is employed to support the policy decided by the Council and implemented by the Board. One of the risks that TTA faces is that they become comfortable with what they have now and do not plan for the day the OAP funding disappears. With three years to go to the Olympics we have time and resources to tackle the big issues. It is my belief that fundamental change is needed in thinking and structure for the sport to succeed in the new millennium. If the sport does not embrace this change then it runs the serious risk of becoming a very minor sport that in a sport conscious country like Australia could become irrelevant. The challenge lies ahead and I am sure we can collectively meet it.

In conclusion it would be remiss if the following were not thanked. Their considerable support enables the sport to prosper.

NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

1997 has been a difficult year with Australian Sports Commission funding cuts affecting many programs.

The following projects have been worked on or are currently being worked on in 1997:

These numbers reflect a small increase from 1996. We are now at a stage whereby the large numbers that were 'falling through the net' have been accounted for. Coaching numbers reflect a 'status quo' with new coaches replacing 'inactive' coaches in even numbers. Coaches accreditation is valid for four years and coaches must provide evidence that they are active to a prescribed points value.

3. COACHING RESOURCES

A. NCAS Coaching Accreditation Courses

A quadrennial review of the Coaching Courses by the Australian Sports Commission is under way.

A major restructure of the Coaching Courses and Manuals is required as those currently in use were written over 10 years ago.

This huge task is being undertaken by the NCAS Coaching Course Development Committee consisting of:

Glenn Tepper - National Coaching Director
 Jerzy Grycan - National Coach
 Aleks Jakubczak - OAP High Performance Program Manager
 Alois Rosario - Table Tennis Victoria Development Officer

The first of these resources, Level 1, should be ready in 1998.

B. Table Tennis in Schools Program

A comprehensive package including modified tables and a complete coaching resource is being developed jointly by Glenn Tepper, Alois Rosario and Wilhelmina Pruyn. The resource will include lesson plans and the appropriate support resources for

and will include basic strokecards, activity cards, skills circuits, competition formats and skills awards. Funding for this project is through Sport and Recreation Victoria. The package will be ready for the start of 1998.

C. School Student Table Tennis Guide

A series of sports handbooks for school students is being produced by Heinemann Library.

Work on the manuscript with author Bernie Blackhall has been completed, with the book to be published late 1997.

D. Inh Van Le Coaching Resource

A coaching resource produced by Inh Van Le should be ready in late 1997. Assistance with editing and terminology was given in the production of this book.

E. Readers Digest Sports Directory.

In conjunction with Readers Digest several pages were included for publishing late 1997.

F. National Coaching Plan 1997 - 2000

The National Coaching Plan 1997 - 2000 has been formalised with additions and contributions welcomed by State Associations.

Copies are included with this report.

4. COACH EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES

A. ITTF/ OTTF High Performance Coaching Project: Adelaide 2 - 8 June, 1997

One of the world's leading coaches, Michel Gadal, ran a seven day coaching course for players and coaches in Adelaide June 2 - 8, 1997. Michel was French National Coach for many years, coaching Gattien to an Olympic Silver Medal in 1992, and is the current Canadian National Coach.

He was targeted by the ITTF as one of the most knowledgeable coaches in the world. Our own National Coach, Jerzy Grycan, well respected as one of the world's leading coaches, also was in attendance.

Coaches and players from Australia, Fiji, New Zealand and Tahiti attended. Players clearly recognised this excellent opportunity with full attendance, however extremely disappointing was the attendance of only 8 Australian Coaches for the duration of the course (including Tepper and Grycan) and another 6 Adelaide Coaches attending at night. This was despite promoting the event to all 230 accredited coaches six months in advance via the Coaching Newsletter. Coaches and players present clearly benefited from Gadal's knowledge.

B. Level 2 Coaching Course

The Level 2 Coaching Course requires the attendance of the National Coach, National Coaching Director and Sports Science specialists.

With all three based in Melbourne it is proposed a course be held in Melbourne October/ November 1997. A minimum of 6 is required to complete the four day course. At this stage there is one definite starter, and 2 doubtfuls who have enrolled. All of the 180 Level 1 Coaches have been notified through the Coaching Newsletter.

C. Coaching Seminars

Due to scheduling difficulties Coaching Seminars will not be held at the Australian Championships in 1997. In 1998, Seminars will be planned for all Australian Championships and during States visits.

D. Coaching Newsletter

The Coaching Newsletter continues to be delivered to every accredited coach on a four monthly basis.

E. Coaching and Sports Science Library

Videos, Coaching Resources and Sports Science Material are continually being updated. A full list of resources is published in each Coaching Newsletter.

5. STATE VISITS BY NATIONAL COACH/ NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

Due to funding cuts, State visits were offered to six of the eight States for the purpose of Coach Education and Talent Identification. (QLD, NSW, SA, VIC, TAS, WA). WA and TAS declined visits.

National Coach and National Coaching Director both visited South Australia in January and June in conjunction with camps held in Adelaide, holding Coaching Seminars and Talent Identification Sessions and Camps.

The National Coach will visit QLD and NSW in October/ November at a date to be advised when the National Team program is finalised.

It is planned that the following visits will occur in 1998

NCD: QLD, NSW, ACT, NT

6. STATE ACADEMIES

Refer to "The future of State Junior Academies" Board paper June 14, 1997.

State Academies are a vital link between the grass roots and OAP/ National team. It was strongly recommended that funding be prioritised to reflect this.

Due to funding cuts, this has not occurred.

The Tasmanian Academy, at the time of writing, was not operating with Peter MaSen's Development Officer position ending, though alternatives were being looked into.

The Victorian Junior Academy position must be closely analysed also with Nela Bran's Scholarship Coach position to end in January 1998 and Table Tennis Victoria's funds extremely tight in the new Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre.

7. INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S FESTIVAL: SYDNEY: 15 - 17 APRIL, 1998

A major International Womensport Festival will be held in Sydney 4 - 19 April, 1998.

Table Tennis Australia has linked in with organisers Present Australia and Womensport Australia to promote an International Youth Women's Table Tennis Tournament in Sydney 15 - 17 April 1998 to link in with the Australian Youth Championships - Melbourne 10, 13 - 14 April, 1998 and Yasaka Classic - Melbourne 11 - 12 April, 1998. Eight countries have been targeted and will include teams, singles and doubles events.

Present Australia are funding the venue costs and organising the International participation of the various countries.

8. SOUTH KOREA VISIT: AUSTRALIAN SCHOOLS CHAMPIONSHIPS, 1997
AUSTRALIAN JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS, 1997

A team of 3 boys and 3 girls, headed by 1985 Australian National Coach Jae Hwa Lee, now a high ranking official with the South Korea Table Tennis Association will visit Australia September/ October 1997. They will play challenge matches and demonstrations at the Australian Schools Championships.

At the Australian Junior Championships they will participate in the teams, doubles and mixed doubles. So as to ensure the Australian U/17 Singles winner is an Australian, an additional singles event will be held - Australian Open Junior Singles Invitational. Eight or sixteen players will compete in 2/4 groups of 4 players round robin, with winners proceeding to the finals.

This will be an excellent opportunity for our leading Australian players to test themselves against some of the world's leading juniors.

The return visit follows a very successful training trip to South Korea in January/ February 1997 for our Youth Men's Team of Trevor Brown, Wayne Gerada and Steven Walker.

Our Youth team was exposed to training and competition opportunities equal to the best in the world, and this is an exchange we should work hard to foster.

NB. Originally the trip to Korea was to involve a Women's Youth Team also, however funding cuts at a critical time prior to departure meant that only one team could go.

NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR

1. AUSTRALIAN SCHOOLS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The new structure for this event, by creating the Championship Division and Challenge Cup Division allowed greater participation and fairness to schools participating. A goal of 100 teams was set for the 1997 event which is a 50% increase on last years entry. An ambitious aim none the less!

The Championships have been given a slogan

"Block It, Spin It, SMASH IT"

at the

Australian Schools Table Tennis Championships

This promotional catchcry, has been featured on entry forms, posters and the merchandise that has been developed in conjunction with the Championships to give an impression of the fast and furious action that Table Tennis can provide young people.

A Championship Package has been put together for teams, which includes all meals, Accommodation, Final Function and Sound and Light Show "Blood on the Southern Cross". This package deal costs \$115 for students and \$130 for adults, and all needs are met over three days. It is attractive to teachers and parents as being an easy option and hassle free.

Schools will have had an incentive to enter this year, as the rewards are greater. The winning team in the Championship Category will win a STIGA Elite Roller Table for their School. The Challenge Cup Categories winners will win Table Tennis Class Sets for their schools, incorporating, video, rackets, balls and net assemblies.

Some SA, TAS, VIC and QLD centres conducted their own School team competitions, with Victoria conducting a very successful Schools Singles Championships. NSW, SA, and ACT have conducted successful State Teams School Championships. However the structure and number of Table Tennis Schools competitions in each State needs to be reviewed again in 1997 to assess the appropriateness and success of what is available for Schools in Table Tennis.

The number of teams may be reduced due to the fact that individuals are only allowed to enter into one category, not multiple, which has reduced the interest for a number of schools. However the Championship Package has proven to be a very positive aspect especially the inclusion of the Sound and Light Show allowing those who have travelled from interstate to experience more than just Table Tennis.

It is a fully national event this year with all states entering teams and this is seen as a positive aspect of running the event immediately prior to the Australian Junior Championships.

However the event will be reviewed in October to assess its impact on increasing the number of young people playing Table Tennis in Australia.

2. VOLUNTEER INVOLVEMENT PROGRAM

The Club Administration Manual was available to Clubs and Associations in April. It was important not to simply supply the manuals without consultation and education thus

guidance and support contacts were given to states, and individual clubs and associations as to how the manual can be used in conjunction with education modules to improve the administration skills and assist clubs/associations in their everyday operations.

The manual has been accepted well by many Clubs and Associations with 62 Clubs ordering a manual. Clubs have received a number of other useful resources and hints on how to utilise the Club Administration Manual and its associated Programs to their full potential.

The key is to now keep the momentum of the Volunteer Involvement Program going, following the positive response. The Volunteer of the Year nomination forms will be distributed in September, along with a poster promoting the RECRUIT, REWARD, RETAIN theme of Volunteer Management. It is anticipated that these awards will be highly supported in 1997 due to the increased awareness of the Volunteer Involvement Program in Table Tennis.

Education for Clubs and Associations is planned for 1998.

3. TABLE TENNIS IN SCHOOLS PROGRAM

A draft Table Tennis in Schools Development Pathway has been developed which outlines the opportunities available to young people in Table Tennis from Primary School to Secondary School, ranging from school programs and competitions to Club orientated Programs.

The 1st draft of the Table Tennis in Schools Resource for Primary and Secondary Schools is currently being processed and is due on the 15th of September. It will be then distributed to the appropriate stakeholders for review and input. The resource is expected to be fully completed by mid October.

It is anticipated the Table Tennis in Schools Program will be completed in December, to allow schools to take on the Program in 1998. An extensive promotion campaign of the program is being developed to ensure that the Table Tennis in Schools Program will have exposure in Clubs, Associations and Schools all over Australia.

A Sport Management student from Deakin University is currently conducting research in a range of areas concerning the status of *"Table Tennis in Schools throughout Australia"*. This should provide Table Tennis Australia with valuable information to assist in their future development and marketing of Table Tennis School Programs.

5. AFTER SCHOOL TABLE TENNIS PROGRAM

This concept is being developed based on a successful model used in the UK. It will be an important part of the School/Club development in the next year as it will assist in facilitating the important link between Schools and Table Tennis Clubs.

It is a positive step to ensure that Children will begin to experience a quality Table Tennis Program in Schools through the Schools Program. However we must ensure that those very children have the opportunity to continue the Table Tennis experience outside school at their local club. This is where an After School Table Tennis Program is important.

This concept is being developed and trialed in a number of Clubs in the second half of this year. If successful I would propose the format to become a National Program that is offered in Clubs and Associations throughout Australia. It is important that new formats such as this one are being offered to cater for the needs of the school age children who are our biggest target and potential growth area.

6. NATIONAL OFFICIATING PROGRAM

Table Tennis Australia has now been officially accepted in the National Officiating Accreditation Scheme at the Australian Coaching Council. Table Tennis will be invited to be officially inducted at an awards ceremony in November of this year.

The emphasis in 1997/8 will begin with the promotion of the program and inducting people into the lowest level of accreditation, as well as education of the State delegates as to how the new courses are to be delivered.

The job now lies ahead to keep moving the development of the Program, and begin to accredit and recognise our officials at all levels. Courses are currently being planned with Cairns, Alice Springs and ACT Table Tennis Associations in 1997.

It is anticipated that the newly created and recognised Associate level will be an attractive level to players, young people, veterans and parents at club level, who would like to have a good knowledge of the rules, but do not wish to take their umpiring any further such as that of State level.

Developments are also occurring to determine whether a shirt will be awarded to umpires at this level instead of a badge, as shirts are a more practical item of recognition. Also the standardisation of the costs of completing a course, so that this area may be a future area of revenue generation for the officials group.

It is planned that the National Officiating Executive will drive this Program in 1998.

7. NEVER TOO LATE PROGRAM

Victoria and the ACT have conducted Family Fun Days for the Vietnam Veterans Associations within their State. Each State ran three activity days for their groups and these were completed by August 1997.

The aim of the program is to provide an organised, fun Table Tennis experience, with a taste of competition and coaching. This may then lead to ongoing participation by the Vietnam Veterans, and their families at their local Table Tennis centres once the organised sessions are completed.

It is now anticipated, that Table Tennis Veterans associations across Australia will use the initiative to foster and increase Veteran players in their area.

Both the Victorian and ACT Programs have been completed, and planning is underway for a Vietnam Veterans Annual Tournament to commemorate the Program, and ensure ongoing participation of the Vietnam Veterans in Table Tennis.

8. NATIONAL LEAGUE

This year the aim was to promote Table Tennis to the wider community, via the use of the National League, by hosting matches in Clubs and Associations throughout the States. The benefits being two fold. The National League develops a wider audience and exposure, and the hosting Club/Association uses the opportunity to promote Table Tennis in their local area, and thus increase the profile of the sport in their region.

There have been three successful "Matches of the Round" conducted thus far in the National League season. Mount Gambier, Warrnambool and Bendigo Table Tennis Associations have taken on the opportunity to host a National League match in their area to assist in increasing the promotion and profile of Table Tennis in their local community.

All have been successful matches, with each area gaining some form of media coverage, in the form of local television and newspaper stories. All three Clubs have gained a benefit from hosting the matches, and the National League teams who have been involved have been most co-operative in ensuring that their teams have been available.

9. DISABLED TABLE TENNIS

Developments are occurring in this area. A Table Tennis Sport Advisory Committee has been put in place to advise the Australian Paralympic Federation of the development, management, and direction of Table Tennis, that will allow Table Tennis to perform to their potential in Paralympic competition

The committee is investigating the possibility of hosting an International Disabled event in 1998, as a Pre Olympic training opportunity in conjunction with next year's Australian Open.

A number of submissions and recommendations to the IPC have proven fruitful and have ensured the Paralympic host countries a minimum of one player in each of the four categories (wheelchairs men & women, standing men & women). This is great news to our athletes who had previously no chance of qualifying for Sydney 2000 due to lack of International competition.

Negotiations have begun with AUSRAPID as to the development of Table Tennis players with an Intellectual Disability, as the 2000 Paralympics will include a category for the Intellectually Disabled in Table Tennis. The selection criteria for this event has not yet been finalised.

To find out whether we have any talent in this area an invitation tournament is currently being considered for April 1998.

In 1998 Table Tennis Australia will be targeting those Clubs and Associations that offer opportunities for the disabled to assist in their development.

10. AUSTRALIAN UNIVERSITY GAMES, AUSTRALASIAN PUBLIC SECTOR GAMES

Table Tennis will be for the first time included in the Australian University Games to be held at MSAC from 29th Sept - 3rd Oct, 1997. This is a promising indication that there exists an opportunity for our players to continue their Table Tennis competition and involvement beyond their High School years.

An application to have Table Tennis included in the Sports offered at the Australasian Public Sector games has been successful and the event will be conducted from the 15th to the 18th of April 1998 in Melbourne. The committee of the Australian Table Tennis Public Service Championships are considering running their annual Championships in line with the Australasian Public Sector Games.

11. INTERNATIONAL WOMENSPORT FESTIVAL

This event is going ahead in Sydney in April 1998. Table Tennis will host an International Youth Women's Tournament. The event is being co-ordinated around the Australian Youth Championships and the Yasaka Classic in Melbourne so that the visiting International teams may compete in a circuit or event while they are in Australia.

The principle of the Festival is to cater for both elite athletes and those involved at the recreational level. Table Tennis is using this opportunity to provide international athletes with an opportunity to gain competition experience in Australia in the lead up to the Sydney 2000 Olympics. This is also a great opportunity for our top females to gain some extra International playing experience, and assist in increasing the profile of Women in Table Tennis in Australia.

12. DEVELOPMENT NEWSLETTER

The Newsletter is an important form of communication for Clubs and Associations on Development Issues and Programs that they can become involved with. The greatest difficulty here is ensuring that it is being addressed and communicated throughout the Clubs/Associations accordingly, not just to the Club Secretary!

The Officials Newsletter will, as of 1998 be distributed to all accredited officials, as a database has been set up, for the implementation of the NOP.

13. REVIEW THE TABLE TENNIS AUSTRALIA PARTICIPATION PLAN

I have been required to review and update Table Tennis Australia current Participation Development Plan to reinstate development funding from the Australian Sports Commission for the 97/98 year. The revised plan has been developed in consultation via the review and input of State Development Plans.

14. STATE VISITS

The " planning for 1997 " day held in NSW at the end of last year had a number of outcomes for NSW Table Tennis. The key priorities for the year were identified and ongoing consultation and review of NSW will be important to keep them on track with their objectives for 1997.

Late February saw a visit to South Australia to meet with their Country Delegates at their annual meeting, to educate and advise them of the programs and initiatives such as the schools, VIP, and NOP that they could become involved with, and to consult as to their input into the development plan. This was a very successful meeting with their country and metropolitan affiliates.

DIRECTOR TECHNICAL

(Incorporating Officiating Executive and Rules Officer Reports)

ITTF RULE CHANGES

At the 1997 ITTF BGM in Manchester, England, various changes were made to the ITTF Laws and Regulations for International Competitions and Regulations for World Championships.

The changes are as follows:

1. BALLS: The specific colours for balls will be white and orange and not yellow.
2. CLOTHING: ITTF authorisation of clothing will be discontinued, but existing authorisations will remain valid until 1999.
3. PLAYING AREA: For International competitions, the playing space must be a least 5 meters high.
4. GLUE TESTING: Will be mandatory in major ITTF competitions.
5. INJURIES: If anyone is bleeding in the playing area, play must be suspended immediately and not resumed until all traces of blood have been removed from the area.
6. ADVISER/ COACH: Where the members from a doubles pair are from different Associations, each of them may nominate an adviser.
7. TEAMS MATCHES: In a team match, a player who is warned for bad behaviour will be liable to incur penalty points for any further offences committed in that team match.
8. INTERNATIONAL ELIGIBILITY: Eligibility for international representation will in future be based on nationality, but eligibility already acquired through birth or residence will continue to be recognised.

REVIEW FOR THE PERIOD 1996 - 1997

There were few changes in the last twelve months.

Ian Finlay was replaced by Les Lawrence by TTNSW therefore he was no longer eligible to serve on the Executive. Fran Keyhoe replaced him as Secretary and in turn Maureen Sherman (TAS) joined the Executive. Greg Bungey is the other member of the Executive.

I want to record my appreciation of Ian Finlay's work as Secretary of the Executive for several years. I know that he is still keen to work in the Officiating Scene.

I also wish to thank the members of the Executive especially Fran Keyhoe as Secretary who did a lot of good work in the Officiating area.

We have been busy with supplying officials for the 1997 Commonwealth Championships in Glasgow, Scotland and the World Championships, Manchester, England as well as the Global Youth Championships and the 1996 Asian Championships.

CURRENT PROJECTS

At present we are focusing on the 1998 Australian Pro Tour which is a major event of the ITTF and the Sydney 2000-Olympics as well as the 1997 Asian Veterans Championships and the 1999 ITTF Pro Tour finals.

OLYMPIC ATHLETE PROGRAM

We would like to take this opportunity to thank our outgoing National Coach Mr Zhou Lan Sun.

Lan Sun relinquished his position as National Coach of Australia in September and finished his job in November. On behalf of the Olympic Athlete Program we would like to express our gratitude to Lan Sun for his input in building Table Tennis in Australia.

1. Introduction and Targets

Currently Australia's world rankings are 39 in Men's Teams and 26 in Women's Teams. Individually the highest ranked Australian Woman are Ying Kwok at 130, Kerri Tepper 134. In the Men's Paul Langley is ranked 232, Russell Lavale 258. The Australian Men's Team improved their position 10 spots from 49 to 39. The Women dropped two spots below their last World Championship ranking from 24 to 26. However the Women's team has seen the average age of 27 drop to an average age of 17 years old (without Miao Miao).

2. National Coach/ Olympic Athlete Program Head Coach

After an intensive interview process Mr Jerzy Grycan has been appointed as Australian National Coach for the next four years, to head our Olympic Program to Sydney 2000 Olympic Games. Jerzy is a former National Coach of Poland.

In total eight coaches were interviewed from a number of countries. All of these applicants have had success with their respective countries.

4. Diagnosing

- Interviews with the potential OAP and Academy Players (26 athletes in total).
- Every match at International level has been recorded and analysed.
- After each competition each player's performance has been assessed from a technical and tactical point of view as well as mental and physical statistics which have been looked at.
- A detailed analysis of the top 100 players was not completed due to a lack of professional equipment (e.g. video camera). As a result of this problem a detailed opposition study has not been done.
- OAP and some Academy players have been medically and physically tested.
- Psychological Performance inventory has been established.

5. Goals for the 96/97 Season

5.1. Build an Internationally Competitive Training System

“Optimisation of Table Tennis Australia Training System”

This main goal has not been achieved yet (due to the restricted financial resources of the OAP program).

5.2. Significant improvement in the International performance level of our players. (In existing “Cottage Industry” conditions)

All players included in the program achieved significant improvement except Shirley Zhou in Women’s and Kent Jamieson in the Men’s Program. See table 1

6. Planning

Annual, half year, monthly and weekly training strategies have been introduced for all main areas of preparation of a professional table tennis player.

7. Realisation of OAP Program Training

7.1 Training - Under new National Coach Jerzy Grycan we realised 770 hours of training including:

- technical 250
- tactical 230
- physical 170
- mental training 120

We had seven players who conducted the program between 20 - 40 hours per week. A group of 10 players between 10 - 20 hours per week.

In total we had 33 players participating in the program.

Due to the large financial restrictions faced on the OAP Program and Table Tennis in general in Australia we haven't been able to develop the quality levels which are needed to fully realise the needs of the program.

E.g. lack of an assistant coach
lack of professional equipment and facilities.

8. *Main International Competition Program (under Zhou Lan Sun)*

Year 1996/97 has been very demanding on our players in terms of the amount of international competition our players participated in.

We have done a lot of research and met with a number of professionals to have a clear view of who and how we are able to contribute to our program. (Coaching staff and/ or support personnel). Close contact with parents has been established and maintained.

Nela Bran is continuing as Scholarship Coach under the AIS program parallel with the OAP Program.

The actual situation in regard to facilities and equipment is well below the standards of our main opposition throughout the world. We haven't secured any sponsors to create a career path for our players, coaches and to establish new programs, again our opposition is in a privileged position.

11. Summary

Taking into account the real Australian Table Tennis situation including the OAP Program and many disadvantages in comparison with leading overseas countries a particular importance has to be directed to technology.

“A Jump to the World Elite” by our OAP players requires Australian Table Tennis to build and create a very effective training system including modern strategies of diagnosing, goal setting, planning, selection, development of coaching staff, supporting personnel, organising stable venue, facilities and equipment, competition, recovery, training load monitoring etc.

That needs the financial investment and concentration of all our resources (human, financial, technological etc.) and very effective communication.

DIRECTOR MARKETING & SPECIAL EVENTS

INTRODUCTION

Throughout 1996/1997, a number of significant changes have taken place within the portfolio of Marketing and Special Events. Hopefully these changes have not only enhanced the manner in which our major events are conducted but also assisted with improving the image of Table Tennis within Australia. These changes will themselves initiate further changes throughout the following year, especially in the areas of sponsorship and media relations.

PORTFOLIO DETAILS

A detailed revised portfolio has been submitted to the Table Tennis Board for its consideration. The paper addresses various activities associated with the special events, promotion, sponsorship and marketing components of the portfolio. Various strategies related to the portfolio components will be developed once the Board approves the revised portfolio.

THE SPECIAL EVENTS

Australian Table Tennis Open (International Pro Tour)

In 1996, this event was held in Brisbane. It attracted a significant number of competitors and spectators. In an effort to secure additional public and private sector funding, it was decided to relocate the event to Melbourne and as such, the event was scheduled to be played at the Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre (early rounds) and then the Melbourne Sports and Entertainment Centre during August 1997.

In Brisbane, the event was supported by a large number of volunteers. Without doubt, their energy and commitment to the event ensured that the 1996 championships were very successful. Special thanks are extended to Jean Dorries and the Queensland Table Tennis Association for their efforts.

During the first half of 1997, considerable work was undertaken to ensure that the 1997 Championships attracted an impressive international lineup of players. Thanks must go to Aleks Jakubczak, Jerzy Grycan and Glenn Tepper as they almost singlehandedly secured the involvement of so many top players. It should also be noted that the contributions of Ron Carlton, Wilhelmina Pruyt and Nicole van den Dungen were beyond what should have been expected.

1st Asian Veterans Table Tennis Championships

The organisation and promotion of the event continues. An Organising Committee comprising representatives from Table Tennis Australia and other interested groups has been operating throughout the year. Following on from the fact that Macau did not host the inaugural event as earlier intended, Melbourne will now have the honour of hosting the first ever Asian Veterans Table Tennis Championships. Early indications suggest that at least 750 players will be involved.

SPONSORSHIP

In an effort to enhance the long term viability of Table Tennis Australia, and Table Tennis within Australia generally, Table Tennis Australia has enlisted the professional support of a sports management company (Total Sport Management Pty Ltd) in order to secure appropriate sponsorship funding for the variety of activities currently undertaken. It is expected that private sector sponsorship will be secured for the 1998 Australian Table Tennis Open (International Pro Tour) to enable the event to be appropriately conducted at the Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre.

MEDIA

To assist with the media coverage of major Table Tennis event in Australia, and in particular the media coverage of the major events, it has been decided to employ a professional media consultant when appropriate. As such, Clarke Hansen Media was engaged to assist with the management of the media component of the 1997 Australian Table Tennis Open held in August.

NEXT STEPS

It is intended that the work undertaken during the 1997/1998 year will include the following:

<u>Special Events</u>	Determine which international events are appropriate for Australia, assess their potential and develop bids as required. Generally work to improve the standards of the event presentation when required.
<u>Promotion</u>	Aim to increase media interest in Table Tennis. Ensure high standard printed material produced by TTA.

DIRECTOR MEMBERSHIP/ DEVELOPMENT

Membership

Registrations for the calendar year ended 31st December 1996, whilst at the time of writing are not complete, are indicating the likelihood of a year of relatively static membership. Reasons for this continuing trend are numerous and have been outlined on many previous occasions. It is my belief that one of the main contributing factors to this position is our poor retention rate - an area of grave concern.

Another contributing factor is non-registration of all members by affiliates. Until such times as it is broadly accepted that Table Tennis is a sport not purely a recreation, and accordingly register all participants, at not just club level, but also at State/ Territory and National level, our profile will continue to be low. It is incumbent on administrators of the sport at all levels to urgently address the importance of the numerous aspects affecting membership i.e.

Membership	Registration
	Retention
	Acquisition

Development

Whilst coverage of development projects will be detailed in the report from our National Development Director, Wilhelmina Pruyn, I make specific mention of several aspects regarding development during the past year.

Numerous programs have been initiated by Wilhelmina whose work ethic is to be highly commended. Tangible recognition of her dedication and initiative is recommended. It has been my pleasure to liaise with Wilhelmina on several projects during the year, one of these being the formulation of a National Development Plan (Participation). Whilst initially this was a project undertaken to meet Government requirements, it is an essential working document for the development of the sport. To ensure the documented plan was representative of our members, associations were asked to contribute to its compilation. Whilst response from some areas was forthcoming with constructive contribution, it was unfortunate that there was not greater input from this level.

Following acceptance by the Board at their meeting immediately prior to the AGM, the finalised Plan will be a document made available to all State/ Territory delegates at the AGM. It is imperative that all affiliates familiarise themselves with the content of this document and work with the National Development Director to ensure its efficient implementation at all levels.

As it is a working document, it will be subject to updating on a regular basis, with reporting on the outcomes of initiatives included therein. I look forward to continued liaison with the National Development Director in this regard.

Included in the Plan is the VIP component, with the Club Administration Manual having been compiled by Wilhelmina during the year and distributed to clubs who ordered same. This is a user friendly document which should provide valuable assistance to clubs in establishing sound administrative structures. To maximise the value of this manual, it is strongly recommended that clubs encourage their committee members to undertake the component courses offered.

I refer readers to Wilhelmina's report regarding the above and other projects undertaken during the year.

Risk Management

A National Sports Injury/ Risk Management Document has been compiled, and like the Development Plan, will be made available to delegates at the AGM, following its acceptance by the Board at their meeting immediately prior to the AGM.

The content of this document covers an exceedingly important aspect of managing our sport - ensuring maximum protection for our members whilst minimising the likelihood of redress for our clubs/ affiliates.

It is recognised that it will be necessary to review this document from time to time, with it being asked that member clubs/ associations provide me with comment in this regard.

General

- It is my firm opinion that whilst it is important to address the elite level of our sport, a specific focus must be directed to the fundamental issues of membership and development. These form the base of our triangle and for survival and progress, the base of our triangle must be solid. With a solid base we will be able to support the apex.
- I look forward to continued involvement on the Board, at least until my current term expires in February, particularly given the revised parameters of the portfolio, assuming they are adopted, and that I retain the same portfolio. It is my opinion that it was essential to establish some more specific guidelines, and accountability requirements, to achieve more meaningful contribution by all members, which should result in overall improved management of the sport.

DIRECTOR INFORMATION & TECHNOLOGY

Ladies & Gentlemen

I present a report on my portfolio for the Annual Meeting.

Activity has been difficult over the past year due to severe financial restrictions. What I would have liked to achieve was not possible so I mainly contained my activities to the ACoRD membership system.

At the time of writing this report, five (5) states have now forwarded an ACoRD disk of their members. One state has not yet converted but has supplied a hard copy of their members. Another state is in the process of conversion and hopefully should be finished by the Annual Meeting. The last state, we don't know what is happening. Contact by mail and then by phone, as yet, has not achieved a satisfactory result. We will keep trying. Our target is to have all states using ACoRD by 31 December 1997.

An assessment of the office computer system has revealed that we have a serious deficiency in that area. Old computer hardware and corrupted software has been a problem. I have taken steps to correct a few of the problems on the existing system, but it is apparent that we must have both updated hardware and software to allow the staff to effectively produce what is expected. We are currently investigating the cost of upgrading the office system and we hope to have something in place by the end of the year.

Email is the new communication tool that is available to everyone on the net. We want to take advantage of this and we are looking at ways to, firstly link up all the Directors with the office, and then get the states linked up so that they can communicate and transmit correspondence and information to the office and also amongst themselves. In addition, results could be easily transmitted to the Chairman of Selectors for quick input to the ranking system and then can be published at regular intervals.

There is so much we could do to enhance our operation with the new technology that is being developed. We must take advantage of it somehow but as with everything, it takes money, and that is something we lack. We are always on the lookout to find ways and means of achieving our aims so the situation is always kept under notice and when the opportunity arises, we will grab it.

I have enjoyed my time as a Director on the Board and I thank Neil Harwood and the other Board members for their assistance during the year, and my term.

AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY

- Four young members have received their *Sport Leader Awards*.
- In 1997 we hosted, or will host, the Australian Deaf Games, The Australian Masters' Games, The Australia/ New Zealand Police Games, the Vietnam Veterans *Never Too Late* program and the Australian Public Service Games.
- An Umpires Committee has been established for the first time.
- Government funding has allowed for our first employee - a part-time Centre Manager.
- A Junior Academy has been established.

NEGATIVES

- Our membership is currently at 200 and so we will show a smaller than hoped for increase on last year.
- Junior Development is our greatest problem. Only one team can be sent to the Juniors this year.
- Board members are overworked.
- Publicity in the local media is difficult to obtain.
- Females, particularly young females, are under represented in our membership.

Table Tennis NSW has been very active during the 1996/97 financial period. With the large task of running the 1996 Australian Junior Championships behind us, we have begun to concentrate on the development of our playing numbers and administrative structures. With three new keen Directors, our Council is united and working hard for a better future for Table Tennis and overall there is new sense of positivity in NSW even though many of the old problems still remain.

At the time of writing this report, TTNSW is on the verge of appointing a person to the new position of Development Officer. This is long overdue in NSW; for years we have been talking about the necessity of "Development" and in the very near future we will have someone working specifically in this area. Linked to this important initiative is our new Junior Participation Plan put together by Warren Gray and Danielle Chan. This is an excellent document and will be the blueprint for the operations of the new Development Officer.

In mid-1996 we appointed Ron Pickering to the position of Administration Officer. Ron has successfully created and improved several resources for our members. We now have a TTNSW Equipment Catalogue, a more professional newsletter, a full list of playing venues and contact throughout NSW and work has started on a complete "Member's Services Guide" for 1998. These are important developments for enhancing the process of communication between TTNSW and our membership.

This year, TTNSW commenced the STIGA School Grade Competition series. These have been well patronised with an average of 100+ children participating in each event. Our Junior tournaments also continue to be successful with around 90 players in the NSW Junior Closed and Open. This year we had record entries of girls which is a good sign for the future. For the first time in at least five years, no event was cancelled in 1996/97. On the negative side, Senior and Veteran participation in tournaments is barely adequate. Our Council is addressing this issue in conjunction with our Tournament Committee. The lack of Senior women is a particular cause for concern (not only in NSW).

The number one issue in this State at the moment is the possible acquisition of a centre in the near future. Playing venues have been and still are the biggest impediment to the growth of Table Tennis in NSW. There is talk of at least four possible venues for a permanent headquarters before or just after Sydney 2000. TTNSW with TTA have been active in trying to seek a firm commitment from the government agencies involved. A new private centre has started in Cabramatta. The people involved with this initiative are trying to get the kids off the streets and into a worthwhile sporting activity. The response from the local community and the Table Tennis community in general has been excellent. The business community in Cabramatta supported their first tournament with \$4,000.00 prize money and in December 1997 they will run another Open event with \$10,000.00 prize money.

In 1996, Keith Bowler and Norma Callinan retired from TTNSW. How can I sum up in a paragraph two voluntary careers that almost span a century between them? Their contribution to Table Tennis in NSW has been invaluable. In recognition of their services,

both were awarded life membership of TTNSW and TTA some years ago. Keith extended his role into the international arena which last year rewarded his efforts with the equivalent of a life membership with the ITTF. Norma represented NSW as a player and for many years was our delegate to Table Tennis Australia. May I thank Keith and Norma for their hard work, advice and encouragement and wish them both a happy and healthy retirement.

If Table Tennis nationally is to take full advantage of Sydney 2000, it is a view of our State that a serious national effort should be made in NSW between now and the Olympics before the resources (perhaps) run out. Such an effort could feasibly result in the doubling of our registered members nationally and put Table Tennis on the Australian sporting map. The potential for Table Tennis in this State is mind boggling, particularly when we consider the European and Asian backgrounds of many of the people who live here. The 1997 Australian census revealed that NSW has a population over 6 million people; 3 and 1/2 million of them residing in Sydney. There is no such thing as a strong Australian sport that is not strong in NSW. Unfortunately, with our scant resources, TTNSW can only make limited and slow progress and it is therefore up to TTA to take full advantage of the Sydney 2000 Olympics or else maybe forever miss a wonderful opportunity. I repeat, this is not just a selfish NSW perspective but an issue of National significance to our sport.

As stated in the first paragraph, overall things are moving ahead in NSW. Except for the venue problem, most of the problems that do exist (e.g lack of female players and volunteers) also occur in other States and seem to be inherent within our sport. They are long term problems and we are confident that through the combination of realistic planning, hard work and Sydney 2000 we can go some way towards solving them. May I take this opportunity to thank the NSW Department of Sport for their continuing generous assistance.

Table Tennis Queensland Inc. is the new name of our association following a unanimous vote at the Annual General Meeting in March. Membership continues to fluctuate with a small decrease in numbers by the end of 1996. Again, the numbers will remain relatively consistent by the end of 1997 with no major changes expected. Some areas of the State have had noticeable increases in membership whilst others have had noticeable decreases. Positive discussions are continuing with other associations wishing to affiliate with Table Tennis Queensland Inc.

The first half of 1997 saw the departure of Lu Qi Wei, our State Coaching Director. Mr Lu's service over the three years had a very positive effect on many aspects of Table Tennis in Queensland. We welcomed another elite standard international coach in the form of Engelbert Hucing. His work so far has been of a very high standard and we look forward to continuing to see the rewards of his efforts.

We must again thank the Queensland Government through the Office of Sport and Recreation for their continued support of Table Tennis Queensland. Their financial and administrative support provide the opportunity to advance the sport in many ways.

Queensland representatives continue to perform well at all levels of Australian Championships. The last 12 months have seen a number of Australian Champions and very creditable performances. The Queensland teams selected to take part in Australian Championships this year are mostly of a high standard and are expected to be very competitive.

We continue to encourage the development of umpires and are pleased to see people taking the interest in acquiring higher levels of accreditation. This area of the sport in Queensland continues to be positive.

Finally I would like to thank all the players, Associations, Board of Management and Executive members which continue to support Table Tennis Queensland in many ways.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA

In February the State body had only one portfolio vacant and the Board of Management was a very enthusiastic group of people, willing to put in a great effort in the coming season.

State Selectors - a change in the nomination of selectors resulted in three groups of people, each representing the different age groups (juniors, seniors, veterans). This has proved to be successful, and introduced new members to sub-committees.

State Representation - South Australia was represented at the Arafura Games in Darwin by players (May 10-17) and teams were selected from the Australian Youth Championships, held in Melbourne during the Easter Yasaka tournament.

There is a problem with the Junior State teams, whereby no person has volunteered to act as Team Manager for this trip and the policy could be in the future that the players are asked to contribute towards a nominated person to act in this capacity. With the young players involved, the State Association is responsible for their well-being and it is necessary that we send a responsible person. However, I do thank those parents who have previously assisted during these trips.

Recognition - The President suggested that recognition of achievements by players be shown, and in this instant, Jenny Burford, winner of the Australian Over 40 Women's Singles at the National Veterans Championships was congratulated.

Coaching - Year 7 Camp was held on 2-6th December at Fort Largs and although the numbers were low, this proves to be a worthwhile exercise and plans are underway for the 1997 camp.

A visit by the National Coach (Jerzy Grycan) was held and some coaches attended a seminar, where the NC advised members of his plans for the next few years.

A new format has been introduced for the Level 1 Coaching Courses, whereby members register and attend a seminar at the Sports Institute and then complete a number of hours with a coach. This has proved successful.

The Director, J. Sior is currently preparing job specifications for the Director of Coaching position and the Junior Developments position.

Efforts are being made to form a Coaches Association, but no person was prepared to chair a sub committee and this idea will be re-considered at a later date.

National Veterans Championships - With the final accounts received for the National Veterans Championships, this resulted in a profit. An informal meeting of the National Veterans sub-committee was held at the home of Graham and Sandie Hoff, at Victor Harbour and a discussion on the do's and don't's of the Championships was tabled for future reference. Many thanks to the Hoffs for allowing us to meet at their home where some people remained overnight and a barbecue was arranged.

Officiating Committee - This committee continued with new officers for the coming year. A decision was supported that SATTA reimburse referees and umpires at SATTA sanctioned tournaments.

Country Activities - The Country Director had numerous ideas and will be encouraging discussion in the near future.

A Country and City competition was conducted in Port Pirie and although the city numbers were low, an enjoyable weekend was had by all. Many thanks to Port Pirie representatives

for their exceptional hospitality and it is hoped that this competition will continue on an annual basis.

Country tours in Victoria - Victoria interested in participating with SA but the timing for the event is to be considered.

Policy & Planning - the Director, G. Bungey advised members that he would be updating and recording changes to the various regulations and would liaise with the various Directors. After some discussion re the Sports Plan, it was decided to meet with the South Australian Sports Institute representatives, with the purpose being to explore the possibilities of Table Tennis becoming a funded sport by SASI.

The meeting proved to be significant and established that Table Tennis will not be accepted as a funded or supported sport by SASI, as they intend to cut back on already supported sports.

Table Tennis Australia National Camp - held in January, was attended by G. Tepper (NCD), A. Jakubczak (HPPM). The premises at the Police Academy at Fort Largs has been a great venue for the camps and will be used again in the future.

Members of the Board met with the visitors and discussed a Sports Plan.

The President, F. Whelan and Administration Director C. Langley, were invited to attend a meeting in Melbourne, with the Table Tennis Australia representatives. (President N. Harwood, NED R. Carlton, NDD W. Pruyn, NCD G. Tepper). They sought the direction in which South Australia would be taking and discussed various projects which may be introduced in the future.

TTA has introduced a National Insurance Scheme at \$2.00 per head, which is a compulsory fee, to be paid by all registered players. Members will be covered when they register with their local club or association provided that the registration reaches the respective State Office within 30 days. Members must claim within 30 days of sustaining an injury so the local club or association has a reasonable time frame in which to submit the registrations.

Manuals on Club Administration and Tournaments have been prepared by TTA and are available, if required.

TTA has introduced a Grand Prix between various States, with OAP players entered. The cost will be \$200.00 and TTA will advise us of the selected players for our State Championships. The States can nominate players, but will not necessarily gain those nominated. A points system has been prepared and the first to third players will receive cash incentives.

ACoRD System - with the assistance of Mr. Maurice Quinn, the ACoRD computer program is operational, but there are further adjustments to be made. A complete listing of all registered members has been entered and in the near future, a listing will be sent to each affiliate and I will require some further information as TTA require addresses and dates of birth.

Junior Development - National Development Director, Wilhelmina Pruyn, attending a meeting arranged for affiliates by Junior Development Director, G. Verall, and advised members of her plans for the development of the sport.

A Country meeting was also arranged that weekend, and country representatives appreciated being able to receive answers to questions, first hand.

Living Health - A Smoking Policy has been prepared and a copy distributed to all affiliates. We are asking all affiliates to support our Association and Living Health by making their venues smoke free areas.

I have highlighted some various activities and alternations to policies which have been implemented this year and there are numerous ventures yet to be considered.

In 1999, Adelaide will be the host city for the Australia Masters Games and in the near future a sub-committee will be formed.

TASMANIA

This year has proven very difficult for Tasmania Table Tennis.

With the funding cuts from TTA early in the year, we found it necessary to terminate the services of the State Development Officer in July. This had lead to concern by the parents of the children in the State Academy as to the on-going development of their children in our sport. We are in the process of going through a review with Sports & Recreation to try to secure some funding for the next three years and hopefully employ a State Development Officer again next year to keep up the interest and increase numbers.

It is of concern to Tasmania, and I think other States are experiencing the same problem, that the number of players who are taking part in the Australian Closed Championships is diminishing. This year we were unable to field a team in both the Men's and Women's events. Where are we going wrong? I am told that this is happening in most sports but we must find an answer to this problem.

We were not able to fill the position of Marketing or Publicity on the Board this year, and the other members tried to cover the gap but this is most unsatisfactory. We are looking at other sporting bodies and their structures with the help of Sports & Recreation to see if we can find a more suitable balance and I think this is something that TTA could investigate. The position of Director Administration was taken on by a new-comer to Table Tennis who knew nothing about the sport but was keen to learn. After a slow start, everything seems to be running smoothly now and I can assure Sally it does get easier.

The concept of National League is new to Tasmania this year and spectator numbers have not been as high as we hoped, but the experience gained by the Tasmania Juniors who are part of the team will be invaluable for their future. Without funding from major sponsors it is hard to get exposure for any sport and if this can be obtained Table Tennis will be more prominent at all levels.

Several of our Juniors performed well at the Australian Youth Championships at Easter and the Board will be doing all in its power to see that this success continues by putting strategies in place for the ongoing welfare of Table Tennis in Tasmania and we look forward to the outcome of the planning seminar in Melbourne in September.

VICTORIA

Throughout the year the only constant force has been the winds of change. TTV has a new Executive Director, a new stadium and perhaps a new culture.

After an exhaustive selection and interview process TTV appointed Graham Lockwood as Executive Director. Graham is a former Senior Executive with the AMCOR Group, having had extensive sales and marketing, manufacturing, profit management and corporate affairs experience. Graham is a Bachelor of Commerce and a Certified Practising Accountant. Graham has had an extensive competitive sporting career in tennis, cricket, football, squash and table tennis.

Graham brings to Table Tennis Victoria a wealth of experience in business and community service and a strong empathy with all ball sports. Graham has quickly come to grips with the issues involving Table Tennis in Victoria and played a significant role in the negotiations regarding the Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre (MSAC). TTV has signed a Licence Agreement with the MSAC Trust which ensures that TTV will be "no worse off" financially and if MSAC reaches the targets set out in their business plan TTV will be much better off.

The negotiations regarding MSAC have been tough and protracted but TTV is confident that the financial viability of TTV has been ensured. The move to an International standard facility has been met with universal endorsement from players and spectators alike. It is hoped that this facility will usher in a new era for table tennis in Victoria with an increase in player numbers and a consequent improvement in player standards whilst adding to the image and culture of the sport. The new era formally commenced with the official opening on July 24 and TTV commenced occupation of its new office on July 28.

TTV is no longer in the venue management business and the time and energy of the Board and staff can now be directly entirely to the promotion and development of Table Tennis throughout the length and breadth of Victoria.

TTV conducted the 1997 Australian Youth Championships in conjunction with the Yasaka Easter Classic. The Youth Championships attracted a significant increase in the usual number of entries and perhaps these Championships may have secured a permanent spot on the tournament calendar. Victoria was successful in both Men's and Women's Under 20 Teams events and Wayne Gerada dominated the individual events annexing the triple crown.

Victoria sent two Men's teams to the Arafura Games in Darwin and all players were delighted with the hospitality extended by their Northern Territory hosts and gained valuable matchplay and experience in the process.

Victorian players represented the City of Melbourne in the inaugural Ho Chi Minh International Inter-City Championships. The Men's team comprising Russell Lavale, Simon Gerada and Trevor Brown won the team event whilst the Women's team of Miao Miao and Shirley Zhou were runners-up. Russell and Miao reached the semi final and quarter final of their respective singles events.

The following Victorian players represented Australia at the World and Commonwealth Championships: Miao Miao, Shirley Zhou, Yvonne Li, Russell Lavale, Mark Smythe, Simon Gerada and Trevor Brown.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA

With the exception of Publicity & Promotion, all Board of Management positions were filled in 1997. Russell Lamborn (President), Peter Mascall (Coaching), Brian Lauri (Social & Fund Raising) and myself (Finance) continued in their 1996 positions as did Executive Director Bob Lake. Chris Marsh returned after a year's absence to take up the Match Directors portfolio whilst Ralph Kober took on the position of Tournament Director. Peter Mascall continued as editor of the long standing Association newsletter "21 Up".

Although it is disappointing Western Australia has difficulty in raising Senior and Youth State teams, it is pleasing that Veteran activities in this area have continued to grow. Even though seldom represented in all divisions, participation in the National Junior Championships remains about constant. The emergence of junior players from Albany is a credit to the efforts of Peter Muller.

Regrettably the level of Government and other sponsorship decreased over the past year. Cuts to Healthway (Western Australian Health Promotion Foundation) sponsorship have resulted in a reduction in activities in the area of coaching (school holidays clinics, club & adult) and other areas even though these activities have been maintained at a healthy level. A 'Tots' program for 4 to 7 year olds initially received a positive result. Also some success was achieved in assisting new clubs at Rockingham and Australind.

In spite of the cutbacks, the Association's financial position continues to improve mainly due to the profit from the Centre. After having an application for funding for a joint centre with Badminton knocked back, work still continues on this project. It is hopeful that a future (modified) application will receive more favourable treatment.

As for 1996, six Open Championships and a grand prix series were held together with Spring, Summer, Winter, Veteran and Social Pennant competitions. Due to scheduling changes two 'Town & Country State Open Championships' were held in the year under review the second as part of the National Grand Prix. The visit of leading players Russell Lavale, Paul Langley, Miao Miao and Tammy Gough as part of the Grand Prix gave a tremendous lift to the Championship.

The last 12 months has seen a substantial increase in activity and participation, particularly at junior and Veterans level. Overall numbers have not increased, however increases are anticipated following flow on from activities that have commenced in 1977.

The Association has been actively involved in two major events, Arafura Games and the National Veterans.

The Arafura Games were held in May 1997, a BI-annual event in Darwin, attracting approximately 4000 competitors from throughout the Asian/Pacific region. This year marked the first time Table Tennis was included and resulted in a very successful event, due in part to the great efforts of coordinator Peter Ezzy. Competitors from Hong Kong, Makau, China, Malaysia, New Zealand, Philippines, Victoria and South Anstralia were included in the event. The event was held at a Darwin Highschool Gymnasium (Air-conditioned with two Tables) and although conditions were considered to be good, this venue is not likely to be large enough for the 1999 event given the interest we have already received. The games are promoted as regional and as such, National teams are not sought. The standard however for the 97 Event was well above participating local and interstate players.

Significant planning and organizing for the 97 Veterans continued throughout the last 12 months. A core of Darwin players undertook the majority of work, headed up by Tournament Organizer Mike Butcher.

Both the above Events have assisted in increasing the organizational skills and equipment levels in the N.T. and I am hopeful that this will be a catalyst for further development of the sport throughout the N.T.

Junior development in Darwin and Alice Springs continued to be active with preparation for the first Entry in a National Junior Event planned for September 1997. Two Teams are proposed to be sent to Victoria. Ted Field continues to devote a considerable amount of his time to Junior activities.

Further Development of the smaller regions remains a priority, it is expected that Jabiru, Yalara, Nhulunbuy and Katherine all have the potential to support some form of activity given the population and current level of informal play.

Northern Territory Government Grants have continued at similar levels to previous years, however this year conditions have changed. The association is now required to prepare and submit a Business Plan with appropriate goals. Funding priorities will generally be set by the Association with a lump sum payment in lieu of previous activity by activity grants.

The Alice Springs Association has sought to include Table Tennis in the 1978 Masters Games held BI Annually in Alice Springs. This will result in further demand for a full time Venue, currently a restricting factor on development.

The Northern Territory Government has informally announced its intentions to construct a new Multi-purpose facility in Darwin to include Table Tennis. This is expected to replace the current venue leased by the NITTA. Few details are available at present but the association is keen to pursue this as a potential new home and venue for Arafura Games.

The association is again in debt to Secretary Mike Butcher for his considerable efforts in leading the association through a busy year.

Major Sponsors this year have been Northern Territory Government, QUIT, Karama Tavern and Darwin Bobcat Hire.
