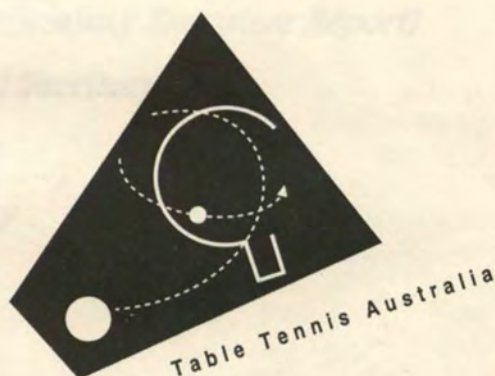

# REPORTS

## PRESIDENT

The 1995 financial year has seen the continuation of considerable changes within Table Tennis Australia. On the whole, the progress has been pleasing. I feel we have made tremendous advancements in terms of professionalism, presentation and the international competitiveness of our players.

The Board of Management has endeavoured to build on previous advancements and achieve the objectives that were set at the commencement of the year. Particular emphasis has been placed on the development and promotion of National League, National Championships and the commencement of the Olympic Athlete Program.

The development of these Elite Athlete programs has been worthwhile in the terms of the elevation of the sport, the public profile and exposure of our top ranked players to international competition. These initiatives have occupied the resources of the T.T.A. Board of Management (BOM) and the Executive Staff. Upon reflection, I believe a more balanced approach to Grass Roots Development will need to be adopted during the forthcoming financial year.

The T.T.A. BOM set an ambitious budget for 1994 - 1995 Financial Year. The budget set revenue objectives for fund raising activities, sponsorship and other events. These budget activities met with limited success during the year. As a consequence, in recent months, operating costs have been reduced in order to reduce the operating deficit for the year. In addition, the unfunded portion of personnel costs and unfunded activities have been reduced for the current financial year.

I am confident that the steps that have been taken will ensure the T.T.A. produces a balanced financial result for the forthcoming financial year.

The National League Finals in Sydney were an outstanding feature of the year. The National League highlights the tremendous advancements we have made in terms of presentation and professionalism. For sheer value for money entertainment and excitement it was a remarkable spectacle. It was particularly heartening to see so many spectators barracking emotionally as the final built to a crescendo. The final reconfirmed my confidence in Table Tennis to compete as a spectacle with other sports.

The commitment to the League by the National League Clubs is central to the future growth and success of the League. There are substantial costs for clubs participating in the League, it is a credit to these Clubs that their commitment is unwavering and their vision for a successful League is clear.

The establishment of the Olympic Athlete Program (OAP) in Melbourne under the guidance of Zhou Lan Sun as National Coach, Glenn Tepper and Aleks Jakubczak has introduced a new standard of discipline, training and preparation for the National Squad players. The OAP has been overseen by Neil Harwood as the Elite Director who has been the driving force in the establishment of the program.

A less publicised, but no less pleasing result, has been the increase in the number of registered players during the financial year.. The result is due to the increase in player numbers in Victoria and Queensland as country and metropolitan Associations re affiliate and register their players. These State Associations are to be congratulated on their efforts for an excellent result.



The National Schools Championship remains a high priority for T.T.A.. Once again Ron Moule has achieved an increase in the number of schools participating in the championship in Canberra. This year the number of schools has increased to 37 from 22 the previous year.

There have been a number of personnel changes during the year and some announcements of change following the Annual General Meeting. Earlier this year Rod Lindroth announced his resignation as National Executive Director (NED). His resignation follows many years of dedicated service to Table Tennis. Rod set a standard of administration and service for all Table Tennis Administrators. He represented Table Tennis in a most professional manner and his relations with The Australian Sports Commission continues to enhance the sport.

The BOM advertised nationally for the position of NED. A considerable number of applications were received and interviews were conducted. Following the interview process, the BOM unanimously appointed Ron Carlton as NED. I believe this is an excellent appointment. Ron's experience in recent years as Development Officer coupled with his athletics background and commercial experience bring a new dimension of expertise to Table Tennis.

Keith Bowler recently announced his resignation from the BOM. His resignation follows 36 years of continuous service to Table Tennis Australia. This is a remarkable achievement. I am sure it is a record that will go unchallenged. However, it would be understating Keith's achievements to focus on his longevity of service and not on the contribution he has made to the sport. Keith has been a wise counsellor on the BOM and a steading influence for many years. That is not to say that Keith has been conservative in his attitudes. On many occasions Keith initiated new concepts and a contemporary approach to the presentation of Table Tennis. His technical knowledge has been invaluable and he has successfully passed this knowledge to others in the sport. In this respect, he has been a mentor and an example to Board Members and sports officials in Australia. Keith is extremely well respected within the I.T.T.F. and his many years of service have contributed to the international status and respect currently enjoyed by Table Tennis Australia.

I would like to acknowledge the efforts of the executive staff during the year. I believe we are fortunate to have the services of such dedicated and capable individuals.

The coming twelve months will continue to provide many challenges. I am confident that we have the personnel, the administrative capabilities, the financial resources and the enthusiasm to meet these challenges.

## ***VICE PRESIDENT, ELITE DEVELOPMENT***

The dramatic changes to our Elite Program continued in 1995 as the Olympic Athlete Program was introduced.

Zhou Lan Sun has been appointed National Coach, Aleks Jakubczak High Performance Program Manager and Glenn Tepper is in the program as a Scholarship Coach.

The mix we have gives us a great deal of people for opportunities as the staff are from Asian, European and Australian backgrounds. Good contacts have been, and continue to be developed in both Europe and Asia with many training opportunities being arranged.

The program is aimed at producing medallists in Sydney in 2000 and nothing less. It is being driven very hard by the Australian Sports Commission. Our sport will change dramatically in the next six years and it is up to us the Administrators, Coaches and Players of today, to make sure that we make the most of this one and only opportunity.

Up until the advent of the Olympic Athlete Program there was virtually no Table Tennis Australia commitment to the Elite level and also very little interest. Now everyone wants to be involved and most of our physical resources are being directed to the elite area. I also note that no financial resource from Table Tennis Australia is being directed to elite development - a fact that I find very disappointing.

It is my understanding that Ron Moule will cease as National Coaching Director at the end of 1995. I want to record my personal appreciation for Ron's work over a long period - he has been responsible for a dramatic change in the way of coaching - he dragged us from the 1950's to the 1990's with major resistance from the old school of Coaches and Officials. I wonder how the Olympic Athlete Program would have been introduced if it had not been for the new way of coaching introduced by Ron. He has been tireless in his efforts to introduce a National Schools Competition and I believe that he has been let down by a lack of commitment on the part of Table Tennis Australia, State Associations and clubs. Children are vital to our future and we should not just focus on the very talented children.

An area of concern to me is that the structure of our sport - it must be built from the bottom up not top down. To achieve this we need the help of a great number of volunteers - administrators, coaches, officials etc and rather than the numbers of these increasing they are dwindling. It is vital that paid staff supplement the work of volunteers and that volunteers are given the goals and recognition they need to continue.

Finally, as I will not be renominating for a position of the Board in 1996, I wish to thank those who have helped and supported me in the past few years. I certainly intend to continue assisting the sport in any way I can.

## ***NATIONAL EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR (Incorporating Development Officer's Report)***

Alvin Toffler in his book "Future Shock" propounded the theory that change was inevitable in our world and that the rate of change was accelerating. Table Tennis in Australia in 1994/1995 was an excellent example of his theory as the Board of Management and the many people around the country grappled with the challenges thrust upon us and attempted to promote our sport as a vibrant, exciting and stimulating activity.

Last year Table Tennis Australia undertook to conduct a survey of 800 local shires and councils. That survey showed that in excess of 400 local Table Tennis Clubs and Associations existed around Australia. Just under 200 affiliated with T.T.A. and the respective State Associations. Over 200, in fact nearly 220 were unaffiliated. T.T.A. has followed the original surveys up with another one of unaffiliated Clubs and Associations to determine why they are unaffiliated. From this survey we will be able, hopefully to deduce reasons for their non-affiliation and implement a strategic plan to include them in the mainstream of Table Tennis.

It is my belief we do not have to sell the game, we have to sell the organisation. The Sweeny Report commissioned by the Australian Sports Commission tells us that 1.3 million Australians play regularly and that there is a Table Tennis table in over 150,000 households in Australia.

Jean Dorries and the Queensland Association report that their numbers are slowly on the increase. But they also report from a survey they did, that something in the region of 30% of their members each year are new. This means that as fast as they are recruiting, others are disappearing out the back door.

It seems obvious from this small amount of research which we must update and spread wider to develop a more accurate view of Table Tennis, that the problems lie in our own organisations. Therefore we must examine the programs we run, the service we provide, the facilities we ask people to play in, the social activities we build around the game and the image we want to promote and foster.

1994/1995 was a year of huge change. A number of new programs were instigated and implemented. Change has occurred at all levels and in all facets of the sport and is continuing to change.

The implementation of the Olympic Athlete Program has seen the resources of T.T.A. stretched to the limit as both the Board and the Staff tackled the huge task of producing a medallist in the Year 2000. Geoff Strang of The Australian Sports Commission stated at a Board Meeting of T.T.A. that the Olympic Athlete Program had taxed the resources of some sports to the absolute limit and in some cases sports were not coping very well. This is a large and complex program that has made Table Tennis Australia focus like never before on its elite players. The Federal Government and the Australian Sports Commission as the funding body have made it abundantly clear that the only criteria for this program is success in the Year 2000 and therefore all spending and planning relating to the program must be targeted at that year. This includes selection of players for the program, competition programs including domestic and international, direct athlete support, sports science services, the employment of coaches and ancillary personnel, camps, talent identification, the training of coaches and any other activity that relates to the elite players.

It is to our credit that Geoff Strang in a public forum including the Minister for Sport, Senator Faulkner, stated that Table Tennis had grasped the concept of the OAP and was administering it well.



Because of the efforts of Aleks Jakubczak, High Performance Program Manager, and the Coaches Zhou Lan Sun and Glenn Pepper, under the direction of Neil Harwood, we are now seeing a far more motivated and dedicated player emerging, one who will be tougher and fitter than ever before. T.T.A. has a long way to go to catch up with other successful sports in Australia, sports with which we are constantly being compared to and ones who boast Olympic Gold Medallists and World Champions. Despite the World Championships placings initial results are promising. Paul Langley's win against World No 38 Thierry Cabrera in Atlanta was a major one and should be followed up with more. The OAP Squad head to Europe this summer for an intensive training and competitive schedule. At home Australia's most talented juniors will attend an intensive camp program while one junior goes to Sweden to play and two go to China for training.

The year has seen great changes in staff as Kelly O'Shea left to take up a position with the Australian Masters Games and then Sharon Graham married to become Sharon Rich and in December resigned to assist husband Andrew in his business. Donna Wilson also finished her six month term and left to work in a doctor's surgery. Kelly subsequently returned to T.T.A. as Administration Manager.

Zhou Lan Sun was reappointed on a contract to run until after the Atlanta Olympics. Aleks Jakubczak was appointed High Performance Program Manager to administer the OAP and Glenn Pepper was awarded a scholarship to be Assistant National Coach by the Australian Coaching Council.

Rod Lindroth resigned as Executive Director and left on June 1st to enjoy 12 weeks of accumulated leave and the Board appointed myself to act as Executive Director while a replacement was sought. It was an honour to be appointed Executive Director in my own right and I trust that I can fulfil T.T.A. aspirations and make the sport a great one.

My personal thanks go to Rod for his unstinting support and friendship and to Sharon Graham whose personal sacrifice during the World Veterans Championships helped in no small way to make the event a great success.

We are building a team at T.T.A. and when we have that team in place we intend to make the sport grow and prosper.

Major efforts have been made to relocate the office from the V.T.T.A. Stadium with over 30 premises being investigated. This move is a necessity for two reasons. One, the existing building will be bulldozed and, two, we have outgrown the existing office. It has become extremely difficult to work in the office with six full time people in attendance at times and with an open door the distractions are immense. The Board have approved the move but the negotiations at the time of writing are still continuing.

In Development we have achieved the following:

1. Stimulated States to create development plans. Most have now got plans in place and are implementing them.
2. Produced a regular Development Newsletter which has been very well received..
3. Produced a Development Leaflet.
4. Produced an Officials Poster.
5. Attended in excess of 200 meetings of Clubs and Associations throughout Australia.
6. Attempted to recruit key CAPS and VIP people in each State. Queensland and Tasmania have had excellent success in these areas.
7. Assisted the Veterans Sub Committee to develop this aspect of the sport across Australia. A Veterans Committee and Executive will be formed at the Australian Veterans Championships in 1995.
8. Initiated a National Officiating Program including a progressive documentation of officials courses.
9. Secured the World University Championships for Australia.
10. Secured the 2nd Asian Veterans Championships for Australia.



11. Secured a major international event for Sydney in 1999. This is through the S.O.C.O.G. (Sydney Organising Committee for the Olympic Games) organisation and the I.T.T.F. and will be a pre Olympic event.
12. Upgraded the magazine Table Tennis Australia which won an award for the best newsletter of a non profit organisation.
13. Introduced the Table Tennis Australia Advantage Card.

Opportunities exist for many new initiatives among them being the following:

1. 1998 Asian Championships.
2. World All Stars.
3. 2001 Commonwealth Championships.

Table Tennis Australia is also developing policies and programs for:

1. Women in Table Tennis.
2. Media.
3. Modified Sport.
4. Update and review of the Constitution.
5. Membership and Affiliation packages.
6. Membership system.
7. Liaison with commercial organisations.

#### National League

1995 saw the most successful National League season ever with the finals series being conducted at Centrepont in Sydney. Croydon, the front runner all season, overcame a very determined Geelong to become Champions for the first time and broke Geelong's strangle hold on the title. Coburg and Sydney made up the four with North Queensland, Perth and Adelaide finishing in that order out of the four. Seven teams competed compared to eight the previous year. Plans are already underway to make next year even better than this season.

#### Championships

Croydon & Districts Table Tennis Association tendered for and were awarded the Junior and Senior Championships. They ran an excellent series and are to be congratulated on their efforts. The Junior Championships attracted a record entry and were a showcase of the future talent of the sport in this country. Shirley Zhou and Trevor Brown dominated but there were many others who in the years leading up to and beyond 2000 will make their mark.

The Senior Championships were highlighted by the appearance of teams from Russia, Slovakia, Japan and Malaysia. The players from these countries added a new dimension to the Championships and this initiative will be continued in the future.

The Veterans Championships held in Perth attracted over 200 players and was excellently conducted by W.A.T.T.A.. This was a great tournament and testament to the spirit of veterans sport and Table Tennis.

At Board level changes will occur at the AGM as Life Members Keith Bowler and Neil Harwood retire. They have given many many years of unstinting loyal service to the sport and all T.T.A. thanks them for their efforts. Both Keith and Neil were honoured at the I.T.T.F. Biennial General Meeting (BGM) in Tianjin, Keith with a Personal Honorary Membership and both Keith and Neil with a Merit Award. They are to be congratulated on these awards that are not given lightly. Keith joins one of only 11 recipients in 6 years since its inception, to receive this award.

Also at the same meeting the following appointments were made.

In addition, Ron Keyhoe was accorded the honour of being appointed Head Umpire for the Men's Teams Final between China and Sweden and followed this up with his appointment to umpire the Men's Singles Final.

All in all Australian officials performed well at the Championships.

Our Women's Team finished 23, improving one place but the men slipped to 49.

At the Commonwealth Championships the Women won a bronze medal and Kerri Tepper and Ying Kwok won a Doubles bronze medal in individual events.

The Men's Team finished a disappointing 7th place.

The year saw visits from Rufford Harrison, Chairman of the I.T.T.F. Equipment Committee and Yap Yong Yih, Executive Vice President of the I.T.T.F., to Australia and these visits proved extremely fruitful.

I started this report with a comment on the pace of change and after finishing it I realise the myriad of things occurring in the sport. There is a latent energy in the sport and we must harness that energy, all the while remaining focussed on the main game, that is promoting a sport free of drugs that everyone can play. This has been a difficult period, particularly in the communications industry and this is shown by the organisations T.T.A. talks to now to gain a foothold in the large commercial world. It has been a huge challenge to keep "my eye on the ball" in this, the busiest period of the year encompassing the Junior and Senior Championships and the National League Final with many other activities we have initiated.

This has been possible by the help of the support of a terrific staff, the Board and the many people who have offered advice and at times congratulations.

## ***NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR***

### ***1995 Coaching Report***

This year, emphasis on coaching support to the Schools Championships and New South Wales has greatly reduced the time available to the National scene from what is already a half-time position. Specific coaching requests from other areas have however been attended to where possible.

We have completed our first coach 'census' under the Reaccreditation System and currently have a register of 164 active coaches and 159 inactive. 18 coaches were registered this year, 30 participants in A.C.T. and N.S.W. are in the process of completing courses and the many participants in half day orientation to coaching workshops are not included on the Australian Coaching Council figures. This is the first assessment in our almost 20 year involvement in the National Coaching Accreditation Scheme (N.C.A.S.) and will now become a four year event.

Our attrition rate is consistent with other sports and reflects deaths, ageing population, transfers, decline of clubs, reduced participation or affiliation rates, the extra paper work associated with re-registration, limited coaching rewards, increasing demands on volunteer coaches, a number of course participants who want to improve their own or their children's game and other societal pressures. We simply do not have a large pool of people waiting to become coaches.

The other demographic coaching change worth attention is the influx of elite players and coaches (and the waiting list) from overseas. It is true to say that we enjoy more high level coaches than our present stage of development can employ or motivate or pay for.

A very different environment has developed rapidly in the recent past which requires modifications to the National Coaching Plan. Recommendations are being prepared for the N.C.C..

#### ***Specific Work Areas in 1994/1995***

- Preparation of State Academy and Sponsorship Plan for New South Wales.
- Establishment of Regional Coaching Centres for Albury/Wodonga, A.C.T. and West N.S.W. to improve playing standards, coach development and introduce Regional Training Camps for both Juniors and selected Senior players..
- The National Coaching Seminars in conjunction with the National Junior and Senior Championships were poorly supported and some form of compulsory expectation to attend may need to be considered under re-accreditation procedures.
- Glenn Tepper has continued and expanded the range of National Junior Training Camps to the States.
- Year of the Coach Awards instituted and continued as Coach of the Year Awards in 1995.
- An adjustable table project centred on Campbelltown P.C.Y.C. and including local primary schools has been develop in N.S.W.. If the promotional component is successful the scheme will be self replicating and extended to other P.C.Y.C.'s.
- Coaching courses are on schedule for South N.S.W. and Western Australia.
- Olympic Athlete Programs were serviced until January 1995.

Given the need to support our elite players and encourage younger ones to aspire to International achievements, I regret the Wharmby Foundation, which was to address such matters has bogged down in administrative and legal procedures. It has recently re-gained momentum and with the \$3,000.00 raised from video sales may yet regain momentum to fulfil this long overdue function.



I would like to thank the State Coaching Directors for their efforts this year, Zhou Lan Sun and Neil Harwood for their support. The New South Wales people who have laid foundations for some interesting future developments deserve to be commended. To the States and individuals for their vote of confidence, support and encouragement to stay on in Table Tennis. I extend my thanks and regret that I could not accede to your wishes.

## **School Development Report**

### **Preamble**

"We must get into schools - they are our future" is a statement recognised by most, but by no means all Table Tennis Administrators. It is also apparent that most clubs are waiting for schools to come to them and that our capacity to manage and develop the school/club interface requires both a change of thinking and acquisition of new skills. The problem exists at regional, state and Table Tennis Australia level and has been documented before. The issues, ideas and strategies are further developed in the workbook/workshop booklet - 'Building your Junior Club' which has made a few steps forward this year.

### **New South Wales**

Most of my efforts this year have been focused in N.S.W. and emphasis simple, robust self evident work practises rather than exotic planning for which I could not see resources to service. The work is still embryonic and as those who have experience of our grassroots will appreciate, a lot of work is required for small increments, but the projects have been:

- school/coaching developments in high density population centres, Gosford and Newcastle (population ½ million:- ½ dozen registered players);
- utilised and incorporated existing resources - schools and P.C.Y.C.'s;
- mending fences with the C.H.S. administration;
- self replicating - lower table project;
- modified coaching/competition formats;
- establish regional coaching centres - (3) for player and coach development;
- initiated after school Table Tennis - Lidcombe/Greenacres;
- identifying and encouraging future development workers;
- assisted with re-vamping the P.C.Y.C. State Championships.

### **National Schools**

The 1995 Secondary Schools Championships have been expanded to include a less intensive Primary Schools Carnival.

### Analysis

- Primary School support has not matched promises.
- N.T. has included a travel grant to the 1996 Championships in its Development Plan.
- There are 10,000 schools and over 300 affiliated Clubs/Associations in Australia, our interface is a little below par.
- The Schools competition is shaky but no worse than other components. Eg. National League, Membership, Volunteer Administration and has been a very low cost exercise to T.T.A..
- Not one team has come from the large Associations with the best facilities and paid National/International player/coach development personnel. There are clearly philosophical differences in work practises and goals between the latter and the volunteers on whose backs we are riding.

### Future Considerations

- The National Schools Events must be encouraged to evolve and in the high profile environment of the Australian Institute of Sport with occasional forays to other venues for special occasions - eg. 'Ambush' profiling.
- A working party of experienced Administrators is needed to resolve issues of:
  - Cooperative development between our 3 levels and resolution of roles.
  - Collating best practises.
  - Balancing the ratio of top down - bottom up components of National Development.
  - School development component of National Development.
  - Continue to advance our Australian School Sports Council category.
  - Revisit the A.B.C. National TV School Sports segment on the basis of our higher numbers.
  - Financially and administratively foster a National Team to the World School Table Tennis Championships. There are a number of ways this could be approached including an O.A.P. commitment in 1997. Whether the World Youth event continues or not, the standard of play and public development opportunities are considerable in this arena.

## ***DIRECTOR TECHNICAL (Incorporating Officiating Executive Report)***

### ***I.T.T.F. Rule Changes***

At its meeting held in Tianjin, China, changes were made to the I.T.T.F. Constitution, Laws, Regulations for International Competitions and Regulations for World Championships Regulations.

The changes to the Laws which technically are the only direct alterations that concern the players of Australia will be notified shortly, as at yet we don't have the exact wording of the new clauses, these will come into use as from January 1, 1996.

On this occasion the changes are very minor.

### ***Review of the Period 1994-1995***

During the past twelve months activity in the officiating area has been intense with continued progress taking place in the facets of Tournament Control, Refereeing and Umpiring.

Undoubtedly the highlight was the visit of the I.T.T.F. Equipment Chairman, Mr J. Rufford Harrison (USA) who was the principal lecturer at a National Seminar held at Albert Park, Melbourne and attended by Officiating delegates from A.C.T., New South Wales, Northern Territory, Queensland, South Australia, Tasmania, Victoria and Western Australia. This two day forum covered all parts of officiating and included a run down of the organisation of the Olympic Games Table Tennis events to be held in Atlanta.

In addition Mr J. Rufford Harrison visited Canberra and Sydney where he conducted seminars and took the opportunity of visiting the Australian Sports Commission in Canberra and Officials of S.O.C.O.G. in Sydney before inspecting the sight of the Table Tennis event in the Sydney Olympic Games.

During the year Mr I. Finlay (NSW) conducted a seminar in Brisbane for twelve officials from Queensland.

Mr Finlay was a Deputy Referee at the 43rd World Championships in Tianjin, Mr P. Males, a member of the I.T.T.F. Rules Committee, Mr A. Tabone, a member of the I.T.T.F. Technical Committee and Jury, whilst Australian Umpires in action were Messrs R. Keyhoe and M. McShane, whilst at the 12th Commonwealth Championships played in Singapore, R. & F. Keyhoe umpired. Mr R. Glasson umpired at the Global Youth Championships in Tokyo and the World Team Cup in Atlanta.

R. Keyhoe was honoured by the I.T.T.F. who selected him in both panels to control the Men's Team Final and the Individual Events Finals.

I would like to place on record a brief summary of our three facets of Officiating.

### ***Umpiring***

A continued drive to enlist new umpires was reviewed and targets set for all affiliated bodies, these targets were agreed at the National Forum held at Albert Park and are being constantly reviewed.

The standard of our International Umpires was confirmed at the World Championships however, attention must be given to new and younger umpires to ensure our ranks at all levels, State, National and International are maintained, indeed improved as we lead up to and beyond the Year 2000.

### Refereeing

Work on our National Referee's examination was finalised during the year and the written test approved by the I.T.T.F., who have now fully endorsed our methods of refereeing administration and control.

The first written examinations and candidates interviews were undertaken at Croydon, Victoria on Sunday September 3rd with 8 officials from Victoria, Tasmania and South Australia sitting for this examination.

Opportunities for officials from other states will be provided during the coming year and we are at present negotiating with the International Table Tennis Federation for them to conduct an International Referee's Examination, which Table Tennis Australia will host, to be held in conjunction with the World University Table Tennis Championships to be played in Geelong, September 1996.

### Tournament Control & Administration

At the National Forum the task of setting up a manual was entrusted to Greg Bungey (S.A.), Lindsay Drummond (VIC) and Maureen Sherman (TAS) and the first draft, some 85 pages, has now been completed. This task will be continued during 1996 and it is hoped to have this (the last facet of our Officiating Program) available during the coming year, and I would recommend that courses and examinations be scheduled for 1997 or earlier if at all possible.

Mr personal thanks are extended to Greg for the excellent work he has carried out to date in the draft he prepared.

I would like to record the appreciation of funding provided by the Australian Sports Commission to enable all of these projects to proceed and include a brief '*WHO ARE OFFICIALS*' from a recent A.S.C. brochure.

#### WHO ARE OFFICIALS

Any person who controls the actual play of a competition by the application of the rules and laws of the sport to make judgements on rule infringement, performance, time or score.



#### WHY DO WE NEED OFFICIALS?

To ensure the spirit of the game/event is observed by all.

In conclusion I wish my successor as Director Technical every success as I announced on September 11th, my retirement from Table Tennis Australia and I would like to leave all officials a short message,

*'Be prepared to accept the Umpires decision'.*

## **TABLE TENNIS A.C.T.**

Significant changes were made at the November AGM. These included a name change to Table Tennis ACT, an increase in the size of the Board including the introduction of a Volunteers Co-ordinator, and an in principle authorisation to make many changes to the Constitution.

Subsequently the Board invited Graham Cooke and Mike Migus to join as Independent Directors with specific expertise. The position of Coaching Director enjoyed various incumbents during the year and is currently a joint arrangement with Arthur Wilks and John Petersson.

### New Centre:-

It is very difficult, isn't it? With the approval of members, the Board changed direction during the year. The goal is now more realistic, achievable and sensible. We intend to refurbish our existing Centre, establish satellite areas for, say, one night and Saturdays in various locations around Canberra and look towards a larger purpose built stadium in the medium term. Two firms have quoted on refurbishment and the Board's decision will be taken in October.

### C.A.P.S.:-

Nine young people were recently presented with their Step 1 Certificates by Senator Margaret Reid. We now have 11 participants doing their Step 2 and two doing Step 3. The C.A.P.S. program and the C.A.P.S. participants are regarded as fundamental to our future.

### Volunteers:-

We all know the importance of Volunteers and most of us rely on Volunteers totally. The establishment and appointment of a Volunteers Co-ordinator has formulated our volunteer management practices. Currently about 35% of our members volunteer in one capacity or another. I suppose this is common with small organisations.

### Jeff Plumb:-

Jeff continues to excel. We are quite proud of him in the ACT not only for his playing performances but particularly for his playing demeanour which is a wonderful example for us all.

### Representative Teams:-

We were able to field teams in all junior categories for the first time as well as Veterans and Open Men. Jeff Plumb led the Mens Team to its best performance ever. Amanda Grahame also achieved a National Merit Ranking in the Under 17 Girls.

### Women/Girls in Table Tennis: (By Glenys Joliffe):-

**PATRONS:** This year Table Tennis ACT was proud to take on board Senator Margaret Reid, Deputy Leader of the Senate, as a Joint Patron along with Kazutoshi Hasagawa, Ambassador of Japan.

**POSITIONS:** There are three women on the ACT Executive now filling the positions of Vice President, Executive Director, E.E.O. Co-ordinator, Chairman of Selectors (Glenys Joliffe); Assistant Manager (Australian Junior Championships), Volunteers Co-ordinator, Coach (Rose Veerhuis); and Assistant Director and Assistant Volunteers Co-ordinator (Glenda Plumb).

**MEMBERSHIP:** Over this year we have had an increase in the number of women/girls involved in Table Tennis in the ACT, this involves players, officials and coaches. I am happy to say that the number has been steadily growing over the last few years. There are now twenty seven female players. This figure does not include the numbers playing in the Secondary Schools' Competition, which had an entry of fifty one mixed gender teams, run very successfully by our President, Arthur Wilks. Nor are our female "senior citizens", who regularly play within their own group, included in the above calculations.

**COACHING:** Aldwyn Altuneg, a top Australian ranked female player (unfortunately recently transferred to a job in Brisbane) devoted many hours coaching to players at all levels over the last three years, and provided an important role model for young women/girls; thus being an important female part of our coaching/development program, along with Rose Veerhuis. Our junior girls participate in our regular mixed gender team matches played weekly; this experience against senior players provides many benefits to these up and coming young girls.

It was very satisfying this year to have two representative girls' teams, Under 15's (Tracey Veerhuis, Alice Kingsland and Julia Grahame) and Under 17's (Amanda Grahame, Michelle Veerhuis and Sally Kingsland) going to Croydon, Victoria for the Australian Junior Championships, under the management of Barbara Cleary (a parent of one of our top junior players) and Rose Veerhuis (lending a touch of youthful and competitive expertise). The teams had a successful and enjoyable trip, highlighted by Amanda Grahame receiving No. 10 Australian Junior Ranking.

**C.A.P.S.:** An important part of this program is geared towards leadership development in young people, and the ACT is proud of its young C.A.P.S. people. ACT has highest number, pro rata of young C.A.P.S. people in Australian Table Tennis and the second highest (Victoria No. 1) overall. Our female achievers are as under:

**STEP 1 Female Achievers** - Michelle Veerhuis, Sally Kingsland and Alice Kingsland;

**STEP 2 Female Achievers** - Belinda Grahame and Kerry Veerhuis.

This year I attended the Womens Forum, the Prime Minister's Australian Women in Sports Awards and am actively involved as Director on the Board of the ACT Association for Women in Sport and Recreation. This has been an enjoyable, busy and interesting period, enabling me to gain a number of diverse female contacts over a wide spectrum.

This year our Association was proud to be able to produce an E.E.O. Policy, which is both necessary politically and a focus for bringing together a wide number of people of varying ages from different backgrounds, persuasions and gender.

*Some Very Good News:-*

- The current Spring Competition has attracted a record number of teams, in fact the largest number for over 20 years.
- As a result of the above, membership has increased 70% over the last 2 years.
- The Senior Citizens Group continues to flourish.
- The High Schools Competition has more teams and more players than last year - both the largest ever.
- Coaching is now conducted in 8 separate sessions, again the largest ever.
- We have been fortunate in gaining Senator Margaret Reid and the Ambassador of Japan as Co-patrons.

*Summary:-*

We are small and will always be small, but we are bigger and will be bigger still.

## ***TABLE TENNIS N.S.W.***

Table Tennis NSW Incorporated (our new name) is entering a new phase of developmental activities and restructuring as we head towards Sydney 2000. The dual task of increasing the quality and numbers of players will be the end result of a four year Development Plan between now and the Olympics. A major overhaul of the administrative structure is currently underway, as is the recruitment of more volunteers to ensure that TTNSW events and programs are more efficiently and effectively managed.

Over recent months, TTNSW has been active in setting up a series of Lightning Carnivals in schools. The purpose of these Carnivals is to introduce school children to Table Tennis and to encourage them to pursue Table Tennis as a sporting interest.

In conjunction with the Lightning Carnivals program, TTNSW is currently setting up junior coaching and training venues throughout greater Sydney. These venues are crucial for the recruitment of players into mainstream Table Tennis and the success of these junior programs is an important part of the overall NSW Development Plan.

For the first time in many years, TTNSW has begun a State Pennant involving its best players. Also in progress is the modernising of the running of our tournaments.

Progress has been made by the active Umpires Association and Veterans Association, who have been successful in obtaining sponsorship for State Veterans teams. Elite players in the Olympic Athlete Program continue to gain creditable results in National and International arenas. Likewise, the advent of the Sydney Smashers has served to boost publicity for Table Tennis and to raise standards in presentation and organisation. TTNSW will follow the Smashers professionalism in the running of the 1996 Australian Junior Championships.

The important issue of a regular venue for Sydney may soon be resolved. TTNSW is looking at a suitable venue for use on afternoons, nights and weekends.

Many changes have been made in the administration of TTNSW. The past 9 months has seen the employment of a new Executive Director, Coaching Director and Administrative Assistant. A new Constitution and Development Plan has changed the focus to a more business-like approach to the administration of Table Tennis.

Overall, positive steps in NSW are occurring at a rapid rate. The Sydney Olympics in 2000 presents NSW with a unique opportunity to promote Table Tennis as the "Sport for Everyone". The NSW Association is totally committed to the future development of Table Tennis in New South Wales.

Through it's own efforts and continuing T.T.A. assistance (particularly in the area of schools), progress will be made in the multitude of areas of operation of State Table Tennis.

## ***NORTHERN TERRITORY T.T.A.***

The Northern Territory Table Tennis Association (N.T.T.T.A.) has further consolidated its position by the successful formation of an independent Committee to form the Darwin Table Tennis Association (D.T.T.A.). In addition a financial base has been established through the agreements between D.T.T.A. and N.T.T.T.A. over venue hire.

The 1994 Northern Territory Championships were successfully held in Alice Springs with a strong contingent of Darwin players. The programming and results administration were organised by Alex and Urshler Kotrancz utilising PC based programs.

Membership has not significantly changed from 1993 and efforts are continuing to expand organised Table Tennis in Katherine, Palmerston and Jabiru areas. Palmerston has been given a kick start by the supply of Table Tennis tables, however a reliable venue has yet to be established.

Once again the Northern Territory was represented at the National Veterans Championships with the addition of a Women's Team. Whilst the Northern Territory did not improve its overall position, individual results have improved. The Northern Territory administration is looking forward to hosting a future Veterans Championship in Darwin and are currently planning the required resources.

Support from Darwin membership has been received for a submission to seek involvement and Table Tennis entry into future Arafura Games - held in Darwin every two years. (Approximate total participation all sports: 3500.) Darwin has several air-conditioned venues and in particular an international stadium that is available for future major events. However competition for venues is a problem during the Arafura Games and upgrading of other facilities is being considered.

Coaching has remained adhoc and it is hoped that through the support from interstate professionals specific coaching sessions can be achieved. Ron Moule has provided substantial assistance in the past. Umpire training has continued through the efforts of Mike Butcher. The general standard of umpiring and rules adherence has lifted.

Sponsorship from the Northern Territory Government has once again been substantial (greater than \$10,000). In addition continued support was received from Joondana Investments, Wastemaster and Darwin Bob Cat Hire.

On behalf of the Committee and members throughout the Northern Territory, I wish to thank the Secretary, Mike Butcher for another magnificent year of solid voluntary effort towards Table Tennis.

The Northern Territory is currently run totally by volunteers. However with the current support of the Northern Territory Government it is intended to employ a part-time Development Officer for approximately 300 hours to enable the achievement of high priority items in the Northern Territory Business Plan.

Promotion within schools has continued through the support of Aussie Sports and the Northern Territory Government. However, follow up action is needed to capitalise on efforts to date.

The improved professional image of Table Tennis Australia, and its continued support for the Northern Territory has given us confidence for the future success of Table Tennis. I anticipate continued growth in the Northern Territory.

## **QUEENSLAND T.T.A.**

Since the Annual Report in August last year, we have been predominantly in a consolidation phase, with the implementation of strategies put in place over the previous few years.

It has proved essential for the administration staff to continue to emphasise to affiliates the necessity of forward planning, to work in co-operation with the State Association, as well as other affiliates as a team for the overall benefit of the sport in this State, rather than to live in isolation. Progress in this area has been slower over the past few years than one would have preferred; however, persistence is now reaping rewards in many areas, with response to Q.T.T.A. initiatives now gaining wider acceptance and support. Compliments are extended to many of our affiliates who are now viewing the "whole picture" rather than being complacent with their local scene.

As we operate on a calendar year, reporting at this time does not give a true reflection in many areas, one of these being our membership statistics. At the end of 1994 our registered numbers had dropped marginally over the previous year. This was the third consecutive year in which this has occurred, and of course left us well short of our projected target figure. During 1995 our membership has increased in many areas, with the overall positive effect of our numbers already exceeding those of 1994, so we remain hopeful of attaining our revised projected target.

(A query was raised in this report last year as to whether the reason identified in Queensland for decline or stasis in membership is repeated in other States/Territories, reflecting in the overall statistics of Table Tennis in Australia. To date no response or feedback has been received so, at the risk of sounding repetitive, I will raise the issue again as I feel it is imperative to positively identify reasons for our poor membership figures. It has been clearly demonstrated in Queensland that our problem is not so much attaining new members, but rather it would appear we lack the ability to retain a fair percentage of our existing members. We currently average an increase of new members in the order of 30% whilst at the same time suffer a loss of existing members in, at best, the same order. Again, as in last year's report, I ask if my suspicions are correct that this can be identified as a problem in other areas. It is a problem we are trying to address in Queensland, and if it were proved as a national trend, it presents a situation that seriously needs to be addressed at that level if we as a sport are to capitalise on what I consider a reasonably positive percentage of people attracted to the sport initially. Whilst it can prove a short term minor boost to membership to concentrate on attracting new members, a lot of resources have been effectively wasted if we lack the ability to retain those so gained. I repeat, until a problem is identified and recognised, no positive steps can be taken to address the situation.)

We continue to benefit from the support of the Dept. Tourism, Sport & Racing to fund in part many of our projects. The Department justifiably considers itself a major sponsor of sport and expects to be treated as such. This has resulted in increased administration demands in meeting the accountability guidelines, preparation and updating of development plans and detailed funding applications, as well as attendance at meetings etc. etc. Fundraising and sponsorship dollars remain relative low components of our overall income, but funds so obtained have increased marginally. We recognise the importance of becoming more self supporting, whilst at the same time trying to come to terms with the difficulties encountered when trying to raise funds from these sources. The level of financial obligation to our National body continues to be difficult to justify to a large proportion of our members and acts as a deterrent to many potential clubs/members.

The continuing employment of a part time State Director of Coaching has proved beneficial, particularly to regional and club coaches who have gained immeasurably from his coaching expertise. If it were possible to concentrate our Table Tennis population into a small corner of the State for 12 months, it is felt our results at National level would markedly improve resultant from the greater concentration of competition and coaching possible in a more confined area. However that is not the reality, and we continue to work within the parameters that tyranny of distance imposes. Since January 3 State Level Junior Training Camps have been conducted in various parts of the State, with our Junior Team Members benefiting from a camp held one week prior to their departure for the National Championships. This has proved impossible to organise for many years, with team members coming from such diverse locations, but will be included in future planning as an essential component of team preparation; time, school vacation timing, funding and distance factors permitting.

Our Junior Teams performed creditably at the National Championships, with our best performances in terms of team positioning at the conclusion of same being Under 17 Boys who only lost one match to be placed second, while our "B" team in that category was placed third. With 7 of our contingent of 16 "A" team members and 7 "B" team members receiving National Rankings we were justifiably proud of the efforts of our 1995 Queensland Juniors. Our senior male team, currently competing at the National Championships, lack the depth of the past few years, having been adversely affected by the retirement of Jens Krause and the move to Western Australia of Ian Irving. For the second consecutive year we have a group of very disappointed young ladies, with the National Youth Female Teams Championships AGAIN having been cancelled. Serious questions surely have to be raised at National level as to what measures they are adopting to ensure this appalling situation does not repeat itself again in 1996.

Most affiliates have conducted Open Championships, with varying degrees of participant support. The State Open Championships which, until the introduction of National League, frequently failed to attract interstate players, has benefited from co-ordinating same with a National League Match, in that one is assured of having at least 3 interstate participants. Our 3 State Closed Championships (Junior, Senior & Veterans) again were well supported in 1995, with State Rankings and Queensland Teams announced at the conclusion of each.

One area in which we have made considerable progress over the past 18 months has been to engender greater interest in umpiring, with numerous association level umpiring courses having been conducted throughout the State, several persons having been granted probationary State level umpiring status and one person having attained full State Level status. Whilst an Officiating Seminar conducted in the Brisbane area was not as well supported as we would have liked, those presented benefited from the content presented by Ian Finlay. Thanks are expressed to Keith Bowler for organising this seminar, and to Ian for his time and presentation.

With the input from workshops at a Development Forum, at which most affiliates were represented, and surveys conducted during the year, we are currently in the position of reviewing our development plan, upgrading it to encompass four years, as opposed to the previous three years, and preparing funding submissions for 1996. With capitalisation on the base established over the past few years, and concerted efforts made, positive progress should be made in the next 12 months.

## ***SOUTH AUSTRALIAN T.T.A.***

Since the installation of new members to the Board of Management of S.A.T.T.A. in November, there has been a gradual change in the format in certain areas and with the influx of new ideas and drive, I feel that the projects of the State Association are being cemented.

Many initiatives were instigated from the findings of the seminar and workshops conducted in 1994. A combination of both were presented to the Annual General Meeting in November and we have since been slowly introducing some projects and some put on 'hold' until our grant applications were approved.

This 1995 season has welcomed nine of ten members to the Board of Management of S.A.T.T.A. with each member having definite ideas on how they saw their portfolios and each one responsible for their duties.

With suggestions from the Tournament Director, Greg Bungey, he put into action the formation of a Country Sub Committee which has gone from strength to strength, with the support from six 'old' affiliates who have not seen the benefits derived from affiliation in the past. With support from our regular country affiliates, the group is now a healthy ten country affiliated associations.

I welcome our new members.

As Tournament Director, Greg has introduced his ideas and accepted suggestions for the improvement of tournaments and intends conducting a meeting at the end of the season, with all tournament co-ordinators within the State.

We saw the Development Director, Jan Makaev, produce a submission to Foundation SA which would benefit all areas throughout the State, but with budget restraints this has since been reduced dramatically by Foundation SA. This has been officially received.

Coaching Director, Janet Sior, has found it difficult to commute from Berri but has endeavoured to organise the coaching area and attend in the city the many state junior squad practises, special coaching groups, meetings, etc. All of which Janet has supported.

Our Finance Director, Lyndon Radbone, has kept a tight reign on the budget for the year and I believe we are in a healthy position as our information presented will show.

In the areas of Publicity/Promotion and Match Play, both Directors Darryl Barkla and Kris Carter have taken on their portfolios with great enthusiasm.

In my position as Administration Director, I am endeavouring to supply all affiliates with as much information as possible, but have found it difficult when Table Tennis Australia posts information direct and I am unaware of this until I have repeated the exercise. I co-ordinate as much information from the various Directors as possible and save costs in postage/printing etc. I distribute minutes of meetings earlier which I believe has been welcomed.

As the player registrations are received, they are updated on the computer and as T.T.A. is now investigating a new program, the current program is in limbo. I was supplied with 1500 numbers and as I have kept all players on this system, there is no room at the moment for the listing of the country members. A new program - Acord - is being investigated and the information can be transferred from Sassy. I am waiting on advice from T.T.A..

I have assisted in various areas, school programs, tournaments, state selection and we have found that many meetings organised by the Division of Sport are held during the day and our sport cannot be represented.



Michael Edwards volunteered to attend the meetings of Sport SA, Commonwealth Games and Olympics, and financial assistance and support is sought in some of these areas. We do need to be represented at those meetings - to be seen and our sport recognised.

I attended an Administration Course Level Two in March, along with Tina Whelan from Woodville Club and at the conclusion had to produce an assignment on a choice of topics. I selected the organising and conducting of a National Championships, with the 1996 Australian Veterans in mind. This paper has been accepted and with a few slight alterations will be tabled at the first meeting of the Nationals '96 Sub Committee which will be formed soon. It may be accepted by the National body as a guide for all states in the conducting of future nationals.

Activities within the State are generating interest. We saw the Sturt Club change premises, but is now in the process of obtaining larger premises and could be ready by September. Extensions to the Brighton Clubrooms are not quite finished but players were introduced to this venue for the State Junior Championships. We saw a computer program introduced for this tournament which was very exciting.

The Board has been investigating insurance for both player and professional for the last few months and as earlier Seminar covered this, hopefully you, the Clubs and Associations, are now more fully informed of your obligations to both your playing and committee members.

The Policy and Planning Director, Robert Henzell, has recently resigned, but tabled a report on his activities during his time on the Board.

With great excitement, South Australia Under 17 Girls State team won the Australian Teams event at the recent Nationals in Croydon. The team of Tammy Gough, Megan Winter, Ellen Winter and Tania Zerna must be congratulated on their great efforts.

Our Under 15 Boys Team lost the final match to Victoria, 5 - 4 which was disappointing but as our boys are still very young, South Australia will have some great players from all states to contend with in the future.

The Board has accepted the challenge to conduct the National Veterans Championships in Adelaide in 1996 and at the moment are finalising details concerning a venue. Once this is in place and contracts accepted, preparations will start moving with the formation of a Sub Committee.

As you can see, there is so much happening in our sport and assistance and support will be most acceptable from all areas.

We have in mind to develop the area of our metropolitan affiliated associations along similar lines of our country associations and with the benefits we can offer, hopefully our sport will survive for another decade.

I wish to lodge a special thanks to our President, John Potter, for 'taking on' the position and supporting the Board and especially for assisting me with any problems.

## **TASMANIAN T.T.A.**

The 1995 Table Tennis year has been another successful year for both players and administrators.

Under the leadership of a new Chairman, who knew nothing about how to play the game, but lots about meetings, liaison and communication, the scene has been set for new directions in the future.

The Tasmanian Board was approached by the Netball Association which has premises at Creek Road, New Town, to ascertain if we were interested in utilising some of their facilities, including Office space. This would be of tremendous assistance in the effective running of the affairs of Table Tennis Tasmania.

The Division of Sport & Recreation, which assists financially with our State Development Officer, relaxed some of its guidelines this year, which enabled us to use Peter Ma Sen more effectively. He was able to spend more time with the elite players and general rosters players instead of having to spread himself around to a multitude of schools. This enabled far more time to be spent with fewer schools and the results speak for themselves.

This year Tasmania was able to field both 'A' and 'B' Teams in the National Junior Championships, and with the success of our Under 15 'A' Girls Team for the second year in a row and the strength of performances in the individual events by several players, Tasmania is becoming very competitive with the rest of Australia.

Two of our Juniors have been invited to travel to China to attend a training camp later this year. This trip will benefit not only the players concerned, but will have an on-going effect on all the people they play on their return. The enthusiasm of Chinese people, both players and coaches, has to be seen to be believed.

The Tasmanian Table Tennis Academy is still operating from the Southern Tasmanian T.T.A. headquarters at the Kingborough Sports Complex. Peter Ma Sen was able to increase his effective coaching time at the State facility this year and it is planned to hold more vigorous and intense sessions next year as a lead up to the Year 2000 Olympic Games. "Mini Academies" are operating at some of the Branches and Coaching courses have been held during the year to have qualified coaches available at the Branches to continue the work Peter Ma Sen does with the school children. This is to ensure correct coaching procedures are followed.

The official newsletter of the Tasmanian Association, "Tasmanian Table Tennis" was produced by the Director of Administration in the early part of the year and the last two editions have been the work of our new editor, Dr Felicity Novy. The work of producing and editing the Newsletter would be so much easier and so less frustrating for Felicity if articles were forthcoming instead of having to be "extracted". This production should be used by both players and officials to reach all Table Tennis personnel.

Our young players are being encouraged to participate in the C.A.P.S. scheme and it is pleasing to see them taking part on Tournament Committees and generally learning the ropes. They are the Table Tennis Administrators of the future.

This is the first year I have been involved with the administration of Table Tennis at Board level, although I have been a delegate for several years, and I have been amazed at the amount of work that the small band of elected volunteers get through at a Board meeting. It is easy for people to sit back and look at some decisions made by the Board and see how it affects them as an individual without taking into account the long term implications for Table Tennis as a whole, so once a decision has been made, the decision should be accepted. Of course, criticism, hopefully constructive, is always welcome so that a truly informed decision is reached.

As the Tasmanian delegate to Table Tennis Australia, I have received mountains of paper work on Australian matters and I am looking forward to my first Annual General Meeting to see first hand the way these officials cope with the day to day running of our sport. It is a mammoth task, and I congratulate Table Tennis Australia for the way they communicate with the States, and are focused on our youth as a lead up to the Year 2000.

## ***VICTORIAN T.T.A.***

In 1994 a Strategic Plan was developed by the V.T.T.A. Board of Management and the general direction of this plan was overwhelmingly endorsed by a meeting of the Affiliated Associations/Clubs.

As a result of prudent financial planning and the support of the Affiliated Associations/Clubs for the Strategic Plan a modest surplus was achieved for 1994 - in stark contrast to the deficits of the previous few years.

The implementation of the Strategy Plan has been the main emphasis of the V.T.T.A. during 1995 and with the continued support of Affiliated Associations/Clubs - especially in the area of player registrations - a more substantial surplus is envisaged for 1995. At 1 September 1995 our player registrations have already surpassed the 1994 end of year figure - a heartening trend that augurs well for the future of Victorian and Australian Table Tennis.

In simple terms the aim of our Strategy Plan is to increase the participation numbers, improve the profile and increase the professionalism of Table Tennis whilst keeping the Association in a sound and stable financial state. With the support and unity of our affiliates we are beginning to make valuable progress in each of these important areas.

The V.T.T.A. Board of Management has been heavily involved in negotiations pertaining to the Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre. To date these negotiations have involved technical and functional aspects of the new facility. After protracted negotiations the V.T.T.A. Board was able to secure 27 National size courts in the new centre. In the next few months we will be negotiating with the Trust on the important issues of management of the Table Tennis area and all the financial aspects relating to the Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre. The role of the Trust is to oversee the management of the Centre.

A major Affiliated Association, the Croydon & Districts Table Tennis Association successfully conducted the 1995 Australian Junior Championships and the 1995 Australian International Open & Youth Championships. The international flavour of the Senior Championships was a boost for the profile and prestige of Table Tennis and T.T.A. is to be congratulated on this initiative.

Victoria performed well at the above Championships annexing the team titles in Under 15 Boys, Under 17 Boys, Under 19 Men, Mens and Womens events. Victorian players also performed splendidly in individual events with Trevor Brown and Shirley Zhou retaining their respective Under 17 crowns. Yvonne Li also retained her Under 15 title whilst Simon Gerada snared his first Under 15 Boys Championship. Shirley Zhou also won the Under 19 Womens Championship. At senior level only the Mixed Doubles escaped international domination with Dennis Makaling and Kerri Tepper the successful pairing.

The V.T.T.A. has recently instituted Junior Girls and Junior Boys Development Squads under the direction of former Internationals Nella Bran and Rod Carlyle respectively. The aim of these squads is to be a "feeder squad" for the National Academy and Olympic Athlete Programs. This is the first time for a number of years that the players between club and elite levels have been provided with a regimented coaching program. The V.T.T.A. Board of Management views these Development Squads as crucial to the lifting of the standard of Table Tennis in Victoria.

The three Victorian National League clubs featured prominently in the National League Finals Series. Croydon Conquerors defeated title holders Geelong Butterfly to win their first National League Championship.

In summary there have been positive gains for Victorian Table Tennis in 1995 and the V.T.T.A. is confident we can build on those gains in the lead up to the Year 2000 and beyond.

## ***WESTERN AUSTRALIAN T.T.A.***

In contrast to previous years all Board of Management positions were filled with some positions being contested. On December 31st 1994 I stepped down as Executive Director after 7 years in the position until resigning on April 30th. The position was then filled by Bob Lake who has fitted into the position well after being somewhat thrown in at the deep end. Regrettably long serving coach Ron Cubbage passed away in February leaving a void in the schools coaching program for which Ron had been the backbone. The Healthway sponsored development programs have now been put on course and sponsorship secured for 1996.

### ***National Veterans Championship***

From an initially pessimistic position this event proved to be the success story of the year, with 56 teams and 193 individual entrants participating. The surplus on the event enabled the Association to buy new tables and surrounds for its headquarters. also a number of Association members, gained valuable experience in the running of a National Championship, which should place the Association in good stead to run future National Championships.

### ***Country Development***

Due to the efforts of Peter Muller the Albany Club has been revived. As well as re-establishing club night activities, a Junior club has been formed and numerous coaching and development activities undertaken with the assistance of Healthway funding. Recently the Association has made positive steps toward having Narrogin affiliated and already a number of their juniors have been involved in Association development activities. Geraldton continues to thrive and has conducted an Open Championship each year since 1990.

### ***Competitions***

During the year ended 30th June 1995 six Open Championships and a Grand Prix series held. Town and Country Bank again sponsored the State Championship which is presented each year as the highlight of the Table Tennis calendar. The customary Spring, Summer, Winter and Veteran pennant competitions were held and it is planned to shortly hold Junior and Social Pennant competitions. Also a pennant competition in the northern suburb of Wanneroo has just commenced.

Recently the owners of the National League team "Perth Power" indicated for a number of reasons that they would not be entering a team in next years competition. Although not stated, the return of Mike Johns to the UK must have been one of the contributing factors as Mike had being the main driving force behind the WA team and in fact the League as a whole. The efforts of Mike, during his 12 years in WA, were recognised by the Association at the recent Perth Power wind up. The Association will soon decide if it wishes to enter a National League team in 1996.


