When the Interim Board of Management took over the management of Table Tennis Australia in May 2000 following the departure of the previous Board of Management, the most pressing problems confronting the Interim Board were financial ones. Put simply, Table Tennis Australia was insolvent at that juncture. Nevertheless, by the time of the Annual General Meeting on 25 February 2001, the only debt of TTA which still remained outstanding was the one to the International Table Tennis Federation. That debt has now been repaid.

However, in the period of approximately 9 months between the assumption of the management of TTA by the Interim Board and the 2001 Annual General Meeting, it had become apparent that there were numerous other problems to be resolved. To name but a few: there were no criteria for seedings, rankings or national selection; there were no requirements for eligibility for national selection; and many of our sets of regulations were badly in need of an overhaul, having been drafted at a time when a vastly different constitution existed. More recently, it emerged that, incredibly, there were no regulations governing eligibility for participation in individual events at National Closed Championships, notwithstanding that National Closed Senior Championships had been held in most years since 1984.

Prior to last year's AGM, the Interim Board approved requirements for eligibility for selection in national senior teams. Those requirements were annexed to my report to the last AGM. At the time of approving those requirements for national senior selection, the Interim Board did not contemplate that we would have any national junior teams in 2001. Ultimately, we did have some national junior teams and the failure to lay down requirements for eligibility for selection in national junior teams at the beginning of last year created some selection problems later in the year when national junior teams for the Asian Junior Championships came to be selected. The Board of Management has now rectified that omission by approving requirements for eligibility for national junior selection. As the Veterans' Test Match between Australia and New Zealand at Easter is likely to be an annual event, the Board has also approved requirements for eligibility for selection in a national veterans' team after 2002 (it is clearly too late to impose requirements for eligibility for selection for this year's Easter Test Match). In addition, the Board has made some minor amendments to the requirements for eligibility for national senior selection after the 2002 Commonwealth Games to take account of the earlier dates for the Australian Senior Championships.

Copies of each of the abovementioned requirements for eligibility for national senior, junior and veterans' selection are annexed to this report (annexure 1a, 1b & 1c). As was the case with the previous requirements for eligibility for national senior selection, the new requirements for eligibility for national senior selection contain a requirement to compete in the main Australian domestic season for a period of three months. One of the purposes of this requirement is to enable our local players to watch and play against our national players in order to improve the overall standard of play in Australia. There is no doubt that competing in Europe and/or Asia will greatly assist our national senior players to improve their standard of play because they will have the opportunity to watch and play against better players. However, that is precisely the reason (or, at least, one of the reasons) why we require our national senior players to compete in the Australia domestic season for three months. Otherwise, a situation could arise where our entire national men's or women's team resided and competed in Europe or Asia throughout the year and merely made themselves available to represent Australia in Commonwealth and World Championships, Commonwealth and Olympic Games and other international events. Over a period of years, literally millions of dollars might be spent in funding these national players to compete in international events, but the standard of play within Australia would not improve as a result of that funding. Instead, the gap between the national players and the domestic players would simply increase. At the end of their international playing careers, those national players might drop out of table tennis altogether and no lasting benefit to Australian table tennis would have been achieved despite the vast sums of funding provided to those national players. Doubtless, some national senior players based abroad might consider the requirement to compete in Australia for a portion of the main domestic season to be an impediment to their international careers and they might well be correct. However, there is a need to balance competing national and individual interests.

There is a similar need to balance competing national and individual interests with regard to national training requirements for international events. Quite obviously, if our national players are to be successful in the international arena, they will need to make some sacrifices in their personal lives to enable them to prepare properly for international events. However, if the national training requirements are so stringent as to preclude our national players from pursuing academic courses or vocations outside table tennis, the result may simply be to reduce competition for places in our national teams. It must be remembered that we are not in a position at present, nor will we be in a position for the foreseeable future, to offer our national players a career path which will provide them with a reasonable livelihood from table tennis. If the only way that players can satisfy national training requirements is by putting their academic and/or vocational aspirations on hold until the conclusion of their international playing careers, that is hardly likely to encourage players, or to induce parents to encourage their children, to pursue an international table tennis career. Again, it is a matter of balancing competing national and individual interests.

It should be noted that each of the sets of requirements for national junior, senior and veterans' selection makes provision for the Board to waive any of the requirements in respect of the eligibility of any player for national selection if the Board considers it appropriate. This allows the Board to consider the merits of each individual case. It is important that players avail themselves of this provision if they wish to be exempted from any of the eligibility requirements and consider that they have grounds to justify such an exemption.

Centreversy ever the celection of the national junior teams for the Acian Junior Championships also highlighted the need for selection criteria for national junior, youth, senior and veterans' teams. Additionally, occasions may arise when a player is selected to represent Australia as an individual (rather than as part of a national team) in an international tournament and, hence, selection criteria are needed for such national individual selection. Accordingly, the Board has now approved a selection criterion for all national junior, youth, senior and veterans' teams and a selection criterion for all national junior, youth, senior and veterans' representation other than in a national team. Copies of each of those criteria are annexed to this report (annexure 2a & 2b).

Last year, the Board decided that both the 2001 Australian Senior Championships and the 2001 Australian Junior Championships would be closed championships. The main reason for the Board's decision was that it considered that each year, there should be championships to determine the best junior and senior players in Australia and those who are determined to be the best junior and senior players in Australia should be Australian Champions. The sets of regulations for the national junior and senior championships each state that the purpose of the Australian Teams Championship is to determine the champion team from the representative teams of the States of Australia. Accordingly, each of those regulations prohibits teams other than State teams from winning the Australian Teams Championship. However, those same sets of regulations (one of which is called the Regulations for National Closed and Under 18 Championships) permit the individual events of Australian Championships to be won by any player who is a registered member of an association affiliated with the International Table Tennis Federation. I have yet to hear a logical explanation as to why the regulations for any Australian Championships should prohibit any team except a team of a State of Australia from winning a teams event of those Championships, but permit any player, as long as he or she is a registered member of an association affiliated with the ITTF, to win individual events of those same Championships.

In deciding to make the 2001 Australian Junior Championships and the 2001 Australian Senior Championships closed, the Board was not opposed to having national open championships (although we have only recently paid our debt to the ITTF for the 1999 Australian Open Championships), but the Board considered that each year, there should be national closed junior and senior championships. One only has to peruse the honour rolls of Australian Championship winners to see that those players who reach the top of their

respective age divisions in Australia usually only remain at the top for a few years, if that. The Board considered that while players are at the top of their respective age divisions in Australia, they should have a realistic opportunity of being Australian Champions. They will not necessarily have a realistic opportunity of doing so if the Australian Championships are open. Although making the Australian Junior and Senior Championships closed may reduce the exposure of some of our players to international competition, more and more opportunities for exposure to international competition, both junior and senior, are arising every year in events other than Australian Championships. Accordingly, the Board recently decided to make the 2002 Australian Senior Championships and the 2002 Australian Junior Championships closed championships. The eligibility requirements to compete in the individual events of those championships are the same as the eligibility requirements to compete in the teams events of those championships. However, the regulations pertaining to national championships are among those sets of regulations needing an overhaul.

I shall now endeavour to summarise briefly some of the events and developments over the past year.

The following Australian Championships were conducted during 2001:

- (a) the Australian Youth Championships in Melbourne, Victoria, in April;
- (b) the Australian Senior Championships in Melbourne, Victoria, in August;
- (c) the Australian Schools' Championships in Minto, New South Wales, in September;
- (d) the Australian Junior Championships in Minto, New South Wales, in September-October; and
- (e) the Australian Veterans' Championships in Perth, Western Australia, in October.

All of the abovementioned Championships were well conducted by the host States and I congratulate them on their efforts. Veterans' table tennis continues to flourish and is one of the success stories of national table tennis.

In April 2001, we sent Men's and Women's Teams to the Commonwealth Championships in New Delhi, India, and then to the World Championships in Osaka, Japan. In the Commonwealth Championships, our Men's Team finished 8th and our Women's Team finished 6th. Miao Miao reached the quarter-finals of the Women's Singles and was ranked number 5 in the Commonwealth. In the World Championships, our Men's Team finished 45th (the same position as the previous World Championships) and our Women's Team finished 36th (compared with 21st in the previous World Championships). Given that our players were young and relatively inexperienced, the results in the Commonwealth and World Championships were quite encouraging. Bob Tuckett and Peng Huy Quach coached our Men's and Women's Teams respectively and Bob was the manager of the two teams. The whole trip lasted approximately 4 weeks. I thank Bob and Peng Huy for the considerable time and effort which they expended, not only in coaching and managing the Teams whilst they were abroad, but also in training some of the players prior to the departure of the teams

In July 2001, TTA appointed Matty Padley as its Chief Executive Officer. From the time when the Interim Board assumed the management of TTA in May 2000 until Matty commenced work in July 2001, the responsibilities of the CEO of TTA were carried out on an honourary basis by Jim Montgomery and we are grateful for his efforts. By the time of the commencement of Matty's employment as CEO, she was the only employee of TTA. Kirsten Millerd, the only other person employed by TTA last year, had resigned as Administration Manager of TTA in April 2001 after several years' service and we are also grateful for her contribution to TTA.

Although Matty was living in Perth at the time of her appointment, we decided to relocate her in Sydney, where she would be closer to the Australian Olympic Committee, the Australian Commonwealth Games Association (both based in Sydney) and the Australian Sports Commission (based in Canberra), those being the bodies which provide us with most of our funding. In September 2001, we began leasing an office in Homebush, Sydney. The office is quite spacious and the rent is quite modest (about a quarter of the rent which TTA previously paid for its premises in St Kilda, Melbourne). Matty's appointment has been very well

received by our members and she has worked very hard to regain the confidence of the AOC, the ACGA and the ASC and to establish an efficient administration for TTA.

In September 2001, we selected a National Training Squad for the Commonwealth Games to be held in Manchester in July - August 2002. As part of our preparation for the Games, we provided funding for some of our National Squad members who are currently based in Europe to compete in the 2001 Scandinavian and Finnish Open Championships in the latter part of last year. In December 2001, we held a three week training camp in Perth for our National Women's Squad under the supervision of Dennis Chen. In January 2002, the whole National Training Squad travelled to Austria to compete in the Austrian Open Championships and then participated in a short training camp in Austria with some of the Austrian players.

We have also been able to provide our juniors with international competition. We sent a Junior Boys' Team and a Junior Girls' Team to the 8th Asian Junior Table Tennis Championships, which were held in Hong Kong from 24-29 December this year. Dennis Chen coached the Boys' Team and Pam Clarke coached the Girls' Team and was also the manager of the Teams.

In January 2002, we sent a Junior Boys' Team and a Junior Girls' Team to Singapore under the supervision and coaching of Fred Whelan. The Teams participated in several days of training sessions with Singaporean junior boys and girls and played a Test Match against them.

The coaching and managing of the various Junior Teams by Dennis, Pam and Fred was done on an honorary basis and I thank them for their contributions.

There is one point about elite table tennis which I should make. Almost all of the funding which TTA receives from the AOC, the ACGA and the ASC is for elite players and must be spent on preparation for, or participation in, elite events. Virtually, the only other source of TTA's income is the State and Territory levies and affiliation fees.

There have been many other areas of activity over the last 12 months, but space and time do not permit me to deal with them in this report, even though some of those areas may, arguably, be more deserving of mention.

In the period leading up to the formation of the Interim Board of Management in May 2000, the States and Territories were largely united against what was perceived, rightly or wrongly, as a common foe and State interests were put aside. That unity remained fairly well intact up to last year's AGM. However, over the last 12 months, there have been occasions when there has been a return to State parochialism and/or personal agendas. If table tennis is to advance at a national level in Australia, then it is important that we all keep the national interest uppermost in our minds.

Finally, I would like to thank all of the members of the Board of Management for their efforts over the last 12 months. It is important to remember that all of the Board members occupy other important positions in table tennis in Australia and I applaud their overall contributions.

Although only having held this position for the last six months of 2001, as Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Table Tennis Australia (TTA), I wish to take this opportunity to not only report on what has occurred, but share with you my hopes for the future.

No one could have prepared me for the enormity of the task which unfolded back in July 2001 and I could waste a lot of energy describing the various problems I encountered. However, what has become most apparent to me whilst doing this job, is that it is far more important for us to look at the 'now' and for ways of making our future a brighter one.

With the start of my employment, TTA took the plunge and decided to relocate the office away from its long time home Victoria and closer to its alliance bodies, the Australian Olympic Committee (AOC), the Australian Commonwealth Games Association (ACGA) and the Australian Sports Commission (ASC).

Moving the 'goods and chattels' of the numerous past employees of TTA was a huge task and a number of people must be thanked for their generous voluntary assistance. My gratitude goes to Lindsay and Annette Drummond for not only their help with packing, but for giving me a home and office in Geelong to work from whilst undergoing an audit from the ASC. Thanks must also go to Table Tennis Victoria, the Geelong Table Tennis Association and Jim and Joan Montgomery for providing TTA with support and storage space during those interim months. Paul Pinkewich helped with transporting furniture to NSW and Noel Shorter allowed me to store it in his offices. All these people made a difficult task that bit easier and I am extremely grateful for their contributions.

Some others who deserve to be recognised are Angelo Tabone and Bev and Brian James. Angelo had given his garage to store TTA archives since the move was made from Albert Park to St Kilda Road back in 1996 and Bev and Brian made a special trip to Geelong to help sort out the TTA technology. Again Lindsay and Annette provided accommodation.

I must also acknowledge the hard work of the Board of Management and the great support and guidance the Board Members have given me since my appointment. In particular, Arthur Wilks, who has worked tirelessly to help me rebuild the flagging relations with our funding bodies the ASC, ACGA and AOC. With Arthur's help we have managed to regain the confidence of these alliances and facilitate the release of the frozen grant monies. I am now looking forward to a fruitful working relationship with all of these groups.

Hopes for the Future

The one recurring question that keeps being asked is 'what benefit do I get for becoming a registered member?' and my answer is simple – 'to provide table tennis in Australia with a future'. If you love the sport, we must all work together and do our little bit to ensure that table tennis is recognised by the rest of the sporting fraternity as the great sport it is. But before we are able to convince the rest of Australia that this is a sport worth supporting, we have to convince ourselves.

Table Tennis is an untapped source of opportunities and I for one am a perfect example of this. Sport is not just winning medals. We won't all be able to stand on a podium receiving Gold, Silver or Bronze, but there are far more ways of benefiting from sport than just that.

Who would have thought that when I started playing in WA at the age of 12 and helping my Mother run our local club for 12 years that I would have been responsible for helping to stage a table tennis competition at an Olympic Games. Who would have thought that when my Father was President of WATTA that I would have become the CEO of the National Organisation. It is through the support and efforts of my parents during my playing career that I have been given two of the most important opportunities in my life.

It doesn't matter where you are. Coming from WA didn't prevent me from being lucky enough to reap the above rewards, nor did it prevent Neil Harwood from Tasmania becoming the Team Manager at three Olympics and the Competition Manager at a fourth.

Who would have thought that when Angelo Tabone at the age of 25 tossed those first coins for a match at Albert Park that he was going to get the chance to umpire at two Olympic Games and be a Jury Member at a third.

Then of course there are the players. The future is bright with new opportunities constantly becoming available. The ITTF has introduced the World Cadet Circuit which will provide our juniors with international experience early in their playing career. Oceania has initiated the formation of the first Oceania Team which will compete at the World Cadet Challenge in Hungary in June 2002.

TTA is your link to these opportunities. Without a National Organisation our sport will only ever be considered as a back yard pastime. Wouldn't it be nice when work mates asked you what you did last night, and you told them that you played at your local table tennis club, to have them reply, 'Hey did you see that great final on tele between the Swedes and China, wasn't that awesome?' or 'Didn't our team do great at the World's?', instead of 'Oh you play ping pong!'. A dream – perhaps, but every sport started somewhere.

Help us develop our Sport and you are helping to create many such opportunities for those you love and care for. It may not be you who will ultimately reap the rewards, but we all have family, friends and neighbours. The future is in our hands!

This portfolio includes a number of interrelated areas.

A. IYV

A \$5,000 grant was received from the *International Year of Volunteers* committee to *Recognise* and *Thank* young umpires. The funding was used to provide a congratulatory folder which contained certificates, letters, the officiating career path diagram and the Level 1 umpire badge. In addition the NOAS registration fee was paid for each young umpire.

B. Officiating

The TTA Officiating Council was established with Arthur Wilks as the Board appointed Chair. Two members are appointed by the Chair and two are elected by the officiating delegates from the eight Voting Members. Currently Graeme Ireland chairs the technical sub-committee, Fran Keyhoe chairs the umpires and referees sub-committee, Ian Finlay chairs the selection sub-committee and Dave Delpratt chairs the awards sub-committee.

A new level 1 umpire course has been written and accredited by the Australian Sports Commission. This course designed specifically, but not exclusively, for high school aged students has attracted 154 young people who are now registered in the National Officials Accreditation Scheme(NOAS). This is the first time that TTA has ever had registered officials in the NOAS.

The Level 2 course has been written and submitted. It will be accredited in March. The two Level 3 courses and the two Level 4 courses are in an advanced state of development.

C. Liaison with the Australian Sports Commission

This area has been time consuming because of its complexity, importance and many facets with a build up of requirements resulting from earlier problems. These problems have now been addressed and most of the required documentation has been submitted including our Strategic Plan. Once our compliance requirements are all approved this area will consume less time but will always retain its fundamental importance.

D. Athletes With Disabilities

A committee has been established to further the aim of TTA providing table tennis opportunities for athletes with disabilities. In the past disability specific organisations have provided limited opportunities for these athletes

TTA, in association with Wheelchair Sports Australia, has selected two female wheelchair athletes to form part of the TTA team for the Manchester Commonwealth Games. The inclusion of these athletes as an integral part of the TTA team is an important breakthrough.

E. Miscellany

Various smaller items could be placed in this basket with perhaps the most important being an update of the TOPS book and the finalisation of TTA's anti-doping policy and its distribution to the Voting Members and ranking athletes.

E. Thanks

This could easily be the biggest section in this report.

Thank you to the other members of the Board under the direction, and control, of Brian.

Thank you to many members of the ASC - Teena and Nadine are with us today.

Thank you to Matty for umpteen hours of support and assistance. Matty is the ultimate example of the "Over and Beyond" syndrome.

Thank you to the many people out there who have assisted me, and who support our great sport. We may perhaps have a few problems (temporary ones) but we are very fortunate in having a wonderful pool of Volunteers.

Allan Clarke

During 2001 successful national championships were conducted on behalf of Table Tennis Australia.

TT Victoria organised the Australian Youth Championships at the Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre in conjunction with the annual Easter Classics and this carnival received excellent reviews from players in the under 20 years age group.

The Australian Closed Championships were also successfully hosted by TTV at MSAC, in August. Whilst most of the nation's leading players attended it would have been better if this tournament was attended by more players, especially in the actual "open" age group. Another huge improvement to this event would be all states/territories entering teams in both categories.

The Campbelltown Sports Stadium proved to be an excellent venue for both the Australian Schools and the Australian Junior and Under 18 Championships during late September/early October. TT New South Wales undertook the huge task of organising these two separate tournaments and did a very good job, receiving plenty of praise.

The Western Australian Association impressed with the faultless organisation of the Australian Veterans Championships at the Kingsway International Sports Stadium at Perth during October.

Unfortunately attendance at both the junior and veteran carnivals was adversely affected, but certainly not to a major degree, by the collapse of Ansett.

Dates have been allocated for national championships during 2002 and all details are available from TTA or state offices.

The big challenge facing players and administrators during 2002 will be the introduction of the eleven-point game. Some players say it's like playing a different sport so this is probably one the biggest single changes to the sport in its history.

It's not only the players who have to come to terms with this alteration. Coaches obviously will need to reassess aspects of their role and those involved in administration have the task of determining the best format for the various types of competition from club level through to national competitions. Our tournament officials also have to deal with this change in culture.

I intend to submit a proposal to the TTA Board to the effect that the age groups of our juniors be reviewed with a view to at least one major alteration. I believe that the junior category should cease at under 17 rather than under 18 as it now stands. Other recommendations will forthcoming, in relation to age groups. In addition I am proposing that extensive consultation take place prior to any decisions being made.

This year has been very busy for me. I have started to work on my portfolio by conducting a Level 1 coaching course in SA.

My aim was to set up a three way level 1 coaching course;

- 1. By suggesting participants to undertake a General Principles Course at the SA Sports Institute. The reason for this is to make sure that those taking the course receive the very latest information available. All Sports Institutes have a calendar of dates in their respective states as to when these courses are to be held. I would suggest all state development officers make themselves aware of these courses.
- I conducted a sports specific level 1 course aimed at the participants of the General Principles to fulfil their course requirements and at the new Level 1 Coaches who wish to complete their General Principles at a later date.
- For coaches whose accreditation had lapsed to help them fill out their log books and to fill out their paper work, e.g. Code of Ethics etc.

I have encouraged the clubs and associations in SA to pay the fees involved with becoming a Level 1 coach if that person is working in their club or association and at present have not had one refusal.

The TTA funding situation is becoming clearer after a very difficult period. There is a modest budget for coaching in 2001/2002 and this should continue in the future assuming a continuation of our much improved relationships with the Australian Sports Commission.

Once the coaching budget has been finalised I would like to see the same format in all states that was used in SA. There would have to be several of these in each state every year to enable us to reach the accreditation numbers of a satisfactory level. Our accreditation numbers have a direct bearing on our funding in the future.

I would like TTA's funding to increase to a level where we can once again attract overseas coaches to conduct courses here in Australia or allow coaches from Australia to journey overseas to upgrade their knowledge which would be useful in Australia.

After the 2001 New Zealand Veterans Championships were held in Christchurch at Easter, where Australia successfully defended the Trans Tasman Trophy and went on to win many of the individual events climaxing a great five days of table tennis, my mind turned to thinking of our own National Veterans Championships to be held later in the year in Perth.

The Western Australian Table Tennis Association had a big job in front of them. As a small association they needed plenty of willing hands and with the long time servant of the West, Irwin Parker, leading the way and supported by a great group – what a championship it was.

It was all up to the players to produce their best form and that they did with many people commenting that this was the best ever National Veterans held. The standard of play was amazing, also adding to the tournament was the Swedish player, Lars Sandmark, with his brilliant play causing some upsets and only for an injury may have gone further. It is hoped that we may attract other overseas players in the future.

Bureau of Sport & Recreation Grant:

A BIG thank you to the Bureau for their assistance in providing a grant towards the new roof on our Centre, which was necessary and could have posed some serious O.H.&S. problems had it not been replaced. Also another thank you to the Bureau for their continued support with the Triennial Grant Program - our Association has been guaranteed further funding for another 3 years. This is essential for the continued development of table tennis in the A.C.T.

Coaching/Promotion:

Development Officer/Coaching Co-ordinator. - Zak Kozakiewicz:

Zak ran school coaching groups at various schools around Canberra with able support.

Disabled Program Schools - Arthur Wilks:

Arthur (assisted by Zak) ran a program for disabled students from Lyneham High School. In 2002 we hope to be running further programs, under Arthur's knowledgeable and astute tutorage.

Other - Mohammed Al Hassan and Dong Dong Zhang have also been involved in coaching. We thank them for their time devoted to Association/representative teams, as well as thanking all the coaches, for their work either at our Centre or in special programs in 2001. Your efforts re high valued and very much appreciated.

Inter-Cities Matches - Canberra/Goulburn:

Hurrah! We have managed after a lot of discussion to settle on a twice-yearly Monaro Cup Challenge between our two cities. The first of these was held on 5 May in Goulburn, followed up by a return challenge in Canberra early in December. These were greeted enthusiastically by the players with a range of teams entered in the Junior, Senior and Veterans categories. I am very happy to report that Canberra has won the Cup in the two overall challenge matches for 2001.

Table Tennis Australia:

Earlier in the year Arthur Wilks, was nominated by us and voted in as the new Vice President for the National governing body, Table Tennis Australia. Again Arthur congratulations from all our Association. Table Tennis Australia also has a new President, Brian Lauri, and a new Chief Executive Officer, Matty Padley, who is now based in Sydney.

NORTHERN TERRITORY PRESIDENTS REPORT

The past year has seen another steady year for the association. The Two main centers, Darwin and Alice Springs have a variety of new faces although total membership numbers remain similar to 2000. A new television add was created in Darwin and run on channel 8 prior to season start. In addition additional pre-season promotion was carried out in Alice Springs to promote membership. Promotional activities were carried out at Palmerston and links established with the YMCA. Further promotion and involvement with the Northern Territory University has been carried out, it is hoped that a formal club will be established in 2002.

The Association has once again been actively involved in the **Arafura Games** held Bl-annually in Darwin during May. This year the games attracted approximately 3500 competitors from throughout the Asian/Pacific region competing in 22 different sports.

2001 marked the third time Table Tennis was included and resulted in a very successful event, due in part to the great efforts of the volunteers from Darwin and Palmerston. Competitors from China, Macau, New Zealand, Philipines, Thailand, Vietnam, Brunei and South Australia were included in the event. The Northern Territory received Medals for the first time following excellent performances from Darwin's Nick Politis.

The event was again held at a Darwin High School Gymnasium (Air-conditioned with six Tables) and although conditions were considered to be good, this venue may not be large enough for the 2003 event should additional entries be received. The games are promoted as regional and as such, National teams are not sought The standard of players from overseas however remains a significant challenge for Australian players.

The continued involvement in Arafura has assisted with organizational skills and equipment levels in the N.T. and I am hopeful that this will be a catalyst for further development of the sport throughout the N.T.

Junior development in Darwin and Alice Springs has continued to be active. Ted Field has contributed significant hours to assist with schools participation including Junior coaching and event organization in Darwin. A large number of players are visiting the NTTTA centre through school visits.

The NT Veterans were again represented at the National Championships held in Perth W.A. One Over 40's team was sent following some difficult times with transport as a result of the Ansett Airlines issue. Alice Springs new player Ric Rosalstic made a great comeback to the game and represents a great boost for the Alice region.

The Northern Territory Championships were held in Alice Springs 28th and 29th July 2001 and once again a strong contingency from Darwin traveled the 1500km to compete. This Years Men's Champion was TY Lee whom defeated Ric Rosalistic. Darwin's Karen Pon took out the NT Open Woman's title.

The Alice Springs Association once again has secured Table Tennis in the 2002 **Masters Games** held Bi Annually in Alice Springs. This will result in further demand for a full time Venue, currently a restricting factor on development.

Further Development of the smaller regions remains a priority; it is expected that Palmerston and Katherine will establish formal competition in 2002 Jabiru and Yulara have the potential to support some form of activity given the population and current level of informal play.

Northern Territory Government Grants have continued at similar levels to previous years. The association will continue to pursue financial support for a part time Development officer.

Both Alice Springs and Darwin have approached the Territory Government for assistance with venues. A facility that is capable of accommodating 8 tables with the option for air-conditioning is being sought in Darwin. Whilst previous years discussions indicated some hope with a possible shared venue at Marrara the likely timeframe has been extended beyond 2004. Brief specifications have been developed for a multi purpose facility adjacent the current Marrara Stadium. It is hopeful that further Design work may proceed within two years.

In Alice Springs a dedicated venue is being sought as the current High School facility is continuing to restrict further development of the sport.

A shared facility is currently being pursued. In Katherine the YWCA has been proposed for competition and it is hopeful that Competition can be initiated from here in 2002

Major Sponsors this year have been Northern Territory Government and AK Drafting services.

Table Tennis Queensland Inc has experienced another busy year.

I believe the correct decision was made by membership at the 1999 Annual General Meeting, in that since then the administrative affairs of Table Tennis in Queensland have been controlled by a single entity in the TTQ Board.

The Board has met frequently during the year and, thanks to the usage of the three-way-chat facility, teleconferencing costs have been minimal. We were also able to have two very productive meetings at Brisbane, the first following the AGM in March (as usual) and the second in conjunction with the Development Forum at Brisbane early in November.

Long serving member, Kev McDonnell, stood down from the Board mid term and on behalf of everyone involved with the sport in this state I would like to extend a big thanks to him for his long term involvement at this level. I would also like to extend thanks to Anthony Humenuik for the excellent work he did in assisting TTQ to turn around TTQ's financial situation over his term as Treasurer. It is also much appreciated that he was willing to continue to act in this role until a replacement Treasurer was found.

It appears to me that the decision to employ Ms Linda Lyell as State Development Manager was probably one of the best we have made in quite a while. Linda seems to have made a big difference to the way we are doing our business, and that will result in positive outcomes for our membership: the associations affiliated with TTQ. Linda's enthusiasm has assisted in ensuring that the Board is working in an improved manner. She has also proved to be quite reliable in keeping the Board focussed on appropriate issues at any given time.

I feel strongly that we were overdue for a "manager" who did not have any Table Tennis ties and I believe there is a lot that we can learn from Linda in the area of contemporary management practices within the sports industry. Operators with Linda's qualities do not stay in positions like we can offer forever. That is a fact of life these days, and must be accepted by the Board and membership alike. We must ensure that we continue to utilise her skills, and be open to any objective suggestions she may offer in our constant pursuit for quality management practices and increasing the numbers participating in the sport.

The Board has been responsible for many important decisions during the past twelve months, with one of the most important impacting on the way we manage the funding provided by Sport and Recreation Queensland (SRQ).

As from May regional development personnel (formerly known as regional coaches) have been employed directly by the associations at which they are based. This arrangement has not affected the funding from SRQ, for which TTQ is extremely grateful. Allocations from such funding, as decided by the Board, are made available to certain associations and acquitted via a set of key performance indicators negotiated between such clubs and TTQ.

The Constitution is currently under review with suggested alterations to be put to the upcoming AGM and a Selection Policy has been drafted with a view to incorporation in the By-Laws attached to the Constitution. A lot of work has been done on a potential pricing restructure that relates to changes fees for affiliation with TTQ, and has the aim of benefiting member affiliates. Difficulties experienced with the change from national to state based insurance scheme have been overcome satisfactorily with the positive outcome that clubs can now access discounted public liability insurance coverage through TTQ.

On the representative scene Queensland had players at all national championships, which has now been the norm for a number of years. We enjoyed a great deal of success and this

pays tribute to the coaching programs that are in place, especially with our youngsters who of course are the future of the sport.

A record must have been established when three Queenslanders made the entire Australian girl's team at the Asian Junior Championships in Hong Kong late in December. Congratulations to Claire Campbell-Innes, Mariana Lee and Cherie Daveson and also to Pam Clarke who helped make this an even more unbeatable statistic when she was named as coach.

Last year I reported that TTA was not in a healthy position. I am pleased to advise that matters have improved, however there is still a long way to go before it can be claimed that the situation has recovered significantly. I believe the current TTA Board and Chief Executive Officer are working hard on reinstating TTA's reputation and I encourage everyone involved with Table Tennis in Queensland to support the national association wherever possible – we are all part of it.

Many members of our affiliated associations have experienced ill health, and some have passed on, during 2001. These types of issues do not usually obtain a mention through our annual reporting process, however there have been a few recent instances that deserve special mention.

The Cairns club suffered two blows with long serving Secretary (and former TTQ Board member) Alan Benton passing away suddenly and Stan Richards, who was a long-term state veteran representative and a person holding great passion for our sport, passing on recently following a short illness.

Townsville statwart, and the Member of TTQ, Joyce Tregea has been experiencing serious health problems over the past few months. Joyce is unique in that she was awarded her state lifetime membership as a player and not on the administrative scene. Her record as a player is absolutely enormous. She has played the sport across all age groups, won numerous national titles, and is still a respected and formidable opponent at veteran level. I am sure all of Joyce's friends and opponents alike are hoping to see her in action again soon.

During 2001 our players had the challenge of playing with the bigger ball. In 2002 players have a fresh challenge and that is the introduction of the shortened game. It was thought that the ball alteration was radical, however it seems that this was relatively minor compared with playing to best of eleven point advantage games. It would appear that in addition with coming to terms with this change, officials will need to determine the number of games to play in various types of competitions.

I wish to extend appreciation to everyone who contributed to Table Tennis in Queensland during 2001 and hope that all the good work translates to additional clubs and more people playing the sport during 2002 and beyond.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I would like to thank South Australian table tennis players and the Board of Management for their support over the past twelve months.

The Year 2001 started off on a disappointing note with vacancies remaining on the Board of Management, but our appointed Members were keen on 'getting things done' and introduce some new ideas. However the fee structure was confusing to many and the decision made was a little late for the affiliates to plan their club fees for the year.

The Tournament Director, Sally Potter introduced some interesting ideas for tournaments and did a marvelous job while in that position.

The decision on the insurance policy was one area to be decided and the final decision was a Public Liability policy for \$10 million and club members were encouraged to have their own cover.

The Government of South Australia supported the sport through the Health Promotion grant and it was a great help to our affiliates in the development of the sport within their areas. The Office of Recreation & Sport has continued their support of our Association with sponsorship of \$15,000. The criteria for the way in which the funding is to be used is to be circulated to affiliates in the near future.

A representative from Health Promotion spoke at one of our meetings and advised us of the information on various programs and pamphlets available for distribution. They were received and sent to all affiliates. The Board was asked to encourage the affiliates to promote the health messages and to inquire about the availability of first aid kits within the venues. We were advised that spot checks would be made at various clubs in looking for the signage on the various health messages etc.

The Major Events of Australia in South Australia have once again offered SA sponsorship to apply for the World Veterans Championships for Adelaide in 2008. The Major Events of Australia as an organisation very professionally run and I would like to thank them personally and on behalf of the Association for their tremendous effort in trying to obtain these Championships for Adelaide in 2006.

Year 2001 was the Centenary of Federation South Australia and Sport SA organised a 'Celebration of Sport' at the Santos Stadium and ETSA Park Stadium, Mile End. Many sports participated in the march past and a display of memorabilia was at ETSA Park. Only a few juniors and veteran players offered their time to march and take part on this day.

The Junior Sports Policy was a booklet sent to all affiliates and will be again sent to any coaches interested in coaching within schools.

The Non-Smoking Policy was a requirement of the contract and was distributed to all affiliates.

In 2001 we saw the introduction of the **40mm ball** and with sponsorship received from various agents, our President was able to supply all affiliates with a quantity of new balls. We thank those Companies for their generosity in donating the balls.

As a suggestion from some affiliates the Board of Management arranged some **Presidents and Secretaries** meetings. Meetings were arranged and it was disappointing that a weekend could not be found so that the country representatives could attend. However the country affiliates did have their country committee meetings where they could voice their opinions. From these meetings, various ideas and concerns were discussed and the decision made

that the monthly meetings would change to quarterly. The next one was to be held in November but the Board delayed that date as it was too close to the Annual General Meeting. The Board does intend to conduct more of these meetings and we would like some input from the country people and we invite the affiliates to lodge some agenda items for discussion.

Year 2001 was the **International Year of Volunteers** and the Government has encouraged all sporting clubs and association to recognise their own volunteers. All affiliates were invited to submit six of their people and some are still processing the paperwork so that presentation can be made at the beginning of their new season.

The Government has arranged for badges to be purchased and certificates printed for presentation to the many that have assisted in some way during our years of existence.

In May the Minister responsible for Volunteers, Environment and Heritage, Recreation, Sport and Racing, Iain Evans arranged for complimentary tickets to be sent to all sporting clubs for a day at the Adelaide Cups. It was an interesting day with many dignitaries serving breakfast to the 'volunteers'.

Other events have been planned throughout the year and I know Table Tennis wishes to acknowledge the work put into the clubs and associations by the volunteers.

Recently advised by the South Australian Government was that legislation was going through about the **Volunteer Protection** and we will be advised as soon as this has been accepted.

We also see the **change of rules** in table tennis, some of which will be introduced from January 2002. The International TT Federation will be conducting their AGM in April where these new rules will be accepted or in some cases changed. At the moment we have been advised by the TTA Technical Committee Chairman, Graeme Ireland of the suggested changes that we can work from, until advised otherwise.

With all these Government initiatives being introduced, we must find time for our players and our sport.

This year has been very successful for many of our State participants, with gold medals in many of the age groups in teams and individual events. There are a lot of people in TTSA that make our Association successful, namely players, coaches, parents and administrators. If table tennis in this State is gauged by our success in National Championships then this combination is certainly achieving the results we desire. Not all players are elite players but they are certainly the backbone of our Association. Without their participation there would be no elite players.

I would like to congratulate all the players who won medals both in teams and individuals at this year's various National events. I would also like to congratulate the South Australian players representing Australia overseas.

'Table Talk' was one area that was not completed within the time frame. Some of our Board Members offered to collate this magazine but then withdrew after the deadline. This was a disappointment as the Board of Management had promised that four editions would be distributed. However two editions were completed with the second one posted in December to all registered members.

This report I hope covers many items of interest and I hope you will understand that the final Annual Report of a year is what all affiliates should store in their archives. It is the history of your sport.

Members of the Board of Management were thanked for their continued input and enthusiasm. A special thank you to Geoff Goss for offering to record the minutes of the Board meetings and this commenced from April.

I would like to thank our country affiliates for the effort they have been putting in. Some of them have been upgrading their stadiums and there have been reports of increase in players in some areas. The country Associations are a very important part of TTSA and I congratulate them on their continued enthusiasm.

Our Association needs to recruit new players into our sport and to attract past players back into the fold. A "back to table tennis" day by clubs could go a long way in achieving this aim.

The Tasmanian Table Tennis Association Inc. has experienced another settled and efficient year. While only five of the eight Board positions were filled, there is a wealth of experience in all facets of Table Tennis administration among the personnel – David Wilson, Elaine Wright, Margaret Turner, Doug Mclean and Bill Atkinson. At the same time, it is encouraging to see the emergence of a number of new, enthusiastic officials among Branch Delegates and Committee Members and the active participation of all Branches in both "politics" and play. The state has no salaried personnel so there is a total reliance on the goodwill of volunteers.

A full calendar of events was conducted on behalf of the state body by the Branches. This included a very competitive State League weekend that attracted all six Branches to the stadium of our newest member, the Deloraine Table Tennis League and saw the monopoly on the Yasaka Shield held by the Kingston team broken for the first time by Eastside League with Launceston finishing in second position.

Tasmania has always been at the forefront of electronic communication and computerised administration and much of the business of the association was conducted by email. In addition, a TTTA web site was designed and updated regularly by our Director of Media and Marketing, Doug McLean, joining those already operated by some of our Branches. Our site can be accessed at http://www.kingston.tco.asn.au/tastt/ It is expected that the popular and accurate computer ranking programme that was employed for many years in the early 90's will be re-introduced in 2002. With this reliance on information technology, the newsletter, Tasmanian Table Tennis, was not published.

Tasmania also experienced a successful year financially, finishing the year with a healthy surplus for the first time in many years. However, this was due in part to limited expenditure on developmental programmes in comparison with previous years. It augers well for a likely reduction in the Branch Levy payable to the state association for the third consecutive year – something which will please local officials who are still continuing the affiliation versus non-affiliation debate.

The return to the rotation system of allocating national championships will greatly assist the more-remote associations such as Tasmania and will allow us to redevelop higher-level administrative skills and officiating skills among our emerging officials. Tasmania always held an excellent reputation for both tournament organisation and the quality of its umpires and referees and both areas will prosper as the responsibility for major events returns to our shores.

The changes to the laws of Table Tennis have created the usual short-term controversy among those who take time to adapt to improvements. The 40mm ball was introduced from the beginning of 2001 to all statewide events and all Branches used it in their local pennant and tournament competitions. It is no longer an issue. After just three weeks of competition, our players are now wrestling with the tactical changes (or committee changes) they feel are necessary as a result of playing games to 11 points.

Our relationship with Table Tennis Australia has experienced limited communication from both sides, but this has now been addressed by the new CEO and our Delegate. In the early part of the year, David Wilson was the national Director of Finance and this enabled our association to keep abreast of most national activities. David's surprise resignation has altered our lines of communication, but we are confident of a continuing positive relationship in the important year ahead. We congratulate the Interim Board and subsequent Board, along with the new CEO on the progress that has been made towards returning the administration of our sport from impending disaster to its rightful position of prominence.

2001 was certainly a busy, rewarding and strategy altering experience for all those at Table Tennis Victoria.

TTV Board of Management:

The Board composition altered a number of times during the year with the resignation and retirement of a number of long-term Board members. Marc Huinink resigned as Vice President, Joan Guggenheim retired from the Veterans Portfolio and John Mackey resigned from his position as Tournament Director. The Board welcomed Phillip Carruthers as Vice President, Val Crumbie to the Veterans Portfolio and George Gardoz to the Associations Portfolio.

2001 Tournaments:

It was a busy year on the 2001 Tournament Calendar with TTV hosting the Australian Youth Championships and The Australian Senior Closed Championships. TTV celebrated with some good results in both the Men's and Womens events. Simon Gerada won the Australian Youth Men's Championships, The Victorian Open and was a finalist in the Australian Senior Closed Championships. Miao Miao won all 7 events she participated in at the Australian Senior Closed Championships and The Victorian Open. TTV also celebrated Men's and Womens team victories at The Australian Senior Closed Championships.

The 2002 Tournament Calendar guarantees to be another challenging year for Victoria. TTV we will be hosting the World Masters Games, The Australian Open Veterans, The Australian Junior Championships, The Australian Youth Championships and The Australian School Championships. Add The Victorian Open and The Country Championships to the above and we are guaranteed to see some great Table Tennis during the year.

TTV Finances:

Financially many of our Clubs and Associations have reported successful years. This can't be said for the State Body however. TTV like a number of sports had Government Grants reduced significantly by the Australian Sports Commission to Sport and Recreation Victoria, who in turn removed the funding for our part time Sports Development Officer. This also coincided with a significant reduction in player registrations adding to the disappointing financial year. A number of areas for improvement have been highlighted now that we have completed four years as a tenant of the Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre.

Although the exact trading loss is not confirmed as yet, it will be significant and TTV has moved swiftly to turn things around in 2002. We have been able to increase sponsorship significantly. A number of projects worked on last year have now come to fruition. We have restructured our player registration fees and categories and increased our fundraising activities. The most disappointing aspect was the loss of funding for the position of Sports Development Officer. Under these circumstances we are unable to retain the services of Tammy Gough. We thank Tammy for all her excellent work and wish her all the best in the future.

TTV Player Survey:

During 2001 The Heart Foundation, Butterfly Australia and AAA Table Tennis helped fund a TTV Player Survey. This was sent to our entire member base in order to learn more about our players. We received 1000 responses and now have some fantastic feed back as to what our players think should be happening with our sport, why they play table tennis, what they think of the bigger ball and the 11 point game, and what they would like to see improved. These results will be published as soon as possible and will be made available to all states.

TTA:

TTV 's relationship with TTA started the year on shaky ground, however as the year progressed both organisations have worked well together. We would like to welcome Matty Padley to the position of Chief Executive Officer of TTA and wish her all the best. During the year Phil Carruthers was invited to join the Board of TTA and this has certainly helped strengthen the ties between the two officiating bodies.

Sport Development:

In 2001 Alois Rosario instigated many programs. These included:

- The Victorian School Singles Championships, which attracted over 50 schools and 2000 students from throughout Victoria. The school development program saw approximately 100 visits to schools as well as development visits through affiliates.
- The Victorian Singles Championships for players with an intellectual disability attracted more than 20 competitors. This was promoted through VICSRAPID and conducted in conjunction with the School Singles Championships.
- The TOPS program continues to be popular in schools from Grade 5 through to Year 10.

TTV also conducted Retirement Village promotions, the Girls of All Ages tournament and the VicHealth Challenge for metropolitan affiliates as well as several other promotions throughout the year. It conducted 3 Level 1 coaching courses during the year including one in Albury/Wodonga and one in Shepparton.

Many of these programs are conducting due to the funding obtained from VicHealth. Sport & Recreation Victoria assists the scheme through subsidy for a Development Officer.

Thanks:

Finally, TTV would like to thank all the volunteers who have helped throughout the year. Without them we would not be able to offer such great programs and the infrastructure needed to be able provide our members with so many playing opportunities. In order for TTV to move forward in 2002 we will see many changes and we look forward to working with our volunteers to meet the challenge.

Although the Association once again functioned with only a half-filled Board of Management, Western Australia had a successful year in many respects including a 15% increase in membership.

The years activities were dominated by the National Veterans Championship which were a great success. This success was possible by the dedication shown by the organising committee (John Flynn, Dave Cooper, Phil Evans, Lyn Smallacombe and myself) and the assistance of numerous volunteers. It is pity that this assistance does not overflow into the mainstream activities, where again the Association was short of volunteers to take on major responsibilities. In particular was the absence of a Tournament Director, which led to makeshift arrangements having to be made.

The Match Committee again performed well under the Chairmanship of John Flynn. It is a pity that John has decided to relinquish the position after years of excellent service. Courtesy of long serving scorer, Chris Marsh, an Association Web site was set up and this provides up to date information on Pennants plus a multitude of additional information. It is fitting that Chris is to be bestowed with the honour of Association Life Membership for his long service to the Association over many years.

The increase in Association activities was mainly due to increased activity at each end of the age scale. Having the National Veterans activity at home naturally stimulated participation in the older age groups, but the increased activity in the younger age groups was due to the increasing success of the Association Junior Development program that is sponsored by Healthway. This was in part due to the assistance received from a number of parents including Penelope Whitby and Nikki Bolt. In addition to the junior coaching stalwarts Phil Ranger, David Brown and Peter Mascall, it was pleasing to see some of the new coaches becoming involved. These coaches attended the Level 1 Coaching Accreditation Course conducted by Glen Tepper in January, which attracted fourteen enrolments. Also a number of juniors attended the coaching course conducted by Dennis Chen. After so many years coaching, umpiring and running the Morley club it is fitting that Phil Ranger receive a life membership for his service to the Association.

The highlight of the local calendar as usual was the State Championship which received an excellent entry, and as a result of publicity received from the

'West Australian', had the best finals night attendance for years. The first State umpiring course for quite a few years was conducted by Ron Gallagher, who it was pleasing to see became quite involved in Association activities after few years absence.

The Association made a \$5741 loss as a result of Ansett Airlines going into administration. Although the Association lost air tickets for travel to the National Junior Championships to the value \$9,740, the actual loss incurred was just over \$6,000 being the additional cost of sending a reduced contingent away. The Board took the view that it was in the interests of the players, State Association and Nationally that Western Australia be represented at the Championships. Also the Board was endeavouring to comply with our Business Plan and Department of Sport and Recreation (DSR) funding agreement by making the best endeavours to send a team away. Also we had the mistaken belief that the DSR would provide some additional financial assistance to cover our losses. A request to the Minister for Sport and Recreation for assistance was flatly rejected.

Apart from that loss the Association was heading for a good year financially. A 25% increase in Centre net and gross income enabled \$5,000 to be spent on upgrading the Centre car park greatly improving the external view of the centre. Courtesy of the organisational work of Cedric Wilson the Association was able to save considerably on the cost of this work. This work was overdue and became a necessity when cars started breaking through the old surface. Once some tidying up work is carried out and some gardens established (volunteers needed) the appearance of the centre will be greatly improved.










PERCENTAGE COMPARISONS

REQUIREMENTS FOR ELIGIBILITY FOR NATIONAL SENIOR SELECTION AFTER THE 2002 COMMONWEALTH GAMES

In order to be eligible for selection as a playing member of a national men's or women's team, a player ("the player") must:

- (1) undergo such coaching and training at such times and venues as is required by the national coach or coaches appointed to coach the training squad (if any) for the national team in which the player is seeking selection ("the national team");
- (2) agree to accept coaching from the national coach or coaches in teams and individual matches at any international events in which the player is selected to participate;
- (3)(a) if the national team is to be selected between the conclusion of the Australian Senior Championships in any calendar year and 31 December of that calendar year, compete in the following events from 1 May in the calendar year in which the national team is being selected up to and including 31 July of that calendar year:
 - at least 50% of the matches in that 3 month period in the highest level of inter-club competition in which the player is reasonably able to obtain a place in a team in the player's resident State or Territory; and
 - (ii) the men's or women's singles events of at least 3 tournaments in the player's resident State or Territory, other than the State or Territory Championships (if played in that 3 month period) and the Australian Senior Championships (if played in the player's resident State or Territory in that 3 month period);
 - (b) if the national team is to be selected between 1 January of any calendar year and the conclusion of the Australian Senior Championships in that calendar year, compete in the following events from 1 May in the calendar year prior to which the national team is being selected up to and including 31 July of that prior calendar year:
 - at least 50% of the matches in that 3 month period in the highest level of inter-club competition in which the player is reasonably able to obtain a place in a team in the player's resident Sate or Territory; and
 - (ii) the men's or women's singles events of at least 3 tournaments in the player's resident State or Territory, other than the State or Territory Championships (if played in that 3 month period) and the Australian Senior Championships (if played in the player's resident State or Territory in that 3 month period);
- (4) compete in the Men's or Women's Open Singles, the Men's or Women's Open Doubles and the Mixed Open Doubles of the most recently held of the player's resident State or Territory Senior Championships prior to selection of the national team;
- (5) satisfy the player's resident State's or Territory's requirements to be eligible for selection, and be available for selection, in the player's resident State or Territory Men's or Women's Team to compete in the most recently held Australian Senior Championships prior to the selection of the national team; and
- (6) compete in the Men's or Women's Singles, the Men's or Women's Doubles, the Mixed Doubles and, if selected by the player's resident State or Territory, the Men's or Women's Teams event in the most recently held Australian Senior Championships prior to selection of the national team.

The Board of Management of Table Tennis Australia may waive any of the abovementioned requirements in respect of the eligibility of any player for selection in any national men's or women's team if the Board, in its sole and unfettered discretion, considers it appropriate.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ELIGIBILITY FOR NATIONAL JUNIOR SELECTION

In order to be eligible for selection as a playing member of a national junior team, a player ('the player") must:

- (1) undergo such coaching and training at such times and venues as is required by the national coach or coaches appointed to coach the training squad (if any) for the national team in which the player is seeking selection ("the national team");
- (2) agree to accept coaching from the national coach or coaches in teams and individual matches at any international events in which the player is selected to participate;
- (3) compete in at least one of the junior boys' or girls' singles events of the most recently held of the player's resident State or Territory Junior Championships prior to selection of the national team;
- (4) satisfy the player's resident State's or Territory's requirements to be eligible for selection, and be available for selection, in one of the player's resident State or Territory junior teams to compete in the most recently held Australian Junior Championships prior to selection of the national team; and
- (5) if selected by the player's resident State or Territory, compete in one of the junior teams events, one of the junior boys' or girls' singles events, one of the junior boys' or girls' doubles events and one of the junior mixed doubles events at the most recently held Australian Junior Championships prior to selection of the national team.

The Board of Management of Table Tennis Australia may waive any of the abovementioned requirements in respect of the eligibility of any player for selection in any national junior team if the Board, in its sole and unfettered discretion, considers it appropriate.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ELIGIBILITY FOR NATIONAL VETERANS' SELECTION AFTER 2002

In order to be eligible for selection as a playing member of a national veterans' team, a player ("the player") must:

- (1) compete in at least one of the veterans' singles events of the most recently held of the player's resident State or Territory Veterans' Championships prior to selection of the national team;
- (2) satisfy the player's resident State's or Territory's requirements to be eligible for selection, and be available for selection, in one of the player's resident State or Territory veterans' teams to compete in the most recently held Australian Veterans' Championships prior to selection of the national team; and
- (3) if selected by the player's resident State or Territory, compete in one of the veterans' teams events, one of the veterans' men's or women's singles events, one of the veterans' men's or women's doubles events and one of the veterans' mixed doubles events at the most recently held Australian Veterans' Championships prior to selection of the national team.

The Board of Management of Table Tennis Australia may waive any of the abovementioned requirements in respect of the eligibility of any player for selection in any national veterans' team if the Board, in its sole and unfettered discretion, considers it appropriate.

SELECTION CRITERION FOR ALL NATIONAL JUNIOR, YOUTH, SENIOR AND VETERANS' TEAMS

Subject to the relevant requirements for eligibility for national selection and unless in any particular case the Board of Management of Table Tennis Australia decrees to the contrary, the sole criterion for selection of a player ("the player") in a national team ("the team") to participate in an international tournament ("the international tournament") shall be the player's likely contribution to the team's overall success (both in teams and individual events) based on the player's likely personal performances and the player's likely contribution to the performances of other members of the team, with those players whose likely contribution to the team's overall success is comparatively greater being selected ahead of those players whose likely contribution to the team's overall success is comparatively lesser.

Factors which are relevant to the sole criterion for selection include (without limiting the same): the player's previous performances in international events (if any), national events and State or Territory events; the player's previous performances against likely opponents in the international tournament (if any); the player's fitness to participate in intensive competition for the duration of the international tournament; the player's style and technique, taking into account the style and technique of the player's likely opponents (if known); the player's temperament; and the player's likely interaction with other players in the team and the coach or coaches and the manager of the team.

SELECTION CRITERION FOR ALL NATIONAL JUNIOR, YOUTH, SENIOR AND VETERANS' REPRESENTATION OTHER THAN IN A NATIONAL TEAM

Subject to the relevant requirements for eligibility for national selection (if any) and unless in any particular case the Board of Management of Table Tennis Australia decrees to the contrary, the sole criterion for selection of a player ("the player") to represent Australia in an international tournament ("the international tournament") shall be the player's likely degree of success in the international tournament, with that player or those players whose likely degree of success is comparatively greater being selected ahead of those players whose likely degree of success is comparatively lesser.

Factors which are relevant to the sole criterion for selection include (without limiting the same): the player's previous performances in international events (if any), national events and State or Territory events; the player's previous performances against likely opponents in the international tournament (if any); the player's fitness to participate in intensive competition for the duration of the international tournament; the player's style and technique, taking into account the style and technique of the player's likely opponents (if known); and the player's temperament.
