PRESIDENT

As at 30 June 1992 the Australian Table Tennis Association Inc. is in a stable financial position. The operating result for the year shows a profit of \$4,774. This is a satisfactory result and is due significantly to the prudent management of the Board and the ATTA Executive. The Association continues to rely heavily upon Government grants and Registration Fees as the prime revenue source. This dependence upon Government grants is the cause for some concern, particularly in these times of recession and Federal Government budget deficits.

It is also apparent that the funding to Table Tennis from the Australian Sports Commission will be directed in the future towards the development of Table Tennis at a grass roots level. In anticipation of these changes the Board of Management has established a Strategic Business Plan to develop financial independence and foster the development of Table Tennis at an elite and grass roots level.

The highlight of the year was undoubtedly the successful bid by Melbourne to conduct the World Veterans Table Tennis Championships in April 1994. Melbourne was competing against bids from countries such as England, Norway and Denmark. The success of the bid is a tribute to all who contributed over a 16 month period. A Management Committee has been established, comprising individuals from within Table Tennis and from relevant industry groups. At this stage the plans and preparation to conduct the Championships are progressing well, however, there is still a considerable amount of work to be done.

It is pleasing to note that after the absence of a number of years, the National League Competition will recommence in August this year. Plans for the 1993 National League Competition have already been drawn up and submitted to interested Clubs and Associations. It is a bold step to conduct an Australia wide National League Competition, and requires a firm financial commitment by participating teams.

In February this year the Board of Management submitted to the Council a number of significant constitutional changes. The changes effectively increased the management power of the Board and were prompted by the need to improve the operating efficiency of the Board and the Executive. Other constitutional changes include the widening and defining of the disciplinary powers of the ATTA for events conducted under the auspices of the ATTA.

A proposal has been submitted by the ATTA to the States for the introduction of a tiered Registration System and the establishment of a Central Register of Players. Whilst the decision with respect to these proposals is still pending, it is hoped that these changes will enhance the commercial prospects for the Sport and improve the service provided by the ATTA to all registered players.

Finally, it would be remiss of me to conclude a summary of the financial year without mentioning the hard work performed by the National Executive Director, Rod Lindroth and the National Coaching Director, Ron Moule. The hours of hard work beyond the call of duty continue to be an example of dedication and commitment. Naturally there are many others in an honorary capacity around the country who have tirelessly continued to give up their time and contribute to the running and development of Table Tennis in Australia. These people are the anonymous contributors, and without their help we could not continue.

I would also like to acknowledge the assistance and support provided to me by the Board Members and the State Delegates during the year.

STEVE KNAPP

VICE PRESIDENT, DIRECTOR TECHNICAL

a) Technical

Arising from the 1992 ITTF Council Meeting held in Gothenburg during May there are two most important subjects that, whilst still in the debating stage, are quite significant. They are Speed Glue and Advice to players in Individual Matches. The following is a brief report on these two issues:

Speed Glue: I have provided a report that has been forwarded to all States, the Coaching Director, and to the ATTA Magazine stating that the ITTF is seriously looking at either banning or restricting the use of speed glue. This glue has toxic components and is quite dangerous. There are instances of players wearing masks when reglueing, of police being called to a tournament with players acting as though drugged, and of airlines refusing to carry it. The ITTF has charged its Sports Science Committee to make a full and detailed investigation, and report to its Executive Board in December. Meanwhile the use of speed glue for reglueing in the playing area at Barcelona has been banned.

Coaching for Individual Matches: The ITTF is again looking at the eventual banning of coaching players in senior individual matches. Coaching will be permitted in senior teams matches and in all junior matches. It was evident at the '92 European Championships that the Referee and Umpires payed strict attention to advice to players during rallies, as several times Coaches were given a yellow card warning and on one occasion, at least, a Coach was removed from the playing hall.

b) Umpiring

The ATTA Umpires Committee 1992 Annual Meeting will be held in Sydney on 16 August. There were a few changes to Rules that will come into effect in Oceania from 1 January 1993, and we will use the usual lines of communication in notifying these.

It was interesting that the Umpire's request for "silence please" was almost completely ignored in Stuttgart at the European Championships, when at times the noise level seemed to exceed that of the MCG at Grand Final time. Indeed, when all tables were in use the Stadium Announcer raised his volume level considerably when announcing a German team or player.

c) Veterans

Elsewhere you will read that Australia gained the right to conduct the World Veterans Championships in 1994. The ATTA views this event as a major one not only for Veteran players, but the taking of a giant step forward for Table Tennis at all levels, from the school children of 8 years of age or even younger to the plus 80 year olders. Our slogan - "Melbourne, Too Good to Refuse" - should be added to with something along the lines of "The Tournament for All" as we need Umpires, people to attend to Information Stalls and selling booths and, most importantly, spectators. There are some of the World greats in the Over 40s - Jiang Le Jiang, Surbek and, arguably the World's most popular player, Jacques Secretin.

DIRECTOR COACHING & DEVELOPMENT

Since the last Annual General Meeting in February I have been almost exclusively involved with National Team affairs - particularly with the lead up to and participation in the Olympic Games. I thank our National Executive Director, Rod Lindroth, the National Coach, Zhou Lan Sun and our Olympians, Kerri Tepper and Ying Kwok, for their contributions during this period which has been a particularly demanding one.

Whilst our previous President, Laurie Wharmby, gave us a period of stable administration and his performance was outstanding, Steve Knapp, our new President, has brought in new ideas and vigour which will see our sport change direction and I expect to see it go forward. To gain the maximum benefit of the change it will be important that all table tennis people exercise flexibility in their vision and are prepared to work together for the common good. I for one am looking forward to the next couple of years and being part of an exciting time in the sport.

Items that are being considered and will have to be resolved are the introduction of a national registration system, a review of the national championships, introduction of computer rankings, and methods of attracting more players, particularly women, to our sport.

I particularly want to thank Ron Moule, our National Coaching Director, for his efforts in the areas of coaching and development. The amount of time and effort he puts in is outstanding and way beyond the amount for which he receives remuneration.

Thanks also to my fellow Board members and the staff of the ATTA for their support.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED

I have examined the books and records of Australian Table Tennis Association Inc. and from the information made available to me, I have formed the opinion that the Balance Sheet as at 30th June 1992 and the Profit and Loss Statement for the six months ended June 30, 1992 fairly represent the Association's operations for that period.

ALAN ROUSE ASA

NATIONAL EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Earlier this year the ATTA changed its "year" from calendar to financial, therefore two Annual Reports are being produced within six months. This Report covers the period 1 January to 30 June 1992.

My contribution will list most of the major activities that I and the office are involved with. I will not go into details as this would make for boring reading and add several hundred pages to the Report!!!

During the period we have dealt with many hundreds of different projects, programs, activities, actions, etc. Some of these are:

- * World Veterans Championships 1994: In the last six months we have prepared, presented and won our Bid. We are now very heavily involved with organisation of this huge event.
- * ATTA Office: We provide a good quality service to our members. The overall structure is presently being reassessed and significant changes will occur during the next few months.
- * Elite Training & Development: The Australian Sports Commission is currently assessing the overall performance of Table Tennis. It appears highly likely that there will be more bad news than good, following this assessment. Ron and myself have spent a great deal of time in the last six months defending Table Tennis' position and making every effort to obtain the best for our Sport.
- * National Team Program: A Junior Team went to China, the Olympic Team travelled to China, Canada and USA, and a Chinese Team trained and competed in Melbourne. Relevant administration takes up a huge amount of both Neil Harwood's and my time.
- * Representing Table Tennis: at meetings, seminars, forums, etc. takes up a great deal of my time. During the period there were some 60-70 of these (including four trips to Canberra).
- * Australian Sports Commission: The Commission is far and away our biggest Sponsor. During the last financial year they allocated nearly \$225,000 to Table Tennis. I believe we, as a Sport, have too great a reliance on these funds. If they ceased or were significantly reduced for any reason - what would happen?
- * Olympic Matters: As this is an Olympic year, there has been a vast amount of time spent in this area (mainly by Neil Harwood assisted by myself).

- * ATTA Finances: Our position has improved dramatically over the last 12-18 months. This didn't occur without a lot of work and difficulties. However, we are a long, long, long way from being considered in an adequate position. This needs to be earnestly addressed by the Board, Council and States'.
- * International Activities: During this six months we hosted a number of special guests. These included Hans Westling (Chairman of the World Veterans Committee) for a week and Messrs Iseki and Shimo (TSP) for four days. We sent four people to Germany to bid for the World Veterans event, three people to Dublin to promote the 1994 Championship, and we were represented at the ITTF Council Meeting in Sweden.

It is not feasible to continue with even this minimal detail, therefore I will simply list some of our other activities:

- * Board Meetings
- * "Routine" Administration (eg. correspondence, telephone, etc.)
- * Funding and other submissions
- * Discussion Papers
- * Liaison with ITTF, OTTF and other International bodies
- * Office and Staff supervision
- * Liaison with our players
- * Prepare Reports, Agendas, Minutes, etc.
- * Dealings with States, NCD, National Coach, etc.
- * Work with the Australian Sports Commission and Staff
- * National Championships
- * Prepare and oversee our Business Plan
- * Annual Meeting - Annual Report
- * Academy Executive Office and everything associated therewith
- * MLC Scholarships
- * Promote, support and satisfy TSP (Sponsor)
- * Supervise Training Camps
- * Worry a lot!!

There are many matters of interest that could be included here, however, space and time dictate otherwise. Suffice to say the ATTA is heavily involved with promotion of our Sport in many areas. Some of these are high profile and are well known. Others are not so well known but rank equally in our efforts to boost Table Tennis. The ATTA is very conscious of the need to lead Table Tennis into a new era of competitiveness. In the next few years we plan to become selfishly commercial in outlook, aggressive in competition with our peers, and pro-active in our efforts to develop. We have formulated a Business Plan which will be implemented with commonsense and purpose.

However, the most important factor in succes (or failure) will be the quantity and quality of support that comes from State, Regional and Club administrations.

NATIONAL COACHING REPORT MARCH 1992-AUG 1992

General :

The final outcome of the financial review by the A.S.C. of sports, including Table Tennis, is not yet known but it would appear that cuts to the coaching area are inevitable. Considerable time has thus been devoted to an anticipated coaching restructure. It is a pity that a number of Academy projects appear in jeopardy at a time when they are beginning to show promise e.g. The Residential Program which had a further 3 young players looking to move to the Academy in 1993. It is also conceivable that the assistance to State Feeder Academies will not be continued. On a brighter note though savings, several small sponsors in cash and kind has enabled the coaching fund to be rebuilt after the general malaise of A.T.T.A finances. A number of resources and coach education projects will be able to proceed on a firm financial footing.

Coaching Development Plan :

Has been submitted to the S.C.D's for discussion and adoption at the National Coaching Forum in Aug. This document contains a number of recommendations to assist coaching to come to terms with present problems and to advance for the next 3-5 years. Coaching Course redesign and alteration to our structures are also envisaged. A copy is tabulated.

N.C.A.S.:

The registrations for July 1992 have already passed 270 and with 3 more courses either concluding or due to start within several weeks, the three hundred target is within reach. Level II courses to be conducted in 3 states in 92/93 have been budgetted for and the first of these will take place in August.

Camps :

A successful junior talent camp was organised at the Academy last Easter and another is scheduled for September 1992. Thanks to Glen Tepper, Clare Young and Lan Sun for their work in this area.

Resources :

In the next several weeks a number of resources will have been revised or completed. A new coaching video, 2 workbooks and a Level O Course Presenters Manual are in hand.

The first issue of Accredited Coach was circulated in June and a second issue should be available by the A.G.M. Coaching articles for the Australian Magazine have also been prepared.

Olympic Solidarity Course - Narrabeen :

A comprehensive coaching component has been included in this course. The program will commence with the coaching of beginner players and beginner coaches in the school system and progresses to the development of State and National Junior Players. Coaching expertise will be provided by Don and Jill Parker from the U.K, Lan Sun Zhou and Noel Shorter.

Womens Table Tennis :

Progress is not spectacular but there are signs of development in this area e.g. emphasis on the issues associated with womens programs has been made in the Solidarity Coaching Course and financial assistance from the Sports Commission to encourage women to attend.

Schools Development :

The Australian School Teams Championships will be held in Ballarat in September and numbers remain stable in spite of the recession. It is disappointing that Four and Twenty have not renewed their sponsorship but alternatives are being considered. The support of the Ballarat Association and Mr.T.Titheradge is acknowledged.

I.T.T.F Schools Project. This was awarded to the A.C.T and funds have been approved by the I.T.T.F and October/November is the anticipated starting time. The support of the I.T.T.F President, Mr. Ogimura in the scheme is much appreciated.

C.A.P.S :

\$5000.00 was obtained from the Sports Commission to place Table Tennis on a competitive footing with other sports in this junior recruitment scheme. Booklets have been prepared and distributed with an administration/implementation formula distributed to the States. \$2500 is available to assist with the scheme's promotional costs.

Conclusion :

I have often made the point in annual reports that Coaching is but a sub-set of the Australian Table Tennis System and its progress is regulated by the pace of development in other parts of the game. Change to the coaching area later this year will reflect the fact that consolidation is needed. The support from Rothmans Sports Foundation, Ansett and Four and Twenty towards our projects is much appreciated : without the A.S.C too much of our Coaching Development would come to a standstill. This year the full quota of State Coaching Directors barely lasted two months and I leave it to your evaluation as to how effective a National Program can be when at times half the states do not have officials and committees in place. Those S.C.D who persevere in spite of lack of resources have my admiration and thanks.

New Centre Developments

Negotiations are continuing with the Hockey Centre, Lyneham and the ACT Office of Sport and Recreation for the design and funding arrangements for our proposed new centre. Our proposal is for six competition-sized courts and appropriate spectator areas. By agreement we will use the support, service and social facilities of the Hockey Centre. Hockey may require us to build an additional area, primarily for use as a gymnasium.

Schools

The ACT is hopeful that the proposed ITTF-sponsored schools project will come to fruition over the next few months. Director Ron Moule has been constantly liaising with ITTF to make this happen. Details are not yet settled.

Outlook

The ACT Association is hopeful that the proposed move into secondary schools combined with the new building and participation in ATTA championships over the next three years will assist this Association to a higher level of player participation than it has had over the past few years.

QUEENSLAND TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

1992 has been a year of mixed success, with some areas of our activities showing signs of stability and progression while others in which we previously improved have fallen away.

Membership has improved by 10% over the past year, but as this represents only 100 new players we can hardly afford to be complacent. It seems that Table Tennis across Australia must raise funds from outside their own ranks in order to pay for the necessary programs required. We simply don't have enough members to pay for programs to increase numbers significantly. This needs to be done on a Regional basis for the greater part, and there are areas throughout Australia already doing a good job in this regard. I think that it is difficult for the ATTA to secure National sponsors and programs until the Associations present the ATTA with the numbers and in turn meaningful funds to pursue programs.

There is a new Director of Coaching with Terry Dahl leaving Australia and Brian Berry reverting from a Regional Coach to State Director Coaching. Once again the funding problem means that we will not achieve the results we require from this position until it is totally funded by the State Association.

Jean Dorries has taken over the position of State Executive Director and has done a good job in calming some of our troubled waters. This position is very difficult in that it is difficult to prioritise duties and the scope of work is broad. This problem has tended to envelop previous SEDs, but we hope Jean will master this aspect.

The Australian Junior Championships were held in Mackay during June. The Organising Secretary, Charlie Payne and his Committee organised this event extremely well. Constructive criticism to come from this event was that, with the increase in participating teams, there was too much play. Perhaps we need to incorporate groups into our methodology because more participants at our National Championships is a positive step.

The Championships showed that Queensland is developing depth in the U15 Boys with the A Team finishing first and the B Team finishing fourth. Queensland is not attracting Junior Girls and Women to the Sport, and retaining them is also difficult.

Gatton Table Tennis Association has resurrected itself and has registered 50 players in its first year. It has established itself as having a balanced approach by addressing the issues of sponsorship, participation at State events, schools development and Association fund raising to varying degrees.

The network of full time coaching personnel throughout Queensland is broadening. Jens Krause from Germany is coaching in Townsville and seems to be well accepted; Brian Berry in Mackay; Dave Delpratt is coaching and doing development work in Bundaberg; Joe Hoad is working for Brisbane Table Tennis.

A well known identity in Queensland Table Tennis, Gordon Brydon passed away in June after a year long illness. Gordon has worked for Table Tennis in Cairns for many years and many would remember him as the organiser of the Australian Championships in 1975 held in that city. Gordon was a National Umpire and represented Queensland as a player for many years.

The Queensland Closed Championships is expanding with the implementation of Division 2 Competition. This year 30 teams competed, which was handled with ease at the Brisbane Table Tennis Stadium. The Queensland Open is not as successful due to large distances separating the higher standard players and the stakes involved with a knock out format.

Kent Jamieson has made the largest single commitment to Table Tennis in Queensland by training in China for the last 6 months. Table Tennis is fortunate that one so talented is also very committed.

The future holds many challenges for all involved in Table Tennis, but the central focus must remain with increasing the number of registered players in Australia. Other important issues such as raising the profile and putting better registration systems in place will only bear fruit if we broaden our player base. Broadening our base will increase our financial independence and increase the chances of finding more elite players.

SOUTH AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

As this is my first year as South Australian Delegate on ATTA Council I feel it is appropriate to thank my predecessor, Mr Mike Edwards for his commitment at National level.

This year has been somewhat of a memorable one for South Australian Table Tennis in that a number of firsts have been achieved, which I will highlight.

Junior Academy: Now in operation in its first year, South Australia's Junior Academy has developed a base to implement specialist coaching strategies beneficial to elite and developing Juniors in South Australia.

National Coaching Program: Recognition and support by the National Academy has enabled, for the first time, two young S.A. players, Paul Langley and Kathy Gould to participate in the National Coaching Program under the National Coach, Mr Lansun Zhou, resulting in enormous benefits which will be detailed in the S.A. Annual Report.

Coaching Director: Congratulations must be extended to S.A.'s first female Coaching Director, Ms Janet Sior, a position well noted for its extensive workload and commitment.

Womens League: An exclusive first to S.A. this year has been the inclusion of a Womens League involving post Senior State ranked, current Senior State ranked and Junior State ranked Women. From all reports the two-person team format has proved ideal and was made possible through the persistence and co-ordination of Clubs and support from the State body.

Australian Youth Championships: The Australian Youth Championships played in Adelaide this year, were viewed as problematic based on the workload needed to contact players at a pre-season time. In view of this the Organising Committee, Managers, Referees and Players are to be commended on the commitment demonstrated to conduct this fifth and final Australian Youth Open Table Tennis Championship, following the decision to tie this age group (U/91 & U/21) in with the National Championships in future years.

The S.A.T.T.A. is currently reviewing its Constitution and continues receiving support from the S.A. Foundation Funding Scheme.

On a final note, a speedy recovery is in order for one of S.A.'s most recognised names in Table Tennis, Mr Ken Sleep.

A more detailed Report on above and other items will be available on the release of the S.A.T.T.A. Annual Report later this year.

TASMANIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

Peter Ma Sen, continued as a State Development Officer of high profile and popularity, and has become a "legend" with schoolchildren throughout the state. He has now taken the Table Tennis "message" to 110 schools! The benefits of the skills and enthusiasm engendered by this state government-assisted programme should begin to show in terms of playing numbers and standard of play in the next year or so. However, with the scaling down of government funding after this year, Branches and individuals are now faced with the reality and challenge of contributing a larger share towards the continuation of Peter's efforts.

The Tasmanian Table Tennis Academy was forced by economic rationalisation to move its headquarters from Elizabeth College to the Kingborough Sports Complex. This venture again received a high-level of ATTA assistance, yet also required considerable financial input from selected players. Administrators are understandably concerned as to its future status and economic viability, should this national funding ever be withdrawn.

Elizabeth College again included Table Tennis as one of its selected sports for the HSC Athlete Development Program, enabling players to pursue excellence and a sound background in their chosen sport and to count the result as a subject for "matriculation" purposes. Tracy Auchterlonie has re-enrolled at a higher level and it is hoped that she will emulate her feats of 1991.

"Tasmanian Table Tennis", the popular, official newsletter of the Tasmanian Association, has not been printed for almost twelve months due to the lack of a willing editor, but is about to receive a seemingly enthusiastic revival under new editor, Tandja Proudlock.

Tasmania's method of computer rankings, now trialled over several years, is still as good and as simple to operate as anything we have yet seen, worldwide. During 1991, the Tasmanian Association purchased its own Macintosh computer (with expanded memory) and a Stylewriter printer in order to be assured of maintaining quality records and databases, writing the state Newsletter and any other secretarial tasks which might be assisted by the age of electronics. However, Tasmania is ready and waiting to translate both its databases and computer rankings into the anticipated national systems under IBM emulation.

Under the expert Chairmanship of Neville Horder, Tasmania is currently preparing to conduct the Australian National Championships at Kingston in August-September of this year. The Southern Tasmanian Table Tennis Association has invested heavily in facility development, with improved lighting and new blue tables as features.

One area of some concern is that the ATTA Development Seminar, conducted in Hobart in October of 1991 has yet to produce significant, identifiable advances in the administration of the sport across the state. It is still felt that many of the organisational and motivational aspects which came under discussion could assist the further development of Tasmanian Table Tennis during the 1990s and perhaps we are being impatient and over-ambitious to expect change to be so rapid.

The other concern is that, like most sporting bodies and businesses, the current economic climate may be about to severely hamper our expended range of operations. Playing numbers are holding - but not increasing significantly - and proposed

reductions in funding are being telegraphed by both state and federal governments. At the same time there is also real fear of increases (beyond the CPI) in ATTA registration fees and increased difficulty in obtaining significant sponsorship. Difficult times, indeed, for the maintenance of programs let alone the implementation of new initiatives.

The executive level of the T.T.T.A. was affected briefly by the retirement of Bill Atkinson after 4 years as President and the non-availability of recent Secretary, Colin Pigrim, to continue beyond an initial year at this stage. Both are still active (Bill as ATTA Delegate and Colin as ATTA Umpires Committee Delegate and Secretary) while outstanding "new blood" at this level has been provided by Geoff Long as Vice President and Margaret Turner as Secretary. Coupled with the existing experience of Elaine Wright (President) and David Wilson (Treasurer) and with Bill retaining a seat on the Executive, quality management has been continued.

The restructuring of the administration of the TTTA so that the majority of policy implementation can be undertaken by a Board of Directors displaying expertise and accepting responsibility for particular aspects (much like the ATTA structure and that of several states) has been the major priority for developmental action in 1992 and produced a considerable amount of excellent debate leading to a decision to support a model embodying a Board of 8 Directors. Constitutional amendments are now being drawn up, with implementation and hotly-contested elections anticipated at the next Annual General Meeting in February, 1993.

BILL ATKINSON

VICTORIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

This year has been one of change within the Association's administration with respect to the position of Executive Director. It is anticipated that with this change will come a whole range of new ideas and initiatives that will allow Victoria to further develop and increase its range of programs, which are presently aimed at increasing participation and development in the primary instance. This year has also allowed Victoria to again prove itself as the leading State in a number of categories, including initiatives designed to enhance the development of our players.

Towards the end of June saw the arrival of a Chinese National Team to partake in a two week training camp with members of the VIS and other invited players. The extremely strong Chinese provided some excellent insights into the level of play our players must strive towards to become competitive on the unforgiving international circuit. A series of matches was played against the Chinese, with some encouraging results being achieved throughout the two week period. This type of exchange is crucial to the development of our players, and we are eagerly looking towards the future for the next of such tours, which will be in September.

At the conclusion of the Nationals in Hobart a team of nine players and Zhou Lansun will be taking part in a four week training camp in China, incorporating a five day stayover in Hong Kong for the Asian Cup. Whilst in China the players will be training with the best the Chinese have to offer, who will be nearing their final preparations for the World Championships. We wish them all the best.

In summing up, the VTTA is looking forward to another successful year. Programs already in operation will continue to be developed, new programs initiated, and a concerted effort made to increase the participation rates of Table Tennis throughout Victoria.

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

After the General Meeting held in early January most of the vacant Board of Management positions were filled, thus enabling the Association to function at somewhere near full capacity (only 3 positions were filled at the November 1991 AGM!). Thus all programmed events were conducted, although the lack of numbers in all activities is a major concern.

Pennants

The top two grades and the bottom grade were played trialling a two player team format. The results have not yet been evaluated, but there was no increase in the participation level, although other factors need to be considered.

Financial

At present the number of registered players is low, with a consequent effect on revenue from registration fees as well as Tournament and Pennant entry fees, etc. and Centre income. While expenses gradually increase, income is taking a dive! The situation is proving difficult to arrest. However, it is pleasing to report that the efforts of the Social and Fund Raising Committee have bolstered revenue, although a State Association should not have to rely on such income to survive.

Healthway Sponsorship (Health Promotion Foundation)

The current project relating to Schools Coaching and Club Formation was completed on 30 June. Although over 100 coaching sessions were conducted over 12 months, 5 "Come & Try Days" run, and assistance given towards the formation of a Club or Association in Rockingham, it is doubtful that there was much developmental impact. A request for funding for a Coach/Development Officer and other initiatives was rejected because the Sport was seen to be too small to justify the required level of funding. The Association was requested to resubmit a proposal aimed at grass roots level with a realistic premium, which resulted in a \$19,000 sponsorship to continue and slightly expand on the previous project.

Country Development

It was heartening to see the improvement of the Geraldton Juniors, as two were selected for the State Junior Team and another trained with the squad. No other country groups affiliated during the past six months, but the Association is hopeful that Mandurah will soon do so.

Junior Girls Triumph

This report would seem incomplete unless the achievement of our U15 Girls Team in winning the National Teams Title was included (technically this should be reported next year as the victory was completed on 1 July). Congratulations to Karen Pon, Clair Stannard, Esther Wan and Coach (Ron Cubbadge) on winning the first National Teams Title since 1962!
