PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The conclusion of the 1992/93 financial year brings to an end another active year for Australian Table Tennis. Whilst activity is not always a measure of progress, I believe the last twelve months have seen some significant steps forward and is a fair reflection of our rate of progress.

The Australian Table Tennis Association office, now located in the former meeting rooms at the Victorian Table Tennis Association, are now modern, well equipped and highly presentable. The A.T.T.A. office is a visible statement of the commitment to professionalism and dedication to the progress of Table Tennis by the A.T.T.A. executive staff. The vast majority of players and administrators would be unaware of the volume of work performed by each A.T.T.A. staff member. We are indeed fortunate to have the services of such dedicated individuals.

The last twelve months has seen the introduction of a number of initiatives that were previously in the planning stage. The three tiered membership structure has been introduced on a national basis. I am pleased to report that all states now operate using the same standard membership software system. This is an important introduction and highlights the cooperation between the states and the national body in order to gain efficiencies and improve the level of services to our registered players.

The 1993 season has seen the return of the National League Competition on a fully fledged and national basis. The high level of club participation and the success of the National League is due to the high level of moral and financial commitment by each of the participating clubs. As with any new competition, there have inevitably been some teething problems. However, these issues have been largely overcome and I believe we now have the correct structure in place with a dedicated National League Committee which will ensure that the competition is conducted professionally and lays the foundation for future growth and prosperity.

Throughout the year and behind the scenes, a considerable amount of work and planning has been taking place in respect to the World Veteran's Championships due to be held in Melbourne in April 1994. Ron Carlton and Sharon Graham in conjunction with the Management Committee have continued to make good progress in the planning, promotion and sponsorship for this massive event. The response rate from individuals and groups throughout Europe, Asia and America has been astounding. Early indications point to a record number of entrants. By way of indication as to the size of the Championship, the A.T.T.A. will be importing 70 Joola tables specifically for the Championship. The logistical difficulties of conducting a Championship of this size will stretch the resources of the A.T.T.A., the V.T.T.A. and the surrounding metropolitan and country associations.

Following a considerable amount of research and trialing conducted by Neville Horder and with the assistance of the International Table Tennis Federation the first Australian Computer Ranking List was released for the July issue of the A.T.T.A. magazine. The Australian system is consistent with the I.T.T.F. Computer Ranking System. The credibility and accuracy of the ranking system is dependent upon the results from state and country championships being forwarded on a timely basis to the A.T.T.A. office.

The Australian team has recently returned from the World Championships in Gothenburg, Sweden. The women's team finished 24th and the men finished 39th overall. Our women could well have finished considerably higher had it not been for the injury of Kerri Tepper who was forced to miss the last two matches. The men could well have hoped for a higher placing, however, the team is young and relatively inexperienced at international level. Our top players are young and dedicated and I am sure that given the right international opportunities they will meet with greater success at the elite level.

Our newly appointed National Development Officer, Anne Oakley recently distributed a document titled "National Championships, 94 and Beyond". This document outlines plans for a fresh prospective on the traditional method of conducting the national senior, youth and junior championships. The overriding aim of the A.T.T.A. is to considerably upgrade the quality of presentation, playing conditions, spectator numbers and commercial appeal for sponsors associated with Australian Table Tennis. These plans and other alternate proposals will be the subject of discussion at the Annual General Meeting to be conducted in Brisbane later this year.

Despite our best efforts over the last twelve months, financial independence through sponsorship and commercial activities still remains our highest priority and our greatest challenge. It is a tragedy that our elite players cannot be funded to attend the World Championships and other major international events. It will in part, be a measure of our success when the A.T.T.A. is in a financial position to contribute meaningfully to our elite player development. Until that time arrives, we cannot hold our heads up and claim to be successful.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge the efforts and contribution made by the Executive, the Board of Management, the National League Committee, the World Veteran's Management Committee and the various supporting sub-committees. There are many other individual contributions that have been made during the course of the year, however, I would like to express my appreciation to Bob Tuckett as Editor of the Australian Table Tennis Magazine and Neville Horder for compiling the computer ranking system and Ron Moule as National Coaching Director. There are many others who continue to work tirelessly and anonymously throughout the year for the benefit of the sport. Australian Table Tennis owes these individuals a debt of gratitude.

VICE PRESIDENT, DIRECTOR TECHNICAL

Another very busy year in the field of Technical Affairs of Table Tennis, almost all entirely dominated by one subject - Glue - with this sole item taking a considerable amount of administrative time. An issue that very few people, if indeed any, ever thought would be part of Table Tennis administration.

However, a few year's back, a discovery that fresh "Bicycle" type glue gave extra speed to the rubber meant this practice became widespread and top players used the glue to re-rubber more and more frequently. Then, in the past twelve months, the knowledge of the toxicity of speed glues was made known to all and, subsequently, health issues were raised. As these glues gave off toxic vapours which were known in the industrial world as being quite dangerous, our own Dr Bob Pappalardo was one of the World leaders in alerting the Table Tennis World to problems that could, or would, face players and others, if these dangerous glues were permitted by the I.T.T.F. for continued usage.

The World heard of Police raids on a Table Tennis shop in Japan, Police being called to a tournament in Scotland, players in Sweden using masks when reglueing. So, in December 1992, the I.T.T.F. banned a lot of glues and set about addressing the problem.

The I.T.T.F. Scientific Committee were called up and no expense was spared in addressing this problem which was the Table Tennis equivalent of the drug issue in many other sports.

Finally, after some four months of investigation, it came down to the fact that there was no liquid glue completely toxic free. So the I.T.T.F. decided at its Council meeting in Gothenburg, Sweden, that from July 1994, only glue sheets can be used for affixing rubber to blades.

Umpiring

The A.T.T.A. Umpires Committee has been more active in the past twelve months, supplying badges for newly qualified umpires, catching up on those not supplied previously.

With the co-operation of the Oceania Umpires Co-ordinator, the A.T.T.A. are in a position to introduce a Referee's Examination and Qualification.

From a National prospective, it is probable that changes will occur to our National Umpires Committee format, to meet the ever increasing demands from State Umpires Committees, individual Umpires, prospective Umpires and other bodies.

Recruitment commenced for the 1994 World Veterans Championships and has to continue throughout Australia for some time, as Umpires are in short supply. This will be the main theme of our 1993 Umpires Seminar.

National Championships 1993

The Australian Junior Championships were held during June and a number of controversial incidents occurred, the last being during the very final match of the tournament, when a local blackout of the area caused play to be stopped in the third and deciding game of the Under 17 Boys Singles Final.

This matter has been discussed with Mr C Clemett, Chairman, I.T.T.F. Rules Committee, who has recommended that both S Gallagher (WA) and D Knott (SA) be declared joint winners. The Board of Management has agreed with this recommendation.

Other National Championships set down for this year are:

Senior\Youth Brisbane 28 August - 4 September

Veterans Unanderra 23 - 30 October

Plans for both Championships are well under control at the time of writing.

NATIONAL EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The last twelve months has seen unprecedented change for the A.T.T.A. Never before has so much occurred in the space of just a year.

The A.T.T.A. is now leading from the front, making the 'hard' decisions, introducing new programs and activities and backing up talk with a lot of action.

Our professional staff has increased from two full time to four full time, one almost full time and one half time. We now have a quality office arrangement with the best of electronic equipment. No doubt most of those reading this report will have noticed significant improvements in the presentation and the quality of work from our office. As we become more proficient with our equipment, so the quality will get even better.

However the most significant changes within the A.T.T.A. have come about in the area of programs, activities and projects. The Business Plan is a document of the utmost importance. It guides us in all that we do. It gives us ideas, it encourages innovation - ultimately it will judge us.

We have introduced a National Membership system. The National League has not only commenced (August 92) but has been expanded to a home and away basis (April 93). Considerable time and effort (by Neville Horder and others) has seen much progress made towards a National Computer Ranking System. We are working vigorously towards a successful conduct, in Melbourne, of the World Veterans Table Tennis Championships (an event of huge proportions).

Major changes have been made to our Constitution and Regulations. The Australian Championships format has and still is being re-assessed. New events are under consideration. We have employed a full time Development Officer. We have recruited people with specific expertise from outside of the sport to assist us. We are looking into things such as Fundraising, Corporate Image, Sponsor Presentation Packages, the Presentation of Table Tennis.

At present it is a very hard slog. The introduction of these things not only is expensive but time consuming. However our determination is strong. The A.T.T.A. is no longer prepared to sit back and wait for things to happen. We are going to be active in areas that we have been inactive, we are now leaders rather than followers, we are going to pursue goals that previously were beyond reach. We will aim high and therefore achieve high.

Just for the record I will include a copy of the flow chart of our Business Plan. EVERY TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION (STATE AND REGIONAL) AND CLUB SHOULD HAVE ONE OF THESE. (We can help to prepare it).

In addition there are some 20 coaches in the process of being accredited and a further, smaller, group of 7 working towards higher accreditation levels.

1993 has been a typical year of crests and troughs in which the development within the coaching system must be evaluated in the light of the profile, administrative, financial and membership issues which besot the sport. I would like to thank the State Coaching Directors of their efforts, under difficult financial and time pressures, over the past twelve months.

Among the crests of the previous year have been

- * The implementation of the fast tracking system for coach development and the interest it has aroused.
- * The Level II Sports Specific Unit conducted in Brisbane and the associated Conditioning Units, also in Brisbane and Hobart.
- * The Northern Territory and Alice Springs Coaching Development and Schools Project.
- * The A.C.T. Schools Coaching Project.
- * Accredited Coach.
- * Revision and upgrading of Aussie Sport video.
- * Revision and/or circulation of Level 0 Workbook, Level 0 Course Presenters Handbook and the Secondary Schools Table Tennis Programs.
- * Expansion of resources, printed and video available to coaches.
- Completion of video Table Tennis Lift Your Game.

- Establishment of procedures for 1993/94 Re-accreditation and Upgrading of all accredited coaches.
- National Junior Training Camps in Geelong and Melbourne.
- Successes of some Juniors fostered under the National Academy.
- * Initiation of programs/projects and supply of coaches and material to Oceania.
- * Overseas and International coaching opportunities available to more coaches.
- Scholarship assistance to overseas players.
- Preparation of the Olympic Plan for Sydney 2000.
- Support and assistance to female coaches.

On the down side I have mentioned the problems of lack of resources but the loss of funding for a full National Academy Program, especially as benefits were beginning to appear, was a major setback to elite development.

The program for 1993/94 is already full, with projects like

- * The Hong Kong visit with associated coaching seminars and a girls camp.
- Completion of upgrading and re-accreditation.
- * Increasing incentives and motivation for overseas development.
- Level I General Principles Workbook (revision).
- Level II Workbook/Manual.
- Academy programs at camps and scholarships.
- Video/handbook on bat rubbers.
- Activities manual for Level 0 and 1 coaches.
- Northern Territory Modified Equipment and Primary Schools Project.
- Training Camp handbook.
- Implementation of the Sports Science Sub-Committee.

Funding has been secured for all projects and some work is under way in many of them.

1993 has been unique in that it is the first time the A.T.T.A. has employed people for the individual roles of N.E.D., Development and Coaching. Although coaching is now a part time position it is, for the first time, in a long period, a discrete task.

I would like to thank Ansett Australia for their support and in addition Lan Sun Zhou, Neil Harwood, Anne Oakley, Rod Lindroth, Glenn Tepper and the Victorian Institute of Sport, head a list of people who have made contributions to the Coaching System in 1993.

NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT OFFICER'S REPORT

MARCH - AUGUST 1993

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The proposal - "Australian Table Tennis Championships - 1994 and Beyond" has created a lot of discussion at both State and National level regarding changes to National Championships. The timing, format and implementation of these changes will be decided at the AGM in Brisbane. The proposal intends to create a better product to sell to potential sponsors, spectators and players alike. To keep pace with sport's commercial and entertainment benefits, we must ensure our products have both quality and substance. Any change creates concern initially, however the long term implications for the sport nationally, are of major concern. The risk has to be taken to reap the rewards down the track.

NATIONAL CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

The opportunity for club based teams to test their ability at national level does not currently exist. The implementation of these Championships will give clubs the opportunity to meet in a friendly yet competitive environment. Planning is under way for implementation of the inaugural National Club Championships in 1994 and a Deakin University Sport Management student will be surveying prospective participants and officials in the near future.

CAPS

The CAPS program is expanding slowly, with the ACT and QLD leading the way. Ben Dorries (QLD) has successfully completed Step 2 and looks set to be the first Australian Table Tennis participant to clinch the reputable "ASC Sport Leader Award". CAPS is now a regular feature in the ATTA magazine and has been promoted at both the ATTA Development Workshop and the Australian Junior Championships in June. Funding has been allocated to four States; ACT, QLD, NSW and VIC.

VOLUNTEERS

The education, recruitment, retainment and acknowledgment of our volunteers form a major priority for the next twelve months. The ATTA is currently producing a plan to ensure our volunteers are acknowledged for their efforts. The second phase, incorporating education and recruitment, will rely heavily on implementation by the States. This area of development requires action from all.

The ASC's VIP (Volunteer Involvement Program) Program, now in place, will assist us with this area of development. Liaison between the ATTA and the VIP Program staff has commenced.

TOURNAMENT ADMINISTRATION

A successful two day seminar has just been conducted with all States excepting Tasmania represented. A major outcome from the seminar will see a Table Tennis Tournament Handbook drafted in the next few months. The handbook will aim to give tournament organisers ideas and procedures for ensuring tournaments at all levels are conducted professionally and with efficient use of available resources.

The seminar was made possible through the Australian Sports Commission and their continued support to administration development is much appreciated. Congratulations and thanks to both presenters and participants and to Mike Johns and Keith Bowler for their valuable contribution in the planning of this seminar.

SCHOOLS DEVELOPMENT

Trends in education departments throughout Australia indicate that now is most crucial for all clubs and regional associations to improve links with both primary and secondary schools. Our efforts within tertiary education institutions again need to be given a much higher priority.

The Australia Secondary Schools Championships will be held in Wollongong in September. The announcement of the Olympic host for 2000 will occur during this event. Many thanks to Illawarra Association and in particular, Joy Brown, for her support.

VETERANS PILOT PROJECT

The Australian Sports Commission has recently granted Table Tennis, one of six sports, specific funding to develop initiatives to increase and improve veterans participation in Table Tennis. This funding will initially be utilised to conduct three State Veterans Development Workshops and to bring the ATTA Veterans Committee together following the workshops to plan specific strategies for the next three years. Phase One is scheduled to be conducted in November.

CONCLUSION

The position of National Development Officer has only been in existence since March. The infinite number of opportunities to develop many facets of Table Tennis at the grass roots level cannot be attempted at once. The success of grass roots development relies heavily on both States and local Associations in the implementation process. Without the support of the ASC, this position would not exist. To all fellow Table Tennis members I have had the pleasure to work with over the last few months, thank you!

DIRECTOR, ELITE DEVELOPMENT AND NATIONAL TEAMS

This year has seen a change in my role from Coaching and Development to the more specific role of expanding the aspects of the competition opportunities for international competition and training.

The coaching and development aspects previously associated with my position are now being very capably handled by Ron Moule, National Coaching Director and Anne Oakley our Development Officer.

This year saw our Women compete in the World Doubles Cup in Las Vegas, our Youth team compete in the first Global Youth Championships in Japan, the World Championships in Sweden and in the International Tournament in Noumea.

In the very near future our Veterans team will compete in North America and two Senior teams and four Youth teams will contest the Oceania Championships hosted by the Croydon and District Table Tennis Association in Victoria. As well as this we have several players training overseas. As you can imagine the administrative effort to cope with these events, which are basically self funding, is enormous.

The main problem at this stage is the inability of us, the A.T.T.A., to assist with any meaningful funding for our National Elite. This is being examined but our small player base combined with the amount of international competition we undertake the problem will only be resolved with imagination and the support of the whole Table Tennis community.

Outfitting of the team still is not totally satisfactory. I thank TSP for their support again and even though at this stage we do not have a formal agreement I understand that this sponsorship will continue. Supply and style of uniform are the main problems and this is because of the difficulty of imports from Japan and the differences in our physique. We are working together on the problem.

The establishment of our professional National Office with appropriate staffing has been great for our sport but this has had its effect on our volunteers. The National Office has the capacity to handle a greater workload than in the past and their professional approach has placed requirements on States that I believe are causing some strains and I know that it is having an effect on the Board members time. We must continue to consider and support our volunteers.

Finally I want to thank my fellow Board Members for their support during the last year and express my appreciation to the National Team members for the co-operation even under some trying circumstances. The help of Rod Lindroth and Ron Moule has been particularly appreciated and we are most fortunate to have the services of Sharon Graham, Anne Oakley and Ron Carlton in the office.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED

I have examined the books and records of Australian Table Tennis Association Inc. and from the information made available to me, I have formed the opinion that the Balance Sheet as at 30th June 1993 and the Profit and Loss Statement for the year ended June 30, 1993 fairly represent the Association's operations for that period.

ALAN ROUSE ASA

DIRECTOR, PROMOTIONS

Up until the end of 1992 I continued to produce 'Australian Table Tennis' in Perth. From the first edition of 1993 production was transferred to Melbourne under the control of editor Bob Tuckett and Director of Finance, John Beer.

1993 saw the launch of the new National League. This was not an easy job. I was responsible for producing the fixtures, which in itself created problems arising to the late withdrawal of the proposed second Brisbane team. I was also involved in the early negotiations with both Ansett and Australian Airlines, a task which was later taken over by Rod Lindroth. Although there have been administrative problems with the League, playing wise it has been most successful, as anyone who has attended any of the matches will no doubt testify. I hope the League will expand in 1994 with teams from both New South Wales and Tasmania added to these from Victoria, Queensland, South Australia and Western Australia. If Table Tennis is to receive more publicity and a greater public awareness and acceptance a successful National League is a must.

I have also been involved with the 1994 World Veterans Championships, which I believe will be a great success. All States should do their utmost to encourage their Veteran players to take part in what could well be the only opportunity for many of them to play in a World Championship.

AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

The TSP Australian Junior Table Tennis Championships held in Canberra in June came to a dramatic and unexpected conclusion when a two-hour suburban blackout stopped play. I expect that most readers would know that this occurred at 17-16 during the third and final game of the last match, the final of the Under 17 Boys Singles. It is understood that an unofficial petition was circulated at the presentation dinner, which was attended by some 170 players, officials, etc, seeking to influence the A.T.T.A. to uphold a decision to declare this match a draw.

A.T.T.A. official representative Phil Males and referee Fran Keyhoe performed their roles admirably, and obviously had some difficult times during the week. The Championships broke new ground when the managers agreed unanimously to a schedule which permitted some simultaneous play of Under 15 and Under 17 teams. This was agreed to assist the home State with its scheduling for the 17 tables, and budgeting arrangements, and to minimise play during the cold night hours in Canberra. The current rules and regulations for this National event seem to be designed for Table Tennis centres of about eight tables, despite players not being permitted to play in both teams age groupings.

The 1992 International Table Tennis Federation International Award to the ACT has resulted in 19 tables being allocated to six high schools. Under the guidance of Development Officer Arthur Wilks, some 41 teams totalling over 200 players are participating in the current high schools Table Tennis competition. As a gesture to the A.T.T.A. and with our intention of seeking the future involvement of these players in other Association activities, the A.C.T.T.A. intends to enrol all these players in the \$2.00 membership category (hopefully, also, the additional member numbers will assist us with our 1994 round of grant requests as discussed below). The A.C.T.T.A. is developing plans to place about 10 tables in primary schools for the start of the 1994 school year.

The Association is developing its plans to build a six table centre as an annex to an Indoor Hockey Centre in Canberra, and hopes to receive some funding from the A.C.T. Government for this (about 24% of total building costs and a subsidy towards the annual interest bill). The Hockey Centre intends to build a grandstand in conjunction with this Table Tennis proposal and has already received a grant of \$110,000 from the Commonwealth Community Cultural, Recreation and sporting Facilities Program for the purpose.

At club pennant level, adult playing numbers have remained static again this year, and the standard of our best players may have fallen away somewhat.

NEW SOUTH WALES TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

The past year has been an extremely busy year, however with the various sub-committees functioning more effectively we have made some progress towards our stated goals.

The coaching and training programs have been more effective with improvements in performances particularly with the Juniors and this was reflected with our Under 17 Boys winning the Australian titles.

This year, in particular, has been extremely busy for the Association with the year 2000 Olympic bid. This has taken up a lot of time of some of the officials and we can only now wait to see whether that effort has been worth it. Should we win the bid in September not only do we stand to gain a playing centre for Sydney, but a recognised home base for the sport. All of us have our fingers crossed.

We have had some success with school sport, but this has to be a major priority for the future. School children need to be exposed to the potentials of the sport, as unfortunately we cannot gain the media exposure that the other sports achieve. This requires a concerted effort from our part to foster the desire to play in the schools. This is also very important as the other major sports have Development Officers going around into schools.

The Association again hosted Open events at Senior, Junior and Veteran levels. No Australian championships were hosted by New South Wales.

We now have the new national registration scheme up and running, after overcoming the compatibility and other problems with the Sassy program. Next year should see the system running very smoothly with few if any delays.

The coming twelve months should see a change in direction for New South Wales as we change the focus of the funding we receive away from administration and channel it into development, in particular into the schools. It will clearly be a challenge for the new Committee to address along with sponsorship for that type of activity.

NORTHERN TERRITORY TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

Teams Competition (Darwin)

Four Senior grades were conducted in the first half of 1992 and three Senior grades in the later half.

Juniors

Peter Easling, Tracy Smith, R.Hee, J.Pudney, M.Butcher and P.Usher continued to coach juniors and assist running competitions. Peter Usher and Mike Butcher ran practice for juniors in Palmerston for eight weeks.

Australian Team Championships

The Darwin members selected for the Northern Territory team were John Pudney (Captain), Graham Symons, Peter Easling and Tracy Smith, and they were managed by Mike Butcher. The venue was Hobart.

Results

We were white washed by all States except Tasmania whom we won one rubber against.

Australian Veterans

The Territory was represented in the Over 50's section by T.T. Lee (captain), Joe Abrantes, Alex Kotrancz and Mike Butcher.

National Coaching Director

A visit from Ron Moule now has increased the Level 0 coaching skills of D.T.T.A. to 14 members and four of these have finished Level 1 courses and are awaiting creditation while Peter Usher and Mike Butcher are credited Level 1 coaches.

Level 0 coaches are J.Pudney, T.T.Lee, C.W.Goh, J.Abrantes, T.Smith, W.Gallacher, R.Hee and E.Raskin.

Narrabeen Oceanic Seminar

Mike Butcher and Peter Usher attended the 1992 Olympic Solidarity Oceanic Region Course in Table Tennis in New South Wales. Issues covered coaching, rules, tournament organisation, psychology, fitness, coaching girls.

Peter Represented the Northern Territory on the A.T.T.A. Coaching Committee and Mike on the A.T.T.A. Umpires Committee.

Mike passed State Umpiring examinations later in Hobart.

Registration

The register of members is now first class with the introduction of A.T.T.A. registration software.

Alex Kotrancz has to be thanked for his untiring efforts in being our registrar.

School Development

It is hoped to obtain finance to introduce tables into primary schools this year and to commence competition at high schools.

Dripstone High has had an open day at Marrara this year and P.Easling, J.Pudney and P.usher had a display at Darwin High School early in 1993.

QUEENSLAND TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

The 1993 Table Tennis year in Queensland has followed a recent pattern of improvements in some areas and falling away in other areas. We understand that meaningful achievements will only be reached with sound management and an ounce of luck.

The February Annual General Meeting of the Queensland Table Tennis Association saw the emergence of Kerry Bryant of Ipswich as the new President after having served on the Board for the previous two years. He has quickly moulded a workable Board which have met three times so far since then which is a good effort considering the distances involved in this State. This would be considered an area of improvement in the last twelve months.

Our State Executive Director, Jean Dorries, has continued this year giving some degree of continuity at a time where there have been changes to personnel. I feel that full time administrators that do a good job tend to have greater and greater demands on their time until the original focus of the job gets lost in answering inquiries. The State Office has relocated to Jean's home to ease costs and to cut travel time.

Registrations at this point of the year are down on last years figures but we are hopeful that the usual half year supplementary registrations and associations who take unauthorised credit will at least bring us near to last years figure. This is an area which is fundamental to our improvement but one that hasn't been improving with any consistency. A break down of associations shows that areas improve one year and then fall away the next which seems to suggest that many of us take a rest in this area every second year.

The Queensland Closed Championships is one tournament that has been done well for at least twenty years and would seem to be still improving at least in terms of numbers and depth if not in top end standard. The improvement in standard should be put in perspective in that the numbers have only improved in the men's section but the women have remained the same. This years event was held in Mackay under the management of Mr Charlie Payne who has established himself as our premier tournament administrator. Charlie will be the Queensland nominee for the forthcoming Administrators seminar in Melbourne and we hope his skills are recognised as he hopes to attend the World Veterans Championships next year.

Kent Jamieson has continued to commit his efforts to improving his Table Tennis. He represented Australian in the World Championships at Gothenburg and then returned to China. It would seem to me that living in China for a period of the best part of two years is a good effort in view of the 'Culture Shock' with out the demands of trying to improve your Table Tennis. We hope he is proportionately rewarded for his efforts.

Jens Krause has continued as Townsville regional coach in a full time capacity and it has clearly stimulated interest in the area with signs of Junior development and some promotions initiated. Townsville's effort in promoting their last home National League match was easily the best effort in Queensland. Most of the National League matches in Queensland have been associated with open tournaments which possibly is not the ideal arrangement but does create a captive audience.

Brian Berry has carried out the duties of State Director of Coaching and regional coaching in the Mackay area. Brian would gladly relinquish the State duty if we could find a suitable person for the job. It would be preferable to have a person working in the south-east corner of the State especially on Developmental aspects. It is clear that given the demographics of Queensland, Table Tennis in south-east is under represented given that infrastructure in terms of Table Tennis is quite good. The employment of a full time person in this area is a high priority. Brisbane is presently employing Mr Kim as an association coach working mainly on their more established players. Dave Delpratt is working in Bundaberg on a full time basis on developmental aspects and coaching.

We hope that on balance the positive achievements of Table Tennis in Queensland lead to greater gains in 1994.

TASMANIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

After some years of negotiation and careful planning, the Tasmanian Association finally established a Board of Directors through constitutional amendments passed in February, 1993. Each of the eight Directors has specific responsibilities in order that all issues relevant to the administration of the sport in Tasmania are monitored and addressed.

As with all such changes, it will take some time to sort out the details of the portfolios and to attract eight leading administrators, but, as far as the A.T.T.A. is concerned, we seem to have achieved the best possible solution for State-National liaison with the upgrading of the A.T.T.A. Delegate to the position of a specific Director of National Affairs whose task is solely to communicate and oversee the implementation of any National decisions in this State and to respond to the A.T.T.A. where appropriate. Previously, we have had to rely on empowering our President or our Secretary or, as was the amazing case under a quirk of our previous constitution, of having an A.T.T.A. Delegate who could not officially attend meetings of the Tasmanian Committee of Management.

Under the expert Chairmanship of Neville Horder, Tasmania conducted the Australian National Championships at Kingston in August-September of 1992. The Southern Tasmanian Table Tennis Association invested heavily in facility development, with improved lighting and new blue tables as features. We believe that these Championships were seen as very successful and could not in any way have prompted the perceived need for a major restructuring of National Championships.

Peter Ma Sen, continued as a State Development Officer of high profile and popularity, and has become a "legend" with school children throughout the State. He has now taken the Table Tennis "message" to 112 schools! The benefits of the skills and enthusiasm engendered by this State Government assisted program should begin to show in terms of playing numbers and standard of play in the next year or so. A thorough view of the SDO program is currently being conducted by the Board to ensure that maximum effectiveness is maintained into the future.

The Tasmanian Table Tennis Academy is still operating from its new headquarters at the S.T.T.T.A. stadium at the Kingborough Sports Complex and two Branches have recently established "Mini-Academies" to cater for increased interest in advanced coaching and to overcome the distance factor in regularly attending the main Academy. Hopefully, all 6 Branches will have similar coaching-training facilities on-line under the umbrella of the State Academy during the next 12 months.

In September, a group of young Tasmanian players, accompanied by Peter Ma Sen, is going to China for advanced training with provincial and National squads. This is a new initiative for Tasmania and will be followed by a reciprocal visit by Chinese contingent in November.

Elizabeth College again included Table Tennis as one of its selected sports for the HSC Athlete Development Program, enabling players to pursue excellence and a sound background in their chosen sport and to count the result as a subject for "matriculation" purposes. Following on from Tracy Auchterlonie's successes in 1991-92, two athletes, Adam Leeds and Robin Cooper are enrolled in 1993 and more are expected in 1994.

There is still no Tasmanian team participating in the National League as a previous feasibility study determined that this was not, at that stage, economical in terms of money, manpower or value to the sport in Tasmania. However, the progress of the Australia-wide competition is watched with interest with a view to possibly supporting a team at some time in the future. Unfortunately, such examples as the current demise of the Tassie Devils Basketball team and the anticipated difficulties in adding a Tasmania-based football team to the AFL are not very positive indicators of potential success.

"Tasmanian Table Tennis", the popular official newsletter of the Tasmanian Association, had not been printed for almost twelve months due to the lack of a willing editor, but received an enthusiastic revival late in 1992 under new editor, Tandja Proudlock. Hopefully, regular editions will be circulated as 1993 progresses. Under the revised Constitution, the T.T.T.A. now has a Director of Publicity (the experienced Neil Kerrison), another critical move aimed at raising the profile of the sport in this State.

A dearth of administrators, whether experienced performers or enthusiastic newcomers, is very evident at Club, Branch and State level, at present. This is particularly disappointing as it appears that the National Development Seminar held in October, 1991, has achieved little of its promise of a new, wide scale enthusiasm and professionalism. Something has to be done to arrest this decline and the T.T.T.A. has received funding under its annual Sports Development Grant from the Department of Sport and Recreation to offset the conduct of a state wide seminar for administrators and potential administrators later this year. In the long term, the implementation of the CAPS Scheme is also seen as being of significance to the future expansion of the sport as we have never had enough coaches, umpires, administrators, etc.

Tasmania received a minor setback to its day-to-day administration when its computer equipment, including software and considerable data, were stolen from the home of the Director of Administration in June. However, this has now been replaced by even more-advanced Macintosch hardware with the capacity to emulate IBM software, thus establishing compatibility with the A.T.T.A. administration.

The Tasmanian Association is currently wrestling with the problems of establishing its section of the National database. All Branches have been issued with copies of the SASSY software so that, following the major task of initial data entry, maintenance of current information from Branch to T.T.T.A. to A.T.T.A. should become an uncomplicated routine.

The recent resignation of Colin Pilgrim as Technical Director and as our member of the A.T.T.A. Umpires' Committee due to increasing work and family commitments has come as a cruel blow to the new Board as Colin had proven abilities and experience in a wide range of administrative matters at Club, Branch, State and National levels. We hope to see his renomination at some stage in the near future.

Finally, the effects of an increasing professionalism and associated accountability in the world of modern sports administration are worth noting. Responding to the internal demands of an increasing number of Branches, as well as to a powerful salaried A.T.T.A. staff (which seems to operate during normal business hours rather than on Sunday nights) is placing pressure on the goodwill of the small yet skilful group of voluntary administrators who comprise the T.T.T.A. Board. Tasmania has always provided innovative contributions to the National scene, but, if we, as a State body are to keep pace with the implications and benefits of the new National vision and determination of the Steve Knapp era, there is no doubt that the establishment of a formal "head office" with at least a part time paid secretariat must become an immediate priority.

The Tasmanian Table Tennis Association congratulates the Board and salaried staff on a year of considerable success in laying the foundations of a better future for our sport in Australia.

Nationals

The highlights were Dennis Makaling and Kerri Tepper both winning the National Singles Crowns, and both being ranked No.1.

Dennis topped it off by being named as the recipient of the Victor Barna Player of the Year award.

Victoria won both the Men's and Women's Teams titles.

Juniors

Shirley Zhou continues to dominate the scene as she won both the U/17 and U/15 Junior Singles Championships in 1993 and was the recipient of the Michael Szabados Junior Player of the Year award.

Victoria won the U/17 Girls, U/15 Boys and U/15 Girls Teams titles.

Veterans

Igor Klaf is unsurpassed in the O/50 Men's Singles and easily retained his title.

Dot Sanders won the O/60 Women's Singles title, and Van Chat Mai the O/70 Men's Singles title.

Victoria won the O/50 Men's, O/60 Women's and O/70 Women's Teams titles.

Kerri Tepper and Dennis Makaling both qualified for the Barcelona Olympics. Unfortunately for Dennis though the Australian Olympic Committee exercised the right of veto by not selecting him. This was Kerri's second Olympics, she competed in both singles and doubles.

Kerri Tepper also competed in the 1992 Butterfly World Doubles Cup in Las Vegas, U.S.A.

The Australian team to the 1993 World Championships in Gothenburg, Sweden was predominantly Victorian players.

The players registration scheme is progressing well together with our insurance policy which is included in the fee.

The elite players are benefiting enormously from the Victorian Institute of Sport Programs.

The position of State Coach (Hua Jie Yang) ended in December 1992 as a result of a Government cutback in funding. Zhou Lan Sun the V.I.S Coach is continuing his excellent work with the elite players.

Umpires

Yuka Braun and Angelo Tabone officiated at the Barcelona Olympics. At the World Championships in Gothenburg, Ruth Singer and Angelo Tabone officiated.

The big event everyone's waiting for, the 1994 World Veterans Championships to be conducted in April is progressing well and Ron Carlton the General Manager is very busy organising this huge task.

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

Again the Association had difficulties in filling Board of Management positions at its Annual General Meeting, a situation which was only partially remedied at a General Meeting held in January, at which time Phil Evans took over as President from Mike Johns. Despite the shortage of administrators, nearly all programmed events were conducted including the following:

Australian Masters Games

Event though the entry was poor (18 local and 7 overseas/interstate) the event was a success with the visitors helping to colour an event designed to maximise participation. The two day event culminated in a presentation function attended by 54 players, officials, friends and supporters.

National League

The first three home matches of the "Western Warriors" attracted a lot of spectator interest (150 attended the match against Croydon\Lillydale) and provided the locals their first taste, for a number of years, of National standard play. This included a number of Juniors involved in the Association Development programs. Hopefully the competition as a whole will prove viable and become a permanent fixture on the National Table Tennis calendar.

Players

It is pleasing to report on the general improvement in standard at the elite end of the scale, which is due to various coaching programs and the impact of the National League. However the reduction in the number of Pennant players is of concern and it is hoped that the current development program will lead to an increase in numbers.

Healthway (W.A. Health Promotion Foundation) Sponsorship

Through the support of Healthway, the Association has been able to continue with its Schools/Junior coaching and club formation program, school holiday clinics, novices competitions and "Participate" days at shopping Centres. Although a reasonable response has been received, the real test of the success of the program will be the extent of the flow on into mainstream activities.

Association Headquarters

Since taking over as President, Phil Evans has made a concerted effort to improve the Centre, including the painting of the front wall and roof and the provision of a disabled access ramp. Financial constraints precluded any further work, particularly as expenditure on essential maintenance items has cut deeply into Association finances.

Financial

The maintenance of the Associations viability is a never ending battle as increased expenditure is recorded against a shrinking "Pennant Player" base. Donations from various sources again saved the Association from a severe liquidity problem late last year. Although the Association is in the fortunate position of owning its Centre, barely enough income is generated to meet normal expenditure let alone extraordinary expenditure, which is a cause of concern.


