This year has seen many changes occur at Table Tennis Australia (TTA). The resignation of Martin Shaw our CEO in March was a catalyst for the Board to consider office relocation and staffing structure to ensure that TTA continued to meet the needs of the members in the most efficient manner. This resulted in Board's decision to relocate the TTA office from Sydney to Brisbane and to employ three part-time staff members to fill the roles of Chief Executive Officer, High Performance Manager and Administration Officer. While this has been a great improvement, the work needed to relocate and establish the office was considerable and demanding. This relocation has saved TTA immensely, the cost of renting the Sydney office was to increase in August to around \$12,000.00 per annum, the new office in Brisbane currently costs \$3,800.00 per annum.

I have taken the opportunity to attend most of the National events this year. During my travels I have met many dedicated and passionate administrators and officials. Without the hard work of these volunteers we would not have the well run events many of our membership take for granted. On behalf of all the membership I thank those of you who have given up their holidays and family to work for the benefit of TTA and overseas.

The High Performance Committee was renamed the BAP Committee (Beijing Athlete Program) this year. TTA has been selected for inclusion in the Beijing Athlete Program coordinated by the Australian Sports Commission (ASC) and this was a requirement for inclusion. Table Tennis Australia now has two staff members from the ASC and the CEO of the Queensland Academy of Sport on our committee. This will provide TTA with more opportunities to develop high performance and work closely with government.

The three event series was introduced this year with the events spread across the country. The Australian Open was in Sydney, the Top Ten in Melbourne and the Australian Closed in Adelaide. All events ran smoothly and the diversity of venues is to be encouraged so more States and Territories can be involved.

Table Tennis Australia and our athletes benefited from the Australian Sports Commission's Direct Athlete Support program this year. Table Tennis's inclusion amounted to athletes receiving directly \$295 920.00 in support for their training and preparation for the Commonwealth Games. The Australian Sports Commission is our major sponsor and I thank them for not only their financial support but also their ongoing advice and interest in all areas of management.

TTA's Athletes with Disabilities Program also received substantial funding from the Australian Sports Commission via Project Connect. This enables TTA to provide ongoing development in this very important area. The Australian Paralympic Committee also became a supporter in 2005 with Tennis being included in the Paralympic Preparation Program. This program provides assistance for those athletes with a disability who have potential to succeed at international events to access training camps and international events. For further information on the Athletes with Disabilities program please see the report appearing later in this document. Thanks go to the team of tireless volunteers who have contributed to this worthy area throughout 2005.

The Australian Junior and Youth Championships in Melbourne were very well attended, as were the Veterans Championships in Darwin. All events were well run with a very high standard of play. I congratulate the organizing committees from Northern Territory and Victoria for their commitment and attention to detail.

Table Tennis Australia, with the financial assistance of the Australian Commonwealth Games Association, supported teams to attend the Oceania Championships and World Junior Circuit Event in Fiji, the New Zealand Open and the World Junior Championships in Austria. Australian table tennis athletes have also been supported to attend the World Championships in Shanghai, Pro Tour and other international events with the intent of increasing their rankings so as to improve our seeding at the Commonwealth Games. At all events our athletes have performed to our expectations or higher.

A strategy of the board this year is to make available funds to enable our developing players the opportunity to gain international experience. This was done in New Zealand and will be pursued further in the future. The same strategy has been employed with coaches and managers of Australian team. Many of our coaches currently resident in Australia have received opportunity to coach Australian representative teams. This will be further promoted in the future in conjunction with coach education to produce National coaches who are not only excellent as coaches but also passionate and

committed to Australian Table Tennis. As we look to develop and improve all aspects of our sport we need to be aware of the need to collectively use the resources available to us. My prime objective for 2006 is to unite all the resources of Table Tennis in Australia for the benefit of its members. With all of us pulling in the same direction we can achieve great results.

I thank the Board and members of the various committees for their commitment to Table Tennis and look forward to working closely with you in the coming months.

Progress, professionalism and positive action have been the catchwords of this year for Table Tennis Australia. It has been a turbulent year with large scale changes being made to the operations of the sport. These changes were most obviously the office relocation and staffing structure review.

Despite this turbulence and 3 months downtime between the resignation of Martin Shaw and my appointment as CEO, the association has achieved many positives as follows:

- Table Tennis Australia secured Direct Athlete Support from the Australian Sports Commission for 19 athletes. This amounted to \$295 920 going directly to table tennis athletes to assist their training to make the Commonwealth Games team;
- Table Tennis was included in the Beijing Athlete Program administered by the Australian Sports Commission. This program brings the benefits of high level Australian Sports Commission input into our High Performance Plan and the opportunity to develop close relationships with Chinese Government and other Chinese officials in the lead up to the Beijing Olympics;
- Table Tennis Australia again secured High Performance and Sports Development funding from the Australian Sports Commission;
- Table Tennis Australia was included in the Paralympic Preparation Program funded by the Australian Paralympic Committee. This amounted to a minimum of \$25 000 per year over the next four years.
- Table Tennis Australia secured \$15 000 in funding for our Australian Junior Commonwealth Games Squad which financially assisted with the teams attendance at the Oceania Championships and Oceania World Junior Circuit event;
- Table Tennis Australia secured the inclusion of table tennis in the 2007 Australian Olympic Youth Festival coordinated by the Australian Olympic Committee;
- Table Tennis Australia was awarded the hosting rights for the 2006 Oceania Championships and the Oceania World Junior Circuit Event;
- The inaugural Three Event Series was held in Melbourne, Sydney and Adelaide;
- National Regulations were reviewed to allow for National Tournaments to be "Open" which will allow participation by other countries and therefore improved competition for our players;
- Closer relationships with New Zealand were forged through mutual involvement in each countries National Open Championships;
- Able bodied and athletes with a disability competed in many international competitions representing Table Tennis Australia commendably. For more information on these events please refer to the High Performance Manager's report and Athletes with a Disability report.
- The Table Tennis Australia website format was revised and content is undergoing ongoing revision and updates;
- Business stationary and the TTA logo had a facelift resulting in a more professional streamline presentation to stakeholders;
- TTA's banking and investment accounts were consolidated to achieve a better financial result for the association;
- The preparation and implementation of Table Tennis Australia's High Performance Plan commenced with the foundations laid for the introduction of national squads, national training centres in 2006;

Whilst this list outlines the highlights of the year it does not portray the many many hours of hard work, determination and dedication by so many people to achieve each of the above. I thank the staff, Board, committees and other volunteers who have assisted us to achieve such an outstanding result despite numerous obstacles and delays.

As we move into 2006 I hold very high hopes for table tennis in Australia. I believe we have the skill and dedication within Australia to achieve international success. Whether this vision is achieved will be determined by the ability of all within our sport to see this vision and work towards it as a whole united group.

The TTAOC did not meet physically during the year, but had two telephone conferences. Mr Will Goodier, TTA President, and Mr Phil Males, TTA Board Member, were included in the second conference. As all members will be present during the Commonwealth Games in Melbourne in 2006, we will take the opportunity to have our first meeting for 2006 there.

The emphasis for this year was on refereeing. Two seminars were held, conducted by Fran Keyhoe and Graeme Ireland. The first in Brisbane was attended by five umpires from Queensland, and the second in Melbourne by a number of Victorian umpires and one from Tasmania. It was disappointing that we were unable to attract participants from the other States and Territories. However we intend to hold another seminar in 2006, possibly in conjunction with the Oceania Championships in Geelong. As a result of the positive feedback from the seminars, Graeme Ireland also gave a modified version of the seminar to New Zealand umpires during his attendance at the New Zealand Open Championships. Two Level 1 umpire courses were held in Queensland.

Due to a variety of circumstances the committee was not as active in the latter part of the year, although we have still done umpire selections for a number of international events. Australian umpires at major events during the year included Mick McShane (Qld), and Lindsay Drummond (Vic) at the World Championships in Shanghai, Joe Clifton (Qld) and Johnathon Blythe (Vic) at the Fiji World Junior Circuit event, Len and Barbara Powell (Vic) at FESPIC Games in Kuala Lumpur and the Taipei Open (Disabled) Championships, and Maurie Poole (NSW). Mick McShane (Qld), Angelo Tabone (Vic) and Russell Glasson (Vic) at the St Petersburg Open. Refereeing appointments included Fran Keyhoe (Vic) at the South Pacific Mini Games in Palau, Angelo Tabone (Vic) as deputy referee at the Japan Open, and Graeme Ireland (Vic) as referee at the World Junior Circuit, Fiji, New Zealand Veterans and New Zealand Open Championships, and deputy referee at the World Junior Championships in Austria. The committee has also been responsible for the selection of the Official of the Year Award, which for 2005 went to Len Powell (Vic), and Junior Official of the Year was Craig Carter (Vic).

The other major training exercise undertaken this year was towards the Commonwealth Games in Melbourne in March 2006. We will have 28 umpires (International and National) at the Games, and most received some refresher training this year, with the emphasis being put on National events. As a result of funding received from M2006 towards training we were able to provide officials for all matches at the Top 10 and Australian Closed Championships, and a number of extra officials at the Australian Junior Championships. We will also provide officials for all matches for the Commonwealth Games Qualifying Tournament to be held in Melbourne in early January 2006.

Officials active within the ITTF include Phil Males on the Rules Committee, Ron Keyhoe on the Equipment Committee, Graeme Ireland on the Technical Committee and Lindsay Drummond on the Umpires and Referees Committee.

COACHING COMMITTEE REPORT

This year I accepted the board portfolio as coaching coordinator and have since brought together a coaching committee. The committee consists of myself as Chair, Sue Stevenson (Table Tennis Australia High Performance Manager), Tien Quach, Frank Kenny, Alois Rosario, and Russell Lavale.

This brings a mix of enthusiasm, experience and an athlete perspective. A level 2/3 course is planned for 2006 with funding being applied for from the Olympic solidarity fund. The intent is to invite an international coach to educate and present this course in August- September of 2006.

It is planned to support the States and Territories to present level one coaching courses. This support will depend on the individual needs and resources available. Consultation with States and Territories will commence early in 2006 to provide assistance in this area.

The coaching committee is aware of the need to make available to all the stakeholders a level of assistance to identify and improve the level of coaching throughout the States and Territories. With more coaches educated to a higher level we can utilize the local membership to improve table tennis across Australia.

BEIJING ATHLETE PROGRAM COMMITTEE REPORT

The High Performance Committee was replaced by the BAP Committee in June 2005. It was a strategy implemented by the Australian Sports Commission to bring outside expertise to selected sports supported by the ASC. The BAP committee has table tennis members being: myself as Chair, Linda Marsden (TTA CEO), Mary Le Gassick (TTA Board Member) and Sue Stevenson (TTA High Performance Manager). The Australian Sports Commission representatives are Phil Borgeaud and Rob Bennett and QAS CEO Alex Bauman. Their strategy is to protect ASC investment and maximize return in the high performance program of TTA through the implementation of a sport specific high performance panel.

This BAP committee will work closely with Sue Stevenson in the coming year to tap into the much-needed resources available at the AIS and help coordinate TTA's High Performance Program within Australia and overseas. While this program has only been running for 6 months and with a lot of effort going into the development of this High Performance Program, I am confident 2006 will bring significant rewards.

I started in the position of High Performance Manager (HPM) in June of this year. One of my first jobs was to identify our long term goals which would help to develop our High Performance (HP) Plan. Our ultimate goal was identified as becoming internationally competitive. To achieve this we needed to implement a more athlete's centered approach which would see our athletes look at all areas of preparation instead of just on-table training.

We have been developing our High Performance Plan over the last six months & hope to have the final version ready to present to the Beijing Athlete Program Committee meeting in early February 2006.

One of my major roles as HPM is to oversee the High Performance Squads individual training programs, which is an essential part of our HP plan. All the players were asked to provide weekly training schedules which documents their on & off table training. These schedules help me to identify any area that I believe the players need to be prioritizing.

For our HP plan to be successful it will be very important that I work closely with the State bodies and that the state bodies cooperate and become involved with national initiatives. One of the first initiatives is the High Performance coaches meeting scheduled for January 2006. A representative from each state & territory plus 2 development coaches have been invited to attend this meeting. I will be presenting the High Performance plan & identifying the roles and responsibilities of both TTA and the State bodies. I will also be presenting at the meeting a level 1 coaching course presenters course. This will teach qualified coaches from each state the skills to deliver the revised Level 1 Table Tennis Coaching Course in their home state. This is the first step in assuring better quality control of our coach development.

I was fortunate enough to attend the High Performance Coaches Forum at the AIS in late November (provided by the Australia Sports Commission) and the Hello Future Coaches Seminar in Linz, Austria in December (provided by the International Table Tennis Federation). The first seminar was focussed on what methods the high profile sports here in Australia have success internationally. The second seminar was an incredible opportunity to learn how the highly ranked international table tennis countries gain success. I will be summarizing and presenting this information at the High Performance Coaches meeting. This information has been integrated into our HP plan and will be an important part of TTA achieving its goals.

For the first time in many years TTA will conduct a National Junior Training Camp. This camp is being held at the AIS in January 2006. The camp is directed at developing a new culture with our young juniors in line with our HP plan whereby they understand how important seasonal planning is & incorporating all areas of preparation into their yearly plan. Specialist speakers in diet, strength & conditioning, recovery, sports psychology & testing will come in to talk to the players about their area of expertise.

I have been working with Arthur Wilks over the last 6 months to help to develop a plan for the AWD's. This has included overseeing the Elite Athletes with a Disability (EAD) who qualified to represent Australia at the Commonwealth Games as well as coordinating the Paralympic Preparation Program funded by the Australian Paralympic Committee.

During 2006 TTA has coordinated the attendance of Australian players to the world Championships in Shanghai, the Oceania Championships and World Junior Circuit event in Fiji, the New Zealand Open, the German & Sweden Open Pro Tour events, the men's & women's World Cup, and the World Junior Championships in Austria.

The New Zealand Open Championships was a successful venture as TTA had decided to partly subsidise a development team and development Manager to these Championships. All players appreciated the opportunity and gained valuable experience. Another benefit gained was the beginning of improved relations with Table Tennis New Zealand (TTNZ).

It's a goal of TTA to build a strong relationship with our nearest international neighbor, TTNZ, in the years to come. We believe that this will help both our countries achieve a higher standard internationally and will contribute to the development of Table Tennis in the Oceania region. Beginning in 2006 we hope to coordinate attendance at each other's national championships and introduce test matches between the two nations.

The team's organization for the 2006 Commonwealth Games has been a large and time consuming part of the HPM role this year and has entailed with much more involved than just what meets the eye. The players have trained very hard and all in all our medal potential at the 2006 Commonwealth Games is looking very promising.

TTA is in a new exciting era where our team of administrators, coaches' network & players will be encouraged to all work together to achieve our common goal of international success. I am looking forward to coordinating this and am ready for the challenge of assisting Australia's table tennis athletes to be successful on the international stage.

On being elected to the Board at the 2005 AGM I took on this portfolio in conjunction with the regulations upgrade.

To open up our National Championships the regulations had to be changed to allow International Teams and players to compete at all levels but still ensuring that there is a National Champion Team. The regulations were approved by the Board in April which then allowed International Teams to compete at the National Open Championships in Sydney.

Following the Oceania BGM in New Zealand 2004, Australia applied to conduct the Oceania Championships and a round of the World Junior Circuit event 2006. Expressions of interest to run these events were circulated to all states. Oceania Table Tennis Federation then requested that both events be run together so the request to all applicants was revised. Geelong was awarded both events and is currently in preparation to run the events in June/July 2006.

The three (3) event series starting with the Top Ten in Victoria then the Australian Closed in Sydney culminating with the Australian Closed in Adelaide, were all a great success and the format appears to be very popular with the players. This series was commenced in 2005 and is scheduled again for 2006 although with a slightly revised schedule.

January 2006 sees the Commonwealth Games qualifying tournament run at the Games venue, MSAC, and will be used as test event for the actual Commonwealth Games in March. These events are run separately by the organising committee and Table Tennis Australia does not have a role in this except to support the event and qualify the Australian Team.

To assist with clarity, in this annual report, the TTA AWD program has been reported under various sub-programs. The areas are complementary and intrinsic to the whole.

CONNECT

This area is funded by the Australian Sports Commission and is now approaching the end of its first, Bronze, year. The second year, Silver, carries a higher level of funding.

Seven of the Voting Members (VMs) are involved in this grass-roots program. Progress has varied tremendously between VM each.

Notable achievements include:

- AWD website established within the TTA website;
- Flyer currently at the printers for distribution to all clubs through the VMs;
- AWD database established;
- Five classifiers provided with subsidies to attend overseas classification seminars (NSW/ACT now has three internationally trained classifiers, Victoria also has three, Queensland and South Australia each have one internationally trained classifier).

The most important achievement is that the Board's Disability Action Plan has been accepted by the Sports Commission and then subsequently by the Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission where it now appears on their website.

The above achievements have been mostly at the national level but the end result depends on the progress at the coal-face, in the VMs. A major aim for the second year is for VMs to run their own AWD championships.

Melbourne Commonwealth Games (M2006)

Three female wheelchair athletes were selected to represent TTA, ACGA and Australia following their performance in the AWD nationals.

The Australian Commonwealth Games Association has provided funding to assist these players in their individual preparation and for training camps.

AWD Championships

This area is supported annually by a TTA budget allocation. The third annual championships, held again at Homebush, attracted 53 athletes in the core areas. The event was an outstanding success by all criteria.

It is hoped to vary the venue from now on for many reasons, one being that travel and accommodation pose additional problems for AWD personnel.

New Zealand has been invited to participate in 2006.

Paralympic Preparation Program (PPP)

This area is funded by annual grants from the Australian Paralympic Committee. The program is aimed at Beijing 2008, but there is the likelihood of continuing allocations if performances are significant.

This is a program for elite and emerging elite athletes.

The Joint Management Committee and the Technical Committee have been established, and 8 athletes have been invited to join the program.

A Head Coach is to be appointed early in 2006.

Example from the Very Top

The ITTF has incorporated the wheelchair rules as standard in their definitive rules. It doesn't come much better than that.

Overseas participation during 2005

- Five classifiers have been assisted with travel from CONNECT funding to update their classification qualifications.
- One athlete from the PPP has been assisted with travel to obtain an international classification.
- Three athletes paid their own way to participate in our Regional Games in KL.
- Two athletes paid their own way to participate in the Taipei Open.
- Two athletes paid their own way to participate in the Korea Open.
- From the above athletes, one Bronze and two Silver medals were achieved.
- Two athletes attended the World CP Games without assistance from this program.
- One athlete attended the World Intellectually Disabled Games as a member of the Australian AUSRAPID team.
- The head Classifier was selected in the classification panels for Kuala Lumpur, Taipei and Seoul.

Coaching and Officiating Courses

The new level 1 coaching course incorporates an overall inclusiveness concept, and umpire and referee courses have been modified to include wheelchair rules and inclusiveness aspects.

Academy of Sport Scholarships

Joy Boyd (NSWAS) and Patrick Horn (ACTAS) have received scholarships for 2006. Congratulations to both. Athletes in other VMs are advised to chase up opportunities in their area.

Thank You

As Manager of the TTA AWD program I would like to thank sincerely a host of individuals and organisations for their support. Unfortunately these people and organisations are too numerous to mention on this page (and probably in a page). This support has ensured the considerable success of the program in 2005.

There is still plenty of work to be done and there is still plenty of discrimination out there, but in TTA we are certainly on the way.

Australian Veterans players showed their willingness to travel for competition by travelling to Whangarei New Zealand for the annual Easter National Championship. A record number of 80 players plus supporters kept the New Zealand economy rolling.

On the Thursday before the Championships began the Trans Tasman Trophy Test Match was held. Australia fielded a very strong team with Wayne Heginbotham, Paul Pinkewich in the 40 men's, Brian Berry, Mick Wright in the 50 men's, Werner Borkhardt, Ken Cole in the 60 men's, Tony Herbert and Geoff Nesbitt in the 70 men's. In the Women's teams Kay Crowell and Alice Abbas in the 40's, Lorrain Baker and Joylan Morgan in the 50's, Margaret Mulcahy and Armida Croccolo in the 60's, Joyce Woodward and Shirley Smith in the 70's.

This test match was played before a big crowd which created a great atmosphere and the Australian players rose to the occasion by decisively beating New Zealand 28 rubbers to 12 to retain the Trans Tasman Trophy. After the match all players and officials were treated to a great reception which all the players appreciated immensely as the match was played in sweltering heat conditions.

Australian players won most of the titles in the Individual Events again played in hot and humid conditions with some great performances by Kay Crowell (SA) in the women 40's in defeating newcomer Wei Deng (NSW) 3-1 in the final.

Mick Wright finished off the tournament after playing strongly in the test match by winning the 60 men's beating fellow Australian Werner Borkhardt 3-0. Margaret Mulcahy however was the shining star winning 6 gold medals completing the hat trick in the 60 and 65 events.

To the Northland officials, congratulations, for this was a well run and very enjoyable tournament and to finish things on a high, a great wind-up farewell function.

Closer to home our National Veterans Championships were held in Darwin, Northern Territory from 10-17 September. This National caused a great deal of problems before it even started. It was to be played in two basketball halls and unfortunately the basketball stadium's management committee who were recently voted in reneged on the previous committee's agreement and at first said we couldn't use the new section at all. With 67 teams and 200 players in individual events this was going to put the tournament in an impossible position. After numerous phone calls between Northern Territory President Graham Symons, the executive, tournament controllers and the Basketball stadium committee we reached a compromise where other than the opening day (Saturday) we could use it till 3.30pm still not good however we had no alternatives. After much consideration and discussions with Bev and Brian James who said it would be tight but could be done a new schedule timetable had to be drawn up. Our other problems were the tables in the new area had to be packed up and moved everyday so basketball could be played.

The executive is deeply indebted to many of the players who, when it was known what problems we had, spent considerable time of their own in moving tables, packing up surrounds and putting them away for the entire 7 days. As well as that, many players when asked if they could be in attendance earlier than the advertised time did so, and the team's matches in lots of cases started 30-60 minutes early. This effort by the players clearly eased the tightness in the individual events. Together with many other interstate visitors who helped out at various stages this was a definite all round Veterans movement at its best. At the end of the week it was with a great deal of satisfaction so many players commented that this tournament was up there with the best they have played in, given that the effort made by the tournament committee and the Northern Territory Association was well worth it. They deserved the accolades.

At the delegates meeting the Executive put forward, after a great deal of thought, a request of TTA for financial help to the amount of \$10,000. This was passed by the Delegates and was put forward as a motion. In 22 years the Veterans Executive has not asked those who wish to play for Australia and travel to Bremen Germany for the World Veterans to really strain their finances. However more to the point we were worried about being able to field a test side in Invercargill New Zealand in the Trans Tasman Test Match. This match is to be played in one of the smaller areas in New Zealand and only gets to hold the Championships once in about 8 years and we felt that they would be devastated if the Test Match was to be cancelled. As TTA has approved the amount of \$10,000 each of the 16 players selected will each receive \$500. I would point out that to undertake this trip the cost is \$1500 - \$1600 so it will be a big help.

Finally to close this report I would like to thank TTA for the swiftness in making this decision which put at ease the doubts existing in the minds of many veteran players that financially they had been forgotten.

To my Executive Committee members, Glenys Jolliffe, Prisca Rosario and Tony Herbert, thank you all for such a strong support throughout the season and I hope that you have had an enjoyable time in steering a remarkable band of Veteran players who show so much zest and enjoyment in our game of Table Tennis.

Our annual "Thank You" to Margaret Reid (formerly Senator Reid) for her continued role as Patron of our Association.

Our Membership has plateaued at around the 300 mark but this still leaves our Association running out of room at our present Kingston Table Tennis Centre. Hence we are pursuing an exciting new option (elaborated on in "Holder Proposal") elsewhere in this report.

1. **Department of Sport & Recreation Grant:**

Also thank you to the Department of Sport and Recreation for their continued support with the Triennial Grant Program, and also for their support in providing a Travel Grant for Jamie Lee Kelly, as a member of the Australian AUSRAPID Team which competed in the Athletes with Disabilities World Championships.

2. **Coaching Program:**

Athletes with Disabilities Program in Schools - Arthur Wilks:

Arthur (assisted by Zak Kozakiewicz, Glenys Joliffe and Mary Costa) ran a program for disabled students from Lyneham High School on a weekly basis throughout the school year. This program which has been running for five years has been highly successful, and enjoyed by all, the students and the coaches. The young students who attend are highly enthusiastic (which is very rewarding) and are strongly supported by their Teacher, Greg, and Teacher's Assistant, Ros. During the year we were joined by Paul Keese and Larry Chiu, following up their Level 1 Coaching Course. Both Paul and Larry have recently teamed up with Arthur to provide extra coaching for Patrick Horne (from 'C' Grade) who has received an Athletes with Disabilities Scholarship from the A.C.T. Academy of Sport.

In August a small team of students, representing the A.C.T. and their School traveled up to Sydney to compete in the Athletes with Disabilities Australian Championships. Details are as follows:

To all those involved in coaching during 2005, your continued support is much appreciated.

3. Championships during 2005:

2005 Australian Senior Open Table Tennis Championships:

We entered four players in an A.C.T. Team for the Championships held in Sydney last year – Dean Stretton (Captain), Scott Taylforth, Geoff Chan and Matthew Helman. Thank you to Song Chen, who also went along as Team Manager.

Australian Veterans Opens Championships – Darwin

Highlights for the trip were:

- Our Men's O.50's Team had a spectacular result with Trevor Taylforth receiving 75% and being ranked officially No. 7 on the Order of Merit Ranking List - congratulations Trevor.
- \$1500 was raised at the Australian Veterans Championships Presentation Dinner Dance on the last night for Jamie Lee's trip as an Australian Team Member for the World Disability Championships.
- Glenys Joliffe was voted back on to the Australian Veterans Executive for a further period of 3 years.

Residents' Championships - 29 and 30 October:

5. International Championships - Athletes with Disabilities – 4TH INAS-FID World Disability Championships:

I am happy to report that the \$3,500 needed for Jamie Lee Kelly (from Lyneham High School) to play in the Australian Team for the AUSRAPID 4th World Disability Championships was achieved.

- An amazing \$1,500 was raised at the last night social function of the Australian Veterans Championships held in Darwin.
- Table Tennis A.C.T. donated \$700 (cash) and \$300 (equipment, etc.).
- Sport & Recreation A.C.T. provided a \$750 Travel Grant.
- Lyneham High School (L.H.S) Special Education Unit raised \$350 with two sausage sizzles.
- And, her Foster Mum and Dad (Maria and Barry Jackson) raised the rest with a Chocolate Drive.

In preparing Jamie Lee for the Championships, Zak Kozakiewicz, Arthur Wilks, Geoff Chan and Glenys Joliffe provided extra coaching.

- L.H.S. set up a table at the school and her classroom teacher devoting regular time to assist.
- Jamie Lee was provided with a half table tennis table at her home to practise on.

Table Tennis A.C.T. Publicity Director Jan Mackenzie, the Public Relations Officer from Marymead, and I co-ordinated to provide some publicity for Jamie Lee.

Jamie Lee left for France only seven weeks after we first heard she had been selected in the team. Wow!!

She provided personal thank you notes to people who assisted her.

A personal BIG THANK YOU (from me) to everyone who assisted in any way whatsoever, especially all those people who contributed at the Presentation Social Function of the Australian Veterans Championships.

6. Holder Proposal – Lease for Land:

All year Glenys J. has been attending Meetings with Futsal Indoor Soccer, Woden Gym, a representative from Sport & Recreation A.C.T. and recently two consultants, who will be putting together our application for a lease on Dixon Drive, Holder (site of the Church which was burnt down in the Canberra fire).

If our application is successful we will be looking at moving into a new Table Tennis Centre within the complex in about 20 months.

Of course it is a matter of achieving the first objective – getting a lease. No guarantees on that.

If that happens we would be looking at making plans for setting up the table tennis component of a new Multi-Sport Complex to house:

- An area big enough for 10-12 national-sized table tennis courts.
- Display area, small centre office, storage for tables, files, etc., access to canteen, meeting room, larger office and parking.

The present T.T.A.C.T. Centre building, with our constant use, is costing us more each year, and because of its size inhibits any future major growth in membership.

7. Order of Australia Medal – Queen's Birthday:

Congratulations to Arthur Wilks on being awarded an Order of Australia Medal on the Queen's Birthday weekend.

It is well deserved after Arthur's long years of dedication to School Sport, Coaching, Table Tennis Administration and his work in recent years with Athletes with Disabilities.

8. 2005 Secondary Schools Championships – Term 3:

The Department of Education asked our Association to run the 2005 Secondary Schools Championships. Years 7/8 were run on 9 November and Years 9/10 on 10 November. It was a particularly successful event, limited only by the number of matches we could play in our Centre during the period allocated.

The students were all very enthusiastic and enjoyed themselves. A Perpetual Trophy (sponsored by one of our Members, Baldev Bedi) was awarded to the Top School. On both days the matches went down to the wire, and very exciting finishes ensured great support from all the supporters. Ninety students took part. Thank you to the "The Canberra Times" (in the Personal Best Section), for their brilliant support/coverage with pictures from all schools, and an article (in total covering two pages).

9. New Up-Front Membership/Competition Fee Structure:

I wish to thank members for responding so positively to the new Up-Front Membership/Competition fee structure. All sporting associations are being encouraged to professionalise their operations, so it was our turn to take the big step. I thank you for your strong support.

2005 was another very productive year for Table Tennis NSW.

We gained two new affiliated associations/clubs

- Port Macquarie P.C.Y.C.
- South Tweed Sports Table Tennis Club

2005 was our 4th year at Sydney Olympic Park – Sports Halls and again in good partnership with the State Sports Centre Trust. We look forward to the continued day-time programmes with the local schools.

The venue was open Tuesdays from 7pm to 9 pm for training & coaching – Paul Zhao the on duty coach. We also ran a Social two person teams competition which ran for 12 weeks. On Thursday nights the Metropolitan / Insurance Competition increased the number of teams once again - and it is encouraging to see more & more junior teams and players participating in one of the two grades. The competition also includes novice players & coaching. Congratulation to Les Walczuk for his continued organisation & success of this competition – this comp will re-commence on Thursday 16th February 2005.

The Veterans monthly pennant also had increased the number of teams participating – five grades with 32 teams – again it was encouraging to see Junior Teams and Junior players gaining valuable teams match practice – U12 Boys team in the B1 Division and Junior Girls Team in the Ladies Division as well as some of the Top Junior Boys playing in the A1 Division – all very valuable experience, the results were evident, especially in the Women's & Junior Girls Team's events at the National Championships with the Junior Girls winning 1 Gold and 2 Silver medals and Veterans winning 1 Gold and 1 bronze medal.

The City vs Country annual challenge was again a very enjoyable & successful day with City this year being victorious

In 2005 NSW had the venue for two national championships run by Table Tennis Australia:

- 1) The Australian Open Championships held at the Olympic Park Sports Halls. This was the first Australian Open Championships since 1996. We had thirteen men's teams nominate to play – the current regulation unfortunately only permits a maximum of ten teams. We also had a record nine teams in the Women's Teams Championship and it was good to have both a men's & women's Team from New Zealand. The standard of play during the week was excellent producing some high quality and excitingly closes matches which were witnessed by large numbers of spectators both during the day and especially during ALL of the night matches. It was also encouraging to see the improvement in the play of ALL the juniors who played in both teams and individuals. Overall a very successful Championship.
- 2) Australian Athletes with Disabilities Championships – this was the 3rd annual championships held at the Olympic Park Sports Halls and ran over three days, a very successful championships hosted by Table Tennis NSW. The championship followed the Australian Open Championship and many of the players were able to watch the finals of the Australian Open on the Friday. Many thanks to the volunteers, officials, players and carers who ALL made these championships a success.

The 2005 Tournaments were encouraging with numbers up in most tournaments. With a few more organisational changes, the tournaments for 2006 will run to a strict schedule on the closing dates with no re-draws on the day, which, had contributed to delays with events commencing late. With the extra tables again being booked (the middle zone) for Junior & Veterans Open & Closed tournaments as well as the Metropolitan Open, this will allow up to 28 tables for singles round robin matches.

Once again the NSW schools tournaments were also successful with the new Schools Tournament Director Ian Finlay having packed stadiums for most events. Ian was well assisted by Tien Quach. Tien organised an early closing date for each event which allowed draws to be timed and forwarded to each school in advance, this proved extremely successful.

Our representative teams for 2005 have once again had excellent performances.

We had one member selected in junior representative teams for Australia overseas, Michelle Beaumont. The Veterans' usual pilgrimage at Easter to the New Zealand Veterans Championships & Test matches, as usual was successful, the Veterans won plenty of medals.

NSW season commences Tuesday 14th February – State Training –

- The Thursday night Metropolitan/ Insurance State Pennant commences 16th February with two grades plus a novice grade – 32 teams all up
- Also the monthly Veterans Pennant commences Sunday 19th February with five grades and 34 teams

Both teams' competitions had increased teams competing on the 2004 numbers

I would like to thank our major sponsors – NSW Department of Sport Tourism & Recreation & STIGA – through Combined Sports Traders – without sponsors, organising & administration can become a financial burden, both, NSW Sport & Recreation and Combined Sports Traders have been generous in their support of the sport of table tennis and we look forward to their continued support for 2006.

2005 has been a relatively busy year for the small band of volunteers supporting the NT.

The Arafura games (May 2005) was hosted in Darwin once again following a 4 year break. The 2003 Event was cancelled due to the Asian bird flu concerns. Whilst the participation from Australian teams was low, the standard of competition once again was very strong including two world ranked players competing from Chinese Taipei. Other competing countries included Indonesia, Macau, Philippines, and Malaysia. Macau took the Gold Medal in the Women's Team Event and Chinese Taipei won Gold in the Men's Teams. Karon Pon from the Northern Territory played outstandingly and won a silver medal in the Women's singles.

Darwin also hosted the 22nd Australian Veterans Open Championships in September 2005. Despite the long travel distances and relative remoteness of Darwin, the event was supported by approximately 240 entrants and included players from New Zealand, Japan, Sweden and Bulgaria. Special thanks go to Bev and Brian James whom once again provided invaluable assistance prior to and during the event. Referees Phil Males and Maurie Poole worked tirelessly to ensure the event ran smoothly and with the support of many visiting players this event was a great success. I was particularly pleased with an overwhelming positive attitude by the players that made this years Veterans another great success.

Competition in Alice Springs and Darwin has remained at similar player numbers to 2004, although it is pleasing to see an increase in junior players in the higher grades. The establishment of junior coaching and local competition is expected to commence in Palmerston in 2006.

Darwin competition/training has also expanded to new trial air-conditioned premises over the wet season with the use of a local defense department stadium.

The local stock of quality tables has been boosted following the veterans championship, NTTTA intends to place a number of Tables in senior schools to help promote the game.

2005 has been a year of change and advancement for Table Tennis Queensland. The greatest changes were the loss of Linda Marsden and Sue Stevenson to positions within Table Tennis Australia – Linda became the new Chief Executive Officer and Sue became the new High Performance Manager. Bronwyn Marshall (who has extensive experience in a variety of sports) was appointed as the new Executive Officer and Danny Lloyd as the new State Coaching Coordinator.

Sue Stevenson resigned from the Board of TTQ and was replaced as the Southern Board member by Stanley Chan from the University of Queensland club.

Competition highlights for Queensland included Andy Shih (Under 18 Boys) and the Under 14 State Girls Team winning the Australian Championships. The Board of TTQ are committed to ensuring further wins for Queensland players and have delegated the planning for this to the newly formed Coaching and Elite Player Committee. This committee will be responsible for advising the TTQ Board on the best way to use the available resources to improve the standard of elite players and coaches in Queensland.

The TTQ Grand Prix was held in Rockhampton in October. This tournament, formerly known as the Top 10, was purposely hosted in regional Queensland to promote the sport to a wider audience. Due to the successful print, TV and radio coverage gained this tournament will again be held outside of Brisbane in 2006.

The Board of Management placed a greater emphasis on good governance this year with a view to making due diligence a priority. This will be ensured with appropriate policies and procedures and consultation with key stakeholders.

Another profitable financial year for Table Tennis Queensland has enabled the Board to plan for the appointment of a State Development Officer for 2006. Working in conjunction with the Executive Officer this position will establish state wide frameworks that clubs can tap into to expand their player base and administration systems. This year has seen a significant increase in membership up by around 300 players Statewide.

Credit must be given to the volunteers from the Board of Management to the Club Committees to the referees and umpires and the mums and dads for showing their dedication to the sport through their tireless efforts. Congratulations to those clubs who achieved their goals in 2005.

Table Tennis Queensland has many exciting projects ahead in 2006. Careful planning, committed volunteers, access to funds and enthusiasm will ensure that these projects are successful. All those involved are looking forward to it.

We started the year with a new Administration Director, Sally Potter and five other directors elected unopposed at the AGM with Ann Percy as Finance Director, Raymond Kennington as Coaching Director Geoff Goss as Fundraising Director, Cynthia Langley as Tournament Director and Su Le as Publicity and Promotions Director added at the first meetings of the new Board. This filled eleven of the twelve positions on the Board with only the Country portfolio remaining vacant and reduced the workload of the other directors who had in the past had to share the burden of any unfilled positions.

Having so many directors for the first time in many years created new problems in scheduling of meetings and then having time at those meetings to deal with each director and their requirements as well as to find time to discuss the various problems facing our sport.

Southern Table Tennis Association

Following the discussions on this matter at the 2004 AGM the Board decided at it's first meeting that Southern should be invoiced for outstanding player registration fees for 2004 and an account for \$3,600 representing an assessment of 100 player registrations outstanding for 2004 was forwarded to Southern. When this account was not paid it was placed in the hands of a debt collection agency and has since moved to be dealt with in the Magistrates Court after attempts at mediation have failed to produce a satisfactory result.

Woodville Table Tennis Club

I am sure that everybody is aware of the potential loss of the Woodville clubrooms so I won't revisit the details except to say that at the time of writing an agreement had been reached with the council for the club to remain in it's current premises. This agreement places a huge burden on the club of having to fund the necessary upgrades to meet fire and safety codes as well as OH&S and disability access requirements of approximately \$120,000. The council has refused to provide any financial support other than their provision of a nominal rental for the premises. A new lease is being prepared reflecting this agreement and should be signed by the end of November.

Tournaments

It was good to see Cynthia Langley take on the role of Tournament Director after retiring as Administration Director although I'm sure she wasn't prepared for the work involved in her new job with the Australian Masters being held in Adelaide this year and then the Board agreeing to conduct the Australian Closed Tournament at Newton as well as organising each of the state titles for the year. Next year she will have the ongoing job of preparing for the 2007 World Police and Fire Games as well as the 2006 Australian Closed and again the various state titles. Declining participation in tournaments is a concern and has lead to several tournaments being cancelled during the year, no doubt the tournament organisers will be looking at ways to improve entries in 2006.

2005 Australian Masters

This event as mentioned was held in Adelaide with some 70 entries received. As the Masters will return to Adelaide in 2007 as the first Australasian Masters to be held Cynthia and her helpers are looking at ways to make the competition better and improving the events that are being offered.

2005 Australian Closed Championships

This event was also held in Adelaide this year and was enjoyed by all those who saw it and a lot of interest has already been expressed in next year's event by those who missed seeing this years. The Closed was part of the three event series which included the Top Ten and the Australian Open. It's not often that we get to see the best players in Australia playing in Adelaide and with the round robin format providing nine rounds of play there was always something going on to catch your attention. Will Goodier, TTA President, attended the event to make the presentations to the players and the TTSA Board took this opportunity to have a dinner meeting with Will so that they could get to know him and talk to him about their concerns for table tennis at national level.

Player Registrations

It is pleasing to note the increase in player registrations for 2005 which has reversed the trend of the last several years of declining numbers. Any increase in player numbers helps to guarantee future development funding from the Office of Recreation and Sport by allowing us to show that their continued financial support is contributing to the growth of our sport.

AGM Forum

Following a request from Combined Churches for a meeting of affiliates to discuss the declining participation rates in the various competitions the Board decided to take advantage of the attendance of many of our

affiliates at the AGM to hold a forum to allow discussion of this issue. The agenda for the forum will be centred on the possible causes of the decline in participants and what can be done to attract new players to our sport.

I would like to thank the members of the Board and all the volunteers who have helped in various ways through the year particularly the members of Houghton/East Adelaide for their help during the Australian Closed and Australian Masters which were both held at Newton. I would also like to give a special mention to the state selectors, referees, umpires, state coaches and team managers and members of the various sub-committees who give their time freely and often considerably to help keep table tennis running, their efforts are much appreciated.

2005 for table tennis in Tasmania was one of "treading water". Sadly Eastside experienced a further decline in numbers from those of 2004 and we will need to assist them in 2006 with efforts to rebuild their player base.

STTTA, Eastside and Burnie conducted junior coaching programs this year utilising grant funds from Sport & Recreation Tasmania. These programs were great a success.

State League was once again successfully staged by the Northern Tasmanian Table Tennis Association using the Launceston Country Club Casino as the venue. I thank David Cramp for heading up the organization of this event.

Preparation work is underway for the 2006 National Veterans Championships which will be staged in Hobart.

There is some activity in coach education. In December 2004 we conducted the first level 1 Coaches Course for many years. There will be some follow up in 2006 to mentor the participants as they complete the practical requirements of the accreditation process. While this group is small, they are enthusiastic and I can see the potential for them to rapidly improve the skills of our junior players which should lead to a better sporting experience for those players. I believe that this will lead to improved retention of these players in the long term.

I wish to record my thanks and appreciation to the TTTA Board members for their contributions during 2005. As Chairman I count myself fortunate to have Directors who are highly capable in carrying out the duties under their portfolios. Thank you to Bill Atkinson for his continued attention to National Affairs, Maureen Sherman for keeping us all up to scratch on technical matters, and Elaine Wright for attending to the administration portfolio as well as taking on responsibility for the finances.

Although Doug McLean did not seek a Board position for 2005 I thank him for continuing his excellent work in keeping our website up to date and getting us media coverage wherever possible and for maintaining the membership database.

I also thank the Branches and the Branch Delegates for their attention to matters raised during 2005.

I will be retiring as Chairman of the TTTA Board at the 2006 AGM. I wish the new Board all the best in their efforts in 2006. There are a number of challenges for all of us in 2006. As I have stated on a number of occasions in the past the sport is in grave danger of downgrading itself from "sport" to "recreation". If we wish to keep the "sport" designation then there is much work to do to rebuild our numbers of players, administrators, coaches and umpires. It will take several years and will require a collective vision and will to act together which we have not had in the last eight years.

2005 has been a solid year for TTV. A tremendous effort by a number of people has helped to turn around the difficult financial situation we found ourselves in over the previous two years. This effort has been led by the CEO, Dale Gilson, with assistance from the Treasurer, Alan Hopkins. We are confident that we have established a platform from which our financial stability is assured.

On the playing front our membership has remained fairly stable. Some associations are losing numbers, while others seem revitalised and other new associations are being established. We have enjoyed our traditional success at a national level in junior, senior and veteran competition. I would like to congratulate every player on their achievements.

I also want to take this opportunity to thank the army of volunteers who make our sport possible in Victoria. All of these people make sacrifices to provide the players with venues, facilities, competitions and community. They extend from those who have the high profile roles such as those held by board and committee members to the less visible but very important activities like staffing canteens and sweeping playing area floors. These people deserve our thanks.

Finally I would like to thank the Board of TTV for their efforts in the past year. As the community has placed greater emphasis on governance issues in the wake of the HIH and One.Tel collapses and the corporate excesses of the late 1990's, even not-for-profit organisations have felt the impact. This has resulted in the establishment of Equal Opportunity and harassment policies; corporate governance guidelines; player, parent, official and coach codes of conduct; greater financial transparency and accountability, and, to a degree, the corporatisation of what was once more of an organising committee. This has provided many challenges for the Board, and it has responded and is in a strong position to both lead and respond to our members in the future.

GOVERNANCE

Again in 2005 all Board of Management positions were filled. Bob Lake continued as Administration Manager and Frank Kenny as Development Officer. Those who continued in their 2004 positions were Brian Lauri (President), Dave Cooper (Tournament Director), Irwin Parker (Finance Director) and Penelope Whitby (Social & Fund Raising). Frank Kenny took on the position of Coaching Director whilst Sue Lang came onto the Board as Publicity & Promotions Director in June.

MEMBERSHIP & TOURNAMENTS

Overall membership remained stagnant, although overall participation levels remained high, as illustrated by the maintenance of a high level of tournament participation. The State Open Championship again attracted an overall entry of over 100. As an experiment, this year's junior finals were held in the late afternoon preceding the finals night for the open events. This proved to be an overall success. The Geraldton club helped maintain the momentum of a successful string of country tournaments by staging an outstanding event. The quality of the entry was second only to the State Open.

PENNANT COMPETITIONS

As usual the Association offered pennant competitions for Summer, Winter and Spring with the numbers of teams more or less unchanged from 2004. It seems that the desire to compete in these competitions has declined over the years, possibly due to the ageing of the player population. There continues to be an ongoing debate regarding the format for pennants but it is considered that team entries will only improve with an increase in clubs and the revitalisation of existing clubs. All competitions ran smoothly in part due the continuation of the duty referee system.

DEVELOPMENT & NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Association Junior Development program, sponsored by Healthway with assistance from the Department of Sport & Recreation, continued on from previous years. A great deal of the Association coaching effort was directed toward the preparation of teams for the National Junior Championships. In that regard the Association congratulates Nicole Low on her success in winning the National under 14 singles title. Congratulations, on the other end the age scale, go out to Jeff Drew in winning the National Over 50 singles title.

FINANCIAL

The Association made a \$4680 profit in the year ended 30 September 2005 mainly as result of the profit made on activities at the centre including coaching. After recording total profits of over \$9,000 in the last two years, the Association is now in a position to finance both the operating costs and capital costs (new tables) of conducting next years Australian Open Championship. To offset this loss additional sponsorship income will be needed, and hopefully, additional publicity generated by this event will result in an increase in Association membership.

GOVERNMENT SUPPORT

The Association recognises the significant financial support of the Department of Sport and Recreation (DSR), but regrettably, the DSR has indicated its intention to reduce the amount of financial support to the Association for the next three financial years. The Association is currently making representations to the DSR not to reduce funding, as the Association believes that the proposed reduction is based on several false premises. Fortunately Healthway sees the Association in a better light than the DSR, in that it has increased its support by \$1,000 for the year ended 30 September 2006. The continued support of Healthway is most appreciated, as it provides the majority of the Association finance for coaching and development activities.

NEW CENTRE

One matter which is of interest to WATTA members and which has occupied some of our Board members for a significant amount of time this year has been the investigation into the possibility of acquiring a new Centre for our Association.

The Board previously investigated this possibility actively and comprehensively from 1995 to 1999, but without any success, and since 2002, we have been making submissions to the Department of Sport and Recreation to ensure that our Association was included in the State Sporting Facilities Plan. We have been conscious that our current Centre is not as large or as well equipped with facilities as our members would like.

Unfortunately, large, well-equipped centres with a reasonably central location cost a lot of money to acquire and operate. Some members appear to regard the acquisition of a new Centre as a panacea, which is not necessarily the case. It is worth noting that in the days before the Association acquired the Centre, we had many more members and many more grades of pennants than we do now. That was because we had many more strong suburban clubs and business house clubs than we do now.

CONCLUSION

After 14 years as a WA delegate to TTA I am stepping down in favour of WATTA President Brian Lauri. During my time as TTA delegate I have endeavoured to provide a positive contribution but regrettably, on a number of occasions, I have encountered numerous insurmountable hurdles and antagonism. I have attended numerous state conferences, development seminars etc with little positive action coming out of these. Also during the last year I have written two letters to TTA on behalf of WA raising issues of concern, neither of which was answered nor even acknowledged. Hopefully TTA will improve their performance in these areas in the future.

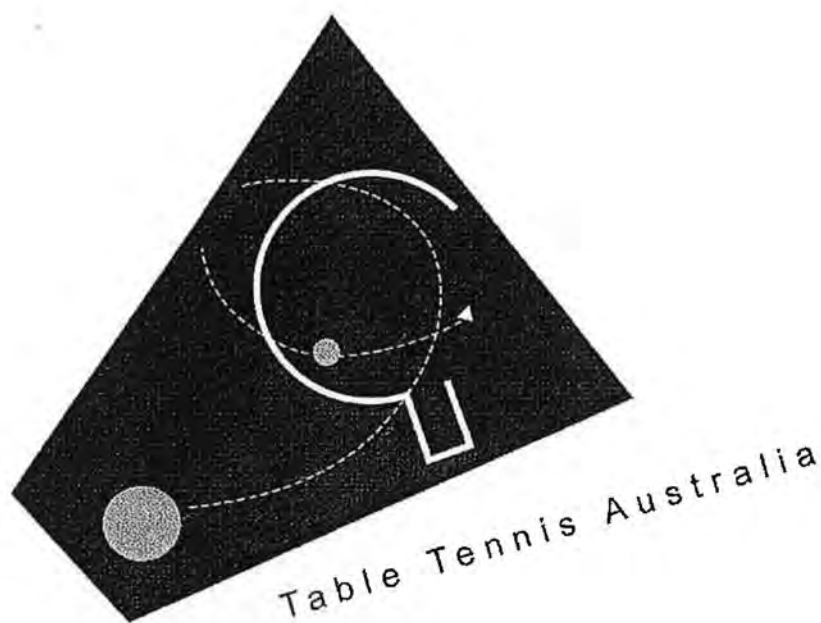

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activities of the Association during the financial year were to provide table tennis services to members of the Association and promote and administer the sport of table tennis.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES

No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.

OPERATING RESULT

The surplus for the year amounted to \$46,484 (2004 \$22,979).

OFFICERS' INSURANCE

During the year the Association paid a premium for a contract insuring all members of the committee. The insurance does not provide cover to the independent auditors of the Association.

STATE OF AFFAIRS

Table Tennis Australia Inc. is in a sound financial position. During the financial year, the Association received significant financial support from various sources including:

- Australian Sports Commission
- Australian Olympic Committee
- Australian Commonwealth Games Association
- Australian Paralympic Committee

Storey Blackwood & Co. Chartered Accountants, audited the Associations expenditure of grant funds received from the Australian Sports Commission for the year ended 30 June 2005 and an acquittal for the total amount received was lodged with the Commission by the due date.

During the financial year, the Australian Sports Commission provided Direct Athlete Support (DAS) funding totalling \$295,920 distributed amongst nineteen (19) table tennis athletes in amounts ranging from \$8,495 to \$18,495. This funding was specifically to assist athletes preparing for the Commonwealth Games. This funding was paid direct to athletes and did not pass through the accounts of the Association.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN THE STATE OF AFFAIRS

The Associations office was relocated from Sydney to Brisbane in April/May 2005. This followed the resignation of the Association's CEO, Martin Shaw who lived in Sydney. As the President and Director of Finance lived in Brisbane it was decided to relocate the Association's office to Brisbane and appoint a CEO to be based in Brisbane.

The Association's new Brisbane office is in a Queensland State Government building "Sports House" designated specifically for sporting associations. The rent/occupancy costs are provided by the Government on favourable terms and are commensurate with the costs of the Sydney office at the time of relocation, however it is understood that the office cost in Sydney was due to triple when the lease was due for renewal in August 2005.

Relocation costs were incurred. Some furniture & fittings were relocated to Brisbane and some new furniture & fittings were purchased. New plant & equipment including computers were purchased to replace plant & equipment near the end of its economic life.

The Association employs 2 persons in the Brisbane office on a part time basis of approximately 20 hours per week each rather than one person on a full time basis. This arrangement provides several benefits to the Association including improved continuity during holidays or in the event of one staff member resigning. The current arrangement is also beneficial during peak work periods when additional office hours need to be expended.

The Association also employs one person on a part time basis as High Performance Manager based in the Brisbane office. The Committee is of the opinion that the Association is not in a position to fund this position on a full time basis. The current part time basis will allow the Association to react quickly to reduce expenditure in this area should sufficient funds not be available at any time in the future.

GENERAL ACCOUNTING & FINANCE MATTERS

The Association uses MYOB accounting software to prepare its accounting records. Direct expenditure in respect of grant income is collated using MYOB Job Centres.

The Association does not operate a Petty Cash system but makes reimbursements by cheque for expenses paid on behalf of the Association.

The following occurred during the year:

- Closed 2 CBA bank accounts.
- Closed J B Were Securities investment account.
- Converted the remaining Commonwealth Bank (CBA) account bank account to a Business Investment Account earning interest.
- Invested funds in CBA Term Deposits.
- Opened an ANZ Business One Card Account. Two cards have been issued to the Association. One is held by Will Goodier the President and one is held in the office. The card was obtained to assist with travel expenses including internet bookings and to provide reward points to the Association.
- The Finance Committee ceased. In lieu of the Finance Committee, all disbursements, including disbursements via the ANZ One card are listed on a monthly basis and placed before Committee Meetings for ratification.


