President's Report

WILL GOODIER

For TTA this past year has been particularly satisfying as we have either begun new initiatives or are progressing well with others previously started. TTA is very grateful for the support from the members and can only prosper with the continued cooperation from the table tennis family.

I thank our CEO, Peter Marriott and the staff for their fantastic work for TTA. I am aware the perception from some is that TTA is a very wealthy and large organisation. In reality there are only four full time and two part time staff. The income received barely covers expenses but the amount of work done is comparable to some sports with twice the staff.

We have had staff changes which include the appointment of Jens Lang as our High Performance Manager and National Coach. Also Bonnie Elliott is our new Administration Officer. Both Bonnie and Jens are a very capable addition to TTA. Sue Stevenson continues with us but has had her roles changed and now is in charge of our Paralympic Programme and the Culturally and Linguistically Diverse and Athletes With Disabilities Participation Programme. I commend all of our staff for their work to improve table tennis.

With William Henzell's resignation from the board this year the board looked around for a suitable replacement and were pleased when Paul Langley agreed to come on board. Paul was also appointed to the Audit sub-committee which also has Barbara Talbot and Graeme Ireland as members. The role of this committee is to monitor the financial operations of TTA and advise the board on best practice strategies dealing with the finances and accounts.

The CEO's report deals with many of the events and achievements of TTA so I need not duplicate them here. I will however mention the outstanding achievement of our AWD. Team and staff. I will also mention the fantastic support from the Australian Paralympic committee. The effort and dedication from Sue Stevenson has resulted in this continued support and I wish her and her team the best for success in the 2012 Paralympics.

The National Conference held this year was a great success in building a closer cooperation between TTA and the States and Territories. This and the Presidents teleconferences bring us more understanding of the challenges and requirements needed to successfully take our sport into the future.

Stability has in recent times been one of the problems associated with TTA and its ability to function effectively. With our CEO and staff working well and the board functioning solidly there now is an ability to plan ahead with certainty.

All the members of the board of TTA are hard working dedicated table tennis supporters .I thank them for their support and volunteer work and hope they continue to enjoy their involvement within our organisation .

I thank the continued support from the Australian Sports Commission, the Australian Commonwealth Games Association, The Australian Olympic Committee and the Australian Paralympic committee. Also TTA has brought many sponsors on board to share our brand recently.

As mentioned in last year's report 2011's challenges were to qualify athletes for the 2012 Paralympics, introduce additional domestic events for our high performance athletes and to roll out the participation plan to increase participants of table tennis specifically from the Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) and Athletes With Disabilities (AWD) sectors of the community.

I am happy to announce that TTA rose to these challenges in all areas thanks to the efforts of the staff at TTA and the ongoing support of the President Will Goodier and the Board Members of Table Tennis Australia

Achievements in 2011

While actual acknowledgement of the Paralympic Games team members has occurred in 2012, 2 players, Melissa Tapper and Rebecca McDonnell have qualified for the London Paralympic Games. Melissa became the standout international player of Table Tennis Australia with an amazing 7 Gold and 2 silver medals from the 7 events she participated in during 2011 and was rewarded by being ranked the number 1 female class 10 Para athlete in the world and being named the TTA "Victor Barna" Senior Athlete of the Year.

With regards to the Paralympic and the future of Para Table Tennis, TTA and Oceania Table Tennis began lobbying the ITTF in 2011 to have Oceania become a separate Para Region rather than having to have Australian and Oceania Para athletes try and qualify through the current Oceania-Asia region which presently exists. To this end TTA formed a Para Committee to work through the many requirements which would be required should the ITTF grant such a separation. While officially announced in 2012 all of this work in 2011 paid off and as of September 2012 Oceania will be recognised as a separate Para Region.

Our High Performance athletes were able to wear Green and Gold at home on 2 occasions during 2011 with the Oceania Cup being held in Adelaide which William Henzell won qualifying him for the Men's World Cup in France. The second event was the inaugural Hyundai Bennelong Cup held at Ryde in Sydney against professional teams from Korea. This test match was one of 2 additional domestic events developed by TTA to assist our high performance athletes at home. The second event was the establishment of the Mounties Invitational which saw the best domestic players in Australia compete for major prize money.

The participation program managed by Sue Stevenson (National Development and Inclusion Manager) has picked up speed with projects implemented in Cabramatta, Bennelong and Gold Coast. Further agreements with Clubs in Queensland, South Australia, New South Wales and Western Australia will be developed in 2012. The largest individual program commenced in 2011 was the schools program to be established in the Bennelong Federal Electorate of Sydney. In conjunction with the Federal Member John Alexander, TTA secured a \$100,000 sponsorship from Hyundai Motor Company Australia to place table tennis equipment into every school and the Royal Rehab Centre in 2012. It is hoped that this program will see over 5000 children playing table tennis as part of their school sport.

TTA officially became a Company Limited by Guarantee and adopted a new constitution at the 2011 Annual General Meeting; the existing Board Members took over as Directors of the new company at this time. The only change of the Board during 2011 was the appointment of Paul Langley due to the resignation of William Henzell who took up a position to play and train in Austria. The Board instigated a new Audit Sub-Committee which will assist the Board in areas of financial management and risk management during 2011.

The Staff of table Tennis Australia saw some significant changes due to the resignation of Brett Clarke and the introduction of the participation program. TTA decided that with Brett's departure that it was time to restructure the staff of TTA. Sue Stevenson moved into the new role of National Development and Inclusion Manager managing the participation program and overseeing the Para High Performance Program. Roger Massie was re-appointed as the National Para Head Coach and would work closely with Sue in managing the High Performance Para program. The old High Performance Coordinator and National Head Coach positions were merged and TTA went on an international recruitment process to identify a suitable person to take charge of the newly created National High Performance Manager/National Head Coach position. In June TTA appointed Jens Lang from Germany into this role.

Whilst the results of all the tournaments conducted during the year are contained later in this annual report, I would like to acknowledge the efforts of the State/Territory committees and volunteers who hosted the major events during the year.

Congratulations to all of the players who competed in these events and a big thank you to all of the Coaches and Managers for helping make these events possible.

Internationally our Veteran, Senior, Junior and Para players and teams were also extremely busy attending international tournaments on almost every continent in the world. Participation in these events would not have been possible without the extraordinary support from our major funding partners, the players and parents of our players. A full list of the events and players which represented Australia during 2011 is shown later in this annual report.

Last but not least it was a pleasure to see these players and teams compete in a true Green and Gold Uniform courtesy of our new uniform sponsor Adidas.

Stakeholders:

As mentioned a lot of the competitions our players competed in would not have been possible without the continued support of our major funding partners and stakeholders. Our Principle Funding Partner the Australian Sports Commission continues to support our sport not just in the provision of finances but the support and resources given through their staff at the Sports

Commission is indispensable. A special thank you to our Partnership Manager Kim Williams, who has continued to assist TTA throughout 2011.

The Australian Paralympic Committee continues to increase their support of Para Table Tennis, with funding and resources which has ensured that every possible opportunity will be given to our Para athletes in their efforts to qualify for the 2012 Paralympics. The APC have also continued to assist TTA in developing a Classification pathway and courses for our sport and has continued to help us develop and improve our Sports Science and Sports Medicine program for our PPP athletes which would rival many other able and disabled programs around the country.

It would be remiss of me not to mention the tireless efforts of the Australian Commonwealth Games Association. The ACGA continues to provide financial resources to the sport of Table Tennis to allow our athletes to prepare for the Commonwealth Games. The ACGA has also provided much needed funds to assist in sending the Australian Junior Team to the World Championships. In addition to these financial resources they have worked hard to ensure that the Athletes were kept up to date in the chaotic build up to Delhi and made sure that the games would be a memorable occasion for the athletes and staff.

The Australian Olympic Committee has assisted TTA throughout 2011 with funds to attend our bench mark events as well as significant administrative assistance in preparing for the 2012 London Olympic Games.

Looking Ahead:

2012 will be a big year with both the Olympic and Paralympic Games being held in mid to Late 2012. Australia will be represented in both of these events and will no doubt make us proud.

TTA will continue to grow on the developments of new domestic events for high performance athletes and we will continue to look for new ways to provide opportunities for our junior players to be exposed to international competition. Jens Lang will become more visible to the States and Clubs throughout Australia as he embarks on a visitation schedule to sit down with States and Clubs and discuss high performance and how the whole sport can play a part in improving the standard of our player internationally.

Our participation program will continue to expand into new States and Clubs with the continued goal of increasing the number of participants involved in our sport.

In closing I would like to thank all of the State and Territory Associations for their continued support of TTA and a big thank you to the Staff of TTA for their tireless efforts.

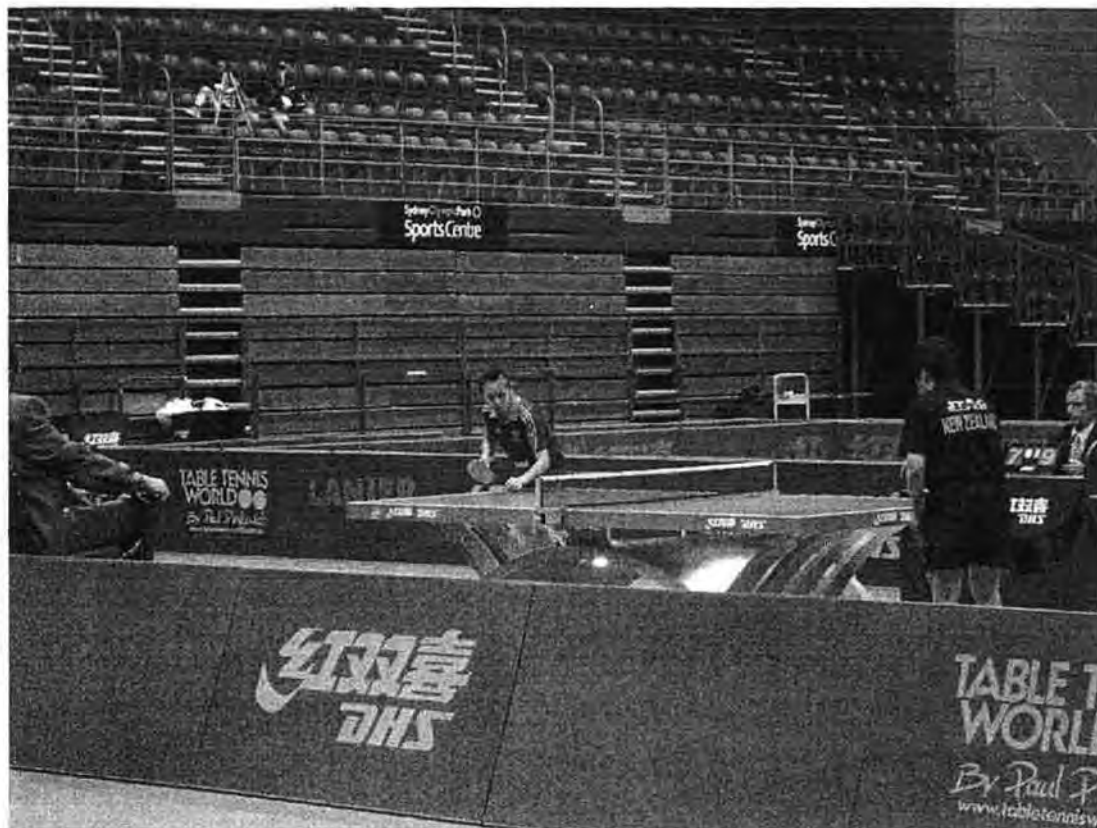

Australian Sports Commission Message

The countdown to an Olympic and Paralympic Games is an exciting time for Australians. As London 2012 looms on our horizon there is much work to be done to fine tune our preparations.

The Australian Government and the Australian Sports Commission (ASC) continue to work closely with Olympic and Paralympic sports, along with the Australian Olympic and Paralympic Committees to ensure our athletes get the best possible support.

Through the Green and Gold project, \$3.85 million in extra funding has been provided for our top Olympic athletes and teams to boost their training and preparations for London 2012.

A true sign that Australian sport is united in working together is the endorsement from the Commonwealth, State and Territory Governments of the National Sport and Active Recreation Policy Framework.

What this means is that for the first time all governments have agreed on priorities for sport.

Underpinning the Framework is the new National Institutes System Intergovernmental Agreement which unites our National Institutes of Sport and national sporting organisations to work hand-in-hand to achieve common national high performance objectives to maximise resourcing and expertise in support of the development of world class athletes to achieve international success.

This Framework is supported by significant additional investment in sport by the Australian Government. The 2011-12 Budget will provide \$300 million to support the full spectrum of sport from grass roots through to elite competition.

Support by the Australian Government will enable a more collaborative long term focus to drive reform within Australian sport and importantly make the connection between Australian's standing on the podium and young Australians participating in sport.

This is an exciting and challenging time for Australian sport. The Australian Sports Commission looks forward to working with all sporting organisations, the state and territory institutes and academies of sport and state and territory departments of sport and recreation, to promote access to, and participation in, sport across the community and support Australia's continued sporting success.

BOARD MEMBERS EXPENSES



Tasmanian Table Tennis Association Inc.

President- DAVID NETTLETON

2011 had as its highlight the successful hosting of The Australian Open and Under 21 tournament at Kingborough in June. This was due in large part to the skills and endeavours of the Management Committee under the Chairmanship of Marshall Muller who did not put a foot wrong during the lead up to the tournament, and worked with precision and attention to detail to ensure its smooth operation throughout. There were others who assisted when required, and of course Phil Males and Graeme Ireland were essential in their specific roles. Much credit as well as the thanks of TTTA goes to everyone involved. It was also proof that the upgraded venue at Kingborough ranks as being among the best in the Country for such an event.

The other highlight of the year was the continuing advancement of Maddy Goodsell as an elite junior player. Her hard work and dedication allied to her talent ensured that although advancing into an older group she maintained her National ranking, and is now close to a National team placement. While elite development is not the most important part of our work, it is very rewarding for us all to have players of this calibre around to encourage and inspire others.

Our main function is of course to attempt to ensure that table tennis is managed efficiently for the benefit of all players. While the main responsibility for this lies with the Branches, we have our role to play. The first priority in this is to have a full Board of Directors, and this again was achieved and so it is with pleasure that I thank them for the work they did in their various roles. Our Board meetings were via teleconference which provided an effective means of working. The next priority is having good communication with the Branches. Unfortunately this year our Council meetings (apart from the first one) were not well attended, and indeed we had to cancel November's due to it becoming obvious that a quorum would not be attained. Hopefully we will have better attendance at these important meetings – where vital decisions have to be made - in 2012.

The programme of tournaments went well apart from there being one less due to circumstances beyond our control. I thank all tournament organisers for the work they put in to make them happen, and all players who participated as well as Maureen Sherman who was omni-present as referee. I would like to add that the guidelines were again updated through the democratic process of recommendations from the tournament committee which next went to the Board and were then ratified at Council. It is therefore essential that these guidelines be adhered to by organisers. No single person has the right or authority to over-ride what has been decided by the democratic processes of TTTA as was the case at the Tasmanian Open this year with unfortunate consequences.

State League was again hosted by NTTTA at The Federal Country Club, Launceston.

This year due to its clashing with Nationals, its format was amended to eliminate age groups. We should give consideration to making this a permanent arrangement. Thanks again to David Cramp and his committee for their organisation of this event.

Tasmania was well represented at all National Tournaments again this year. It was particularly pleasing to see us able to field junior girls' teams again which had not been the case for some considerable time up until last year. We fielded a 'B' team at the Men's Open as well as the 'A' team which was a first, as well as two teams in the Men's U.21. Once again we thank the time and effort put by the coaches and managers of these teams who gave their time freely.

Once again the Academy and Southern Regional Junior Development Squad were in operation throughout the year under the direction of the head coaches David Wilson and Andrew Goodsell respectively. Consequently we now have several juniors playing at advanced skill levels as well as with great enthusiasm. These are vital groups in our efforts to develop the sport here and we thank all involved. The intention remains to expand the Development Squad to other areas, but this again proved impossible this year due to various factors, but not for lack of trying.

Roger Massie joined the TTA staff this year as National AWD Coach. In addition to his work for TTTA as our AWD Director he has been very busy with the Australian AWD Teams. Tasmania has a long history of supplying quality personnel at a National level. Roger carries on this proud tradition. Congratulations Roger on your achievements in 2011.

Once again we have been well supported by Sport and Recreation Tasmania with a grant of \$7,500 in 2011 for developmental purposes. The bulk of this money went to Branches as a payment for introductory sessions run at their centres. Several people were involved in facilitating this, and we have as a result a number of new players involved with our sport.

We were successful in applying for a grant for 2012 for \$13,500 to be spent mainly on introducing the sport to disabled people in an attempt to open up the possibilities of them participating at some level in the sport. Roger Massie will be the organiser of this programme for TTTA.

I would like to express my appreciation of the help given us by Sport and Recreation Tasmania and its officers which has helped us in our aims.

I look forward to 2012, and the continuing enjoyment of table tennis by all those involved, and thanks all of you who contributed in 2011.

State Delegate - IRWIN PARKER

As is usually the case the WATTA board was not filled leaving additional work for the remaining few. David Cooper made a return to the Board as President and was faced with the resignation of the Tournament Director resulting in him having to take on this responsibility. Finance Director Irwin Parker, after a stint filling in as Executive Director, relinquished this position to Bob Lake who returned to the position after an absence of three years. Chris Marsh continued as Match Director. Dennis Chen continued his dual roles of Coaching Director and State Coach achieving heartening results with our junior players.

During the year seven Open Championships were conducted commencing with the Albany Open. Of the seven, five were conducted by affiliated clubs and two by the Association. Generally speaking these events were well supported. Additionally leading players also participated in the WATTA Grand Prix series an event that was instituted by Mike Johns in 1990. As usual the Association conducted three pennant seasons (Summer, Winter and Spring) and although overall number of teams entered was disappointing they were keenly contested. The Match Committee and the Association are always looking for ways to lift the profile of the pennant competition and to entice more entries.

On the National Championship level the bronze medal winning performances of both our boys and girls under 13 teams was heartening as was the number who made the orders of merit. If these and other junior players stay with the sport, WA should be well served in the future. As usual our veteran players performed well at the national Veterans Championship winning several gold, silver and bronze medals and a number achieving an order of merit.

David Brown was appointed as (honorary) State Development Officer and in that role was heavily involved in Schools/ Junior coaching AWD activities and in conducting Schools & Junior graded tournaments. Additionally David fulfilled the position of Registrar and provided technical support in the computing area.

While official approval has been given by the Town of Victoria Park to build a new sporting complex, including a dedicated table tennis stadium, has been approved a great deal of work needs to be done. Detailed design work needs to be carried out, a comprehensive business plan formulated and funding arrangements finalised. The Association has and will be working closely with the council and it is hoped that planning will be completed this year with building taking place in 2013.

In addition to the Board Members the Association has been well served by a number of volunteers during the year. These include Peter Mascal (canteen), Charles Ellwood (General clerical and centre work), Greg Letts (Newsletter Editor), Paul Andriessen (Scoreboard maintenance), Edward Trang (Junior team manager), Craig Campbell (Junior team non playing captain), Maureen Hooper (Gardening), Lindesay Mee (Match Committee, tournaments and Centre work), Sue Campbell (Tournaments and admin), Victoria Southcombe (Tournaments), Gerry Bridson (Seniors group organiser) Phil G Ranger (Junior club). Additionally at club level there are a number of others who contribute significantly to Association activities including the running of open tournaments.

The Association made a profit of \$5734 which represented a \$13,000 turnabout from the previous year. This was due to the absence of the need for substantial work on the centre which was the case in 2010. Also the cost in sending away state junior teams was less due a smaller number of participants. Otherwise the Association more or less operated within the same parameters as in 2010. The centre recorded an operating profit of over \$24,500 which was applied toward Association operating expenses.

Core funding from the Department of Sport and Recreation was maintained at \$16,000 and will be maintained in 2011/12. Development funding from Healthway for the 15 months ending 31 December 2011 amounted at \$14,500. Additionally Healthway continued to provide \$2,500 sponsorship for the State Championship. Future funding has been tied into calendar years with \$15,000 being approved for the 2012 calendar year. Healthway income was supplemented by the ASC'S 'Active After School' program which complements the development activities of the Healthway program.

In 2012 the Association faces a number of challenges including the staging of the National Junior Championships. Hopefully a few old hands will come on board and be complimented by some new faces. The institution of the category of social membership by TTA is seen as forward step. Hopefully this initiative combined with the TTA Participation Plan will result in an overall increase in numbers Australia wide.

On sitting down to write the President's Report for the TTA Annual Report, I decided a good starting point might be to read back over the Annual Reports of the last five or six years, to hopefully gain some inspiration. It proved a very worthwhile exercise in terms of realising just how much had been undertaken by Table Tennis Queensland, its member associations and individual members during that time frame. There had been some great successes as well as some areas for reflection, but the overall conclusion seemed to me that as an organisation we are gradually making progress in many areas.

As always, this report needs to begin with an acknowledgement of the contributions of our three staff, Derek Scott (Executive Officer), Karen Carruthers (Administration Officer) and Jason Walsh (Regional Club Coordinator) who continue to provide tireless effort in the implementation of Board policies, and working towards the continuing development of table tennis in Queensland.

PARTICIPATION

Membership figures for 2011 showed a healthy 5.7% increase on the previous year from 1542 to 1630, fuelled by three new member clubs during the year in Dalby, Moreton Bay and Townsville. However, eleven of our existing clubs showed a small decrease in members on the previous year. A further slip in members saw Brisbane Table Tennis Association replaced by Gold Coast Table Tennis Association as the state's largest club (by number of members).

Club membership grew from 20 to 22 with three new clubs joining TTO and one club (Montville) closing.

The Queensland Schools Championships again had a record number of teams and schools participate with 74 teams from 38 schools across three events: Gold Coast, Brisbane and Townsville. My thanks go to all of the volunteers who gave up their time to help in running these events.

PEOPLE

There were four Level 1 or TOPS coaching courses offered in 2011, run by Danny Lloyd, State Coaching Coordinator and by Cathy Townsend. There was one state and one national umpires' course held during the year run by Dave Delpratt. My thanks go to Dave, Danny and Cathy for their efforts during 2011.

The introduction of the new TOPS Award has seen a significant increase in accredited coaches for two primary reasons. Firstly the course is attractive to school teachers for their in service training and we have had large numbers of teachers attending. Secondly the format of the shorter course accredits successful candidates on the day of the course, lessening the drop-out rate from people doing the Level 1 course and then not completing the additional requirements. By the end of the year TTO had accredited 47 TOPS Coaches, a great success.

Finally, 2011 was another a year of awards for Queensland officials, with Dave Delpratt a finalist in the Official of the Year Award at the Queensland Sports Awards.

DEVELOPMENT

TTQ secured funding of \$52,000pa for three years to employ a new Regional Club Coordinator during the year. Jason Walsh was appointed in August 2011 and has been working with his group of six clubs assisting them in a range of development initiatives. We have also secured funding for a multisport club coordinator in Cairns, in partnership with Queensland Badminton and Queensland Tenpin Bowling, and this role will be advertised in early 2012.

Totally Table Tennis was launched in 2011 and was trialed at Townsville and Gold Coast during the year.

A series of Development Squad weekends were organised at Gold Coast, Brisbane, Rockhampton and Townsville. However attendances were mixed and this program will be reviewed for 2012.

Three clubs have been selected by TTA for Federal Government Participation funding to develop their Athlete with a Disability (AWD) programs: Bundaberg, Gold Coast and Townsville. I hope to see good increases in players nominating for the state AWD team in 2012, especially since the event is being held in Queensland (Gold Coast) for the first time.

FINANCE

TTQ received government funding of \$141,000 (+GST) in 2011 in funding, split across core funding, Jobs Plan funding and a Queensland Academy of Sport scholarship for Peri Campbell-Innes. I would like to thank the Queensland Government Department of Communities (Sport and Recreation Services) for their continued financial support in 2011.

The core funding is guaranteed until the end of 2013 and will increase in line with CPI until this time. As noted earlier, we also secured \$52,000pa in funding to employ a Regional Club Coordinator in South East Queensland and again this funding is guaranteed for three years increasing in line with CPI.

GOVERNANCE

The 2011 Annual General Meeting (AGM) brought about some changes to the TTQ Board of Management with Tony Herbert and Paul Uttley filling the vacant board positions from South and North Queensland respectively.

During 2011 the Board of Management developed, reviewed or updated the following governance documentation: Constitution & Bylaws, Communications Policy, State Team Subsidy Policy, Complaints Procedure and Risk Management Documentation.

CONCLUSION

TTQ recognises that the sport of table tennis within Queensland depends upon the army of volunteers who organise clubs, events, transportation and Table Tennis Queensland itself. Therefore Table Tennis Queensland would like to thank all volunteers, coaches, players and parents who have all contributed towards the success of the sport in 2011.

Finally, Table Tennis Queensland would like to thank all clubs and individual members for their continued support in 2011.

Governance

The TTV Board commissioned external consultants to review the governance of TTV. As a result the Board implemented a number of initiatives, including the creation of two independent director positions, meaning the Board could attract highly qualified professional directors from outside table tennis. The Board has now used this to appoint two skilled sports professionals.

The Board also appointed a new CEO with a background in sports management, in particular the Olympic movement.

Flowing on from the review, TTV has restructured its governance, disbanding the 'portfolios' held by Board Directors and creating new committees that report to the CEO, and making the CEO accountable for the operational performance of the association. At the same time, the Board has lifted its focus from operational activities to focus on three levels of governance: strategy, performance and compliance.

Operations

TTV continued its success on the playing field with strong performances in AWD, junior, senior and veteran ranks.

Strategy

A change in focus has been adopted by the state body. Rather than focus on providing programs, pennants and activities the state body is now focusing on helping its clubs to deliver these services to the playing members. As an example, it is licensing out its premier pennant competitions for clubs to run.

A real focus on school participation and on increasing membership is expected to substantially boost membership numbers over the next few years.

Equal Opportunity

Recognising that females are significantly under-represented in our sport the Board was fortunate to find three highly skilled female directors to appoint to the Board. It subsequently appointed one of these to the important role of CEO. It is hoped that providing leadership opportunities to women will play a lead role in the wider adoption of our sport by female players, officials and administrators.

To encourage female participation TTV now pays equal prize money to male and female competitors, regardless of entry numbers in tournaments.

On the occasion of my third AGM as President and reflecting on 2011, we have been able to consolidate on the work of several years. We have seen players representing NSW develop to become a major part of the top elite group within Australia.

We have continued to increase the number of Associations affiliated with our organisation and this increases the number of registered players. We have again been active in trying to promote table tennis in the regional areas, while still maintaining a presence in the metropolitan regions. We have worked closely with the Country League to improve this aspect of our operation.

I am pleased to welcome the new Affiliates from Blayney Table Tennis, Eurobodalla Table Tennis Club, Coffs Harbour Over 50s Table Tennis Club, Kogarah RSL Table Tennis Club, E.L.I.T.E. Table tennis Club and Forestville Table Tennis Club.

The new membership level called "Social" has continued to grow, which reflects the value of introducing this new level. Because of the efforts of TTNSW the national organisation TTA is also making allowances for this level of player and it will be phased in across Australia over the next few years.

The table below indicates the changes within the Levels between 2009 and 2011. In 2011, the number of "pensioners" stayed steady. The drop in "Competition" did continue and this could be for a number of reasons, one we are aware of is that one association accidentally enrolled a lot of their members as social instead of Club; this will be corrected in 2012.

The highlight of 2011 was again the excellent results of all our representative players in national tournaments. New South Wales continued to be very successful at national competitions, which reflects well on the effort of the players and their coaches. In the recent Australian Olympic Qualification Tournament, NSW was well represented in both the men and women's groups.

The TTNSW office arrangements still proved to be difficult to maintain on a permanent basis. Of course Ted, Jan and Jason have continued to service the office and the requirements of the organisations. However the ideal of having a permanent person in the office still eludes us. As most of the activities are undertaken on a voluntary base and we receive very little in government support it is hard to make the move to a more permanent arrangement. The base costs for having full time office staff would be over \$65000 per year and this is not an option on our current revenues.

In early February 2012 TTA finally agreed to a national database through the IMG organisation. This move should enable us to have better access to membership information, and allow our Association Members better access to their member base information.

An additional benefit is allowing us to move our web site to a more flexible service, again through IMG. Over 2012 members should start seeing major changes to the way we communicate and disperse information on upcoming events.

One important aspect is that we need as many players as possible to have access to emails. This makes getting information out easier and more effective and cost efficient.

As we have received enough nominations to cover the executive and Board, there will be no election this year. However, we will be calling upon members from time to time to add their considerable experience to benefit the organisation.

I would like to Thank Tony Bo for his input this year and welcome back Q Tien as a Director. Tien brings a lot of experience especially in the AWD area and will be looking after this activity for us in the coming year.

Finally, I would again like to thank all Council and Executive members for their advice and goodwill over the past year. I believe that we will continue to develop this sport in the state and this can only be a benefit for our Affiliate members and players.

Winter Pennant winners and all State Award winners were presented with their trophies.

A special thank you to Ann Percy who has performed the roles of Executive Director and Finance Director. Ann has performed these roles well and has introduced to the Board during the year improved financial control and reporting.

Once again this year has been a difficult year with positions on the TTSA Board not being filled which in turn creates more work for other Director's. For Table Tennis SA to continue to maintain a satisfactory future, a full Board of Directors is required, people who are willing to commit time to their portfolio, attending monthly meetings and in general have table tennis at heart.

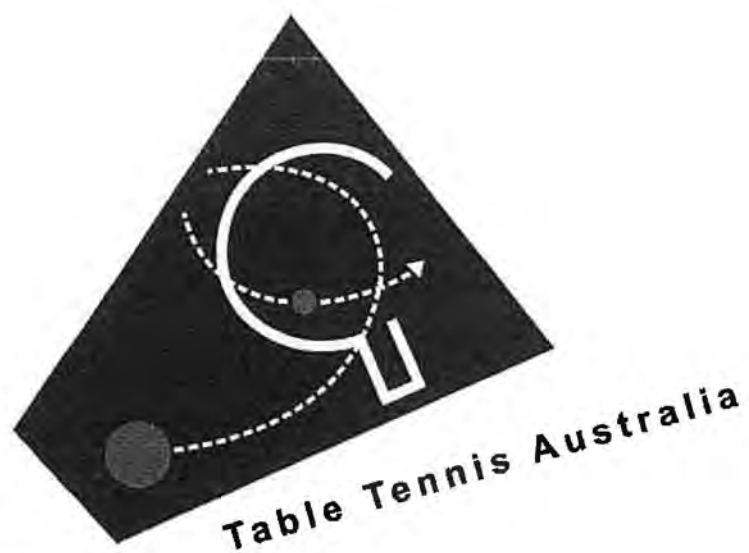
