

REPORTS

PRESIDENT

I am pleased to report that the 1995 - 96 financial year has been very successful for Table Tennis Australia (TTA).

The number of registered players has increased significantly from 7,700 in 1994 to 9,100 in 1995. An increase of 18%. This increase in the number of registered players reverses the trend from previous years and brings TTA closer to the medium term target of 10,000 players.

TTA has introduced a number of new initiatives and has built upon the gains of previous years. A significant achievement has been the upgrading of status by the ITTF of the Australian Open to be part o the elite Pro Circuit Tour.

The Australian Open will now accumulate points for competitors as part of their qualification for the ITTF Pro Tour Finals in Tianjin, later this year. Prize money will be US\$30,000 and the highlights will be broadcast nationally on the ABC. Entries have been received from 35 international players this year.

The TTA office will shortly relocate to new offices in St. Kilda Road, owned by Roche Brothers, a mining and construction company. The VTTA centre, where the TTA office is currently located, will be demolished to make way for the new Albert Park Sports Complex. The new offices will be shared with Volleyball Victoria and will provide appropriate facilities for the executive.

The National League has completed its most successful year. Spectator numbers have generally increased, some matches having in excess of 300 in attendance. Whilst this is a pleasing trend, it should be acknowledged that many clubs still struggle financially to participate due to the high costs of travel and associated expenses. Nevertheless, the National league continues to grow as evidenced by the interest from two consortiums bidding for the Tasmanian Licence.

Last year the National league finals were held at the Sydney Centrepoint Convention Centre. The finals were a showcase presentation with lots of entertainment, crowd participation and exciting matches.

This years finals promise to be even better. Highlights will be shown on Sports Tonight and other stations. A professional media build-up prior to the finals is planned, on order to heighten public awareness of the finals.

The National Schools Championships were conducted in Canberra under the auspices of Ron Moule. The Championships have grown steadily and have attracted a loyal following amongst some schools. In 1995, a total of 35 schools attended the Championships.

In 1996, the National Schools Championships will be held in Geelong. Wilhelmina Pruyn, National Development Officer, has responsibility for the Championships and has done an excellent job increasing entries and promoting the Championships. This year we are expecting an entry of 50 teams including entries from Tasmania, Victoria, N.S.W., S.A. and the A.C.T.

The National Officiating Programme is a less well publicised and low key achievement. However, the National Officiating Programme is an integral element of meeting Australian Sports Commission criteria. The programme establishes a structure for recognising and rating officials according to their qualifications. The programme also includes training so that officials can improve their level of qualification. As an incentive, participants in the programme may wish to nominate through the program as a volunteer for Sydney 2000.

Highlights of the International arena include a record 5 Australian Olympians in Atlanta. In Europe this year, the Women's Team competed very successfully with Jian Fang Lay being ranked 54 in the world. This is the highest ranking ever achieved by an Australian player

Glenn Tepper has been appointed National Coaching Director. During the year he has conducted an enthusiastic and highly successful camps program. The success of the camps programme has prompted plans to extend the camps to all State next year.

Glenn has also been responsible for increasing the number of registered coaches. There has been a 76% increase from 130 coaches in 1995 to 210 coaches in 1996.

The Acord registration system is now in place. For the first time ever, Table Tennis now has a complete data base on all registered players. This system has been designed by the Australian Sports Commission and provides significantly more accessible information on player and official categories. All registered players will be issued with a membership card in order to verify registration.

Following discussions with TTNSW and TTA Board approval, the National Development Officer, Wilhelmina Pruyn will relocate to Sydney later this year, for a period of 6 - 12 months. This decision has been taken in order to assist NSW in their development programme and build upon the success of the Australian Junior Championships and recent initiatives undertaken by NSW for junior competitions.

In conclusion, I would like to acknowledge the contribution made by the TTA executive during the year. The quality and commitment to their work has been outstanding. Table Tennis is fortunate to have the services of such a dedicated group of individuals.

I would also like to take the opportunity to thank the TTA Board of Management for their commitment and support during the year.

NATIONAL EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

I am writing this report buoyed by the news that registration figures for 1995 have exceeded nine thousand, an increase in excess of one thousand three hundred. 1995/96 was a year in which great changes occurred in Table Tennis and the above reinforced the view that the change was for the positive.

It has been a year in which Table Tennis Australia had confronted the task ahead put by the Australian Sports Commission to achieve two objectives.

- 1. Increase the participation rate and
- 2. Become internationally more competitive.

It is heartening that at the close of 1995 we were able to demonstrate to the Commission that we were able to meet all our objectives in world ranking's of our elite players and to register a significant increase in registered players.

What is required now is a strength to stick to the programs put in place and to build on these with new and innovative ones.

The past twelve months has seen a change in personnel. Rod Lindroth resigned as Executive Director and my thanks go to him for all the support he afforded me. Wilhelmina Pruyn joined Table Tennis Australia late in 1995 as National Development Officer and with her bubbly personality and infectious enthusiasm has set about the task of implementing many programs. Ron Moule ended many years of loyal work with Table Tennis Australia as part time Coaching Director. His position was changed with extra funding available from the Australian Sports Commission and Glenn Tepper was appointed as National Coaching Director. Kelly O'Shea ended her second stint at Table Tennis Australia moving to a position outside sport. Nicole van den Dungen takes her place as Administration Manager. We also saw Nela Bran appointed as Scholarship Coach replacing Glenn Tepper.

In keeping with the demands of the Australian Sports Commission, our largest funding agency, to make all sport in Australia professionally run and accountable through performance based contracts with sport, Table Tennis Australia has implemented many programs.

Our agreement with the Commission means that we must have a national database of all athletes, officials and coaches involved with the sport and to that end we have adopted the ACORD system of memberships. There have been teething problems with the program but all the major hiccups have now been ironed out. No doubt minor glitches will be encountered as time progresses, but these will be overcome. At the time of writing we have over ten thousand people on the database and will build this. For the first time we will be able to access any member, know their status in terms of player, official or coach, their level, and through the year by year update whether they remain a member or drop out. We can then plan our grassroots development programs much more confidently because of the data available.

In addition, opportunities will exist for marketing and merchandising to increase the financial rewards of membership and to upgrade our information process.

Because of the growth of the staff and the more professional approach the sport has adopted it was imperative that a change of location for the head office was required. It has taken some time but a location has been identified and the lease negotiations were well advanced. By the time of the Annual General Meeting an announcement will be made.

The past year has seen two planning matters addressed. A national insurance scheme covering player accident, coach and official indemnity and club and association liability has been investigated. A proposal for this is set down for the Annual General Meeting.

Dunhill Madden Butler has addressed the issue of the Constitution and placed before the meeting a proposed new document. It has taken some time to get to this stage and hopefully the finished document will be approved.

The magazine has been cut back to three issues to fall in line with the budget but also to ensure its high standard. As anyone knows producing a newsletter is an onerous task. I must thank all the contributors who make the job easier. Warren Gray, David Brown, Karol Javor and Keith Bowler have been of great support with stories or photographs and my thanks go to them. I have a policy with the magazine that as long as an article or letter is not libellous, slanderous or personally attacks anyone it should be published. Only with open debate will we address our problems and progress.

The National League has seen its most successful season yet with crowds in excess of three hundred attending some matches. Two consortiums are vying for the Tasmanian Licence for 1997 and this is a healthy sign for the League. The finals will be at Centrepoint in Sydney again and will be covered by television and also promoted by Grand Slam International. The Sydney Smashers will be responsible, jointly for the conduct of the event with Table Tennis Australia.

The Australian Open, conducted at Croydon was a great success with a number of international teams taking part and securing the major titles.

The Australian Junior at the same venue was also a successful event and congratulations go to Croydon for their organisation.

The Australian Veterans Championships were a resounding success and Joan Guggenheim and her committee earned all the accolades attributed to them. The last to be held in the Albert Park Centre they demonstrated all that was good about the Vets.

The Australian Schools Championships saw thirty-eight teams contest the event in Canberra. This was an excellent result and was a tribute to the hard work put in by Ron Mule over a number of years.

As we head towards 2000 and beyond, Australia has put its hand up for a number of events.

The highlight was the securing of the Oceania leg of the ITTF Pro Tour. The event will be based on the Australian Open and offers US \$30,000 prize money. The plan is to make this an annual event in Australia and place Australia firmly on the world circuit and guarantee the best players visit Australia each year.

The World University Championships will be conducted in September 1996 and the Asian Veterans Championships in November/ December 1997.

A Pre Olympic event will be conducted in 1999 and the Olympic Games in 2000. Australia is bidding for the 1998 Asian Championships and the 2001 Commonwealth Championships.

In response to the changing world of technology TTA is planning, when the office relocation occurs, to link up to the National Sports Information Centre, the Internet and introduce E-Mail. Having achieved that it would be a long term plan to hook States onto the system through our resources. The initial hookups will be done through the support of the Australian Sports Commission.

We have introduced a system of newsletters covering various activities and the dissemination of information through these is proving more than beneficial. The number of accredited coaches increased by 100 with the publication of lists in the Coaching Newsletter. The Officiating Newsletter "The Technocrat" will play a vital role as the National Officiating Program becomes operative.

The 1995/96 year has been a busy one with the further development of the OAP program, the planning for international competition, a sports science scheme for Table Tennis being developed, our camps program being expanded, the issues of Women in Table Tennis and Disabled Table Tennis being addressed and the demands of an Olympic year which throws special demands on the National Calendar.

It is my belief Table Tennis Australia is poised to take on the opportunities that have opened up for it.

A vision, a drive and an enthusiasm to build on the gains made and the programs now in place is required. If everyone in Table Tennis grasps the vision and is prepared to work towards those twin goals of increased participation and improved elite performances then the sport should leap confidently into the future.

In conclusion it would be remiss if the following were not thanked. Their considerable support enables the sport to prosper.

NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

My first task is to thank the outgoing National Coaching Director, Ron Moule, for his untiring work after thirteen years in the position.

The following projects have been undertaken in 1996:

1. NCAS Coaching Accreditation

For the first time, a one page published list of all accredited coaches by states and levels, that goes out to all states, associations and coaches, on a regular basis has been produced. This has made a huge difference in the number of coaches "slipping through the net", and this is reflected in our increased coaching numbers.

2. Coaching Newsletter

This is going out three times a year, with a far greater emphasis on practical coaching and sports science advice for coaches. The newsletter which is crucial for grassroots coaching is now being mailed to every accredited coach to ensure delivery. Reports from both the Australian Sports Commission and from accredited coaches to the changes have been very favourable.

3. Coaching Manuals

The updating of all our coaching courses and coaching manuals is desperately needed, as this hasn't been done for many years and much of the material is well out of date.

The process of approval for new Courses/ Manuals through the Australian Coaching Council is a lengthy one, which I expect to be completed by the end of 1997.

A Schools/ Junior Resource has just been completed, which included Lesson plans, Warm up games, Relays, Balance and Co-ordination activities, Skills circuits and match play variations.

A Coaching/ Sports Science Library which includes books, articles and videos is being continually updated. These are listed in the coaching newsletter and available for loan/hire.

4. Talent Identification

a) National Junior Camps

Camps have been expanded upon to cover a greater number of states and to cater to a wider age group.

The camps include all aspects of preparation including:

-Peaking plans, Sports Psychology, Nutrition, Physical Training, Multiball and Video analysis.

c) State Junior Academies

State Junior Academies have been established in Tasmania under Peter Masen and Victoria under Nela Bran. Juniors in both these academies are training up to 15 hours/ week, to coincide with the desired aim of increasing training levels to International standards. It is hoped to expand this program to other states and regional areas over the next 12 months to 2 years.

d) ITTF Junior Training Camp 1997

Negotiations are continuing with the ITTF for an Oceania Junior Training Camp in 1997, run by world renowned coach, Michael Gadal, (currently the Canadian National Coach and personal coach of Jean-Phillipe Gatien) to follow the Australian Junior Championships.

e) Korea Junior Exchange 1997/98

Funding has been approved and negotiations are continuing with the Korean Table Tennis Association for a Junior Exchange to occur, January 1997, with Australia visiting Korea and January 1998, with Korea visiting Australia.

NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT OFFICER

I must say that my appointment as National Development Officer is proving to be nothing smaller than the challenged I expected it to be. I take this time to thank Ron Carlton for his support and for the strong direction in which he has passed onto me in my position.

This year has seen a significant rise in registrations which is a credit to Ron. I anticipate this trend to continue as those in Table Tennis are recognising and utilising the benefits that are available to them through affiliation with their State and National body. I would also like to think that they can also see the great progress the sport has shown and the prosperous future that we are working towards.

There are a number of projects that I have taken on this year, such as the organisation of the National Schools Championships which has for the past eight years been very professionally administered by Ron Moule. It will be a great task to achieve the success that he did with this event.

The National Officiating Program is another large assignment. With the Sydney 2000 Olympics now a reality, Australian Table Tennis will require an urgent need for qualified sports officials, umpires, referees and volunteers both men and women to meet the demands of an expanding sports scene. Table Tennis needs an accredited program for our officials to become recognised as being progressive and professional.

I have also committed myself to the development of resources for the use of Grass Roots Clubs and Associations. A National Development Officer cannot possibly visit ALL Clubs and Associations in Australia, but can have an assisting role by providing them, with some resources and that will guide them to running a successful Table Tennis Club/Association. Such resources include: The VIP Table Tennis Australia Club Administration Manual, Table Tennis Australia's Ultimate Guide to Running Successful Tournaments, and Courses for Umpires and Referees.

To compliment the resources offered, it is anticipated in the next year that the NDO will visit Clubs and Associations to provide hands on assistance to those Clubs who are requiring assistance. This will be a major part of the service to Clubs/Associations as part of their affiliation to Table Tennis Australia.

Australian Schools Championships

There has been promising interest from a number of States. Tasmania in particular is progressing very well with their teams as is South Australia. The ACT still have their ban on school sport out of school hours, but upon its lift, await a number of teams from a strong Secondary School entry.

NSW has secured teams from strong Association support such as Albury/Wodonga and Gulgong. One again NSW has proven to be a strong supporter of the Championship. Gillian Hutchenson in her ongoing commitment to running both Primary and Secondary School Table Tennis Events in NSW contributes to this ongoing enthusiasm of student and teachers alike. These types of events are feeders to the National Schools Event. Victoria is not progressing as anticipated, and this will need to be addressed accordingly for the future.

The Primary School Event is not having a response like the Secondary event, and being my first Championships I will take into account the positive and negative responses to shape future Championships.

2. Development Newsletter

The Developmental Newsletter will continue to be an integral link in the communication with Table Tennis Australia and it's affiliated Clubs and Associations.

The focus of articles concentrates on Grass Root Development Issues for Clubs and Associations. These include Junior Development, Club Planning, Volunteer Management, New Ideas and Initiatives, School Programs, State Success stories.

Future editions will see the inclusion of some other Developmental Programs which are in their embryonic stages of becoming included in Table Tennis Australia's Developmental Plan, such as Gender Equity and Table Tennis for the Physically Disabled.

By alerting Clubs and Associations to the importance of these issues, I then foresee Table Tennis Australia's resources being targeted to fulfil these needs.

3. National Officiating Program (NOP)

The NOP is developing at a consistent rate. Graeme Murphy from the Australian Sports Commission, National Officiating Unit has been a great assistance in providing the program with direction and ideas. An Officiating Structure and Competencies have been developed and will be reviewed by the Officiating Executive at the scheduled meeting. A draft submission will also be reviewed by the committee and on its approval will be submitted to the National Officiating Program for Accreditation. This is a very long process, but the standard of the program must be high, and constantly reviewed to be identified with current industry standards of accreditation.

On completion, this will be yet another service that Table Tennis Australia will be able to provide to its Associations and Clubs. The Sydney 2000 Olympics will be a strong selling point for this program, and I predict promotion of the Table Tennis NOP to begin in late 1996, and courses to begin in 1997.

A National database of Australian Officials is currently being established. This will allow greater communication and delivery of services to those who are currently in the officiating scene. It also allows a Table Tennis Australia to target those states who may need assistance in their officials accreditation in the future.

4. Volunteer Involvement Program (VIP) Table Tennis Australia Club Administration Manual

The VIP Table Tennis Australia Club Administration Manual has been distributed to State Executive Directors and Secretaries for their review. It is essential that the manual be reviewed by each state as it will a resource for all their clubs and Associations and will need to be adapted to their needs. There has been a good response from a number of States as to the changes and ideas that they have for the manual. Thus publication of the manual has been postponed until later this year.

I believe the greater input the more useful and essential the manual will be to meet the specific needs of Table Tennis Clubs and Associations. It is also important to let the states contribute to the resources that will ultimately be their own.

This will be a key resource that all affiliated Clubs and Associations will receive at the beginning of the year, and will be of great assistance to Club Administrators.

The 1996 Volunteer of the Year Nomination Forms have been distributed to all Associations and Clubs, and once again it is hoped that Committees will take the time to recognise and nominate those Volunteers who have made a significant contribution to Table Tennis in their area. Nominations are due back to the National office late in August.

5. Veterans Affairs Project - it's never too late!

After a series of many proposals and redrafts we have reached a successful, workable project that will see Younger Veterans and their families playing Table Tennis in two States over a six month period. The funding has been allocated and a working group will be moving forward with the Program in October.

The concept behind this is to integrate the Younger Veterans (Vietnam & Korean Veterans) and their families in an enjoyable, social, fun and maximum participation activity, run over a period of 4-5 hours on a weekend, with a commitment of the group to continue their involvement over a six month period. The emphasis is on fun and participation, and there are many ways that this could be administered. The current proposal outlines distribution of the funding to two States and offers them the opportunity to run a similar event to entice participation, by similar Younger Veteran groups.

Coaching and encouragement to continue their Table Tennis experience would also be imperative, however it is anticipated that the participants will enjoy their experience enough, to continue future involvement playing Table Tennis once the Program is completed.

Other States then have the opportunity to use the working model to increase the number of Younger Veterans playing Table Tennis in their State

6. Table Tennis - The Olympic Journey

This year Table Tennis Australia have in conjunction with Paul Salmon Tours and Table Tennis Victoria have become involved in a School's Excursion program, called The Olympic Journey.

The concept was introduced to Table Tennis Australia by Peter Norman. The concept involves school groups taking an excursion to an Olympic Venue. The NDO developed a Table Tennis Olympic Journey, and has assisted VTTA with it's direction and application.

The Table Tennis Olympic Journey has students:

- meeting Olympic athletes and asking them questions about their sport and their experiences.
- watching an Olympic standard Table Tennis Exhibition match
- touring the historic Olympic training venue Albert Park
- participating in Table Tennis games and skill clinics

- receiving information and brochures about Table Tennis The Olympic Sport,
 Table Tennis in Victoria and how they can access their local club
- Paul Salmon tours also produce a Table Tennis Specific Educational resource that is used by the teachers in class after the Olympic experience.

There have been two Table Tennis Olympic Journey's that have taken place so far, and the response from both students and teachers involved has been extremely positive. The journey has the potential to bring in groups of 80-100 children through Albert Park at one time, giving them exposure to Table Tennis at the highest level as well as a physical experience on the Table.

It is also a good opportunity for the athletes in the Olympic Athlete program to develop themselves professionally, by being involved in public speaking and talking about their experiences being an elite athlete. There is also financial benefit to them for their services.

Table Tennis Victoria has taken on the program with much enthusiasm, and are excited about the benefits that this program will bring in the future.

7. Club and Association visits

Although visits have not been as extensive as I would have liked, I have found that my priority this year has been the development of resources such as the VIP Club Administration Manual, Tournament Manual, and the writing the Course content for the National Officiating Program as well as the National Schools Coordination. These projects will be completed by the end of this year, which will enable myself to visit Clubs and Associations next year to assist with hands on application of the resources developed.

8. Gender Equity Development

Initial developmental work is being investigated into the development of a Gender Equity action Plan for Table Tennis. This is to address the concern of equal opportunities for men and women in Table Tennis.

The plan will involve collecting a database of information in regard to numbers in Table Tennis in all areas. It is essential to work towards assuring equity in all aspects of Table Tennis including the provision of rewards and incentives, coaching, officiating, administration and Participation. There is a need to assess it specifically by gender and consult widely within Table Tennis throughout Australia. This will provide us with a benchmark on which to establish special measure programs that will move us closer to an equity program

The gender equity plan needs to be developed through wide consultation across Table Tennis with assistance from the Australian Sports Commission so that it is specifically tailored to suit Table Tennis at National, State, Regional, and Grass roots level.

Like many things, achieving full access and equity for girls and women in Table Tennis will not be achieved overnight. The development of an effective plan and it's implementation is a long term project involving continual consultation, information gathering, monitoring and evaluation.

9. Disabled Table Tennis

I have offered my assistance to the key people in Disabled Table Tennis with their own development plan and the possibilities of involving and integrating disabled Table Tennis into mainstream Table Tennis.

Discussions have been initiated with the interested parties, and negotiations have begun to affiliate Table Tennis groups with a disability as members of Table Tennis Australia.

In recent years many sports for athletes with a disability have gone sports specific under the umbrella of their National Sporting Organisation. This has proved very advantageous to those sports concerned, and has seen great developments in these sports especially swimming, Tennis, Basketball and Athletics. This concept is long overdue in the sport of Table Tennis and would be of mutual advantage not only to the athletes and disability groups, but also to Table Tennis Australia.

These advantages would include:

- Greater awareness in the general Table Tennis Community, which will encourage more athletes with a disability to participate
- Opportunity to include information and articles in Table Tennis Australia newsletter, thus gaining promotion and exposure on a national Scale
- Allowing the promotion of Table Tennis as a complete anti discriminatory sport which encourages all participants regardless of race, physical stature, age or disability

DIRECTOR TECHNICAL

(Incorporating Officiating Executive and Rules Officer Reports)

ITTF Rule Changes

At the 1996 ITTF Council meeting held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, various changes were made to the ITTF Regulations for International Competitions and Regulations for World Championships.

The changes to the regulations are as follows:

- 1. Lighting: Where several tables are in use in a playing hall, the lighting level must be the same for all of them, and the level of background lighting must never be greater than the lowest level of lighting in the playing area.
- 2. Advertisements: There may be 1, 2 or 3 advertisements on the front or side of a shirt, within a total area of 160 sq. cm., and 1 or 2 advertisements on shorts or shirt, within a total area of 80 sq. cm.
- 3. Permission: An Association must not unreasonable withhold permission for any of its players to compete in Open International Championships or an international restricted or invitation tournament.
- 4. Discipline: A player or official who commits a serious offence against ITTF regulations will be reported to his parent Association with a recommendation for disciplinary action.

In Australia these will come into effect as from January 1, 1997.

Review for the period 1995 - 1996

During the past twelve months several changes have taken place. Firstly after a lifetime of service (36 years) to Table Tennis Keith Bowler OAM retired from the Board. Keith was involved in most local facets of the sport especially in the officiating arena.

I want to record my appreciation of Keith's work and guidance over the years.

I have taken over the reigns as Director Technical and Chairman of the Officiating Executive. There was one other change in the Executive. Greg Bungey replaced Maureen Sherman and joins Fran Keyhoe and Ian Finlay who is also the Secretary.

During this period the Officiating Executive has been busy in several areas. Firstly the Board decided to reintroduce the Australian Closed Championships due to the fact that the Australian Open now attracts a lot of quality overseas players. This allows Australian Players to become National Champions. This is also another avenue for the testing of referees and umpires at National Level.

The inaugural National Referees exam resulted in the following candidates being accredited as National Referees.

Lindsay Drummond Graeme Ireland Fran Keyhoe Ron Keyhoe Ruth Singer Angelo Tabone Maurice Poole The referees examiners are Ian Finlay and Phil Males who are the only two International Referees in Australia.

Major events conducted during this period were the 1995 Australian Open and Youth Championships conducted in Croydon, Victoria which for the first time drew a large International entry in the Individual Events as well as having a separate International Team's Competition.

Also both the Australian and Oceania Olympic Qualifying tournaments were conducted in Coburg, Victoria.

Australia was in the forefront in providing officials for Major overseas events. At the Atlanta Olympics we were represented by Phil Males (Deputy Referee) as well as Ron Keyhoe, Ian Finlay and Russell Glasson (Umpires). For the Atlanta Paralympics, Mick McShane was Deputy Referee. Congratulation are extended to all especially the umpires as for the first time the Oceania contingent was all Australian.

Current Projects

At present we are working on several important projects.

Tournament Control and Administration

The tournament manual as originally commenced by Greg Bungey, Lindsay Drummond and Maureen Sherman is now complete and has been extensively checked by various persons including our development officer Wilhelmina Pruyn as well as Fran Keyhoe and Graeme Ireland. This has been an extremely large task and it would be remiss of me not to thank Greg Bungey for his extensive commitment.

1996 International Referees Seminar

Due to the good work of my predecessor Keith Bowler, Table Tennis Australia together with the ITTF and with financial assistance from Australian Sports Commission have organised an International Referees Seminar and Examination to be conducted in Melbourne in September. The object is to obtain as many as possible ITTF qualified International Referees. This is essential with the Major International Program scheduled for Australia culminating in the 2000 Sydney Olympics. The Seminar and Examination which will be conducted by the ITTF Rules Committee Chairman, Mr. Colin Clemett as well as Borje Karlsson, also from the ITTF Rules Committee, will cater for Australian as well as overseas candidates predominantly from Asia and Oceania.

Umpires

Congratulations to the following successful Umpires in the 15th International Umpires Exam.

Graeme Ireland (VIC) Ralph Kober (WA) Leslie Lawrence (NSW) Peter Lazell (NSW) Maurice Poole (NSW) This is the largest number of umpires qualifying as International Umpires from Australia at any one time. Congratulations also to Dave Delpratt (QLD) who has passed his National Umpires Exam. Ruth Singer was selected to umpire at the 1995 Asian Team Cup in Shanghai, China and both Ruth and Maureen Sherman umpired at the 1996 World Veterans Championships in Lillehammer, Norway.

This year the new Officiating Newsletter called the "Technocrat" has had 2 issues published. There will be 4 issues per annum.

OLYMPIC ATHLETE PROGRAM

My first task is to thank the Australian Sports Commission for their professional and financial support.

Introduction and Targets

Currently Australia's World ranking's are 49 in Men's Teams and 24 in Women's Teams. Individually the highest ranked Australian player is Jian Fang Lay at 49 and 5 other women in the Top 150. In the men's category, Australia's highest ranked men are Paul Langley and Jamie Perry both at 288. The Olympic Athlete Program base was set up in Melbourne due to the fact that the majority of the elite athletes are already based in Melbourne.

2. Intensive Training Centres

The establishment of Intensive Training Centres on a state wide basis was a high priority for the Olympic Athlete Program in 1995/96. Two State Academies to date have been established in Tasmania and Victoria. The performance of these programs is coordinated by Olympic Athlete Program Coaching staff and the National Coaching Director, Mr. Glenn Tepper.

SPECIAL EVENTS

- 2. BACKGROUND

2.1 1st Asian Veterans Table Tennis Championships

From 30 November to 6 December 1997, Melbourne will host the 1st Asian Veterans Table Tennis Championships at the yet-to-be-completed Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre at Albert Park. The state-of-the-art facility will have 25 table tennis courts as well as a Show Court with seating for 1,000. Tourism Victoria has allocated \$100,000 to Table Tennis Australia (TTA) to assist with the costs of the event.

Due to the fact that the inaugural championships, scheduled for Macao in late 1995, were cancelled, the main thrust of the promotional activity could not be undertaken. However promotional literature has been developed and the NED and General Travel, the appointed inbound tourism operator, continue to liaise with the relevant Asian table tennis organisations to ensure that the championships attract at least 1,000 competitors plus accompanying persons. In particular, promotional material has been distributed internationally via the General Travel Regional Tour Operators network and Tourism Victoria's offices in Hong Kong, Indonesia, Japan (Osaka and Tokyo), Korea, Singapore and Taiwan.

2.2 10th World Veterans Table Tennis Championships

The bid to secure for Melbourne the 10th Championships in 2000 was developed by the NED and Director Special Events. Funding was secured from Tourism Victoria to assist with the bid cost (\$15,000) and with event organisation and promotion (\$100,000) if the bid had been successful. The bid, along with bids from Canada, Czech Republic, Italy, New Zealand, Sweden and Switzerland, was formally presented to the Swaythling Club in Slovakia during the recent European Championships. The bid was unsuccessful as the Championships were awarded to Canada. It is understood that the committee could not be convinced that the veteran players would return to Australia after six years. It should be noted that the cost of the bid was within the budget allocation provided by Tourism Victoria.

2.3 World Universities Table Tennis Championships

The Australian Universities Sports Federation (AUSF) secured for Australia the above championships and awarded them to the Geelong Table Tennis Association. Table Tennis Australia has been asked to assist with the technical aspects of the event. While the event has secured cash sponsorships from Tourism Victoria and Deakin University (host university), the financial risk associated with the Championships is borne by the AUSF. While the initial intention of the AUSF and TTA was to limit the involvement of TTA to technical matters, the level of involvement has been significantly increased to ensure that the organisational and financial aspects of the event are properly addressed.

2.4 International Table Tennis Pro Tour

The NED has continued to liaise with the ITTF regarding opportunities to annually host an Australian leg of the Pro Tour. Both the ITTF and the Australian Sports Commission have provided funding. The competition is similar to Grand Slam events in other sports. Approximately 200 players would compete for points and it is

understood that the Australian leg of the tour would receive additional points to attract the world's best players to attend.

REPORT - J. DORRIES: DIRECTOR MEMBERSHIP/ DEVELOPMENT

On my appointment to the portfolio of Membership/ Development in December 1995, following an initial communication, I elected to survey all State Associations, asking them to prioritise the issues that had been allocated to me under that portfolio. The intent was then to focus predominantly on those issues nominated by our members as of greatest concern.

Unfortunately response was not forthcoming from many Associations: however, I thank those who did respond, and assure them that a summary of their responses was presented to the Board of Management. Follow-up communication was forwarded to each State/Territory, with certain requests. Again the response was limited.

Considerable time has been spent communicating with our National Development Officer, with what I felt were the State/ Territories priorities being relayed to her. I can empathise with Wilhelmina whom I believe must feel somewhat daunted by the task/s presented to her. Whilst her job description appears to cover a fairly broad base, I fell her emphasis must be on a few specific very vital elements of basic development, in the first instance. Tangible results in a couple of areas seen as vital for the basic development of the sport would give her a greater sense of achievement, as well as instilling a high level of confidence in her ability by those at the "coal face".

Two areas of grave concern are the continued relative static membership over the past few years, even though the last financial year has shown an increase in registrations, which will prove pleasing if this increase is maintained and improved upon. Our overall fairly static membership is, I feel, resultant to a large extent from poor retention, and decline in youth involvement in many areas, including at National Championships. A very clear Youth Policy is essential to stem the tide of our players completing their years in junior ranks and then moving away from the sport. Whilst TTA cannot directly control the domestic issues of individual clubs and associations and what services they offer for younger players, I feel a definite policy needs to be adopted and a workable, achievable plan implemented and followed through at a National level. If correctly designed, this should impact at local club level.

The profile of table tennis as a sport will remain difficult to elevate as long as our overall membership remains low. Whilst recognising there are many contributing factors to the profile of a sport, I believe one of the major aspects is our numerical inferiority in the sporting community. Again the destiny of individual clubs/ associations is primarily in their own hands, however it is incumbent on the national body to ensure attractive packages are in place to ensure maximum registration through those clubs. It remains a perception, and in many cases justifiable, that the average weekly fixture player at club level sees no value in paying a registration fee to the National Body. I believe it is not so much a monetary, as it is a value for money consideration. As has been indicated reports over the last couple of years, it is imperative to retain existing members if we are to make numerical progress. There is little value in gaining new members, if our overall numbers remain at best constant, due to poor retention of existing members. I am of the firm belief that this is an area well overdue for appraisal and action.

Whilst I have not referred to all areas under my portfolio in this report, all have been considered, primarily in the area of priority placed on them by the States/ Territories. For the sake of presenting a short report, I have elected to nominate just a couple of areas.

I have found myself in the initial 9 months on a learning curve, and feel somewhat disappointed that at the end of that time I cannot nominate a specific tangible result. However, considerable groundwork has been done, with a lot of dialogue occurring, which hopefully will provide a platform from which to launch into the "new TTA year".

Various factors have contributed to my lack of written communication to the State/ Territories of late, for which I apologise. However they can be assured that after the National Championships and the Annual General Meeting I will resume my correspondence with them.

Again I thank representatives from States/ Territories who have responded to several communications from me since the allocation of my portfolio, as well as those who have phoned, written or sent facsimiles about various issues under that portfolio.

- The CAPS scheme continues to flourish with 3 young people in their Sport Leader Award phase.
- Membership has reached 192 so far this year. While this is minuscule in comparison to other States, it is an increase from 88 only 3 years ago.
- With two Level 3 Coaches, one Level 2 and half a dozen active Level 1's, we are very well situated for the future. Numbers in coaching groups already reflect this emphasis.
- We have but two State umpires while 4 became probationary state umpires this year. Officiating is to receive added emphasis in 1997.
- We were awarded a highly Commended for our outstanding Volunteer Management practices.

- The State Government Grant's Authority has indicated it is considering an increase in our funding and also relocating us in the triennially funded category because of an appraisal of our management practices. Of course there are budgets.

All in all the good things certainly outweigh the disasters.

Our playing conditions continue to be thorn in the side. No one questions the fact that our Centre is appalling. When it rains outside it rains inside and then there is the mildew. Some of the toilets work though and not one person has fallen through the holes in the floor.

It was in October 1995 that we applied to buy the building, extend the lease and have renovations approved. Just last week we finally sent the cheque and the new lease agreement now waits for signature. Further, the modifications have been approved and tenders have closed.

All of this goes to prove that if you are patient anything can happen!

We are continuing with the aim of expanding into small satellite centres in the outlying areas. Three schools are being used on Saturday mornings for coaching.

There are other possibilities with regard to several large combined sport halls and being a pragmatist I am certain something will happen sometime somewhere.

NEW SOUTH WALES

The period of 1995/96 has been intensely busy for the Council of Table Tennis NSW. A restructured Council was voted in at the March Annual General Meeting:

Undoubtedly, the highlight of this period was our work with juniors. Over 250 juniors participated in the inaugural NSW Student Championships in December 1995, at the State Sports Centre. A record 85 juniors played in the NSW Junior Closed and a record 96 in the Open. For the first time ever, we had 5 junior teams at the National Championships in Sydney. Our Schools Teams Championships also continue to attract large entries with NSW providing over 50% of the total entries at the 1995 National Schools Championship.

Overall, the 1996 Australian Junior Championships were successful. We demonstrated to ourselves and other States that NSW was capable of handling a large event. From all reports received so far, players, parents and spectators had an enjoyable Championships. We look forward to hosting another National event in the not too distant future.

The appointment of a new Tournament Committee in 1995 has led to better organised and well-run tournaments. Entries continue to rise, particularly in the juniors. Veteran entries into tournaments were stable while senior numbers continue to dwindle. Unfortunately, the State Pennant which began in 1995 could not continue due to the lack of a venue.

For the second year in a row, our registration numbers are improving with over 1000 members registered in 1995. Around 35% of these were juniors, 45% veterans and only 20% seniors. The trend of dropping numbers in the senior ranks is a serious concern. However, this problem is not unique to NSW and overall our numbers are improving. This is the first time we have made the 1000+ mark for many years.

We are proud of the achievement of our Veterans and Umpires Associations, both of whom continue to be pro-active in their respective areas. We are also pleased to report that NSW now has 52 accredited coaches - the highest number in Australia.

The main focus of reform in NSW over the past year has been the area of Administration. It is the Council's view that until we get our "House" in order, we cannot hope to properly develop our sport and service our members. To that end, over the past year we have amended our constitution, drafted new By-Laws, have four people working on the Association's administration where previously we had two and have actively recruited more people to assist with administrative tasks.

In conclusion, we must look at the last year as a year of mixed results, with incredible achievements in some areas while some fundamental problems still remain in other areas.

With the enormous task of the Australian Junior Championships behind us, we look forward to the challenge that lies ahead for Table Tennis NSW.

QUEENSLAND

The Queensland Table Tennis Association has continued to slowly consolidate its position over the last twelve months. We were pleased to see our first increase in membership in several years in 1995, and are on target to further increase in 1996. Unfortunately, while membership increases in some areas of the State, losses are still occurring in other areas and the reasons for this need to be investigated and acted upon to encourage retention of players. We are currently looking at assisting at least one new association in affiliating with the QTTA and expressions of interest have come from other groups playing table tennis within the State.

Our tournament calendar has been moderately successful with most local associations holding Open tournaments and some of these have been impressive with the standard of entries and prizes offered. Some associations have benefited from local sponsorship and this is an area all local associations need to pursue. Our major tournaments have been the Queensland Junior Championships in Townsville in the week following the Easter weekend, the Queensland Open at Gatton in June and the Queensland Closed Senior Championships in Brisbane in July, which this year incorporated the Queensland Closed Veterans Championship. Entries at the Queensland Closed Senior Championships were unfortunately somewhat depleted due to its clash with the Australian Junior Championships, depriving some of our juniors from exposure to the higher level of competition.

We were pleased to see several new faces on our Board of Management this year and are hopeful for a fresh input of ideas, whilst expressing thanks to the outgoing Board members for their contributions. We have had a change in our State office, with Jean Dorries stepping out of the Executive Director's position to devote her time to her position on the Queensland Board of Management and also her role as a member of the Table Tennis Australia Board. Jean's expertise has been a bonus to Queensland Table Tennis in this position over the last 4 years. We welcome Greg Jackson to the position of State Executive Director and wish him the best in his new role.

Much time and effort has been spent by the executive of QTTA and the organising committee of the Commonwealth Bank Australian Open and Youth Championships in preparation for this event at the Brisbane Table Tennis Stadium on 17th to 24th August, 1996. We wish to thank our sponsors, the Commonwealth Bank, Brisbane City Council and the Office of Sport for their support of this event.

We must once again thank the Office of Sport for their continuing support of QTTA. Their funding enables us to continue to operate effectively while seeking other sources of funding.

We continue to draw on the expertise of our State Director of Coaching, Mr. LU Qi Wei and continue to employ 4 regional directors of coaching. We are hoping to expand across the State both the number and the expertise of our coaches to improve the standard of our players both in general and at Australian Championships. Our juniors performed creditably at the Australian Junior Championships in June. Whilst we were unable to achieve gold medals in any of the categories, our juniors non-the-less acquitted themselves well, with quite a number obtaining National Rankings.

We are continuing to encourage umpire development and are pleased to see people showing interest in gaining qualifications at all levels, from Association to National umpiring standard. We feel further work is necessary in this area however, to improve the overall standard in the State by having more qualified umpires available to officiate at tournaments.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA

Since the Annual General meeting in November 1995, we saw the Board of Management of S.A.T.T.A. remove one port-folio and replace it with another three positions.

The new areas designed for development were Veterans Junior and Country which was a split up of the earlier Development Directors position.

With these new port-folios, it was hoped that this would spread the work load amongst the Directors, but it has been disappointing that some positions were not filled, and it has been necessary for some projects to be picked up by other Directors which has created extra work for some.

Coaching

Early in the year, Coaching Director Mrs. J. Soir, due to ill health, found it difficult to deal with her port-folio and has since resigned.

The Administration Director picked up some of the projects that had been advertised on our calendar with one being a Level 1 Coaching Course in May, which was cancelled due to lack of nominations. Another course has been set up and a change of format suggested by Mr. Fred Whelan, may attract more numbers and interested people have registered with Fred.

A positive move by Table Tennis Australia, was the offer of a visit to S.A. by the National Coach, Mr. Lan Sun Zhou that he would call into our State after his visit to W.A. This venture was very time consuming, having to arrange various venues, taking into account the number of tables, the regular weekly sessions they conduct, selection of squads and the booking of accommodation of Mr. Zhou. Some suggestions were that we spread the squads around the various clubrooms and as it was during school holidays, many players were available and took advantage of the invitation. A morning was organised for coaches and Mr. Zhou imparted his knowledge onto those in attendance. This was one exercise that S.A.T.T.A. could not afford to miss.

Junior Development

In this area of development we see the continuation of the school programs and the Australian National Primary and Secondary Schools Championships being conducted in Geelong in September, this being an added attraction to the local schools and I believe some South Australian Schools have entered this National Competition.

I have had schools requesting Coaching Manuals prepared by TTA, but have been advised that this book needs up-dating and will not be attempted until 1997 so arrange printing when ordered.

We see many affiliates conducting their own junior coaching program and players being encouraged to enter the State Junior Trials and school children events in the local tournaments.

Country

It is gratifying to see much movement within the country areas which will be reported by Mr. Keith Chellew.

The Riverland Masters Games was one project which after some teething troubles, proved to be a success and did assist with the introduction of new members in the Renmark area. The Board wishes to thank Dennis Robinson for his organising of the event.

Tournament

Our tournament scene has continued, with some Clubs and Associations using the computer system which has been encouraged by Mr. Greg Bungey. It was disappointing that Greg found it necessary to resign from the Director's position, but I thank Greg for the effort and work put into that area.

We have Directors controlling the Match Program area, Fund-Raising for State teams, Promotion of the activities through the newsletter "Table Talk", Veterans Development, Finance, all recording the various areas associated with their port-folios.

In the National Scene, we saw the introduction of the change of age group to U/14 (was U/15) and U/17 (remain) and U/20 (was U/19). We were advised that this was to bring the age groups into line with the ITTF regulations. But within the States, the younger players were disappointed, having to compete with the U/17 age group for this current year.

In the recently competed National Junior Championships, we saw some great performances by some of our first year competitors in particular, which holds great promise for continued success in the future.

South Australian players performed well to reach six finals: U/14 Boys Singles Winner - W. Henzell, U/17 Boys Singles Runner-up - W. Henzell, U/14 Mixed Doubles - W. Henzell/ B. Huskins (T), U/17 Boys Doubles Runner-up - C.Y.Cho/ S. Walker, U/14 Boys Doubles Runner-up - A. Swanson/ A. Wood, U/14 Girls Doubles Runner-up - K. Bungey/ A.M. Jolley.

In the Australian ranking's, we saw William Henzell head the field and seeded Number 1 in the Under 14 Boys and Number 2 in the U/17 Boys. We congratulate these players.

Another great performance was from our own South Australian born, Paul Langley, who won the Australian Closed Men's Singles Title in Melbourne and competed in the Olympic Qualifying competition and earnt his selection to represent Australia in both the singles and doubles (with R. Lavale - V) at the Atlanta Olympics.

We saw our top juniors, Steven Walker, William Henzell and Tammy Gough selected into the Olympic Athlete Program, with Tammy residing in Melbourne to further her training. These three players were selected into the Oceania Youth teams that recently won in New Zealand. Congratulations to Steven Walker for winning the Oceania Boys Singles title.

All the above mentioned players, have been a product of the last ten years of the coaching programs set up by TTA and the States. National camps, State orientated coaching sessions, local camps, junior coaching within the local clubs etc. - all these with the support of the local accredited coaches.

It is very exciting that South Australia will be hosting the Play Safe Sport Australian National Veterans Championships in early November and has a very keen committee, who is going to great pains to make sure that this Championship is very successful. The venue will be the Clipsal Powerhouse and will hold 17 tables.

Our main sponsor is Living Health (was Foundation SA), along with Santos, Mazda, Radio Rentals. Posters are being printed and will be distributed to all affiliates along with other promotional material. The Committee is hoping to attract many of our local Veterans into the competition and assist during the week.

In the Administration area, we see the Director endeavour to assist and provide support and information to all affiliates, with hope in the future of obtaining new equipment for the Association. TTA would like all States to use the ACORD program, but our computer needs to be updated to cater for this and funds are not readily available at the moment.

We rely on many volunteer workers, as most sports do, to assist and promote their clubs, which in turn will strengthen and build a stronger State Association.

This is a positive move, and whilst it has no bearing on the actual control of the sport in this State, it will allow the use of the outstanding Juniors that are now coming through our ranks. I look forward to reviewing the results of this move over the coming year.

TTV now has all Board positions filled and looks forward to the future with confidence.

At this stage I wish to pay tribute to Angelo Tabone for his 25 years of dedicated service to Victorian Table Tennis. Thank you Angelo for your commitment and efforts on behalf of Table Tennis.

The implementation of our Strategic Plan is still the crucial role of TTV's Board of Management and Staff. The key areas of financial stability, professionalism, participation and profile have seen positive gains.

Since my 1995 report TTV has successfully conducted the biggest ever Australian Veterans Championships and also rejuvenated the Australian Closed Championships in conjunction with the Yasaka Easter Classic. The Coburg Table Tennis Club also successfully staged the 1996 Olympic Qualifying Tournament. Three Victorian players successfully qualified for the Atlanta Olympics - Mark Smythe, Russell Lavale and Shirley Zhou. Congratulations to all our Olympians on their selection which is a just reward for their dedication and many sacrifices.

To assist in improving the profile of Table Tennis in Victoria, Table Tennis Victoria negotiated with Channel 31 (Community TV) to broadcast a series of half hour programmes over a period of eight weeks. TTV is attempting to monitor the impact of these programmes and gauge the benefit to Table Tennis in this state.

Table Tennis Victoria has successfully negotiated sponsorship with Jefferson Ford which includes the use of a car for a six month period with TTV logo appropriately displayed. TTV hopes this window of opportunity will lead to bigger things with such a potential major sponsor as Jefferson Ford.

TTV in liaison with TTA has initiated a Victorian Junior Academy for players immediately below the National Academy level. The coaching is being undertaken by ex Romanian International and former Australian Champion Nela Bran. After some initial problems the Academy has recently been reviewed and the players currently participating should reap substantial benefits in the near future.

Victoria performed well at the Australian Junior Championships winning the Under 17 Boys and Girls Team events. Victoria also performed splendidly in the individual events with Trevor Brown and Yvonne Li winning the Under 17 Singles titles. Wayne Gerada combined with Trevor and Yvonne to win the Under 17 Boys Doubles and Mixed Doubles respectively. Yvonne annexed the treble combining with Sarah Doolan to win the Under 17 Girls Doubles. Franky Pearce and Matthew Rouse paired to win the Under 14 Boys Doubles.

Victoria featured prominently in the National League with Croydon Conquerors and Coburg Cobras making the finals. The all conquering Croydon Conquerors successfully defended their National League Championship.

Table Tennis Victoria is still heavily involved in negotiations with the Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre Trust. These negotiations currently pertain to the financial and management aspects relating to this international standard facility. It is anticipated that the MSAC will be open to the public sometime during the period July - October 1997.

I wish to thank the TTV Board and Staff for their contribution and also thank the staff and Board of TTA for their ongoing support for Table Tennis in Victoria. TTV is confident of continued improvement in participation numbers, professionalism and profile for our great sport.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA

After having all Board of Management positions filled during 1995 only half the positions were filled at the October 1995 AGM. Russell Lamborn (President), Peter Mascall (Coaching) and myself (Finance) continued in their positions, whilst Bob Lake's appointment as Executive Director was confirmed from January 1st 1996. Brian Lauri was appointed to the Board in early 1996. Regrettably the key position of Match Director and Tournament Director were unfilled leaving the Executive Director to assume most of the responsibility for these key activities.

As result of a moderate increase in fees and some innovative initiatives by Bob Lake, income from the centre has shown a marked increase and enabled funds to be set aside for a future centre. In this regard the Association has been working with the Badminton Association of WA toward the development of a joint centre. It is envisaged that such a Centre would have dedicated areas for each sport sufficient for local use, and in the event of a National/ International event being held, the other sports area would be taken over. Plans are in advanced stage with this project and hopefully a funding application to the Government will receive favourable consideration.

Most of the Associations coaching and development activities are incorporated in the Healthway (WA Health Promotion Foundation) Sponsorship. Activities include schools coaching and competitions, junior and club (beginners) coaching including school holiday clinics, novices/graded junior competition and accreditation of coaches. Also an initiative of Peter Mascall, a "Tots" program aimed at 4 to 7 year olds, is to commence shortly. A concerted effort has been made to involve country areas in these and other Association activities. The affiliation of Mandurah has increased total country affiliations to 3 and hopefully Narrogin will soon follow suit.

During the year ended 30th June 1996 six Open Championships, a Grand Prix (6 rounds) series were held together with Spring, Summer, Winter, Veteran and Social Pennant competitions. Town and Coutnry Bank sponsored the State Championship for the 7th year and hopefully the Association will be able to retain this generous sponsor. There has been a heartening increase in tournament entries due mainly to increase in the level of veteran participation.
