

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The highlight of the year was the successful staging of the World Veterans Table Tennis Championships in Melbourne. The Championship's attracted a record entry of 1800 players together with 500 accompanying partners. It was an ambitious logistical and financial undertaking which served to harness the latent resources within T.T.A.

The result was a Championship of unprecedented professionalism and commercial success. The success was due significantly to the efforts of the Executive Staff in particular, Ron Carlton as General Manager and the Management Committee.

The National League competition continues into its second full season. It is pleasing to note that a Sydney Club has entered a team, taking the competition closer to being a truly National competition. The Clubs have made sporadic and isolated efforts to attract crowds and present the matches as entertainment.

The finals of the National League should provide a much needed impetus through television coverage, crowd support and a professional presentation.

The challenge for T.T.A in 94-95 will be to obtain sponsorship for the National League and to ensure the Clubs attract sufficient local support to remain commercially viable.

The introduction of the controversial tender system for National Championships came to fruition in Geelong for the Junior Championships. The Championships were a unanimous success and demonstrated the merit of the new system.

It is disappointing to note that Player Registrations continue to remain flat to lower. This is a disturbing trend as our Government funding and commercial appeal is linked to player numbers. In some cases the decline in player registrations is merely a reflection of Affiliated Associations refusing to register players with the State Association. Steps are being taken to ensure that the registration of all players is a condition of Affiliation.

The T.T.A. Board of Management is pleased to acknowledge the appointment of two independent Directors to the Board, Alan Frankenburg and Brendan Downey. The appointment of these two independents completes the Board re-structure.

It is apparent that some of the State Associations are struggling to meet the demands of the modern environment. In particular, I refer to NSW and SA. NSW have displayed considerable movement, but questionable progress. SA have made best efforts to form a cohesive Board but are finding it difficult to attract capable volunteers.

In summary, it is fair to say that considerable progress has been made for the financial year 93-94. However, our sport remains a long way behind in terms of player numbers, commercial appeal and international competitiveness. If we are to improve our status then "considerable progress" may not be sufficient to ensure our long term viability. We need to make some quantum leaps forward in order to ensure our financial security and ensure our international competitiveness.

VICE PRESIDENT, ELITE DEVELOPMENT

This year saw some dramatic changes to our elite program and some opportunities for future changes.

Over the past years our "Academy" has been operated as an adjunct to the Victorian Institute of Sport Program.

The V.I.S. decided from December 1993 to not support Table Tennis on a full time program and our program was in danger of also being disrupted. It was only through the strong efforts of our National Coaching Director, Ron Moule, and our Executive Director, Rod Lindroth, that the Australian Sports Commission provided funds for a National Coach. The VTTA provided free table hire and the Academy continued albeit in a restricted form.

At the same time as the situation with the Academy was being resolved the Australian Olympic Committee was promoting a proposal to put in place a plan to maximise performance of all sports at the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney. The project, named the Gold Medal Plan, really raised the expectation of players and administrators within our sport and at the time of writing this report it seems that benefits will not materialise at the expected level.

It seems that the Gold Medal Plan, now known as the Olympic Athlete Program, will provide for a coach, a program manager, sports science, funding for international competition and some financial assistance for targeted athletes. I do not think that it will provide funding for player relocation to Melbourne or player support training overseas. The decision regarding our allocation will be made in the next few weeks.

I wish to express my disappointment that once again this year Table Tennis Australia has not been able to financially support the development of our athletes and contribute materially to the cost of competing internationally. If we are to make an impact on the international rankings more support from the Table Tennis community must be forthcoming.

Despite the selection outlined above I am very pleased with the effort made by players and in particular their performances internationally. We competed in the Global Youth Championships in Tokyo, the Commonwealth Championships in Hyderabad and the Oceania Championships in Papeete, Tahiti. The Bronze medal in the Women's Team event at the Commonwealth and the absolute dominance of our Australian's at Oceania were highlights.

These performances were attained as a result of hard work and sacrifice of individuals. Players are relocating from other States to be part of the development scene in Melbourne and many of our players are now competing and living in Europe in our "off" season. The moves are being made, with very little help financially, and show the desire of our players to succeed.

On the National scene I applaud the advances made by the National League and I see this competition vital to our elite development program.

I wish to record my appreciation to:

- * Zhou Lan Sun who worked under difficult conditions and without the total support of the Table Tennis population. The players do benefit from his technical expertise
- * Ron Moule for his assistance and wise counsel
- * Rod Lindroth and his staff for their total support
- * Fellow Board Members.

NATIONAL EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The rapid rate of change and improvements that commenced in 1992-93 continued into 93-94. Table Tennis Australia, as an organisation, is now the equal if not better than all sports of our size. We are running along business principles and almost daily are upgrading our work methods. Our hope is that it will not be long before the States/Territories are working along similar lines and with similar goals and ambitions.

A great deal has happened in the last year.

- National Computer rankings introduced and expanded.
- * The National League has graduated to a full home and away basis.
- * Our visual image was designed and introduced.
- * A corporate image has been introduced (ie: A.T.T.A. to T.T.A.).
- * The World Veterans Championships were successfully conducted.
- We continued to make improvements to our constitution.
- * For the first time Australian Championships were awarded following a "bid" process.
- * An Australian Veterans team travelled to North America (USA and Canada).
- Australian teams competed throughout the world: New Caledonia (Noumea International) Japan (Global Youth Championships) India (Commonwealth Championships) Tahiti (Oceania Championships)
- * The T.T.A. Membership program became fully operational.
- * The sports `Officiating' section is now under the control of an "Executive" rather than a large Committee.
- * We have recruited people with specific expertise from outside of the sport to assist us.
- A merchandising program has been commenced.
- * We have begun researching our options relating to an intensive training centre, office, club etc.
- We have sent questionnaires to all of Australia's 867 local councils seeking data on our sport.
- * We have planned a market survey of our members for late this year.
- * Data has been compiled that gives us direct access to all of Australia's Newspapers.
- * Since November 1992 our professional staff has increased from two full time to four full time, one almost full time and two part time. We now have a quality office arrangement with the best of electronic equipment. Hopefully you will have noticed significant improvements in the presentation and the quality of work from our office. As we become more proficient with our equipment, so the quality will get even better.
- Our Training Camp program continues to improve.
- * T.T.A. has taken over (from the V.I.S.) all aspects of our Elite program.

- * We have spent a considerable amount of time and money developing a Gold Medal Plan strategy.
- * We have commenced an assessment of our Structure with some changes already being implemented (ie. Independent Board Members).
- * A 'sponsors presentation package' is nearing completion.
- * In excess of \$ 70,000 worth of Joola equipment has been brought and sold. (A little is being kept for our own purposes).
- * We have been heavily involved with the ASC "Mature Aged Sport" project (Three State and one National Seminars).
- * Considerable time has been spent on issues relating to States (particularly NSW).
- * Research has taken place concerning T.T.A. hosting major International events (I.T.T.F. All Stars, Asian Veterans, World Championships, World Team Cup).
- * T.T.A continued to be represented in major forums e.g. CAS, ASC, AOC, ITTF, OTTF, ACC together with many other seminars etc.
- * The Hong Kong Sports Institute (Table Tennis) visit was most successful.
- * A great number of National League matters are being dealt with including the formulation of a licence form and licence agreement.
- * We have commenced research with the possibility of becoming a Company incorporated with the Australian Securities Commission.
- * Efforts are being made to extend the benefits available to our members.
- * We have been extremely fortunate to "recruit" Mallesons Stephen Jaques as our Honorary Solicitors.

And so this list could go on and on. All I have listed are the main points. There are literally hundreds of issues, programs, projects, events, etc that we deal with during a year. Far too many to detail in this document. It is important to note that almost everything we do, we do with the aim and in the hope of benefiting Table Tennis.

On the down side there has been a great deal of NON productive time spent on issues such as "Glue", Disputes and Rubber. This is a very frustrating part of my job. We have too much to do with matters of a positive nature, to be bogged down by attempts to prevent "cheating" or to resolve issues that are of no material benefit.

One of the problems confronting Table Tennis Australia is that no matter how good changes and improvements are at National level, they mean nothing, if they are not implemented at State and/or Regional level. The determination and vision of some must be the determination and vision of all if we are to see a better future for Table Tennis. I appeal to all who read this to assess their role and the role of their organisation. We must all have the highest of ideals, achievable goals, be ambitious - all with the strong desire to see Table Tennis progress towards one of the high profile Australian Sports.

The start point is "The Vision". From this you develop strategies, that lead to the vision becoming reality. Table Tennis Australia is very keen to help any Club or Association in Australia to develop "The Vision" and to formulate strategies aimed at turning the vision into reality.

Our vision is to see a Membership of in excess of 20,000, Gold Medallists at International level and Table Tennis as a high profile sport. The business plan is our means of achieving this vision. It will certainly take many years to reach fulfilment. (We are already 2 years down the track). However, we must accept the long term nature of the program and be determined to find our way through all barriers.

There have been a number of staff changes during the year:

Anne Oakley finished as Development Officer

Kelly O'Shea joined us (on a Government Traineeship Scheme) and assisted with the Administration.

Ron Carlton completed his task as General Manager of the World Veterans Championships, and commenced as the Development Officer Donna Wilson is working with us for 6 months as part of the Governments "Jobskills" program.

In conclusion I wish to comment as follows:

- * Congratulations to everyone involved with the World Veterans Championships The hundreds of Volunteers, the Management Committee, Umpires, Referees, Ron Carlton, Sharon Graham, Kelly O'Shea. This was a superb event - the best ever! All of the people referred to above deserve all the plaudits. Well done.
- * Thanks to The Australian Sports Commission for their continued financial (and Physical) support. If it weren't for the Commission it would be impossible to achieve anything let alone the rapid progress of the last 2 years.
- * I wish to pass on a personal vote of thanks to all of our staff who do an excellent job often under very trying circumstances.
- * Thankyou to Steve Knapp, TTA Board Members and State Delegates for their courtesy and consideration during the year.
- * I appreciate very much the support of the various State/Territory administrations. No names listed, as I don't want to inadvertently leave someone off. Thankyou for what you do.

1. The highlights of the preceding coaching year include:

- * The visit by the Hong Kong Women's Team and the three training camps for players and coaches in Victoria, A.C.T. and N.S.W. respectively.
- * The success of the Tasmanian State Institute at the National Junior Championships was a reflection of what long term planning and cooperation between states and T.T.A. can achieve. The players motivation, Peter Ma Sen's and his assistants coaching, the administrative skills of David Wilson and the early planning and financial assistance from T.T.A. demonstrate the symbiosis of good infrastructure and coaching to player development.
- * Seven Junior Training Camps and three National Team preparation programs for the Commonwealth, World, Youth and Oceania Championships.
- * Coaching Finances, combined with the TTA Financial Statement, indicated a solid financial base resulting from low overheads, grants, sponsorships, manuals and video sales and camps have produced a surplus to upgrade all our manuals in 94/95 and contribute revenue to T.T.A.
- * The Elite Coaching Program at the Academy has produced excellent results at Oceania, laid a good foundation for the Asians, World Team Cup, Commonwealth and Worlds for the remainder of 94/95.

Other highlights have been:

- * Successful negotiations with the A.S.C. to re-finance the Academy after the withdrawal of V.I.S. funds in October 1993. Without this achievement there would have been no elite program in 1994.
- * Excellent preparation for Oceania with the Academy Program supplemented by training with former world champions and then the Hong Kong Team. A very successful outcome for our National Coach.
- * The Academy policy of attracting young interstate players to the Academy has been reflected in good performances at state, national and international level.
- * The overseas scholarship fund of \$10,000.00 provided by the A.S.C. has assisted 8 players with overseas and interstate opportunities, identifying and developing talent that will underpin our team towards the Sydney 2000 Olympics. These players are either already overseas for 1994/95 or have their international schedules planned. This entrenchment of international involvement in our Table Tennis standards and culture is crucial to our future.
- * The encouragement and placement of experienced overseas coaches in state and regional centres has risen to 9, ensuring elevated local standards and production of talented young players. Inclusion of Mr Alex Jacubczak in the Graduate Coaching Diploma Course from the A.C.C.
- * The Gold Medal Plan proposed in 1993 will be introduced within weeks as the Olympic Athlete Program. These funds, while not the amounts we were led to believe we might attain, will still make a very useful contribution to our elite development and the raising of our sporting profile. It is a very good time to be a young player with international aspirations.

2.

National Coaching Accreditation Scheme

- * Reaccreditation and Upgrading was commenced in 1993 but the implementation and responses within the States has not been good. We will need all of the next 4 months to meet our responsibilities and the A.C.C. deadlines.
- * Coaching Course reviews are underway and will be ready for submission to the A.C.C. by the due dates.
- * Administration. The loss of our N.D.O., the protracted work on the O.A.P. and the Hong Kong Tour delays have created a substantial series of challenges or problems, depending on how you see them, and have swamped this first year of the half-time N.D.C. position. The increasingly professional standards of coaching administration required by Canberra and State governments sorely tests our volunteer administration structures in the 8 affiliates of T.T.A. The number of operating State Coaching Directors has varied between 2 and 4 throughout the year. To those who service the coaching programs my heartfelt thanks for holding the line under difficult pressures.
- * Manuals. The present system of production is labour intensive but cost effective and flexible to the point that we have the resources to upgrade all existing manuals - and workbooks in 94/95.
- * Sports Sciences. Our incorporation of the sports sciences still has some way to go, however increased psychology services were provided to players and camp programs. Eric Rosario added conditioning programs to Sports Specific Level II. Coaching Courses in Tasmania and Queensland in addition to his work with camps and players. Efforts to involve umpires in this area are underway.

In addition to our 4 previous N.S.R.P. projects, Tertiary Institutions have lodged projects for studies of Nutrition and Sports Psychology in Table Tennis.

3. Schools Development

We have advanced from the prospect of no Championships in 1994 to being able to underwrite the cost of holding the event at the Australian Institute of Sport in "The Cannons Palace". Sponsorships for \$1,000.00 worth of equipment for prizes has been negotiated. The aim is 50 schools and a team from each State. This is achievable if regional affiliates can recognise the difference between knowing that promotion in schools is difficult and doing something, administratively financially and coaching about the difficulties. Moves are underway to incorporate a Primary Schools Carnival in the same venue and at the same time in 1995.

4. Wharmby Foundation

After the year 2000 funding for our elite program will decline and unless Table Tennis is ready to assume that responsibility we will revert to the structural weaknesses that have hindered our development throughout this century. The B.O.M. has endorsed the Wharmby Foundation to address this situation and by the time of the AGM the final administrative framework and the first fundraising program will be underway.

5. Conclusion

In assessing the year against the National Coaching Plan we have made some progress in most areas and retained flexibility to take opportunities as they have arisen. There is still much to do and improve upon.

NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT OFFICER

Following the culmination of the 7th World Veterans Table Championships it was a great relief to spend two weeks winding down by attempting to pull together all the remaining loose ends and then take two weeks holiday as per my contract. I was flattered and readily agreed to accept the position of Development Officer of Table Tennis Australia when Rod Lindroth approached me with a concrete offer. It is my belief that Table Tennis is poised to undergo a resurgence in this country and my feeling was that it would be exciting to be part of that process.

In my position as General Manager of the World Veterans Championships I was privileged to visit many Table Tennis centres throughout Australia. From Cairns, Mackay, Townsville, Brisbane, Albert Park, Ballarat, Geelong and many others I observed a set of facilities that were excellent. I also met many hard working loyal and often inspired people working hard to make our sport attractive in what is a challenging and varied marketplace.

Make no mistake. We are in a competitive and commercial world where many sports are after a diminishing commercial dollar and a fickle potential group of participants. It is easy to be pessimistic about our sport and its impact on the community.

I am fortunate in one sense. I can see the big picture and can come to appreciate the many people working hard out there in the marketplace. For a marketplace it is. You have to sell the sport. You have to pass on your enthusiasm for your recreation and convince others that they will derive the pleasure you do from it. That is not hard if you believe in it and love it. You do not have to be a super salesperson to radiate your love for your sport. We have seen an increase in registration at National level for the last two years, albeit slight. It is my belief participation rates are increasing. I believe just as many people are playing the game now as were twenty years ago.

We are a developing sport but real development revolves around numbers. The more registered the more strength you have. Politicians take note of it. Numbers means votes. Commercial organisations take note of it. Numbers mean increased sales. You cheat your sport by not registering members. Numbers means finance. Finance means programs, coaching, development, courses both coaching and administrative. Numbers mean credibility and pride.

Convince your local club that registering of all members is imperative.

At Table Tennis Australia we are developing. The Staff has grown from Rod Lindroth and a part time secretary to six full time employees and one part time. This is in response to the programs being generated and the success of the World Veterans Championships.

A major priority of the National body is to develop the National League. Sports that have grown and created high public profile all have successful National Leagues. Table Tennis has a real and viable National League. Identify your local club and get along and support it. The National League will be part of the Development Officers portfolio. We have secured ten minutes television time Nationally for the 1994 final. We hope to attract a sponsor both for this event and the League in 1995. It is imperative that the League succeeds and we at Table Tennis Australia will be doing our utmost to ensure it does.

We are endeavouring to run one major international event each year to inspire players to be better and to encourage non players to become part of the sport.

We are bidding for a major international event for 1999 to be run as a pre Olympic event. We are planning a National Membership drive involving all clubs and associations throughout Australia and we hope to release details in the latter half of this year. We are upgrading the presentation of all major events on the Table Tennis calendar by working in liaison with all successful tenders for National events.

At the time of writing my time in the Development Officer's position had been brief. Next year in this publication I hope to be writing of achievements rather than plans.

Let me say that amongst all the negativity I can only see positives, that the potential of the sport is limitless. We have a game that everyone can play. This is its strength and its weakness. It means people can wander down to a local club and start playing immediately. It also means that because of the casual nature of the game they escape the State or National registration net. Let us build on this strength together to make everyone part of the Table Tennis family.

It would have been easy to aim to do better than the two previous World Veterans Championships but as their track record had been found wanting the Management Committee set very high standards and they were all met.

The general consensus from overseas players, officials and visitors was that these Championships were simply the "Biggest and the Best". Every person connected with the Championships deserves a good pat on the back for a job extremely well done.

Umpiring

Table Tennis Australia's Umpires Committee was of course also equally busy with the World Veterans Championships and performed magnificently.

The Executive Committee are K. Bowler (Chairman), I. Finlay (Secretary), F. Keyhoe and R. Gallagher who resigned and his replacement is M.Sherman.

Ron Keyhoe umpired at the 2nd Global World Youth Championships in Japan with distinction.

At the Oceania Championships in Tahiti Fran Keyhoe was the Referee and Ron Keyhoe was Deputy Referee. Fran Keyhoe has been appointed Oceania Umpires Co-ordinator.

I.T.T.F. RULES AND REGULATIONS

As Council Member, Oceania, I attended the 1994 Meeting of the I.T.T.F. held in Tianjin, China, during May.

Thirty-six proposals were dealt with by Council on a wide spread number of issues, from changes in the length of games to limiting entries in World Championships, to glue, the subject that won't go away.

A summary of decisions made at this meeting will be available in the near future and will be sent to all State Associations. However, I will mention two of the more controversial issues, those of shortened games and glue.

Games to 11 Up:

Five European countries moved that the I.T.T.F. experiment world-wide, with 11-up games in all tournaments. This was not carried. However, it was agreed that an organiser of Open Championships can apply for permission to conduct games up to 11 points. This will almost certainly happen throughout Europe, where there is considerable opinion that 21 point games are too long, containing too many unnecessary or 'dead' points. Maybe, it's preferable to say that in 11-up games, every point is vital, no points can be given away without a fight.

BUT PLEASE NOTE, this Rule will apply to International Open Championships only. If State or Affiliated Associations wish to continue with 21-up games, they can, just as they can play 31 or 57 up games, if they so desire at the present time.

The Glue Issue:

On the subject of liquid glues, from now until August 1995 (Internationals), I.T.T.F. Approved Liquid Glues and PSA sheets (glue sheets) can be used for affixing rubber to blades. After that date, Internationally only PSA Sheets are legal. The Australian Association will have to study these dates, as they are in the middle of our season.

Advice has been received that a number of manufacturers are spending a lot of time and effort in attempting to develop non-toxic liquid glues, such as water based glues, as in many areas, there are strong anti-PSA Sheet feelings.

World Championships:

The size of future World Championships and a possible quota system, was another important topic which could have major implications for Australia. The International Table Tennis scene is still recovering from the record entry at the 1993 Championships in Gothenburg, with its expenditure reaching some US4-5 million dollars.

After the 1995 Worlds in Tianjun, China, bids for future World Championships are few. Yugoslavia has an option, still to be confirmed, for 1997. Germany withdrew from 1997 because of costs. Council had no alternative but to sanction the Executive Committee the right to proceed with a possible quota system if need be for 1997.

If a quota system restricting entry to World Championships were to be set at 48 teams, Australia would have to watch carefully its rankings, especially men, if a non-Continental Zone quota system was adopted.

Treated Rubber Sheets:

A new problem has arisen and first came to our knowledge during the World Veterans Championships. Rubbers are being treated by such means as lasers, the rubber re-packaged and sold as a 'special' or varied rubber. Naturally, the supplementary treatment alters the character of the rubber from that originally approved by the I.T.T.F.

The I.T.T.F. Executive Board are to discuss this problem early in September. We await their decision with interest. Keith Bowler

- 1. It is very pleasing to report that Ian Finlay and Phil Males are now fully qualified I.T.T.F. Referees. Ian and Phil had passed the written and theory sections of this examination some years back in Malaysia but both had to wait for the World Veterans Championships for their practical examination.
 - 2. Also, during the year, R. Glasson (Victoria) passed the I.T.T.F. Umpires examination.
 - 3. This was the first year of Table Tennis Australia's Umpires Executive which replaced the previous Umpires Committee. The Executive, K. Bowler, F. Keyhoe, I. Finlay and R. Gallagher, met during the World Veterans Championships and discussed a wide range of issues and made several recommendations to the Board. With one exception, all were carried and one matter deferred.
 - 4. Subsequently, Mr. R. Gallagher resigned his position and was replaced by Maureen Sherman.
 - 5. A Table Tennis Australia Refereeing examination has been established and will commence operating during 1994. The first examiners will be I. Finlay and P. Males.
 - 6. Mrs. F. Keyhoe has been appointed Table Tennis Australia Umpires Recruitment Officer. Fran has already conducted her first recruitment course in South Australia.
 - 7. Approaches have already been made to the I.T.T.F. regarding allocation of Australian Officials to Olympic duties for the Sydney Year 2000 Games.

It is probable that one Deputy Referee for the Atlanta Games will be an Australian Official.

At the I.T.T.F. Council Meeting in Tianjin, the condition the International Umpires aged over 60 be not considered for International matches was lifted, with the onus of competency being left to National Associations.

1. **Overseas Competition**, (August 1993)

A contingent of Australian Veteran players visited the USA and Canada. A full report on this tour has been presented.

The development of further international competitions is to be encouraged in both Oceania and South East Asia.

2. National Championships NSW (October 1993)

A detailed report and summary of meetings held have been fowarded seperately. This was a highly enjoyable event which received record participation. The honorary membership of two local football clubs close to the facility promoted an opportunity for combined social contact every evening of the Championships and was much appreciated. The holding of the event in a regional centre away from the capital city provided a very relaxed atmosphere and was a credit to the Illawarra and NSW associations.

National Forum on Mature Aged Sport - Brisbane (November) 3.

We were represented at this forum by Jean Dorries of Queensland. The forum followed on from the joint initiative of the Australian Sports Commission and the Confederation of Australian Sport to investigate the arena of Mature Aged Sport in Australia. Following recomendations in a November 1992 report "Play On" one of the suggestions was that the Australian Sports Commission should establish or coordinate service for Mature Aged Sport to work with National Sporting Organisations and State Departments of Sport to help them develop programs to involve more mature aged Australians in regular sporting activity.

Four major areas of the forum were identified:

- To provide direction and cohesion in the growth of mature aged sport.
- * To increase the status of mature aged sport and to develop a clearer understanding of the product.
- To develop strategies that national and sporting organisations can utilise to
- promote the mature age sporting events/games. To improve the quality of mature aged sporting events/games and address the problems of ad hoc development.

I recommend the proceedings to all who are interested.

4. Strategic Development Plan

Workshops were conducted in Unanderra, Hobart, Sydney and Adelaide and all who participated provided valuable imput into the formulation of a plan which was drafted in Melbourne during the World Veterans Championships.

The enthusiasm of workshop participants is most encouraging, many gained personally from the experience.

The work is now in front of us to develop and recruit volunteers to administer the expected explosive growth ahead.

I recommend the Strategic Development Plan for adoption by T.T.A.

5. World Veterans Championships, Melbourne (April 1994)

There has already been much reported about the success of these Championships.

On behalf of Australian Veteran players I acknowledge our appreciation of the foresight of those who captured the event for Melbourne and congratulate and thank those who contributed much of their valuable time in organisation of the event and had the stamina to ensure it was successfully executed. This is a major shot in the arm for Table Tennis in Australia and contacts made can now be nurtured for further international competition.

6. Acknowledgments

We wish to thank the Board of Table Tennis Australia for their continued support to Veterans Table Tennis and to the Australian Sports Commission and Confederation of Australian Sport who not only supplied funds for the development of the Strategic Plan and provided Ron Burns assistance as a facilitator during the workshops, but were also a major sponsor to the World Veterans Championships. Ron's affable assistance made our task clear and effective.

NATIONAL COMPUTER RANKING SYSTEM

- * The computer ranking system has been on trial again during 1994 and appears to maintain a high degree of accuracy when compared with a manual ranking.
- For this year ranking lists have been produced on a monthly basis with a top 100 men and women now being published.
- * Currently only a senior ranking list for both men and women is possible although results for Youth, and Junior U/17 & U/15 are being input and contribute to determining a senior ranking.
- * Recent correspondence with the ITTF suggests that they may be willing to undertake further development of the software to set up separate data bases for all recognised player age groups. This would enable us to more easily produce ranking lists for our own age groupings. If this does not occur I propose to duplicate the system a number of times and run individual systems for each age group commencing in 1995. This may require the purchase of additional memory for the computer.
- * Support from the States with providing results is on the whole OK however it should be noted that timely arrival of results is imperative to ensure up to date rankings. Numbers of tournaments being input this year has increased with Queensland now contributing many results. The quality of results/information provided is still inadequate in some cases and there is much room for improvement in some States with draw methodology and presentation (women playing in the Men's Singles?).
- * Some queries are starting to arise on the mechanics of the system which does suggest a healthy interest by players. There may be a need to produce a handout on the system and how it works before it has any official stature. At the moment event weightings are determined by the National Selectors and may differ from player expectations. For example National League which has limited player participation has a very high weighting. Is this equitable?
- * I propose that computer rankings replace manual rankings for men's and women's competition during 1995 and that computer rankings for other age groups (excluding veterans) be produced on a trial basis.

Vale:

The A.C.T. Table Tennis community (and no doubt the Australian and New Zealand Table Tennis communities and many other organisations and individuals) was saddened at the untimely death of Graham Lassen.

Though in Canberra for only a year Graham had established himself as a fine player, an even better coach and a very lovely person. The A.C.T.T.T.A. expressed sympathy to Graham's family and to his friend, Julia, and has instituted a perpetual trophy in his name.

New Centre:

The over-riding concern and energies of the A.C.T.T.T.A. throughout the year have been directed at the provision of a new centre. Unfortunately negotiations with an established sporting body to build abutting their premises fell through. There are still four irons in the fire, but until such time as a larger, better equipped centre is established development of the sport in Canberra is stifled. It is even true to say that table tennis has gone slightly backwards because of the negative impact of our current playing conditions. In addition the above, open events have had to be curtailed.

C.A.P.S.:

There has been significant progress with C.A.P.S. Six participants have completed Step 1 and two have commenced in Step 2. Three co-ordinators facilitate the work of the participants.

Jeff Plumb:

Our Association congratulates Jeff on his many outstanding achievements during the year, the latest being a member of the winning Australian U/19 team in the recent Oceania Championships held in Tahiti, runner-up in the U/19 Men's Singles and also in the U/19 Men's Doubles.

Schools:

Forty-nine high school teams entered the 1994 inter-school competitions. This is again a record and bodes well for the future of Table Tennis in the A.C.T.

Coaches:

Regular coaching has been extended from two to five sessions a week to accommodate the increase in numbers. One coach is completing Level 2, eight finished Level 1 and fifteen have done Level 0.

Competitions:

Three competitions were held during the year with four grades in each. The Autumn Competition trialled the "best-of-5, 11-up format". Reactions were mixed, of course, but perhaps surprisingly a significant minority found some favour in the trial. The results of this trial have been outlined and a copy given to Table Tennis Australia.

Membership:

There has been a small increase in membership in 1994. While there has been significant turnover the total exceeded 110 for the first time for many years.

Representative Teams:

A.C.T. has entered teams in the Australian Open Championships, the Australian Juniors and the Australian Veterans. Many individuals have competed in other Championships and a large contingent went to the N.S.W. Country Titles.

Senior Citizens:

A thriving senior citizens group of some thirty individuals enjoys the sport on Monday and Thursday mornings. One couple even comes across from Young each week to join in the festivities. This group supplies a C.A.P.S. co-ordinator and four other members have offered their services in the Volunteers Register.

Women/Girls in Sport:

Our Executive Director, Glenys Joliffe, is a Director on the Board of the A.C.T. Women in Sport & Recreation (A.C.T.T.T.A. is a member of this lobby group) and attended a four-day Seminar on Women in Sport. Focus on Marketing and Management, in April this year. This seminar was open to all sporting groups in the A.C.T. and she hopes to be able to implement some of the knowledge gained from it. There are twenty-two women/girls at present playing in our main competition season of the year, our highest number ever. This number covers a large range of ages and abilities (including coaching and C.A.P.S.) which is good for the future of females in table tennis in the A.C.T., as it gives excellent support for the junior/school students progressing into the ranks.

Summary:

In comparative terms A.C.T. Table Tennis is very small, but there are many encouraging signs, including a dedicated committee, significant growth in schools and junior coaching and the various possibilities for a new centre. We look forward to 1995 with confidence.

NEW SOUTH WALES

Restructuring

The Council and Executive of New South Wales since December have come together to work out a strategy to restructure Table Tennis in N.S.W. to bring us up-to-date with sports administration and set the frame work to run on business-like principles. The starting point was to accept the criticism that we hadn't achieved much success in either increasing the number of players or lifting the profile of the sport in this state. A review of the manner in which we conducted our business highlighted faults, though unintentional, and by wellmeaning people, meant that things just didn't happen. Where did we start.

1. Our Constitution upon examination was outdated. It had been framed around delegates of Associations coming together making decisions, with the Executive able to make decisions between meetings providing they were ratified at the next council meeting. The concept of having delegates meant people "represented" their Association, not necessarily providing any more input to the operations than to express a point of view at Council meetings. The answer was to change the constitution so that a Board of Management could run the business, meeting more frequently, with policy formulated from "Directors" each having a portfolio with outlined responsibilities. The new constitution was adopted on June 4 with the following structure.

The Administration Director is a position on the board filled by one of the board members.

- 2. The old constitution did not recognise players as members, only associations. This was a hindrance to people registering. The new constitution now recognises players as members, and clubs and associations as affiliates.
- 3. In line with the Australian body we changed our name to Table Tennis New South Wales.
- 4. Our previous business plan, though sound in principle was like an impost from above. Allegiance and ownership of the plan rested with a few. Our new plan has been framed around the directorships, with input from Council to put together a 4 year business plan with a one year operational plan. This plan has been submitted to Government as part of our application for grants for the 1994/95 financial year.

The four year business plan has specific objectives and key performance indicators that all, including the government funded positions, will be measured against. The main objectives are:

A 20% increase in membership per year Permanent playing centre leading up to the Olympic Games Decentralised training centres

6. Future council meetings will revolve around achievements against the business plan, rather than administrative matters.

Championships

5.

N.S.W. played host to the Australian Veterans Championships in October 1993. The venue for this Championships being the BHP Sports Centre at Unanderra, a suburb of Wollongong, approximately 100 kilometres south of Sydney. There was concern that these Championships could be poorly supported due to its location and the closeness to the World Veterans Championships in Melbourne in the following April. The Championships however were a success, with over 200 competitors from all over Australia and New Zealand. Media coverage of the event was excellent, with the print and television coverage and interviews reaching a large audience in southern N.S.W. N.S.W. also bid for the 1994 Junior Championships, however we weren't this time successful. The National Schools Championships were also held at Unanderra.

Staff

Keith Bowler retired from the position of Executive Director of Table Tennis N.S.W. from June 30. The position has been advertised and new appointee is expected to be announced in July. Norma Callinan, Executive Assistant, will also be retiring in the not too distant future and again we will be advertising for a replacement, The N.S.W. Association recognises the long and valued service both have provided to the sport both for our State as well the Australian Association.

NORTHERN TERRITORY TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

The Northern Territory Table Tennis Association made significant progress in 1993 with the inclusion of Alice Springs at the N.T. Championships for the first time since 1985. Eleven players represented at the event.

Registered membership totals 154 of which 43 were from Alice Springs. Efforts are continuing to reactivate Tennant Creek and Katherine and to encourage Jabiru and Palmerston to play the game.

Teams represented the N.T. at the National Veterans Championships in the Over 40 and Over 50 Men's section. This was the fist time two teams had represented the N.T. at these Championships. The Over 50 Men retained their position at 6 from 10 teams while the Over 40 Men were at the bottom of the rung at their first attempt.

T.T. Lee performed the best of all representatives (having returned from the Australian Representative Team to the USA and Canada) where he managed 16 wins from 27 matches in the teams events and was beaten by the eventual winner, Le Van Inh in the third round of the Over 50 Men's singles.

We hosted the Arafura Youth Games in Darwin and Table Tennis was amongst the six sports that were conducted. The teams comprised two boys and one girl aged 16 to 19 years. The Indonesians were all too strong for us, but we all enjoyed the experience.

Our State Team did not eventuate through injuries to two players and there is a major need to develop our juniors to maintain our presence in National Championships.

The position of Director of Coaching was not active during the year and we have suffered through the loss of our volunteers to southern states without replacement and some have become absorbed in their pursuit of academic qualifications.

Four Level 1 coaching qualifications were achieved and over 20 participants attended a Level 0 course of which 10 came from Alice Springs.

Two State umpiring certificates were presented bringing the total number of State Umpires to 3. There is a need to encourage Alice Springs to join the State umpiring fraternity.

Juniors were coached on Friday evenings throughout the year and we should plan to conduct training camps for all Territory Juniors next year.

REPORT ON ACTIVITIES OF THE QUEENSLAND TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

The year of Queensland Table Tennis has been one of improvements in some areas, stabilisation in others and some losses in areas where previous gains had been made.

The most encouraging aspect has been the appointment of a part time Development Officer/Director of Coaching. You may recall that Queensland reported to last years AGM that the funding has been secured for this position but problems were being experienced in finding suitable applicants interested in the position. Lu Qui Wei commenced employment in February 1994 after assistance from Ron Moule. There has been a period of familiarisation and he is now attempting to make some inroads into the school system in the South East Corner of the State with visits to schools which will establish a presence in preparation for a more coordinated interschool type competition in the future,

Lu held a Talent Identification Camp at Rockhampton (approx 700km north of Brisbane) for junior players ranked between four and ten in Queensland The camp was conducted over four days and involved coaches from Rockhampton and Bundaberg (approximately 300 kms south of Rockhampton).

The Development Officer in association with the Executive Director has targeted an area on the south of Brisbane in reasonable proximity to Logan Table Tennis Association facilities. Twenty three primary schools have had written communication with two schools immediately taking up regular services of Qui Wei and another two committed to the offer during July, August, September period.

There has been a measure of reluctance from some associations in the South East corner of the State to embrace the services of this new position with some associations still not extending invitations to Lu Qui Wei but this should not be construed as a personal problem but more a reflection of the 'Under Siege' mentality of some Club administrators.

You may have noticed that I have mentioned distances in a couple of instances in this report and this is not done as a Geography lesson but more as an attempt to establish some empathy with the Council and Board regarding the inherent problems experienced by Queensland regarding the tyranny of distance and our particular demographics. There are approximately 1100 players registered in Queensland but in many instances there is a club of 100 players every 300 kms and nothing in between. This causes problems when attempts are made to employ full time people on a State basis because provincial clubs located large distances from Brisbane find it difficult to see the benefits of contributing especially when they haven't got the personnel in positions within their club to take advantage of the structures that these positions create. The fundamentals in Queensland of decentralised clubs is a very good foundation for growth but it would be easier to fund state positions and coaches if all players and clubs were with a 100km radius of Brisbane.

Our State Executive Director carried out statistical analysis of the members of Queensland Table Tennis between 1992 and 1993. The figures revealed that although membership went from 1223 in 1992 down to 1118 in 1993, a modest drop of 8.58%. A more detailed analysis revealed that new registrations were a pleasing 393 or an increase of 32%. The down side is the staggering loss of 498 registrations from the previous years list. It would be interesting to know if other areas of Australia have similar statistics and if so; are these areas making the same mistakes Queensland Clubs obviously are? It would seem that some resources of Table Tennis Australia need to be directed into finding out if these statistics are universal and if so can we do anything to arrest our abysmal retention rate? Perhaps it may allay my fears that increased costs and protracted Pennant formats are becoming significant factors in our poor retention. I am not suggesting that Table Tennis Australia does not require the funds that are being drawn from the users but I am suggesting that the load is spread among too few. The Queensland Annual General Meeting in February was held in Brisbane in conjunction with an Administrative Development Forum. Allan Clarke of Rockhampton was elected as the new President with Kerry Bryant standing down to become the Vice President. This creates the problem of distances for executive meetings with a decentralised executive. Jean Dorries has continued as State Executive Director with the added responsibility of helping to administer the Development Officers position during the formative period. This position continues to be difficult with clubs in near proximity placing many demands with very little assistance to advance the common cause.

There are presently four Regional Coaches working throughout Queensland in addition to the State Director of Coaching. They are located in Mackay, Townsville, Bundaberg, Rockhampton. The South East corner is clearly the area in need of an additional Regional coach to take advantage of the population base in that area.

Brisbane hosted the National Senior Championships in September 1993 and with the amalgamation with the Youth Championships there was greater activity during the week. There was a noticeable lack of 'Big Matches' at times which would be most suitable to potential spectators. There should be matches played when people may be driving home from work and early evenings rather than at all times pandering solely to the players wishes. We need to put social competition on at times which are most suitable to the player, but National competitions are about raising the profile and attracting spectators and sponsors. A lateral thinker from the Board needs to have more input into the format of national titles. The positive side of the event was that it was run smoothly and generally to schedule.

The C.A.P.S. program is gradually becoming accepted and mainly due to our S.E.D. keeping it in the headlines is starting to gain a greater level of acceptance. Our participant has completed the three steps of this program and has been awarded an Australian Sports Commission Sports Leader Award Certificate. Five associations have appointed C.A.P.S. coordinators with varying numbers of participants.

The Queensland Junior Championships were held in Cairns at Easter. These Championships were used as a selection guide for the National Championships. It was noticeable that associations are still having trouble fielding in the Under 17 girls section which we assume means that the recruitment and retention rate is worse than in other areas.

The Queensland Open Championships were held in Mackay, June 11 & 12. A National League match was scheduled for the Saturday evening in order to facilitate the duel effect of bolstering the playing standard at the Queensland Open. The North Queensland Marlins played Croydon in National League which immediately provided some top end strength for the Queensland Open. The quality of presentation for both events has improved but much work needs to be done to improve crowd participation and break down some of the stereotyping that is often present in our formats.

The net result of the years activities must be seen as positive although we must build on our small achievements to show more tangible results in 1994-1995.

SOUTH AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

Since the Annual General Meeting in November there have been many positive steps taken in introducing new ideas and although the positions on the Board of Management were not filled at the A.G.M. the members were keen to tackle some new innovations. It did mean however that the elected members would endeavour to cover those positions not filled.

The Board took drastic measures in trimming the budget for 1994, which would reduce the deficit dramatically. Some areas were of concern but the Board decided that this one year would see the deficit disappear.

The Constitution was to be overhauled with input from nominated members from affiliates.

Insurance was introduced and supported by the majority of affiliates. All sporting associations have been advised to take out insurance to cover its officers. We were made aware that the Associations Incorporation Act, 1985 has been amended in a way which has implications for officers of Associations.

A suggestion by the Sports Institute that the Association prepare a five year sports plan, was taken up and an approach made to On Your Marks/Sports Pty Ltd (Mr Barry Stanton) to assist us in this area. This proved successful, and the draft prepared from the information gathered at the seminar, has been discussed with Mr Stanton, our President Mr Chris Leonard and Mr Jeff Hiscock, our Policy and Planning Director. The contents are being finalised and will be distributed as soon as received.

At the same time, South Australia was one state nominated by Table Tennis Australia, to conduct a Veterans Workshop, with invited speakers attending and presenting ideas and comparisons from other sports.

Both seminars held within a fortnight of each other were well attended by representatives from a good range of affiliates. T.T.A. representative Mr Mike Butcher and Australian Sports Commission representative Mr Ron Burns attended the Veterans Workshop, while T.T.A. representative Mr Ron Carlton visited Adelaide for the Sports Plan workshop and at the same time advised members of the preparation for the 7th World Veterans Table Tennis Championships which were held in Melbourne from 22 April.

During the year, the Directors welcomed Mrs Janette Makaev (Development Director), and Jeff Hiscock (Policy and Planning Director) onto the Board but at the same time have accepted resignations from three members C. Leonard, Mrs Makaev, Mrs Whelan, whose positions have been re-advertised. The Board has recently accepted new members, President John Potter, Finance Director Lyndon Radbone and Tournament Director Greg Bungey and discussions are currently under way.

Chris Leonard during his time as President, tabled some ideas one of which being the visiting of the non-affiliates and affiliates, to discuss ideas, problems and suggestions which may attract future affiliation with the State body.

The Tournament Committee presented an idea which was being introduced in Victoria, that the Hilton Hotel be used for the finals of a prestigious event, at the same time as promoting our sport, improving our image and acknowledging our sponsors. This idea was not supported by our affiliates which was very disappointing but we did however take up the offer from the Southern Association, to hire their venue for the State titles. Due to the efforts of Michael Drage, an ex state player, the Association obtained sponsorship from Prudential Assurance Pty for the State Championships, which were successful, and country affiliates were invited to enter teams in a competition included in the program and run in conjunction with the state events.

Some activity has commenced in the fund raising area, with some parents forming a committee and raising funds for State Junior and Youth teams.

Secondary squads have commenced at the Torrens Club, under the guidance of Mr Bill Oatey, and this idea was reintroduced by the State Selectors.

Our Coaching Director, Janet Sior, has been sent to Whyalla in her teaching position, and is endeavouring to continue with her portfolio.

In the Umpires area, we find that there has been a formation of an Umpires Committee and they will keep their members informed of alterations to rules and appoint umpires and referees for the various tournaments.

While all these new innovations are being introduced, the school competitions are being continued, match competitions and tournaments organised, all of which have added an extra workload for the Board members.

On behalf of the Board and the members from South Australia I wish to thank Chris Leonard for the good work and contribution he has put into Table Tennis. We are very sorry that he has had to retire from the administration, but hopefully his health will improve in the year to come and he may return in some capacity.

TASMANIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

Overall, the Tasmanian Table Tennis Association has experienced another successful year of operation in 1993-94.

Peter Ma Sen, continued as a State Development Officer of high profile and popularity, and has become a "legend" with school children throughout the state. He has now taken the Table Tennis "message" to 112 schools! The benefits of the skills and enthusiasm engendered by this State Government-assisted program have begun to show in terms of the standard of play as evidenced by the historic victory and high individual rankings of our Under 15 Girls team at the recent Junior Championships. However, another review of the SDO program (involving a telephone link-up of all Branches) is about to be conducted by the Board to ensure that maximum base level development and cost effectiveness is maintained into the future.

Two new affiliated Table Tennis Associations have recently commenced operations on the North-West Coast - one at Deloraine and the other, known as the Central Coast Table Tennis League, at Ulverstone. This augers well for the future increase and spread of playing numbers across the state, although some other associations are struggling, either financially or in terms of playing populations.

The Tasmanian Table Tennis Academy is still operating from its current headquarters at the STTTA stadium at the Kingborough Sports Complex and some Branches have established "Mini-Academies" to cater for increased interest in advanced coaching and to overcome the distance factor in regularly attending the main Academy. Hopefully, all 6 Branches will have similar coaching-training facilities on-line under the umbrella of the State Academy during the next 12 months.

In September, a group of young Tasmanian players, accompanied by Peter Ma Sen, went to China for advanced training with provincial and national squads. This was a new initiative for Tasmania and was followed by a successful reciprocal visit by a Chinese contingent in November. Incorporating a number of public and school appearances and a well-presented Shandong vs. Tasmania Academy "test match" with intensive coaching of our young players proved a worthwhile formula and further such exchanges are anticipated.

Elizabeth College again included Table Tennis as one of its selected sports for the HSC Athlete Development Program, enabling players to pursue excellence and a sound background in their chosen sport and to count the result as a subject for "matriculation" purposes. Adam Leeds (second year) and Peta Johns are currently enrolled for this specialised course.

No national events were conducted in Tasmania during the past twelve months and it is feared that the conditions surrounding the new system of "bidding" for such Championships may preclude or discourage successful applications by smaller states in the foreseeable future.

There is still no Tasmanian team participating in the National League as a previous feasibility study determined that this was not, at that stage, economical in terms of money, manpower or value to the sport in Tasmania. However, the progress of the Australia-wide competition is watched with interest with a view to possibly supporting a team at some time in the future.

Unfortunately, such examples as the current demise of the Tassie Devils basketball team and the anticipated difficulties in adding a Tasmania-based football team to the AFL are not very positive indicators of potential success. Nevertheless, comments such as, "Now that the Sydney Smashers have joined the National League it can be considered a truly National Competition" always serve to fire up determination in the island state ! Following its brief revival in 1992, "Tasmanian Table Tennis", the popular, official newsletter of the Tasmanian Association, was not produced throughout 1993 due to the lack of a willing editor. It was left to original editor, Bill Atkinson, to instigate a more-permanent recovery and regular editions, attracting articles from a wide variety of contributors, are now circulated statewide.

A dearth of administrators, whether experienced performers or enthusiastic newcomers, is still very evident to Club, Branch and State level, at present. However, the anticipated positive results of the restructuring of the T.T.T.A. administration began to show with the attraction of three new directors with particular expertise to the Board at the January elections. Media personality (and Table Tennis parent), Mike Swinson became the new Chairman, Sue Fisher, a financial manager with the Department of Education and the Arts became the new Director of Finance and recently-qualified National Umpire, Maureen Sherman was elected as Technical Director.

It is hoped that the CAPS Scheme which was introduced to TTTA Branches during the past twelve months (and now has active participants in at least three Branches) will assist in the promotion of a new breed of young officials in the long term.

A statewide development seminar was conducted in May, 1994, with a number of priorities for action being established. The successful implementation of these priorities according to the agreed timelines will be critical to the re-development of the sport in Tasmania.

The Tasmanian Association is still wrestling with the problems of maintaining its section of the National Database and sorting the stored information in practical ways to aid the expansion of the sport. Part of this difficulty has arisen due to the incompatibility of the system with the Macintosh hardware which is used by the TTTA and most of its Branches and individuals.

Finally, the effects of an increasing professionalism and associated accountability in the world of modern sports administration are worth noting. Responding to the internal demands of an increasing number of Branches, as well as to a powerful salaried T.T.A. staff (which seems to operate during normal business hours rather than on Sunday nights) is placing pressure on the goodwill of the small yet enthusiastic and skilful group of voluntary administrators who comprise the TTTA Board. Tasmania has always provided innovative contributions to the national scene, but, if we, as a state body, are to keep pace with the implications and benefits of the new national vision and determination of the Steve Knapp era, there is no doubt that the establishment of a formal "head office" with at least a part time paid secretariat must continue to be an immediate priority. The "culture" of the TTA has changed, thank goodness, and we are trying to follow suit.

The Tasmanian Table Tennis Association congratulates the Board and salaried staff on another year of considerable success for our sport in Australia, highlighted by the successful staging of the World Veterans Championships.

At the 1993 Annual General Meeting Nick McConnell stood down as President of the V.T.T.A. due to the pressure of business commitments. He was succeeded as President by Bob Tuckett.

The V.T.T.A. is experiencing a difficult financial period. A Strategic Plan is being developed to redress this situation. The Strategic Plan will be a detailed outline of the V.T.T.A.'s objectives and resultant actions to be pursued during next five years. The Strategic Plan will provide the leadership and direction necessary for the development of Table Tennis in Victoria.

The announcement of the construction of the new Melbourne Sports Centre by the end of 1996 is great news for our sport. \$52 million has been set aside for the new centre to be located on the other side of Albert Park lake. In the Melbourne Sports Centre there will be five sports: Swimming, Badminton, Squash, Basketball and Table Tennis.

The V.T.T.A. Board of Management is working diligently to ensure that Table Tennis secures a centre of international standard which is functional and financially viable for its members. Another cause for concern is the downward trend in players registrations for 1994. All affiliated associations have been informed of their responsibility in registering all their members to provide both Table Tennis Australia and the V.T.T.A. with a sound financial base.

Two of our major affiliated associations successfully conducted major international events. The 6th Oceania Championships were hosted by the Croydon and District Table Tennis Association at their new International stadium at Kilsyth from the 12th - 15th of August 1993.

The 1994 Australian Junior Championships were conducted by the Geelong Table Tennis Association under the new "bid system". Teams from New Zealand, Papua New Guinea and Tahiti participated. These Associations are examples of progressive management ideas coupled with a diligence to undertake significant roles in developing Table Tennis in their respective regions.

The Coburg Club successfully staged the National League finals. In a enthralling match Geelong Butterfly defeated Coburg 4-3.

Victorian players again were at the forefront in achieving excellent results:

1993 Oceania Championships

Dennis Makaling and Kerri Tepper excelled in winning the singles crowns.

1994 Oceania Championships

15 year old Shirley Zhou achieved six gold medals.

National Championships

Kerri Tepper won her fourth title and along with Dennis Makaling secured the number one ranking. Victoria won both the men's and women's teams titles.

JUNIORS

Trevor Brown dominated in winning both the U/15 and U/17 Singles Championships. Shirley Zhou again won the U/17 Singles and Yvonne Li annexed the U/15 Singles crown. Victoria won the U/15 and U/17 Boys and U/17 Girls Teams titles.

VETERANS

Pam Tait won the Over 40 Singles whilst Bill Bates and Van Chat Mai won the Over 60 and Over 70 titles respectively. Victoria won the Over 50, 60 and 70 Men's Team Titles and the Over 60 and 70 Women's Team Titles.

Without doubt the highlight of 1994 was the World Veterans Championships, which was a magnificent event. Congratulations to T.T.A. on a wonderful achievement - Victorian players Van Chat Mai and Stan Wynack won a gold medal and two silver medals respectively.

REPORT ON THE ACTIVITIES OF THE WESTERN AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

The perennial problem of the lack of volunteers willing to take on honorary positions again besieged the Association. It took two attempts at holding the Annual General Meeting before a quorum could be found and then only some of the positions were filled.

Currently the Association is operating with a three person Board and only a handful of other workers. Thankfully we are well served on the National Veterans Championship Organising Committee. However numerous positions are unfilled including the most important coaching portfolio. In spite of this all programmed events have been conducted.

Healthway (W.A. Health Promotion Foundation) Sponsorship

Through the continued support of Healthway, the Association has been able to continue with its Development Program involving Schools, Junior coaching and competitions, club formation, school holiday coaching clinics, novices competitions and shopping centre displays.

Sponsorship has already been approved for 1994/95, and it is hoped that the assistance from small group of "Retired" (from employment) coaches will continue, but health problems may cause a curtailment in this area. If we are ever to make a large impact funding for a full time Coach/Development Officer would be needed. However the level of Healthway/State Government funding is frozen because of the Governments need to pay off W.A. Inc debts!

Association Headquarters

Improvements to the Centre has again been the initiative of President Phil Evans. A busy bee weekend saw the Centre insulated and painted internally. The outside appearance of the Centre has been improved with some concreting and the erection of an Association sign. Also Centre Court lighting has been upgraded.

Competitions

During the year ended 30 June 1994 some seven Open tournaments were held at the Centre. These together with Pennant matches, the Grand Prix series, Top 10 and National League matches ensured a good level of Centre usage. Town and Country Bank again sponsored the State Open Championship.

Players

Overall registrations are expected to be up in 1994 due to an increase in the number of social and tournament players. The "Pennant player" base is somewhat reduced in recent years although the loss in numbers (and revenue) has been offset by the increased use of the Centre by the social and tournament players.

The improvement in standard in the elite end of the scale has been maintained and it is pleasing to see Western Australia players names in National teams and in Oceania/National rankings lists.


